2. Reference your R/2017 of 19 May 1944, the position of the three draft Regional Orders is as follows:

(a) Licenses.

This Order is being prepared, as you know, for issue as a General Order. Since, among other things, the proposed legislation has to do with orders concerning insurance, the Public safety sub-Commission felt obliged to consult A.R.E. before making any recommendations on the subject.

(b) Public Meetings.

This Order has been prepared and approved. It is being published as General Order No. 55 and is now in the hands of the printers.

(c) Measures and Publications.

Reference is made to this R. letter 200/29/0A of 4 April 1944. The suggested Decree has been drafted and approved but is under discussion with the Italian Government. It is hoped that it will be finally approved before the next meeting of the A.R.E. on 29 May 1944.

SUBJECT: Region III Order on Public Meetings.

TO : Dep. Executive Commissioner.

1. This order has twice been referred to Col. Upjohn for comment. At Folio 16 he objects to the draft chiefly on the grounds that it is unnecessary, but in the last sentence he infers that if this amendment is made he will not object.

2. I phoned Col. Poletti who is willing to accept Chief Legal Officer's amendment. He is particularly keen that the order should be issued because he is continually receiving inquiries from officers in the provinces as to how requests for public meetings should be handled. In his opinion Proclamation No.11 does not cover this.

3. I think that the order should be issued with the amendments recommended by the C.L.O. Do you approve ?

1. In accordance with your letter of 30 March 1944, Ref/129/43/CA, proposed regional Order 33 has been revised. The Questore no longer has discretion as to the holding of meetings. The original order was drafted with the eventual turnover to the Italian Government in mind. It was never proposed that the Questore would have unlimited discretion. An Administrative Instruction would have been issued directing the Questore to clear all such matters with AMG. The original proposal has the merit of bringing the Questore into the picture gradually in preparation for the role they will have to assume after the turnover.
2. The revised order should answer the objections detailed in your letter of 30 March 1944.

Considering the desirability of permitting public meetings within the Province of Avellino and within parts of the Provinces of Naples and Benevento, and the need of regulating such meetings:

I, Charles Poletti, Lieutenant Colonel, Regional Commissioner, Region 3, by virtue of power vested in me hereby

O R D E R

Article I.

Right of Public Meeting.

Subject to compliance with the provisions of Article II of this Order, public meetings may be held within the following communes, that is to say -

(a) within the Province of Avellino, every commune;

(b) within the Province of Naples, the communes of Pozzuoli, Marano di Napoli, Villaricca (frazione), Qualiano, Villaricca, Mugnano di Napoli, Melito di Napoli, Sant'Antonio, Cesa, Grumo Nevano, Frattamaggiore, ³¹⁵¹ Frattaminore, Crispiano, Caivano, Acerra, Nola, Roccarainola, and every commune to the south of those communes; and

(c) within the Province of Benevento, the communes of Pennarano, Ceppaloni, San Leucio del Sannio, San Angelo a Cupolo, San Nicola Manfredi, Paduli, Pago Veiano, San Marco dei Cavoti, Reino, Circello, San Croce

del Sannio, Castel Pegano, Castelvetero,
San Bartolomeo in Galdo, and every commune
to the east of those communes.

Article II.

Conditions of Public Meetings.

Section 1. A public meeting shall not be held without a written permit from the Provincial Commissioner of the province in which the meeting is held. An application for a permit to hold a public meeting shall be made by the promoter of the meeting to the Questore of the province in which the meeting is to be held.

Section 2. Where a written permit is granted by the Provincial Commissioner, the public meeting shall not be held otherwise than on the date, and at the time and place, and for the discussion of the subject or subjects mentioned in the permit.

Section 3. Whenever possible every public meeting shall be held indoors. Where a written permit is granted by the Provincial Commissioner for an outdoor meeting, the meeting shall not interfere with any traffic, whether pedestrian or vehicular, passing along or over any road or street open to the public.

Section 4. At a public meeting no person shall do or say anything -

(a) which supports, or encourages any other person to support, any of the ~~enemies~~ ³¹⁵⁰ of any of the United Nations or any of the ideals of the Fascist or Nazi parties;

(b) which leads or may lead to public disorder; or

(c) which causes or may cause, or encourages or may encourage any other person to cause, any

Article III.

Jurisdiction of Courts.

Any person charged with the violation of any of the provisions of this Order may be tried by an Allied Military Court or by an Italian Court having criminal jurisdiction. Every Italian Court having criminal jurisdiction shall have competence and jurisdiction to hear and determine, in accordance with Italian criminal procedure, all cases in which a violation of any of the provisions of this Order is charged and which have been referred to be tried by that Court, but that Court shall not have power to award any punishment greater than it can lawfully award under Italian law.

Article IV.

Penalties.

Any person who is charged with the violation of any of the provisions of this Order shall, upon conviction by an Allied Military Court or an Italian Court having criminal jurisdiction, be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, with or without other lawful punishment, as the Court may determine.

Article V.

Interpretation.

Section 1. In this Order the expression "the promoter" means, where there is more than one ~~promoter~~ of a public meeting, each of those promoters.

Section 2. For the purposes of paragraph (32) of Article II of Proclamation No.2, Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory, dated 25 August 1943, and Section 2 of Article V of Proclamation No.11, Allied Military Government of Occupied Territory, dated 1 September 1943, a public meeting which complies with the provisions of this Order (including the provisions relating to public meetings contained in the before mentioned "Testo Unico" and "Regolamento") shall be

deemed to be a public meeting, demonstration or assembly authorised or permitted by the Allied Military Government.

Section 3. Nothing in this Order shall prejudice or affect the provisions of Section 3 of Article V of the before mentioned Proclamation No. 11

Article VI.

Extent of Order and Effective Date

This Order shall apply to the Province of Avellino and to those parts of the Provinces of Naples and Benevento as are mentioned in Article I of this Order and shall become effective on, from and after April 1944.

To: Executive Commissioner

1. Ref your 291/12/CA dated 26 March 1944, my comments on proposed Regional III Order No. 33 are as follows :-

(i) The C.C.S. directive permits attendance at "meetings of Political committees and such other activities of a similar nature as you may deem to be advisable". Such meetings are, however, all governed by the opening words of the directive, namely, "within your discretion".

The proposed regional order runs directly counter to this directive because the discretion as to the holding of the meetings is to be vested in the questore/ (see Art. II, Sec. 1 and Art. III) and NOT in the Allied Military Government; the real effect of the order is to divest the Allied Military Government of discretion in the matter, nor is it any answer to this to say that a copy of the permit is to be sent to the Provincial Commissioner (Art III, Sec 1), for the person under the order, to exercise the discretion is the questore and not the P.C.

(ii) It is important that the Italians should understand that meetings are held only at the discretion of the Allied Authorities (see Signal on P.37) and this order gives a contrary impression.

(iii) Further the proposed regional order runs counter to existing directives issued by the D.C.C.A.O., A.M.G. on 18 Jan (see para 2 - P.33) and D.C.C.A.O., A.M.G. 15 Army Group on 11 Jan (see para 2 - P.32) which preclude any alteration to the existing proclamation on the subject, i.e., Proclamation No. 11, Art. 5. *3146*

(iv) Furthermore I see no necessity for the proposed order; under Proclamation 11, Art. 5, permits for meetings may be granted and the C.C.S. directive merely indicates that a more liberal policy in granting permits may be adopted; there is no reason whatever to alter the existing machinery.

(v) Finally if it be desired to alter the law as laid down by Proclamation No. 11 this should be done by a proclamation or general order emanating from the Military Governor or at least the Chief Commissioner and not by the order of a Regional Commissioner.

2. I also have a number of criticisms of the proposed order in detail but in view of the above I do not propose to set them out here.

3. For the above reasons I advise that the publication of proposed Regional Order No. 33 be not permitted.

SUBJECT: Political Activities

TO . . . R.C.A.O., Region I
R.C.A.O., Region II

1. The revised policy of the Combined Chiefs of Staff has been communicated by A.F.H.Q. in the following terms (copies of which you have already received):-

(a) "Within your discretion, the Italian people may be permitted to participate in such political activities (other than Fascist) as do not lead to rioting and disorder".

(b) "These will include the right of peaceful assembly, attendance at meetings of political committees, publication and distribution of political works and such other activities of similar nature as you may determine to be advisable."

(c) "Upon their release, political prisoners shall be cautioned that political activity on their part which gives rise to or tends to give rise to rioting or disorder will not be tolerated." 3136

2. Although paragraphs 1 (a) and 1 (b) above call for a substantial modification of policies which have heretofore been observed in the enforcement of the provisions of Section I, Article IV and Section 2, Article V of Proclamation No. 11 those provisions are not abrogated by the terms of the revised policy.

3. Permits for meetings may be granted with more freedom. Discretion to withhold permits still remains with Regions.

4. (a) The following instructions have been received from A.F.H.Q. regarding cases where it is found necessary to withhold permits for political gatherings:

"When important political meetings are banned, short official announcements should be made, giving reasons and the text wired to this Headquarters. This should combat unfavourable comments and propaganda".

(Political Activities - Cont'd.)

(b) Whenever, in the exercise of your authority and discretion action involving the denial of authority for any political meetings has to be taken, you are requested to inform this Headquarters by cable without delay:


- (1) Nature of meeting which will not be authorized.
- (2) Auspices under which it was to be held.
- (3) Date, time and place proposed.
- (4) Brief reasons for prohibition
- (5) Text of official announcement made.

(c) Cables sent in accordance with paragraph b. (b) above will be followed by full report.

5. Publication of Newspapers: A programme of control is being formulated by the Allied Publications Board and a directive on the licensing procedure will be issued shortly.

6. The instruction in paragraph 1. (c) above must be carefully and rigidly observed in all cases of political prisoners released, particularly those who were imprisoned or otherwise detained by the former Fascist Government.
