1. The instructions in this Branch letter 1904/9/G(SD1) dated 25 Jul 44 are cancelled.

2. The functions of air formation Headquarters in this theatre are as follows:-

(a) DAF are responsible for air operations on the front of Fifth and Eighth Armies. All administrative matters for the units under their control, which are the concern of or affect Fifth or Eighth Armies, are dealt with direct between DAF (Rear) and the Army concerned.

(b) HQ MATAF controls DAF operationally but has no administrative link with DAF except on matters of major policy.

(c) HQ TAF (ITALY) is a branch of MATAF established to fulfil the function of MATAF so far as operations in ITALY are concerned.

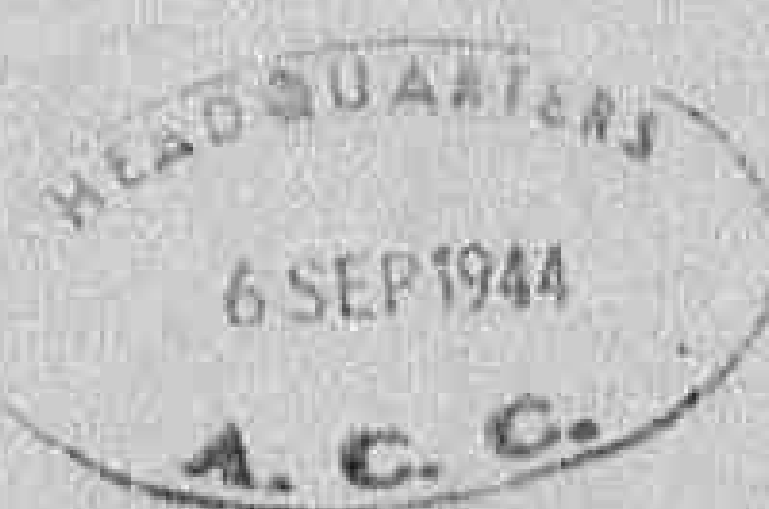
3. The following channels of communication will accordingly be used:-

SUBJECT: Correspondence.

TO : Secretary General

1. Reference your memorandum dated 20 JUL 44, the question of an amendment to para 7 a. of Establishment Memorandum No. 2, has been discussed with the Administrative Section, who have agreed with this Section in the following suggested amendment.

- a. The Director of a Sub-Commission may correspond direct with the head of the corresponding division in Regions or AMG Armies or with technical branches of military formations but only on technical subjects and on routine matters affecting his Sub-Commission. All other correspondence to Regions or AMGs will be carried out through the R.C. & M.G. Section. All correspondence from Regions or Army AMGs will be addressed to HQ ACC.

2. Economic and Administrative Sections recommend that the Message Centre be instructed that correspondence from Regions or Army AMGs on technical subjects or routine matters affecting Sub-Commissions will be sent to either Administrative or Economic Section as may be appropriate, and on other matters to R.C. & M.G. Section. It should be explained that a technical subject is any matter within the sphere allotted to a Sub-Commission.

This letter from Col. Chapman is sound in principle but based on two incidents rather small and comparatively unimportant in themselves.

2. The first one (para 3 and folio B refer) was a clerical oversight on Col. Legg's part. Col. Legg rang me up for the permission to take this action, which was urgent, and I cleared it with Lt Col White of Reg 4 in RC's absence.

3. The second point (para 2 and folio 12 refer) is also a technical one. The document should have gone out on the signature of Ex. Comm: instead of 94. The principle of whether Hq should order vehicles away from one Region to another is a separate point: the right of doing so undoubtedly exists.

4. Col. Chapman is in the hotel tonight before leaving for Naples tomorrow, and you might wish to discuss it with him.

SUBJECT: Orders.

TO : Executive Commissioner, Hq A.C.C.

1. Within the past two days there have been brought to my attention two so-called orders issued by staff officers of Hq. A.C.C. Neither of the orders purported to have been issued either by your authority or by that of the Chief Commissioner and each of them attempted to dispose of matters within the control of the Regional Commissioner. In both cases copies were not sent to the Regional Commissioner and information was obtained only through gossip.

2. In the matter of the purported order issued by G-4 - this is a matter which I discussed with you ten days ago and you assured me that motor vehicles requisitioned in Region III for the use of Region III would not be taken from Region III. At that time I told you that certain cars had already been taken out of the Region, including the Regional Commissioner's car. I was assured that these cars would be ordered returned. None of them has been returned.

3. In the matter of the purported order signed by Colonel Legge - on the face of it, it appears that copies went to everyone except to the Regional Commissioner of Region III, who was chiefly concerned about at least two phases of the matter.

4. I understand that Military Government is a military operation being performed by a military establishment under military regulations. I also understand that the Regional Commissioner is the commanding officer of his Region, that his immediate superior is the Executive Commissioner and that the next higher command is the Chief Commissioner. I am informed that that is the chain of command. During the past twenty-six years in which I have been connected with military establishments I have been educated and trained to the idea that a staff officer has no powers of command and can issue orders only in the name of his commanding officer. In the past nine months of connection with this operation it has been somewhat disconcerting to me to observe the tendency to ignore the fundamental principles of staff functioning, of chain of command and of channels of communication. Now I am intimately and personally concerned and I view the situation with some consternation.

5. I am responsible for the conduct of operations and for the protection of my organization and of my Region, and yet I discover that orders are issued to my subordinates direct and of which I have no knowledge. May I request that orders emanating from your headquarters affecting my Region and directed to the attention of a particular section or officer be sent in duplicate so that, at least, a copy can be laid on my desk?

SUBJECT: Channels of Communication.

TO : Admin. Section.

1. In reply to your 3/IB/AS of 3 July 1944, I am in complete agreement in principle that too many letters on routine and technical matters are sent to this Section unnecessarily and I will write to AMG Eighth Army to try and clear the matter up.
2. The specific cases here mentioned could all have been settled by a small amendment to the old Executive Memorandum no. 2, now issued as Establishment Memorandum No.1. As the whole subject is under consideration at a meeting shortly to be held by representatives of the three Sections and presided over by Col. Denmore, I shall not refer further to it now.
3. (a) With regard to the points in your para.2, the following observations are made :

Encl. A: No issue vouchers were received in this Office. Your comments agreed.

Encl. B: Comments agreed, but it is considered that in this case the original should have been sent to Public Health Sub-Commission with a copy to R.C. & M.C. Section for information.

Encl. C: Enclosures not received in this Office; comments agreed.

Encl. D: This matter was dealt with by this <sup>Section</sup> ~~Branch~~ who passed it to P.R.O. in their capacity as liaison between A.C.C. and A.P.B.

Encl. E: This matter was brought to the attention of this Section by your Legal Sub-Commission in their AGC/4083/1/L of 29 May 1944. This Branch then raised the matter with Eighth Army who replied that the action taken was correct. Your Public Health Sub-Commission was never concerned and the misunderstanding would not have arisen if our original query to Eighth Army had been copied to you for Legal Sub-Commission's information.

(b) I will endeavour to trace in the Message Centre here where the missing enclosures have got to but it is possible that they may have been sent direct to your Public Health Sub-Commission.

4. For the meantime until the Committee I referred to above has met and discussed these issues I will take steps to ensure that in future cases of correspondence of this sort the action copy, together with all enclosures, is forwarded to the Sub-Commission concerned direct.

5. Your enclosures are returned herewith as requested.

1. Ref your ACC /71-4/FOOD dated 28 Jun 44.
2. The necessity for strict economy in the use of sacks is fully appreciated by this HQ.
3. As the area for which this HQ is responsible is constantly changing, it is the practice to issue supplies direct to the PCs of the areas occupied by means of Transfer Vouchers on which the number and size of sacks, if any, is noted.
4. Under present operational conditions, each Province is administered by this HQ only for a few weeks and it is impossible to control a sack account. If this were attempted, it would mean, in practice, that empty sacks were being collected in say MILAN and handed in on account of full ones issued to CAMPOBASSO.
5. All LOs, CAOs, communal officials, etc., have been warned of the gravity of the sack position and every care will be taken to see that these containers are properly conserved. It is regretted, however, that, under present circumstances, this HQ cannot control the return of sacks.
6. In the event of our entering any area in which we find sacks available and surplus to absolute local requirements, we will arrange for the acquisition of these and the immediate shipment to the nearest ACC depot.

"Cots for Hospitals".

2. Areas recently occupied by Eighth Army appear to have sufficient  
beds for immediate needs. This observation plus the fact that jurisdic-  
tion of territory is now being rapidly transferred to Regions suggests  
that Regional Public Health Officers after they have had an opportunity  
to study the civil hospital needs in their area should submit require-  
ments for cots.

3. The DDMS Eighth Army has consigned to AMG Medical Section Eighth  
Army 700 hospital beds abandoned by Germans in Anagni. These beds have  
been left in Anagni in the care of Regional Public Health Officer AMG  
Region IV with the mutual verbal agreement that these beds will be avail-  
able to AMG Eighth Army upon demand.

1. Ref letter 325/10/CA of 1 Jun 44, received through Region V, this matter has now been investigated.
2. It is true that on or about 15 Mar 44, a FS Sgt of 5 Corps made the arrangements mentioned in PIZZOPERRATO.
3. At that time the place was in 'no man's land' and frequently visited by enemy patrols.
4. Communication with the commune was only possible on foot, from VILLA SANTA MARIA, involving a four-hour journey.
5. FS personnel were taking up ammunition for certain Italian individuals in the village.
6. The road to VILLA SANTA MARIA had not then been opened and the CAO of the area was located at COLLEDIMEZZO.
7. The FS personnel were asked by the CAO to carry out the arrangements mentioned, and in the difficult and unusual circumstances prevailing his action is fully approved.
8. It was possible to put into VILLA SANTA MARIA early in April a CAO who visited PIZZOPERRATO and other communes, although the same difficulties in the matter of communication existed.
