BROMBINI PARODI and DELFINO - Storage
of Naval Powder by.

1. Approximately 200 tons of powder in bulk form is stowed at the Anagni plant of the subject commercial firm, located on the Rome - Cassino line, about 65 kilometers from Rome. The powder has been inspected by an officer from the Naval Sub-Commission, ACC, and a complete report submitted to the Flag Officer, Western Italy to determine whether or not it can be utilized by Allied Forces for demolition work or any other purposes.

2. At the present time no guards are on duty at the Anagni plant. It is requested that the Army Sub-Commission, in conjunction with the Regional Control and Military Government Section, have guards stationed at the plant by Italian Military authorities, pending ultimate disposition of the powder.

3. Please inform the Naval Sub-Commission if this can be accomplished.

2. There is also no objection to direct Italian civil officials to employ civilians as guards for such installations provided no Italian military personnel are available.

2. Please say whether this proposal can be put into effect.

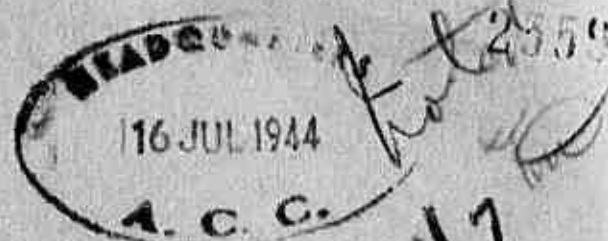

SD 1088 . CONFIDENTIAL . Reported that numerous Italian Army installations including dumps, warehouses, magazines, depots, area headquarters and records are in areas being taken over by Allied troops . These installations and records should be safeguarded . Impracticable to send Italian Army personnel to take charge on the spot and in time to prevent loss . Therefore suggest that AMG Officers direct Italian civil officials installed by them in each area to employ civilians as guards for such installations until Italian Army can either take over or secure possession of property and records.

1. Consequent on future plans for Island Base section, it is requested that Italian guards be provided as follows from Italian XII Corps w.e.f. 1 JULY to 1 AUG 44 unless A.C.C. can offer release before latter date:

Electric sub-section	34
Train and Refugee control	52
Refugee camp	35
Security of Warehouses-A.C.C.	506
Total	<u>627</u>

2. Liaison officer M.M.I.A. SICILY has relevant details.

3. The number of guards required was worked out 2357 originally with I.B.S. supervision. The large figure for security of warehouses comprises guards of 84 hours for 39 food warehouses. Preparations are in hand for eventual hand-over of these warehouses to the Italian authorities; it is hoped to complete this by 1 AUG.

2. The proposed organisation of the Italian Army personnel portion of the above W.E. is as follows:-

3. It will be seen that the proposal number of Sergeants is 9 against 6, while Corporals have been reduced from 25 to 19 and G.D. men increased from 197 to 200. This is to allow 1 Sergeant for each Platoon, including the Headquarters Platoon.

4. It is proposed to allocate these personnel as follow 255

To:- HQ Allied Control Commission.....H.Q.Pn and 3 Duty Platoons.

To:- A.M.G. Regions II, III, IV, V, VII.....One Duty Platoon each.

Four duty Platoons have been asked for up to date, two for HQ A.C.C. and one each for A.M.G. Regions IV and V. This office letters 16080/1/G-1 dated 1 and 11 Apr '44 refer.

A short discussion was held between Maj. Gen. Browning (Head of Army Sub-Commission), Brig. Lush, Col. Fiske and Capt. Talbot.

Gen. Browning said that our requirements for guards must be demanded through Hq. AAI. Capt. Talbot was instructed to take the matter up with Col. Adams Economic Section with a view to Submitting our requirements to AAI.

The main problem was thought to be Naples and Bari and perhaps Reggio.

Gen. Browning emphasized that only self-contained units would be available.

Brig. Lush said that Economic Section must place ahead when stating the requirements

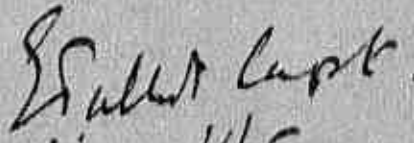
