Subject: Visits to Italy - Representative of British and
Foreign Bible Society.

22nd July, 1944.

On receipt of your memorandum G-5 210.482-12 of the 10th July the Political Section established contact with the Reverend G. R. Miegge and asked him to write a report on the present status of the British and Foreign Bible Society's interests. Two copies of this report are enclosed and Dr. Miegge will be grateful if the signed copy can be forwarded to the Secretary of the Society in London.

2. The Reverend G. R. Miegge was also asked whether he thought that a visit by the Reverend Cummings would be useful at present in furthering the work of the Society. You will see from page 3 of his report that Dr. Miegge's views are that, while such a visit would always be welcome, he doubts whether he could furnish the Reverend Cummings with any more information than he has already provided. In these circumstances and in view of the fact that Dr. Miegge's report contains a good deal of detailed information, we would suggest that any decision about a visit by the Reverend H. W. Cummings should be postponed until the Society have had an opportunity to consider the report. Moreover, by that time further consideration will no doubt have been given to the general question whether civilian agencies may be permitted in Italy, since this general question is at present under review.

We agree with para 4 of AM.HQ's letter but before taking any action shall be glad if you will make some enquiries concerning the premises of the Society in Rome at 25 Foro dell'Impero Fascista and the stock of Bibles there. At the same time please ascertain if an Italian named MINCHI, who was left in charge, is still there and looking after things. Please forward a report as soon as possible and say if you consider it essential that the Rev. H.W. Cassin should visit Rome now.

SUBJECT: Rev. H. W. Cummin, M.B.E. (Br.)

TO : Allied Control Commission, Rome ✓

1. The above-named is director of the British and Foreign Bible Society's North African Branch at Algiers.

2. The activity of the Society is to distribute copies of the Holy Bible. They had a depot at Fors Dell' Impero Fascista, 25, containing a stock of Bibles. Before the war this was in the charge of Rev. W. H. Rainey, who is now in Australia. When he left, an Italian named Miegge was left in charge.

3. Rev. Cummin is applying for permission to visit Rome in order to discover how the Society's property and activities have been affected by the War, and to determine whether Miegge is a suitable person to resume charge.

4. We are opposed on principle to allowing individuals to visit Italy for purposes such as this, which are not directly concerned with the war effort; but the British and Foreign Bible Society states that they have a seat on a Council composed of representatives of the Y.M.C.A., the Salvation Army and other humanitarian bodies already active in Rome and that they consider that "the primary need is spiritual restoration".

5. Will you please advise whether you are prepared to support an objection to Rev. Cummin's visit. If not, we propose to authorize the journey.

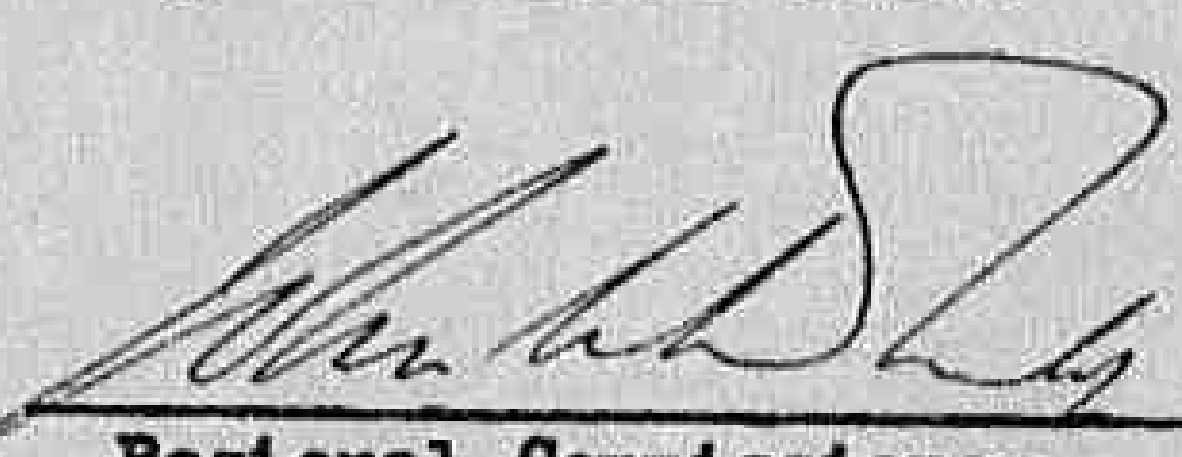

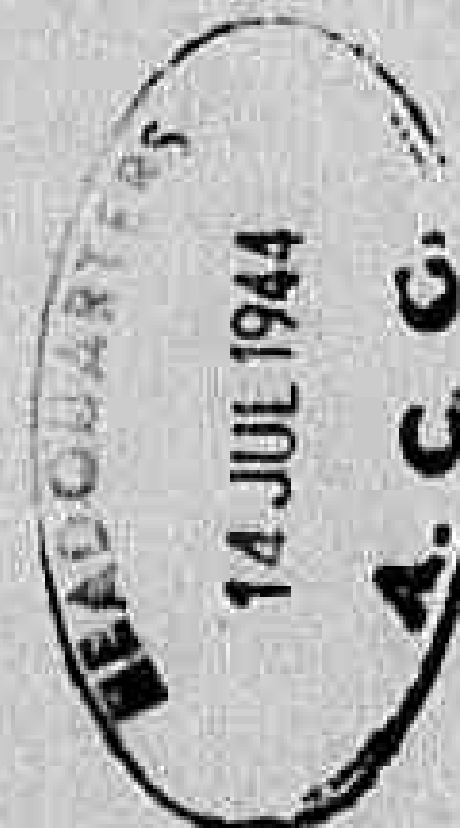

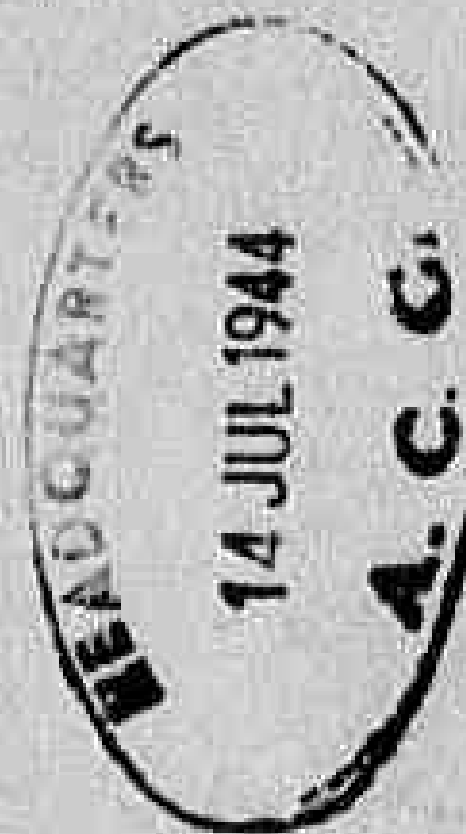

3. That part of 751/7/CA of 7 June 1944 relating to Italian officials is cancelled. Members of the Italian Government now have permanent passes. Italian officials may be granted passes to travel to Rome by the Secretary General at Naples or Salerno, without reference to the Security Branch, provided assent is given by the Head of the relevant Section or Independent Sub-Commission.

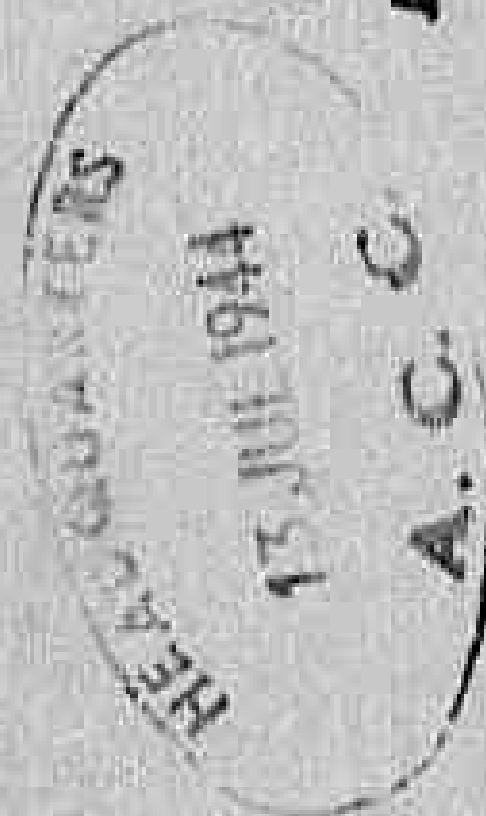

The bearer of this letter is Major Gordon, *RAF*
R.A.M.C., of 45 General Hospital. He has a few
days' leave and hopes to reach Rome. His ambition
is the re-establishment in Italy of the Boy Scout
movement, and his immediate desire - on arrival in
Rome - is an audience with the Pope. His errand
is, therefore, a Christian one, his motive in our
interest and I feel he should be encouraged.

Boy Scout training will teach the children
obedience - which they sadly lack - and counter the
evils of the Ballila. In Taranto, children have
had a difficult time, what with the requisitioning
of schools, small pox control, and the usual
military restrictions which drove the children to
the streets exposing them to the local brand of
Communism with its atheistic teachings. I shall
be grateful if you will give Major Gordon any
advice and help in his humane mission.

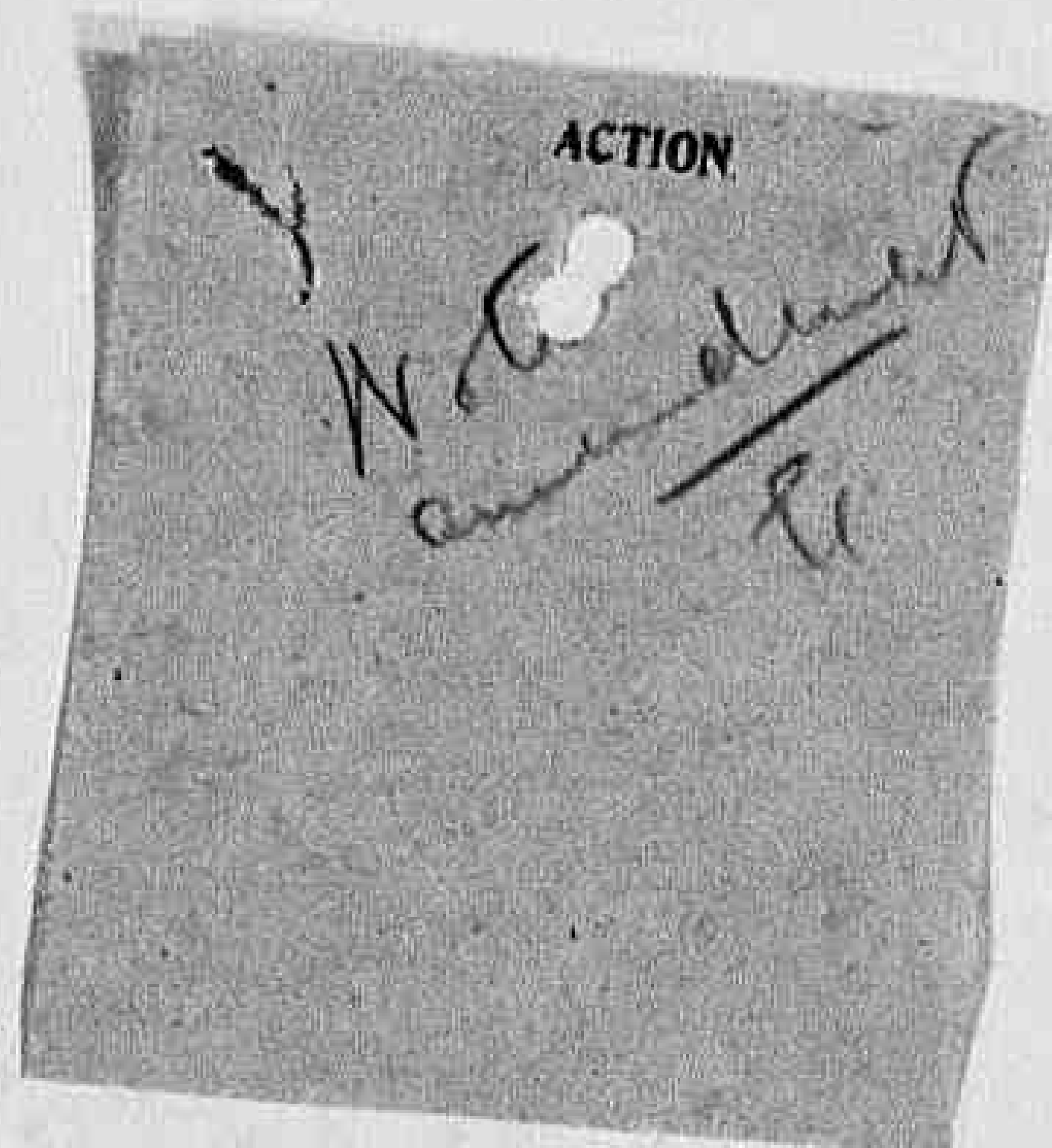

1. Reference Col. Chapman's request at 28. I knew of the slackness about these passes some time ago and rang up Major Talbot who promised that he would get in touch with Col. Pollock to tighten up at ~~low~~ end. The difficulty is stated to be shortage of Carabinieri, but I still think that control posts on one or two of the main roads into the city should not be impossible to arrange. Col. Chapman in any case has taken the bull by the horns here and arranged for two Region III control posts on the Garigliano River on Routes 6 and 7.

2. As regards Italian officials the only two whose passes were refused were those who wished to go to Rome for private reasons. Security Branch rightly rejected these because Phase III has not yet been declared. Col. Chapman has been told this and is quite satisfied.

1. I would like to bring to your attention the anomalous position which exists at the present moment in the above connection.

2. It is a fact that, in spite of the so-called prohibition which is supposed to exist in connection with passes to Rome, the order is being flaunted, and, that whomever wills, proceeds to Rome and returns regardless of any pass or permit.

3. Reputable Italian Officials who have reason to proceed to Rome, and make their applications in a proper manner, have these applications refused by A.C.C. in spite of a recommendation given by this Headquarters after due consideration. This means that individuals who honestly try to keep within the law suffer, whereas those who disregard it move backward and forward freely.

4. It is submitted that, where a recommendation for a pass to Rome is put forward by this Headquarters, the application has received due consideration, and that in no case, more particularly where a senior Italian Official is concerned, should such an application, duly forwarded with a recommendation from this office, be rejected.

With reference to our previous correspondence, I welcome the occasion to communicate to you that now after the liberation of Rome, there is urgent need for me to go to that city to place myself, as soon as possible, in direct contact with the plenipotentiary Swedish Minister, with whom I have had no communication since August 1943.

Aware of the difficulty which still exists in regard to the release of special permits for such trip, I permit myself to appeal to you with the hope that you will kindly support my request which I shall present on the 15th of the current month to the appropriate Allied Authorities.

I will make the trip by automobile together with Mr. Umberto Murra, Chancellor of the Royal Consulate of Sweden and the driver, Mr. Francesco Bettare. I think that it will be necessary to remain in Rome for two or three days. I point out that I, as well as the other two gentlemen, have relatives in Rome to whom we could go for lodging.

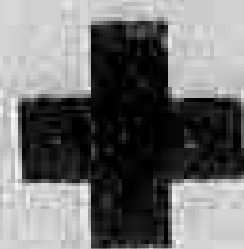

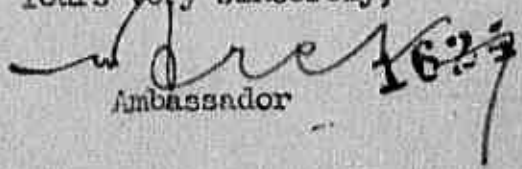

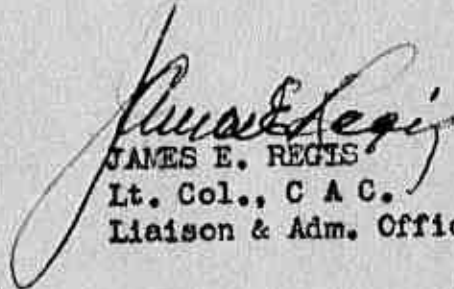

As you might well know I have been Ambassador of Greece in Rome until the day of the Italian aggression against my country, when I was obliged to leave the Italian capital under the most inconvenient conditions having abandoned there all my furniture and other movable property.

I would like therefore to go to Rome for two or three days so that I might take care of my belongings. But, as on the other hand the Doctors advised me, in consequence of the typhus of which I lately suffered, to travel on about the 20th inst., I will have to go to Rome latest in the course of next week.

I would be grateful to you if you explained to the competent Authorities the exceptional circumstances of my case and kindly ask a permission for me and my driver to enter Rome and stay there for two or three days.

Please note that no question of accommodation will arise, as I intend to dwell in the building of the Greek Legation.

SUBJECT: Orders for Rome, Requested for.

TO : Security Branch, R.C. and M.G. Section.

1. In order to get fishing activities going immediately from the Gulf of Gaeta to Rome to provide additional food for that area, it is requested that Lieutenant Commander R. C. F. Malieri, USOGR, (no serial number) Chief of the Fisheries Division of this Sub-Commission be issued orders to effect this necessary travel.

2. He is to survey fishing conditions at Gaeta, Terracina, Anzio, Civitavecchia and San Paella. The latter place is a short distance from Rome, less than five kilometers.

3. It is requested that Commander Malieri be given orders to enter Rome to interview fishing interests, the various cooperatives, and fish merchants and also to find out the condition of the fish market. If desired a quantity of fish can be exported to Rome proper from Calabria if truck transportation is made available.

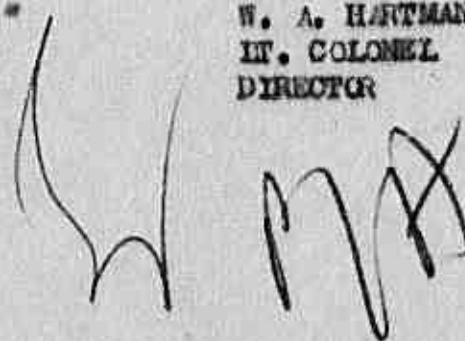
4. It is further requested that orders be issued to Capitano Nicola Fusco, IRN, Chief of the Fisheries Section of the Ministry of Agriculture. Capt. Fusco, who prior to the war was connected with the Ministry of Agriculture in Rome, knows the area inch by inch and the survey can be effected immediately.

5. This Sub-Commission certifies that the issuance of these orders is essential. Reports have reached here that a large percentage of the fishing craft have been sunk and net equipment has been damaged. There is a quantity of hemp available immediately to effect the repairs. In addition unless local conditions are known at the various fishing villages recommendations to resume fishing cannot be made effectively to Naval authorities.

6. It is requested that the orders be issued for Comdr. Malieri and Capt. Fusco so as to leave Naples 8 June and return to Naples by 15 June or earlier.
