Sir,

Having had the honour of knowing you personally, in A. Ababa, and so being able to appreciate your qualities as Commander as well as your generous spirit, I permit myself to ask you the following favour, hoping that you will be so good to understand and help me.-

On our evacuation from A. Ababa to the concentration camp in Kenya all our affairs were left to the custody office of enemy goods.- On account of my health I was able to repatriate, leaving there my brother and my son who were still in Camp N.1 (A) Nyeri Kenya, as Civilian Evacuees.- I have then been informed that with the intervention of the Allied Authorities some of these have been repatriated.- May I hope that you will be so kind as to interest yourself for the repatriation of my son and my brother?

I hope that you will remember that our Firm in A. Ababa supplied goods to the Allied troops in 1941/1942.- These goods were consigned to Maj. Goldstein and Lt. Col. Birchell of the Railways, to the Military Command of Harghessa for the sum of Lstg. 3500, to the British Army Command, 60 lorries for £.1200 and many lesser consignments made to other Commands.

You remember perhaps having visited us with Mr. Dallas on which occasion you acquired three 2476 hal dinner services and some other stuff.-

I permit myself to mention these particulars in order you may remember better your visit.-

My brother's family's helped the following Allied prisoners to escape from the camp of Poppi (Arezzo)

On re-entering in Italy in August 1943 after 23
 years in the Colonies, it was impossible for me to do any
 business, as reports from A. Ababa informed me that the Ugazzi
 Firm had supplied goods to the Allied Command, that the Firm
 belonged to "Free Italy" and had done propaganda against the
 fascist regime. For these reasons I was menaced with a law-
 suit and with being closed up in a concentration camp.-
 I tried and succeeded in remaining concealed, doing at the
 same time propaganda and helping the clandestine front.-

On the Allied occupation of Rome I had hoped to
 use my industrial capacities, but so far it was in vain.-

In view of this situation I should be very grate-
 ful were it possible that my brother and my son should return
 to Italy or at least be enabled to return to Somaliland or
 Eritrea.-

I may mention that my brother deposited several
 hundred pounds with the Camp Commander and £.1500 at the
 Barclay's Bank in A. Ababa, which sum would allow me to begin
 a business on his own account.-

I enclose copy of a request which I have already
 sent to Cl. Campbell.- If it is not possible to grant this
 request, my Firm would be ready to buy or administrate a cer-
 tain number of your motor vehicles, and in this case give you
 the necessary guarantee.- I know that in Naples in April 42
 the A.C.C. (transport office) in Piazza della Borsa, conceded
 to a private firm (The Motor Vehicle Firm of Camoenia),
 160 lorries of the Allied Command to be used for this Command
 or when necessary for Italian organisations of public utility.

This arrangement took place as a result of the
 Regional Order N° 38/42 on April 1944, issued from the Head-
 quarters Region 3 Allied Military Government APO 394 U.S. Army

With your kind intervention I should be able in one
 case or the other to work honestly and profitably.-

I beg you to forgive me for troubling you, but I
 just would like to be able to work together with my partners
 and I think we may merit it, having always been in sympathy with
 the Allied and having suffered considerably during 20 years of
 Fascist Regime. Besides, I am always ready to continue my help
 to the limits of my possibilities in your great political work
 economic and moral reconstruction.

Approx. 600 Maltese and Greek ex-internees, formerly residents of Tripolitania, at present held in Aversa Camp will embark Naples under orders Mov Naples o/a 10 August 1944 for repatriation to Tripoli and Benghazi. Arrangements for their reception in Tripoli have been made by HQ. B.M.F. Tripolitania.

2. TRANSPORT: O.C. Aversa Camp will make all necessary arrangements for transport to port of embarkation.

3. MEDICAL ARRANGEMENTS:

- (a) All ex-internees will undergo FFI inspection prior to embarkation.
- (b) All ex-internees will be in possession of certificate of inoculation and vaccination.
- (c) All baggage will be disinfested.

4. DOCUMENTATION: Nominal rolls in duplicate will accompany the draft. O.C. Aversa will notify this HQ. actual numbers embarked.

5. BLANKETS: Blankets belonging to this Sub-Commission will not accompany draft.

6. BAGGAGE: All baggage in possession of the ex-internees will accompany.

7. FINANCE: Captain Ward J. OATES, Finance Officer this HQ will ensure that all Italian Lira in possession of ex-internees is exchanged for BMA currency.

9. SECURITY: Major SIMCOCK G 2 this HQ will ensure that only ex-internees granted MTA by AFHQ (G 2 Cl) will be included in draft.

All personnel will be warned that they are on no account to discuss their voyage prior to embarkation or after disembarkation at destination.

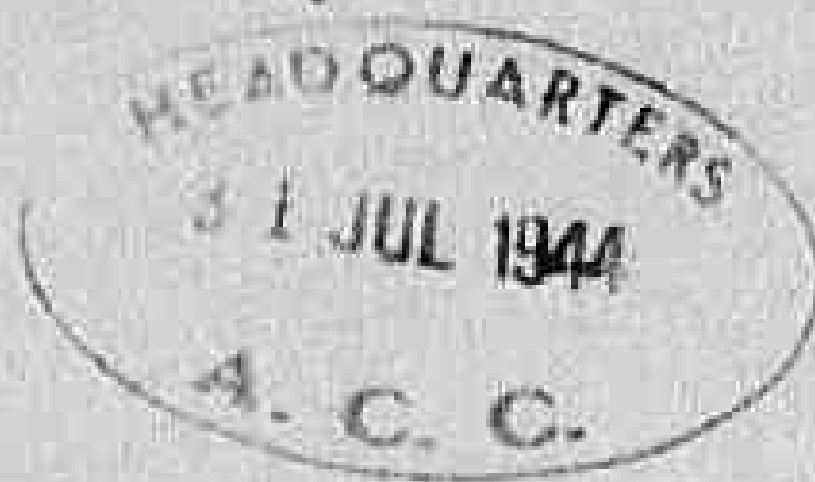

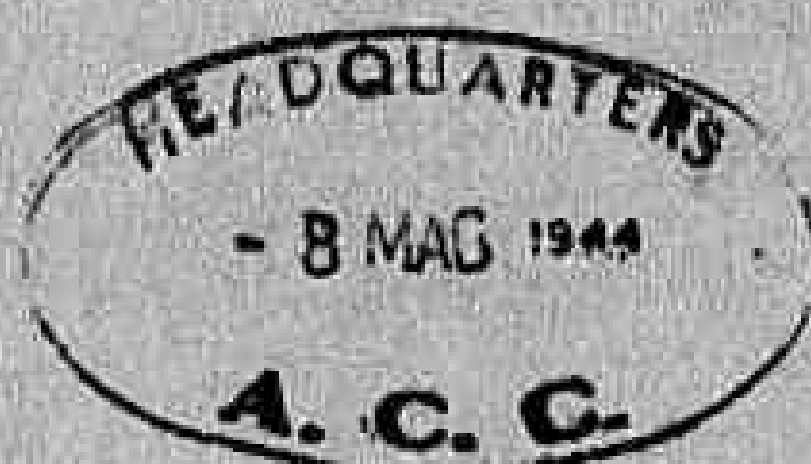
