1. No 3 Remount Purchasing Commission has been operating in SICILY since Nov 43 for the purpose of obtaining mules which are operationally required for the Allied Armies.

2. Up to date 3,408 mules have been obtained, either by purchase requisition, or return of ex Italian animals.

3. To meet Armies' requirements 400 mules must be obtained each month.

The present mule population of SICILY is estimated at 135,000 consequently the figure of approximately 5,000 mules per annum only represents 3.7% the loss of which cannot represent any serious hardship to the inhabitants.

4. Following the SICILIAN campaign over 6,000 German or Italian Army animals found their way into civilian hands. Only two to three hundred of these animals have been recovered. The campaign therefore improved the animal position in the island.

5. O.C., 3 Remount Purchasing Commission reports that for the last four months he has not been able to obtain his monthly quota. It is known that the mules are there but they are not being produced according to the requisition orders. O.C., Remount Purchasing Commission is not obtaining the requisite aid from the local ACC officers in enforcing these requisitions, or in taking action when they are flagrantly disobeyed.

6. On the mainland, every possible assistance has been given by your officers. Heavy fines have been inflicted for failure to obey requisition orders.

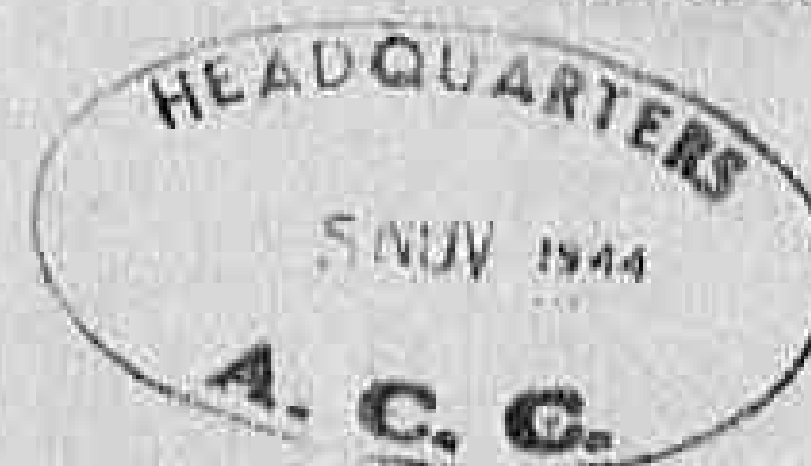

1. With reference to your 391/25/CA of 30 September 1944, the following has been obtained and is forwarded for your information.

2. a. It is confirmed that the sheep are required for Indian Troops, who will only eat meat which is slaughtered by them according to their religious rites.

b. A.F.L.R.S. have allotted to the British Army a total of 48,000 sheep and goats, of which 15% are to be obtained from Catanzaro, that is to say, not more than 7,200.

c. As it is intended to purchase at an overall rate of 9,000 per month, the amount to be produced by Catanzaro will be approximately 1,450 per month.

d. A further point of comment is that as only male animals will be accepted by the Indians, pregnant animals will not be purchased.

The Catanzaro H.Q. Region VII of the A.C.C. has requested the requisition for the Allied troops of following cattle:

- Sheep	17.960
- Goats	2.600

Though said requisition is already under way, I deem it to be my duty to point out to this Mission the prejudice deriving from it to the cattle property of Calabria, so much for the great amount of animals requested as for the season in which said requisition is being effected. In fact at the present period of the year lambs are not available and sheep are nearly all pregnant, so that the butchering of said cattle will have serious consequences in the long run worsening the meat and cheese supply for the inhabitants.

I therefore warmly beg this Mission to examine the possibility of reducing the number of the cattle to be requisitioned and to delay the delivery till after the period of the sheep's production.

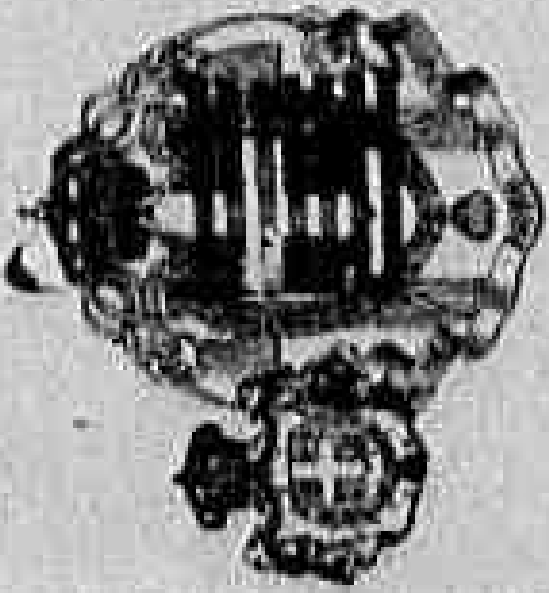

1. The Italian Civil Authorities were informed to prepare itineraries for No.3 Remount Purchasing Commission by the Provincial Commissioner, Palermo Province.
2. The Provincial Commissioner of Palermo and Trapani Provinces was transferred to another Region shortly after receipt of request by No.3 Remount Purchasing Commission for these itineraries, Capt Bullock taking over this work.
3. Capt Bullock was transferred to another Region shortly after receiving assurances from the Prefect of Palermo that the matter was in hand and well organized and on August 8th the matter was passed over to Capt Pike, Director of Agriculture Sub-Commission who is now organizing the matter.
4. Capt Pike addressed a letter, AGR/1039/Reg.1 dated 8 August 1944 to C.C. No.3 Remount Purchasing Commission requesting information of the date of his visit to Palermo and his requirements. No reply has yet been received to this letter.
5. This Headquarters will co-operate with C.C. No.3 Remount Purchasing Commission in all particulars and will request all necessary assistance from the Italian authorities in connection with the requisitioning of mules.

TRANSLATION OF LETTER TO LORD RENNELL OF RODD
from Antinucci Paolo - Foggia 15 January 1944

I the undersigned Antinucci Paolo, son of the late P. Savenic, domiciled in Foggia, Via Francesco Crispi No. 38, near A.E., beg to inform you of the following :-

On Oct., 7th 1943, on the Foggia - Bari road, in the presence of myself and of Sig. Lauriola Francesco, Via Bari - Podene 254 and of Pasqua Francesco of Pasquale, Virginia Ferta No. 9, there was requisitioned a mare belonging to me; each of us received a receipt signed by Capt. D.M. Pilley, and countersigned by Lt.-Col. Pease of the 3rd Inf. Brigade Coy. R.A.S.C. When making the requisition Capt. Pilley, giving us the receipt, told us to go on the following day to the AMGOT H.Q. (Palazzo Marcelline) in Foggia, Corso Garibaldi, to receive payment for the horses which had been requisitioned.

On Oct., 8th, we both of us went to the AMGOT H.Q. for payment, the officer in charge of the requisitioning of quadrupeds said that the receipt was incomplete, as no price was specified, he asked us to leave it there for correction, asking us, meanwhile, to return on the 10th October to obtain payment. Despite some misgiving I decided to trust this officer, and handed over my receipt, Sig. Pasqua kept his, waiting to see the result of my trusting action.

On Oct. 10th I returned to the AMGOT H.Q., and found to my amazement that the officer to whom I had spoken had left Foggia, and had gone to Termoli.

I put my case to all the British and American officers there, who expressed words of consolation or rather of regret. The only person who displayed any real interest was the British Town Major of Foggia, who said that if I could give him the name of one of the officers who made the requisition, he would look into the matter. I gave him all the details, but never succeeded in getting either the price of the mare, or the return of it (?).

I am therefore writing to you, in order to obtain a just settlement of the matter.
