2. If true as alleged, the complaints indicate that there is a complete disregard of Italian law and regulations as well as Allied policy. In the interests of all concerned it is believed that strong action should be taken to the end that grave incidents will not occur and that the Yugoslavs will conduct themselves properly. These people should be made to realize that they are guests in Italy and not conquerors. Acts of terrorism will lead to grave consequences and certainly will not assist in the prosecution of the war.
3. I would appreciate your views on this matter in order that satisfactory relations, if possible, can be established between the Yugoslavs and the Italians. I am sure that the Italians will do their part.

SUBJECT: Activities of Yugoslav Partisans in MONOPOLI

30

As the personnel of the Yugoslav partisan Base in Monopoli increases constantly, the Town Major is forced to requisition more and more buildings outside each one of which a sentry armed with rifle and hand grenade is placed.

The military who carry out such sentry duties forbid civilians to walk at night through the streets where such buildings are located.

The state of affairs has already led to grave incidents.

On the 17th of May last, at about 03.15 hrs a Yugoslav soldier whilst on sentry duty was wounded in a foot by the explosion of a hand grenade. According to him the grenade had been sent rolling along the street from the corner of an adjacent street. From investigations made this does not appear to be true. Had it really been an attack it would have been far more logical to throw the grenade and not to send it rolling.

On the morning of June 2nd at 04.15 hrs a fishvendor TAVERA Raffaele was killed by rifle shots fired point blank by a Yugoslav sentry while he was turning to comply with the order issued by said sentry. The vendor was on his way to work.

On June 1st, a Carabinieri Patrol, while on duty was stopped by a Yugoslav Patrol who ordered them to discontinue their service and return to their Barracks.

All the above incidents are causing great alarm and strong reaction among the population.

I must therefore request MMIA to kindly consider the advisability of intervening energetically and as soon as possible, in order that the activities of the Monopoli Partisan HQ may return to normal at once, discontinuing these acts of terrorism and respecting Italian Sovereignty in the City and port of Monopoli. Only thus will further grave and regrettable incidents be avoided.

- (a) HQ Special Ops Mediterranean are responsible for the command and administration of all Yugo Slav Naval and Military personnel in Italy; otherwise known as MILAY.

- (b) "Z" Military Mission has been allotted to HQ Special Ops.

3. Yugo Slav Partisan Army operating in Dalmatia

- (a) HQ Special Ops Mediterranean are responsible for the maintenance of the Yugo Slav Partisan Army operating in Dalmatia.

4. Yugo Slav Military personnel in Italy

- (a) HQ Special Ops Mediterranean are responsible for the command and administration of all Yugo Slav Naval and Military personnel in Italy; otherwise known as H.M.Z.
- (b) "Z" Military Mission has been allotted to HQ Special Ops Mediterranean for the purpose of training, equipping and administration of H.M.Z.
- (c) No 2 District will render all possible assistance through their local administration machinery, e.g., accommodation, works services etc to HQ Special Ops Mediterranean in carrying out the responsibility defined in para 3(a) above and are authorised to issue rations, personal clothing and equipment to a maximum of 5,000 men.
Detailed instructions on the issue of rations, clothing and equipment will be issued by this headquarters.



DIRECTIVE FOR "Z" MILITARY MISSION

1. INFORMATION.

Attached at Appdx. A will be found a summary of the present administrative situation regarding N.L.A.Y. in Italy.

2. OBJECT.

The object of the Mission is to effect liaison between the Yugoslav Military Delegation BARI and the appropriate Allied authorities to ensure that:

- (a) The Allied policy towards N.L.A.Y. as regards its organisation in Italy is carried out. ✓
- (b) N.L.A.Y. in Italy is properly administered. ✓
- (c) N.L.A.Y. carries out the orders of the appropriate Allied authorities in all matters pertaining to local administration and discipline.
- (d) N.L.A.Y. is given the necessary assistance to establish depots and carry out training in areas as ordered by No. 2 District. ✓
- (e) N.L.A.Y.'s wishes as regards policy and implementation of its local administration and training requirements are met as far as possible and compatible with para. 2(a) above.
- (f) N.L.A.Y. is equipped to the scale agreed. ✓
- (g) N.L.A.Y. conforms to the financial policy as may be laid down. ✓
- (h) Liaison is maintained with D.P.S-C. so that the arrangements made for the maintenance and movement of Yugoslav refugees in this country work smoothly. 2923
- (i) Liaison is maintained so that the arrangements made for the training of medical personnel and the care of Yugoslav wounded in Italy and Malta work smoothly. ✓
- (j) N.L.A.Y. observes the existing regulations regarding security. ✓

3. COMMAND.

You will work under the orders of H.Q., S.O.(I). Adm. Echelon.

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4. LIAISON.

You will maintain close liaison with the following:

- (a) Military Mission N.L.A.Y.
- (b) Force 266
- (c) No. 2 District and the Sub Areas concerned.
- (d) D.P.S.C., BARI.

5. METHOD.

- (a) You will obtain the necessary information, particularly Strength Returns, from the N.L.A.Y. Delegation, to allow you to arrange for the responsible issue of rations, clothing and equipment.
- (b) You will obtain an initial return, and thereafter such returns as you require, of the various vehicles in possession of the N.L.A.Y., and you will prepare a War Establishment for its vehicle requirements, which you will submit to H.Q. S.O.(M) Adm. Ech. for onward transmission to A.A.I. for authorisation. You will arrange with No. 2 District for the maintenance and repair of these vehicles, and for the provision of the necessary spares.
- (c) You will arrange for the formation of one or more general Base Depots for all personnel of the N.L.A.Y. not required elsewhere, such as at the various ports etc., in an area approved by No. 2 District, where personnel can be trained, equipped and held pending their return to YUGOSLAVIA.

In this connection, you will recommend whether this Depot should be a general Depot for Army, Air Force and Naval personnel, or whether a separate establishment for Naval personnel not required at the time should be established.

- (d) You will provide such technical assistance as is available to assist the N.L.A.Y. in its training.
- (e) You will arrange for the necessary accommodation to be made available as required, direct with the Sub Areas concerned.
- (f) You will arrange for the normal issue of clothing and equipment, to the scale decided, to be made through D.A.D.O.S., H.Q. S.O. (M) Adm. Ech., on the authority of that H.Q., by 576 S.S.D., who will demand replacements of common user items from A.A.I. as necessary. The underlying principle regarding this matter is that a certain amount of clothing and equipment is available for the N.L.A.Y., which may either be used in Yugoslavia or by its soldiers in Italy. In this connection you will recommend to H.Q. S.O.(M) Adm. Ech. what stocks of clothing, equipment and necessities the N.L.A.Y. in Italy must carry to prevent constant demands of a small nature.

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- (g) You will arrange for the submission of what returns H.Q. S.O. (M) Adm. Ec. may require to plan their future demands for clothing, equipment and necessities to be held for their use by 576 S.S.D.
- (h) You will recommend to H.Q. S.O. (M) Adm. Ec. as soon as possible what financial arrangements are necessary for the maintenance of N.L.A.Y. and its naval requirements in Italy, for onward transmission to higher authority.
- (i) You will arrange to be kept fully in the picture regarding the present and future policy as regards refugees and wounded Yugoslav military personnel in this country and in Malta.
- (j) You will arrange with N.L.A.Y. Military Mission to set up the necessary documentation, particularly of the whereabouts of its wounded soldiers, so that at any time you can report what is the situation.

6. GENERAL NOTES.

- (a) You will aim at concentrating all personnel of N.L.A.Y. not required elsewhere, in one (or two - as specified in para. 5(c)) Base Depots where they can administer themselves with your assistance, but you must be prepared to make the necessary arrangements to assist them, particularly in their accounting, so that they may be provided on a proper basis with what they require.
- (b) You should deal in all matters affecting N.L.A.Y. through N.L.A.Y. Military Mission, FARI.

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Appendix A.MEMORANDUM ON PARTISAN PERSONNEL IN ITALY

The following is the up-to-date position regarding Partisan personnel in Italy as understood by this H.Q., and supersedes F.266/48/AQ dated 2 Apr 44.

1. GENERAL.

The position regarding the administration of Yugoslav personnel in this country is not satisfactory, and has been deteriorating for some time due to the fact that no official body existed to deal with these personnel and also to the fact that there was no authority to equip them. A.A.I. are now issuing a directive, and the position has already shown an improved during the last few days.

From the following, which is intended to serve as a guide to (a) the present position, and (b) the future commitment, it will be seen that this H.Q. and the R.N. have in fact been assisting the Yugoslavs to the limit of their ability. It must be stated in this connection, however, that they have not had the facilities for discharging their obligation (as they had no responsibility proper towards the Yugoslavs).

2. PRESENT NUMBERS.

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Regarding the above, CARAVIGNO personnel are shortly to move to M.E. The Naval School at MONOPOLI is no more than a holding camp for unemployed naval personnel, and of the 327 at MONOPOLI docks it is estimated that 200 at the most are required. No information regarding the reason for the OSTUNI party can be discovered. As soon as mules are available the muleteers will shortly move out. Those Yugoslavs employed by M.E. 53 and M.E. 54 are doing essential work. At MANFREDONIA, MOLA, MOLFETTA and BARI (24) the personnel

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are employed in connection with Yugoslav shipping affairs under their own arrangements. The figure of 675 for ships' crews includes the crews of 93 ships, of which 23 are in commission, and the remainder are scattered in ports and harbours up and down the eastern Italian coast. (The Yugoslavs maintain full crews on ships which are not in commission).

In view of the fact that N.L.A.Y. do not consider it to be in their interest to divulge the numbers of personnel in this country, these figures should be treated with reserve.

3. FUTURE NUMBERS.

N.L.A.Y. expect their numbers within two months to increase as under:

1,000 from dissidents in M.E.
2,000 from P.W. camps etc. in Italy, Sicily and Sardinia.

ACCOMMODATION.

(a) The Yugoslavs dislike CASTRO Camp and give the following reasons:

- i. It is in small houses, and not in a tented camp which they prefer, such as CHAVINA. (N.B. Tentage is in short supply).
- ii. There is insufficient water.
(N.B. No. 71 Sub Area have this matter in hand).
- iii. The training areas are unsuitable.
(N.B. This is not confirmed from personal observation)
- iv. It is extremely uncomfortable, and such is in fact the case.

Consequently no steps are being taken to send personnel who are not required for any other purpose to CASTRO.

It is recommended that "Z" Military Mission should consider the suitability of CASTRO Camp now. It clearly needs concentrated work done on it by No. 71 Sub Area, but "Z" Military Mission should remember that the Camp was established under the orders of G.O.C., No. 2 Military District, who is the over-ruling factor in this matter.

(b) Eastern Italy is littered with Yugoslav naval hangers-on.

It is recommended that a village in the heel of Italy, on the sea, should be selected and all naval or alleged naval personnel whom "Z" Military Mission considers to be unemployed should be centred there together with the MONOPOLI Naval School.

(c) The remainder of the accommodation is reasonably satisfactory, but requires attention from "Z" Military Mission, particularly in MONOPOLI, where the Yugoslavs are very crowded.

6. CLOTHING, EQUIPMENT AND ACCOMMODATION STORES.

No proper system is at present in force. It is suggested that the proper system is as in this H.Q. letter attached, but that "Z" Military Mission should consider immediately how to start up some proper system of accounting, otherwise after obtaining their initial stocks they will have difficulty with the V.D. in securing the necessary replacements.

7. TRANSPORT.

It is recommended that "Z" Military Mission take the following action:

- (a) To allot under orders No. 2 District V.D. numbers to civilian cars.
- (b) To arrange with No. 2 District to accept demands for spares and replacements and to authorise petrol issues to all N.L.A.Y. transport bearing approved V.D. numbers.

8. Force 266 is directly under your command for operations in YUGOSLAVIA, ALBANIA, and the Dalmatian Islands.
9. You will establish your headquarters in the BiH - BIJ DISI area in TITO at the earliest practicable time. OSS will designate one officer to serve in the operations section of your General staff and one officer to serve in the supply section of your General staff.
10. You will maintain close liaison with the following agencies:

- a. Special Operations Committee Advanced, this Headquarters, which is now established in Caserta but which is being directed to move to BiH area and to operate in close liaison with you.
- b. The Foreign Office has ordered an advisor on YUGOSLAV - ALBANIAN affairs to BIH. You will seek the advice of this Foreign Office representative on political matters affecting YUGOSLAVIA and ALBANIA.

- b. A.P.S. Section is being attached to you to augment the security personnel already at your disposal for dealing with domestic security matters. Should you require to make security investigations outside the area of your own installations, contact should be made with PR No. 2 District (G.S.I.(b)) who will deal with the matter for you.
- c. An interrogation and security section for serving refugees is established at BIH. It is responsible to AF. (G-2). You should retain in the closest touch with this section.

b. The Foreign Office has ordered an advisor on YUGOSLAV - ALBANIAN affairs to BARI. You will seek the advice of this Foreign Office representative on political matters affecting YUGOSLAVIA and LIBYA.

c. In your capacity as advisor to S.A.C. on special operations the chain of communication between S.A.C. and Brigadier MacLean will normally be through you.

d. A suggested method for maintaining liaison with these agencies is to establish a special operations committee which would meet daily or as often as you desire.

11. a. You will be responsible for the command and administration of a General Base Depot for all YUGOSLAV personnel in ITALY.
