MEMORANDUM.

Alessi Roberto son of Giovanni, Lawyer and Accountant, born at Civitavecchia on November 13, 1883, resident in Rome - Via Gioacchino Belli, 27, married with Zanchini Adelaide daughter of Giuseppe, having two sons: Renato - Doctor in Law, Navy Lieutenant of the Reserve, and Ruggero - a University student in medicine, 5th year.

He entered the Provincial Administration of the Interior in 1902 and in 1907 was transferred to the Central Administration, remaining there up to 1919 when he resigned, whereupon he got praises and honours.

Always due to his merit and also following examination, he attained the rank of First Accountant? but from 1913 to 1915 he was manager of the Explosives Office with the General Management of the Public Safety, he being the Purveyor of the Laboratory for Explosives. He acted as Secretary of the Advisory Committee for explosives. By R.D. he was appointed Secretary of the Committee for the setting up of depots of liquid ~~fuel~~ and inflammable fuel in Ports and in the Maritime State property. By another Law he was appointed Secretary of the Committee for the reform of the Law on the military obligations. He was Secretary of the Committee for the organization of fire-control services in the Communes.

During the previous war, although he was declared ^{unfit} ~~undisposabile~~ for military service, he applied for being called to arms and owing to his experience, he was enlisted with the rank of Lieutenant of Artillery, detailed to the Technical Service, later on, with the rank of Captain he was Secretary of the Lt.Gen. Supervisor of Artillery Constructions; later on, he was transferred to the Ministry for Arms and Ammunition, where he was Secretary of the Lt.Gen. General Manager of the Supply Service of War material.

For acts of gallantry he was solemnly praised and was proposed for the ~~Brave~~ ^{Golden} Medal.

From 1920 he ^{has been} ~~is~~ a lawyer in Rome, enjoying great consideration in Magistracy and Lawyers centres. He is a Supreme Court Lawyer, and he specializes in civil, commercial, administrative and financial matters. He is adviser of Public and Private Bodies.

He is inscribed in the Register of the Syndicate of Lawyers and Procurators of Rome, as well as in the Accountants Register, and also in the Register of practitioners in Economics and Commercial matters of Latium; in the register of Commercial Experts, and in the register of Medium Teachers.

He is known, esteemed and well thought of by all the citizenry of Civitavecchia, city in which he had his Studio in Piazza Vittorio Emanuele No. 26.

Entrato nell'Amministrazione Provinciale dell'Interno nel 1902, passato nel 1907 in quella Centrale, vi appartenne sino al 1919 in cui presentò le dimissioni, ricevendone lodi ed onorificenze.

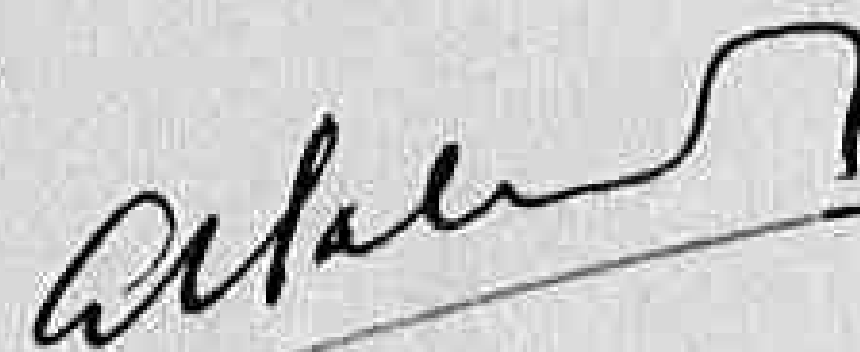

SUBJECT: Rome Services Administration

TO: Chief Commissioner

1. Ref attached letter from the Ministry of Industry Commerce and Labour, the Ministers requests have been discussed with interested Sub-Commissions. The Economic Section is in accord with the general principles involved in the Ministers recommendations.

2. It is specifically recommended that the Italian Government be requested to submit to this Headquarters, names of suggested Commissioners for list A, who, if approved, will be appointed by ACC. Such Commissioners should be civil servants or persons holding technical qualifications. It is important that no appointments of a political nature be made.

3. Reference organizations covered by list B (to which should be added "Contributi Agricoli Unificati", the office of Unified Agricultural Contributions for Social Insurance) and by list C, it is recommended that they be continued as at present operating.

Subject ; Rome services organization -

This Ministry, in view of the coming liberation of Rome, believes it advisable to point out to your Commission the following :

A) That the problem regarding the eventual dissolving of the syndical organizations and the conservation of their movable and real estate properties be examined.

It is presumed that it is the intention of the Allied Military Government to provide for the dissolving of the above mentioned organizations existing in the Capital; therefore this Ministry, to avoid the ruinous consequences deriving from a provision calling for the immediate suppression of the above organizations, points out to your Commission the advisability that for each Confederation, a Commissioner be appointed who would promptly provide for:

(a) the immediate replacement of all the Directors of the depending organizations (national federations and provincial unions) with elements chosen in accordance with the Allied Military Government of proven anti-fascist faith and especially competent in syndical problems, possibly selected among persons who already interested themselves in these problems with the free organizations existing before the fascist regime.

(b) supervision and conservation of the movable property and real estate of the individual agencies;

(c) the gradual demobilization of the personnel beginning with the immediate dismissal of employees politically compromised.

The above measures appear to be indispensable because the agencies are important national organizations which have in Rome considerable properties and spacious offices, the value of which is the only guarantee for the liquidation of the payments due not only to the personnel of the central office, but also to the personnel employed in branch offices which have already been dissolved or are still functioning in occupied Italy, a personnel which totally numbers several tens of thousands of functionaries and employees.

The syndical organizations for which a Commissioner should be appointed are :

- fascist confederation of the agriculturists
- fascist confederation of the industrialists
- fascist confederation of the credit and insurance agencies
- fascist confederation of the agricultural workers
- fascist confederation of the industrial workers
- fascist confederation of the commercial workers
- fascist confederation of the credit and insurance agencies employees
- fascist confederation of the professionals and artists
- fascist confederation of the dealers

We take this opportunity to point out to your Commission the necessity that

no measure be taken with regard to agencies and institutes at the dependencies of this Ministry and with exclusively assistance and economic character, as for instance the undermentioned, in regard to which the Allied authorities have already ascertained and recognised their exclusively technical, assistance or economic function, not at all a function of fascist politics:

 - National Propaganda Institute for the prevention of accidents
 - National Institute for the relief of employees of para-statal agencies
 - National Institute for the relief of Statal employees

- Ente Italian Sulphurs -Rome
 - Italian metallic minerals Co. -Via Molise 11, Rome.
 - Italian coals Co. -Via Lucullo 14, Rome
 - National Ente for the wood pulp and paper
 - Silk National Ente
 - Italian Cotton Institute
 - Italian lignite coals Co -Via Lucullo 14, Rome.
 - Italian Petroleum general Co. -Via Marconi 40, Rome.
 - Iron minerals Research - Via Regina Elena - Rome.
 - Iron mines - Via Regina Elena - Rome.
 - National Institute canned food -Corso Vittorio Emanuele -Rome.
 - Iron Industries - Via Regina Elena -Rome.

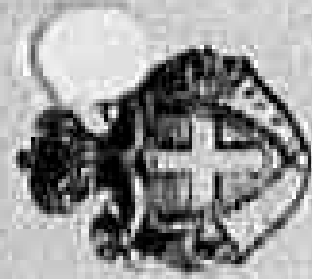

To : Interior Subcommittee,
H.Q., A.C.C.

1. A preliminary reconnaissance today showed the Prefettura in Rome to be intact - as, indeed, is virtually the entire city.
2. The late Prefect had disappeared and his place assumed by a Prefect appointed to the post by Badoglio at the time of the fall of Mussolini. ~~He~~ has apparently been in retirement since the Italian armistice. His name is Francesco di Suni della Planargia, Prefetto del Regno.
3. There were numerous flunkys and "white-cellar" workers in the Prefettura, but the senior staff were apparently out on the streets giving welcome, or resting at home. A meeting of all the heads of services is being held by Lt. Col. de Garsten today, after which I shall let you have his report.
4. Di Suni, on first impression, appears a weak and uneffectual man. You may also find on enquiry that the Italian Government have an alternative to recommend. In any case di Suni is being allowed to carry on for the time being.
5. A further communication on the government of Rome Province will be sent to you shortly: this is merely to say that it does not look at present as though the team you had been requested to prepare will be required.
6. They might be useful, however, for Viterbe Province.

INTERIOR SUB-COMMISSION

As soon as the Capital is liberated it would be advisable if a limited number of trustworthy officials who have a full knowledge of men and of the services would be sent to Rome.

They would do so to cooperate with the Allied Authorities who are scheduled to take part in the administration of the Capital, and also to establish liaison between this Ministry and the Ministerial Offices which will be in the Capital; finally to reorganize the officials remaining in Rome and prevent infiltration of elements of contrary political connections.

The above particularly interests this Ministry because of its importance to the welfare of the Nation and of the Capital in particular, and due to the political character of the services that the Ministries supervises.

I wish therefore you to examine this proposal with particular attention, in view of our common interest in seeing a rapid and perfect reorganization of the services.
