SUBJECT:- Improper Requisitioning.

The following is an extract from a report received from the Director of Hirings at this HQ :-

"While on my visits of inspection I always make a point of calling on the AMG Officers, Town Majors, etc. to ascertain whether there are any claims or complaints on the part of the civilian population.

Most of them have mentioned the fact that they receive visits from inhabitants who are the bearers of a piece of paper purporting to be a Requisition Receipt Note for goods and which appear to have been signed by members of the British Forces in some fictitious manner, such as "Hollywood Star", "Uncle Sam", "Churchill", "Thank You".

These persons appear to be genuine and to have supplied the goods thinking they were being properly requisitioned, and of course it is prejudicial to the prestige of the Allied Forces that they should have been thus swindled. The Claims officers receive directly similar claims and we also have a fair number of cases where unauthorised Officers have exercised the powers of requisitioning contrary to the rule laid down in GRO 124/44".

There is not record at this HQ of an FGCSM in which anyone has been convicted of this type of fraud; the reason for this presumably is that such cases are rarely worth investigating, and no action is therefore taken to trace and punish offenders.

It is suggested that you should issue instructions to AMG Officers, that when they get a serious case of this nature, in which it appears that enquiry might result in the apprehension of the offenders, they should report all the available facts to the Area etc HQ, in order that any possible investigations may be made. It is being suggested to HQ AAI, and the Claims Commission that similar instructions should be issued to Town Majors and Claims Officers respectively.

It is emphasised that only serious cases should be dealt with in this manner; it would obviously be impracticable to have every complaint of this nature investigated.

1. The Requisition Division is concerned with the procurement of materials and supplies from overseas sources for civilian use and consumption. In executing this program, the following are functions of the Requisition Division:

- a. Requesting regions and subcommissions to submit requisitions for materials and supplies which are essential to the carrying out of the directive or policies established by Combined Chiefs of Staff, the Combined Civil Affairs Committee, the Commanding General, AFHQ, or the Economic Section, ACC.
- b. The reviewing, screening, and editing of civil supply requisitions submitted by regions and subcommissions.
- c. The maintenance of records of civil supplies ordered.
- d. Obtaining shipping data and documents on shipments of civil supplies.
- e. Preparation of shipment reports on civil supplies.
- f. The recording and maintenance of supply data and information on manufacturers' and federal stock specifications, weights and cubages, current availability, supply administration procedure, etc.

Dear Colonel,

My wife Candida TUPINI owns a store for works of art made of porcelain and crystal glass (articles of luxury); the store is located at Piazza in Lucina N° 8 - Rome.

This store has been closed for a year because of lack of personnel.

This morning Capt. LAFFERTY, A.D.O.S., via Botteghe Oscure 46, appeared in my house and claimed that keys to the above store have been delivered to him so that he could ascertain what goods there were in the store.

My wife pointed out that she as the owner has not delivered the keys to anybody and asked Capt. LAFFERTY what he desired.

The Captain answered that he needed several thousand glasses and porcelain plates for a military camp. My wife then pointed out that she was sorry for being unable to comply with his request because as the store carried only articles of luxury there never have been ordinary glasses or plates in the store and there were left only several sets of very fine glasses or plates which are not suitable for military messes.

Captain LAFFERTY was not convinced and insisted on visiting the store to ascertain what in fact it contained.

He then made an appointment for tomorrow morning 0930 at what time he will fetch my wife and proceed with her to the store.

Information is requested as to whether the said Captain has the right to make the above request and furthermore whether he may compel the owner to deliver glasses or plates (articles of luxury) which are part of complete sets.

Please excuse my disturbing you, I am with, etc. etc.

2. As complete instructions on accounting may be issued at any moment (see para.1 of Order) it is considered that a special order by AOC is not necessary at the moment.

TO : R.C.'s Regions IV, V, VIII and IX.
AMG 5 & 8 Armies.

1. It will be appreciated that coal supplies are very largely dependent upon imports, which in turn have to be arranged for at least three months ahead.
2. This affords little difficulty so far as occupied territory is concerned but becomes a major problem when considering territory at present in enemy hands yet which is likely to come under our control in the near future.
3. In order that some provision may be made for territory still in enemy occupation those Regions which are planning to take over such territory should submit as early as possible an estimate of the minimum amount of coal necessary for essential civilian needs bearing in mind damage to plants, difficulties of discharge of ships and inland transportation.
4. For the purpose we enclose a specimen form "C.D.1." which will be completed by Regions as early as possible in the planning stage, and sent to Coal Division ACC. It must be appreciated that without this guiding estimate it is impossible to plan supplies.
5. On occupation being effected it then becomes necessary to review the position and obtain the earliest possible information from AMG 5 or 8 Army on any stocks available.
6. We enclose form "C.D.2" which it is essential to be completed and returned with the least possible delay. This could be completed by one of the A.M.G. officers who is first to enter the newly gained territory and will enable the Coal Division to at once allocate such stocks to the best advantage. Stocks should in all cases be "frozen" immediately on arrival in an area.
7. Likewise it is imperative that Form "C.D.3" - a questionnaire is also completed by the same officer and returned to Coal Division in order to enable them to plan future supplies on a more accurate basis.

3. It is appreciated that certain Regions may not be acquainted with the method of application for coal and coke, and for their guidance, it is essential that the following information accompanies the formal application on ACC Form, M.A.T. 10.

- a. For what industry the coal or coke is required.
- b. A statement that, after examination, in your opinion, the demands are reasonable and necessary for the particular requirement under review.
- c. A detailed statement of the requirement, stating type of plant, daily consumption, and the disposal of the product.
- d. If disposal is to the Military, a confirmation from them as to its Military necessity.

4. Demands will only be considered in this form and with the exception of those for Region II, should be sent to THE COAL DIVISION, A.C.C., H.Q., who will arrange to place the applications before the Coal Section, A.A.I., for them to arrange the release.

5. Those for Region II must be put through the Coal Section at No. 2. District, where arrangements have already been made to satisfy a screened demand.

SUBJECT: Requisitions for Supplies.

TO : Deputy Executive Commissioner

1. Ref. your LND/7.01/1 dated 7 May 44, herewith, comments and suggestions.

2. I consider that a memorandum of the type suggested by you would be extremely valuable. What is required is a guide to all ACC/AMG officers telling them the method of obtaining any supplies that they may need at any time.

3. Apart from the supplies of the Italian Armed Forces, there are three types of supplies which are needed for two classes of people.

- a. ACC/AMG personnel, American or British or Italian personnel working for ACC/AMG.
- b. The Italian population generally.

These stores are:

- a. Regimental T/E or G 1098 stores.
- b. Stores required for, or on ACC/AMG strength but outside the authorised T/E or G 1098 e.g. requisitioned vehicles.
- c. Supplies for essential civilian needs of occupied Italy.

4. In the preamble to the memorandum, these divisions should be clearly defined, and it should be pointed out that (a) and (b) stores are a G-4 responsibility and (c) is an Economic Section or Regional responsibility depending on whether they have to be imported or not. In other words, G-4 is responsible for the needs of personnel of ACC/AMG, both assigned and attached, American, British or Italian and Economic Section is responsible for the supply of the Italian population.

5. The body of the memorandum would, I suggest, be divided into three parts.

- a. Supplies for ACC/AMG personnel both American and British. That is required is not so much a description of the functions of the G-4 Branch, as a description of the type of equipment and supplies concerned, and a directive on how to obtain them through G-4 from American, British or Italian sources. This should cover requisitions, local purchase and indent. Addressees for example, should have similar responsibilities.

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- a. Supplies for ACC/AMG personnel both American and British. ^{that} is required is not so much a description of the functions of the G-4 Branch, as a description of the type of equipment and supplies concerned, and a directive on how to obtain them through G-4 from American, British or Italian sources. This should cover requisitions, local purchase and indent. Addressees for example, should have simply explained to them how to obtain personal equipment, office equipment or repair parts for requisitioned Italian equipment.
- b. Supplies for Italian personnel working for ACC/AMG, whether in the Headquarters, Regions, or Food Warehouses, etc. A brief directive is necessary showing what type of stores can be obtained and in what form they should be demanded from G-4.
- c. Supplies for the essential civilian needs of occupied Italy or for stock piling for territory not yet occupied. This is the responsibility of the Economic Section. My suggestions as to the form this part of the memorandum should take, are being prepared and will be forwarded to you shortly.

- 2 -

6. The three classes mentioned in para 5 above, cover all supplies which ACC/AMG personnel will require apart from the requirements of the Italian Armed Forces as stated above. The three categories in Major Brown's letter do not cover para 5 b, above, or channels for demanding British supplies.

7. The preamble to the memorandum should also clearly define the three types of requisitions. There is first, the local requisition, where goods are requisitioned in Italy e.g., vehicles, buildings, etc. The procedure for such requisitioning is explained in Establishment Memorandum No. 14. The second class of requisition is that prepared when goods are required for the civilian population from overseas sources. The procedure for this type of requisition will be explained in the memorandum to be forwarded to you (see para 5 c, above). Thirdly there is the case where stores are obtained locally from Army sources, e.g. G-4 making an emergency requisition on PBS. There is one point which requires clarification. Establishment Memorandum No. 14, describes the procedure for requisitioning for ACC/AMG "domestic" needs (see para 5 a, and b, above). Where it is necessary to requisition in Italian Government territory for civilian needs (para 5 c) e.g. to requisition goods for an engineering project for which ACC has been made responsible, or for the purpose of amassing the harvest, such requisitioning should be carried out by the Italian Government under the supervision of ACC. ACC cannot requisition for other than its "domestic" needs. Where it is necessary to requisition in Military Government territory, application should be made to the local military commanders (i.e., PBS or District) for them to requisition, as the power of requisition has only been delegated to ACC/AMG for its "domestic" needs. In AMG Army territory, as the AMG officers are part of the Army Staff, any requisitioning can be carried out by the Army concerned.

8. It is important that certain points in para 5 (a) and (b), should be made clear by G-4 e.g., how can repair parts be obtained for requisitioned vehicles or how can rations be obtained for Italian drivers working for ACC when on a journey lasting several days.

1. Reference attached correspondence, I agree that the procedure for obtaining supplies should be clarified.
2. I suggest that it be made clear that
 - a. The Economic Section is responsible for the supply of the essential civilian needs of Occupied Italy.
 - b. G-4 is responsible for the supply of personnel assigned to and working for ACC.
 - c. Navy, Army and Air Forces sub-commissions are responsible for the supply of the Italian Armed Forces.
3. In the two cases mentioned in your letter, case A clearly falls under 2 b. above. Case B falls under 2 c. as the Carabinieri are supplied from Italian Army sources, but if they cannot produce the flashlights, I suggest G-4 try to obtain special authority as the Carabinieri are working for ACC.

1. In addition to many other cases the following are good examples of the need for schooling or instruction on the proper channels of supplies for ACCs:

- a) Office of PRO brought to this office request for a photo enlarger, which is necessary for that department. I passed it on to G-4 ACC. PBS will no doubt take the position that APS must do this type of work and that we will have to get authority from AFHQ.
- b) Ind & Com wants 200 flash lights for use by Carabinieri and took the matter up with G-4 and in the absence of Maj. Scoggins took it up with Maj. Miller, British, who sent him to S-4 2675 Regt. These flashlights are for the Carabinieri doing work for ACC. There are no Carabinieri in 2675 Regt. ACC and therefore such supplies are for G-4 to handle with PBS - who will no doubt bring up the same objection as they have many times before. No authority to issue supplies for use in connection with civilian activities.

2. These are just two of many such cases that indicate that neither the sub-Commissions nor the individual officers have a clear conception of what supplies can be and should be furnished by the Supply Agents.

SUBJECT: Requisitioning of Supplies by ACO/AG

MEMO TO: Lt. Col. "Oscar"

1. This communication is in accordance with the suggestion in para 4 your memo of 22 April 1944.

2. The use of supplies by ACO/AG can be divided into three general classes:

- Ordinary supplies and equipment for the use of military personnel (Americans) in ACO/AG in accordance with Regulation 7/2.
- Supplies for use in projects for civilians (Italian) exclusively.
- Supplies for use in projects for civilians (Italian) but which also affect military operations.

3. The procedure for requisitioning supplies in each class is as follows:

- Requisitions for these supplies entered in para (a) above are submitted by G-4 ACO/AG to Hqs and are drawn by G-4 2675 Post, ACO.
- Requisitions for these supplies entered in para (b) above are submitted to Domestic Section ACO/AG and are passed to Ind & Gen Sub-Com for action if available through Local Resources Board AAI (Rear Agneth), if not available through this board they are passed to the Requisitioning Branch of Domestic Committee which screens and submits them to Hqs, AAI, which considers and submits them to Hqs (Dom Branch). G-4, War Department.
- Requisitions for these supplies entered in para (c) above are submitted by G-4 ACO/AG to G-4 Hqs whose action must be guided by para (2a) War O-4, 303- Materiel, to G-4 Materiel, 26 March 44 (copy of which with instructions attached).

4. Post problem arises from the construction placed on the above mentioned para by G-4 Hqs. The question of the emergency, the use of and the replacement of must be decided. If G-4 Hqs turn down the request G-4 ACO/AG appeals to G-4 AAI (Rear Agneth).

5. Experience as LO-AG at AAI (Rear Agneth) has proven that in some cases ACO/AG has submitted requisitions for supplies as emergencies which could have been anticipated far enough in advance to have been sent through regular channels (para (b) above.) In other cases the military necessity was considered too remote.

1. This communication is in accordance with the suggestion in para 4 your memo of 22 April 1944.
2. The use of supplies by ACC/ME can be divided into three general classes:
 - a) Ordinary supplies and equipment for the use of military personnel (American) in ACC/ME in accordance with Regimental T/2.
 - b) Supplies for use in projects for civilians (Italians) exclusively.
 - c) Supplies for use in projects for civilians (Italians) but which also affect military operations.
3. The procedure for requisitioning supplies in each class is as follows:
 - a) Requisitions for those supplies embraced in para (a) above are submitted by G-4 ACC/ME to HHS and are drawn by G-4, 2675 Post, ACC.
 - b) Requisitions for those supplies embraced in para (b) above are submitted to Executive Section ACC/ME and are passed to Ind & Com Div-Com for action if available through Local Resources Board AAI (Rear Area), if not available through this board they are passed to the Requisitioning Branch of Executive Committee which screens and submits them to HHS, AAI which considers and submits them to HHS (Rear Branch). G-4, War Department.
 - c) Requisitions for those supplies embraced in para (c) above are submitted by G-4, ACC/ME to G-4, HHS whose action must be guided by para (2a) for G-4, HHS. HHS, to G-4, HHS, 26 March 44 (copy of which with instructions attached).
4. Most problems arise from the construction placed on the above mentioned para by G-4, HHS. The question of the emergency, the use of and the replacement of must be decided. If G-4, HHS turns down the request G-4, ACC/ME appeals to G-4, AAI (Rear Branch).
5. Experience as LO-ACC at AAI (Rear Branch) has proven that in some cases ACC/ME has submitted requisitions for supplies as emergencies which could have been anticipated far enough in advance to have been sent through regular channels (para (b) above.) In other cases the military necessity was considered too remote.
6. Such cases not only cause friction but indicate inefficiency on the part of the organization submitting the request.
7. It is recommended that all sub-committees and independent committees of ACC/ME be required to acquaint themselves with the procedure for requisitioning any type of supplies and that requirements be anticipated far enough in advance to have them made available through regular channels.

G-4 BRANCH

1. The G-4 Branch is charged with the preparation of policies, and the supervision of execution of arrangements for supply, transportation, and other administrative matters related thereto. It is responsible for advice as to necessary decisions concerning supply and transportation for the Allied Control Commission as a whole. The main task of the G-4 Branch is to ensure adequate and suitable equipment for the commission itself, for the Regions under control of the Commission and in conjunction with the HQ 2675 th Regt. and British Administrative HQ at Tizi-Ouzou, for the initial equipment of newly formed Regions. This will necessitate careful planning, allocation and reallocation of the limited equipment, particularly motor vehicles, to provide for all needs while giving priority to the most urgent requirements.

 - (e) Construction, operation, and maintenance, of utilities and other facilities relating to supply, shelter, transportation, and hospital accommodations.
 - (f) Salvage of ACC equipment and material.
 - (g) Procurement of real estate, shelter, and facilities, including their requisitioning, repair, maintenance, and disposition, in conjunction with local commanders.
3. The compilation of draft TE/G1098a and correspondence concerning them is a responsibility of G-4.
4. The G-4 Branch contains both American and British Officers, who must work in very close cooperation as the supply, equipment and movement plan must be an integrated, inter-allied plan.
5. In all cases G-4 will seek the advice of the Chief Staff Officer of the Section concerned.
6. It is for G-4 to produce plans, including those for movement, and when they are approved, draft the order for issuance by the Adjutant General.

REQUISITIONS FOR CIVIL SUPPLIES FROM AFHQ

1. Until further notice the following procedure will be adopted in regard to requisitions for all Civil Supplies.
2. (a) All demands will be submitted to Industry and Commerce Sub-Commission who will scrutinize, collate and prepare requisitions on AFHQ in the proper form.
(b) Sub-Commissions and Regions will not under any circumstances, send requisitions direct to AFHQ.
(c) All requisitions must be signed by or for the Commanding General, after submission at stated intervals to the Chief of Staff.
3. Demands should cover periods of six months forward and must reach I and C Sub-Commission not later than 31st March and 30th September.
4. (a) The date by which supplies are required will be stated in the demand.
(b) The port to which it is desired that supplies should be sent will be named.
(c) Items in demand will be described in complete detail using recognized G-4 (or Q) descriptions where possible and a statement to justify each item will accompany the demand.
5. Supplementary Requisitions. These will only be submitted in cases of extreme urgency. Demands should reach Industry and Commerce Sub-Commission not later than the 15th day of the month; for the current period not later than 15th December.

Notes:

- A. Only minimum essential requirements will be considered.
- B. Rehabilitation demands will only be considered if they relate to an industry or undertaking the functioning of which is vital to the war effort.
- C. Civil supplies requisitioned from AFHQ take between 3 and 6 months before they reach the port of discharge.
- D. Requisitions for the first six months of 1944 have already been forwarded to A.F.H.Q.

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2. (a) All demands will be submitted to Industry and Commerce Sub-Commission who will scrutinize, collate and prepare requisitions on AFHQ in the proper form.
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- C. Civil supplies requisitioned from AFHQ take between 3 and 6 months before they reach the port of discharge.

SUBJECT: Allied Control Commission Requisitions.

TO : Commanding General, MEDUSA, APO #394, U. S. Army

1. A considerable number of small requisitions, principally for engineering items and medical supplies, have been placed on Peninsular Base Section by the Allied Control Commission, contrary to published instructions.

2. The requisitioning procedure for the ACC, as stated in Appendix 1 to AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 67, requires ACC to submit all requisitions through the Military Government Section, AFHQ, for approval. In the case of requisitions for items urgently needed, this procedure entails a series of cables between all of the Headquarters involved. It is desired to eliminate this procedure, in certain instances, at the discretion of the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, in accordance with the following:

a. The Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, shall be empowered to issue to the Allied Control Commission supplies for which the need of immediate issue is definitely indicated, provided that the issue of such supplies from the Base Section stock will not cause such articles to be in short supply prior to replacement through ACC supply channels.

b. Repayment for supplies borrowed will be effected through normal ACC/LES channels. Requisition submitted covering items issued in accordance with paragraph 2 a. above will contain a statement to the effect that the requisitions are submitted to cover repayment of the Base Section stocks.

3. Concurrence in the above is requested.

I --- DEALING IN STAMPS AND CURRENCY.

Section III, Circular Number 234, this headquarters, 1943, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"1. All members of the armed forces and persons serving with or accompanying such forces are forbidden to offer by advertisement or to engage in the business of dealing in any currency or postage stamps issued by the Allied Military Government or by any other governmental authority within this theater.

2. The foregoing does not apply to the sending of currency, coins and postage stamps in small numbers and denominations, as souvenirs, in private communications."

II -- AWARDS TO UNITS.

Paragraph 6 b, Circular Number 26, this headquarters, cs, is amended by deleting the words "or group" and substituting therefore the words "or similar unit".

III - REQUESTS FOR PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT IN EXCESS OF T/O & E OR T/PA.

Section II, Circular Number 78; Section I, Circular Number 120; and Section I, Circular Number 209, this headquarters, 1943, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. a. All requisitions for personnel not in accordance with appropriate Tables of Organization or Tables of Organization and Equipment will be forwarded through command channels to this headquarters.

b. All requisitions for supplies and equipment not in accordance with appropriate Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances will be forwarded through command channels to this headquarters except requisitions from units assigned to SOS NATCUSA. Authority has been delegated to the Commanding General, SOS NATCUSA to take final action on requests from units assigned to SOS.

2. Each succeeding headquarters must evaluate such requisitions in the light of operational necessity, state definite approval or disapproval, and indicate:

a. Whether the request is to meet a temporary need or is a recommendation for permanent changes in Table of Organization and Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances. When the requirement is of a temporary nature, a brief explanation will be made as to the operational necessity for the additional personnel or equipment including length of period the need will exist. When the requirement is permanent, and a change in Table of Organization and Equipment is recommended, the communication will be in suitable form for forwarding to the War Department.

b. Whether the proposed changes apply to a particular unit because of some special operation or mission, or are equally applicable to all similar units. When proposed changes (temporary or permanent) are to apply to all similar units within the command, each forwarding headquarters will state that the recommendations represent generally agreed, consolidated opinions for all organizations of the same type within that command.

3. The following policy will govern the issuance of supplies and equipment in excess of Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances.

a. Authority has been delegated to Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA to approve for issue supplies and equipment in excess of Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for units assigned to SOS NATOUSA.

b. Requests for supplies and equipment in excess of Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for units other than those assigned to SOS NATOUSA will be forwarded by this headquarters, if deemed advisable, to the Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA for comment as to availability, and, in case of service units, whether the requests are considered justified. (See Section XII, War Department Circular Number 422, dated 29 December 1942, for classification of troops). These requests, with recommendations of Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA, will be returned to this headquarters for final action.

4. a. Authority has been delegated to the Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA to approve and publish provisional Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for provisional units assigned to SOS NATOUSA.

b. This headquarters, if deemed advisable, will forward requests for provisional Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for all other provisional units to the Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA for comment as to availability, and, in case of service units, whether the requests are considered justified. Provisional Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for combat units, with comments as to availability by the Commanding General, SOS, will be returned to this headquarters for final action. Provisional Tables of Equipment or Tables of Basic Allowances for service units, with comments as to availability, and revised in accordance with SOS recommendations as to justification, will be returned, in suitable form for publication, to this headquarters for final action.
