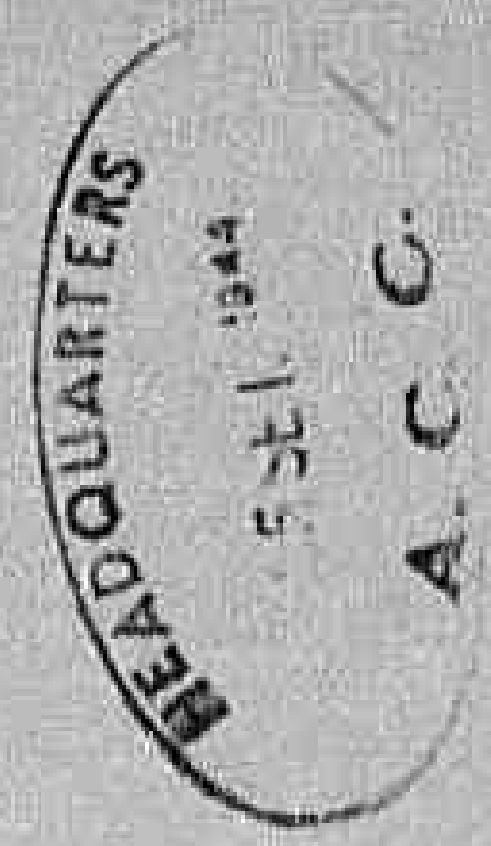

R. C. Memo No. 1 (Amended)

ORGANISATION AND POLICY

1. Tasks of ACC, Southern Region

First Priority To protect the interest and to satisfy the needs of the Allied Forces in the Region and to ensure that the Italian people do not do anything detrimental to the prosecution of the War.

Second Priority To hand back to the Italian Authorities all purely civilian administrative work at present being done by A.C.C. when this can be done without prejudice to the First Priority task, so that the number of A.C.C. officers in the Region can be further reduced without damage to the Allied interests as soon as possible. The Regional Commissioner's target is a reduction in essential staff to 50% in six weeks.

Third Priority To give every possible assistance to the Italian Authorities in their administrative work, so that the administration is as honest, efficient and expeditious as possible. To lend A.C.C. authority to civil officials when this is desirable, to put A.C.C. punch behind their work and to exercise firm A.C.C. control whenever it is necessary to ensure the above tasks are carried out.

2. Powers of A.C.C. in Italian Government Territory.

Officers of the Commission in the Region are reminded that they are there not as governors but to advise the Italian Government. One of their most important functions will be liaison between Allied Military Formations in the Area and the Italian Administrative officials. Action must be restricted to advice. Only in the gravest emergency and if the interests of Allied Forces are in immediate jeopardy should they take executive action. If possible reference should be made to this HQ., before such action is taken: if this is possible a full report should be furnished at once.

In round figures (exact figures are not yet available in some cases) the constitution of Southern Region will be as follows:

Dear *Brigadier,*

Many thanks for your D.O. letter 803/5/CA, dated 1 September 1944.

I have issued an amended R.C.Memo No.1 in which your paragraph 2 takes the place of the old one.

I thoroughly agree that my original paragraph 2 went altogether too far. The strong wording, however, was intentional and not an oversight. It was intended to correct a slight inclination to "defeatism" by some ACC officers who were inclined to adopt the view that in Italian governed Italy ACC officers were more or less powerless. My own experience is quite contrary. Any officer with a little personality should be quite competent to "advise" Civil Authorities in such a manner that Allied interests in the war effort are fully protected. Not only are Civil Authorities in most cases willing to ^{accept} ~~accept~~ such advice, but they are anxious to have it expressed in writing as an alibi to political critics.

I ~~did~~ not like officers in this Region informing local, military authorities that they were more or less powerless - hence the paragraph 2 which I now see was perhaps ill-advised on other grounds.

Thank you for putting me right.

Only in the gravest emergency and if the interests of Allied Forces are in immediate jeopardy should they take executive action. If possible reference should be made to this HQ. before such action is taken: if this is impossible a full report should be furnished at once."

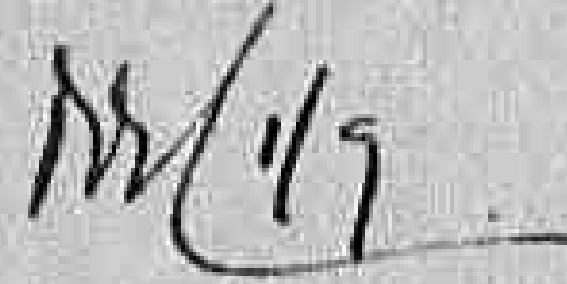

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region

1. I refer to para 2 of your Memo No. 1 on Organisation and Policy as mentioned above and consider this para of the directive lays the stress on the wrong note i.e., emergency. I would suggest that a paragraph something on the lines I give you below should be substituted for it. I think you will find that it covers the point raised by you but puts the stress on the fact that officers are primarily advisory and not executive.

NEW PARA 2.

2. Officers of the Commission in the Region are reminded that they are there not as governors but to advise the Italian Government. One of their most important functions will be liaison between Allied Military Formations in the Area and the Italian Administrative officials. Officers are not there in an executive capacity except in the gravest emergencies, when if the interests of the Allied Forces are in jeopardy they may take executive action. They should, however, whenever possible refer to HQ before taking such action. When any action on these lines is taken without prior reference it is most important that such action be immediately reported to Regional HQ.

Action must be restricted to advice.
Only in the gravest emergency and if the interests
of Allied Forces are in jeopardy should they take
executive action. If possible reference should be
made to this HQ before such action is taken: if
this is impossible a full report should be furnished
at once.

1. Tasks of ACC, Southern Region

First Priority To protect the interest and to satisfy the needs of the Allied Forces in the Region and to ensure that the Italian people do not do anything detrimental to the prosecution of the War.

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2. Powers of A.C.C. in Italian Government Territory

Officers of the Commission in the Region are reminded that in an emergency they have the right to take any measures which are necessary for the protection of the Allied Forces or for the prosecution of the war. In important matters, Regional H.Q. should be consulted whenever possible, but when this is not possible they may act. In such circumstances they have full powers of arrest, of requisition and of control of essential commodities and the right to give orders to civilian authorities. The exercise of these powers must, of course, be immediately reported to Regional H.Q.

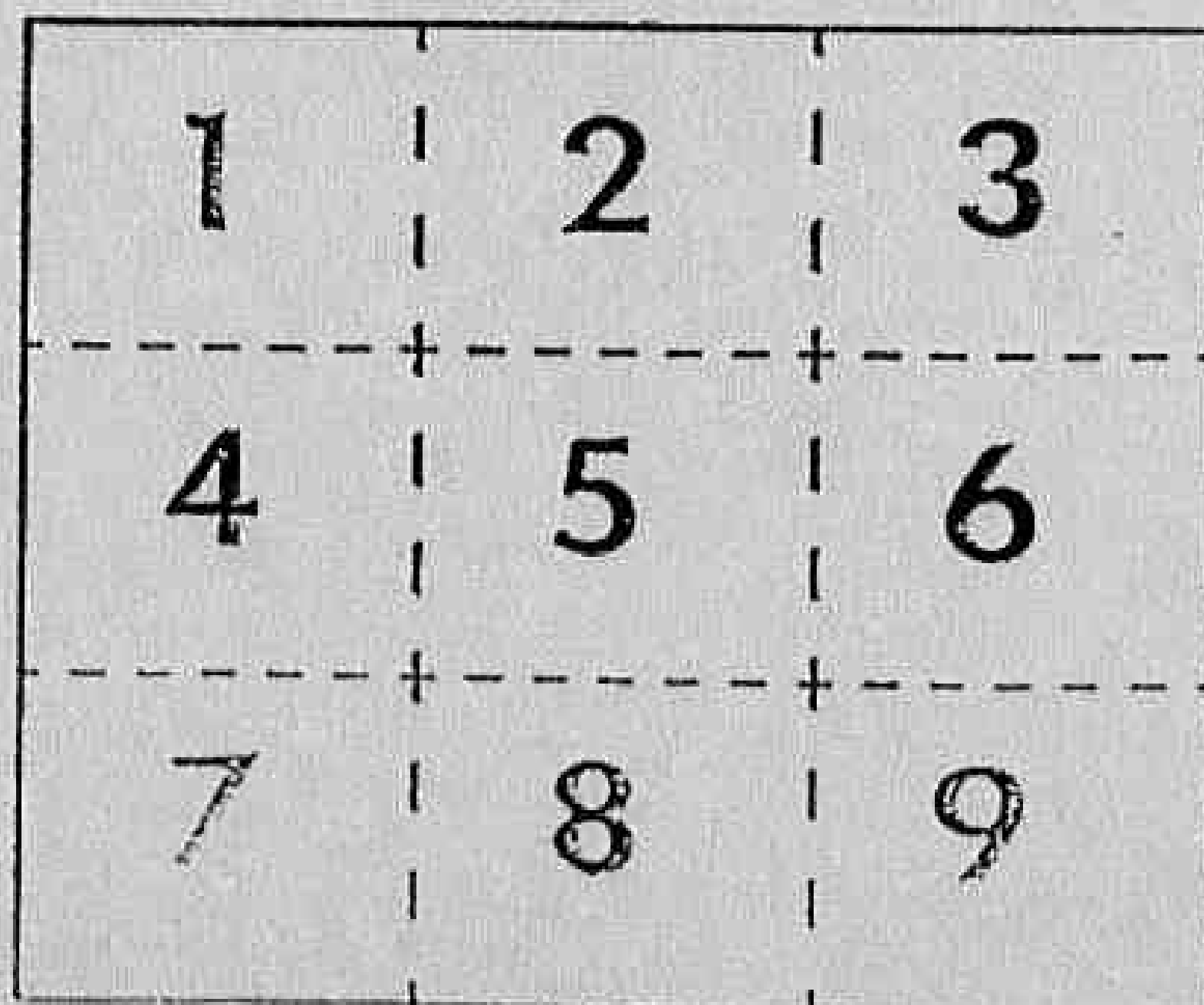
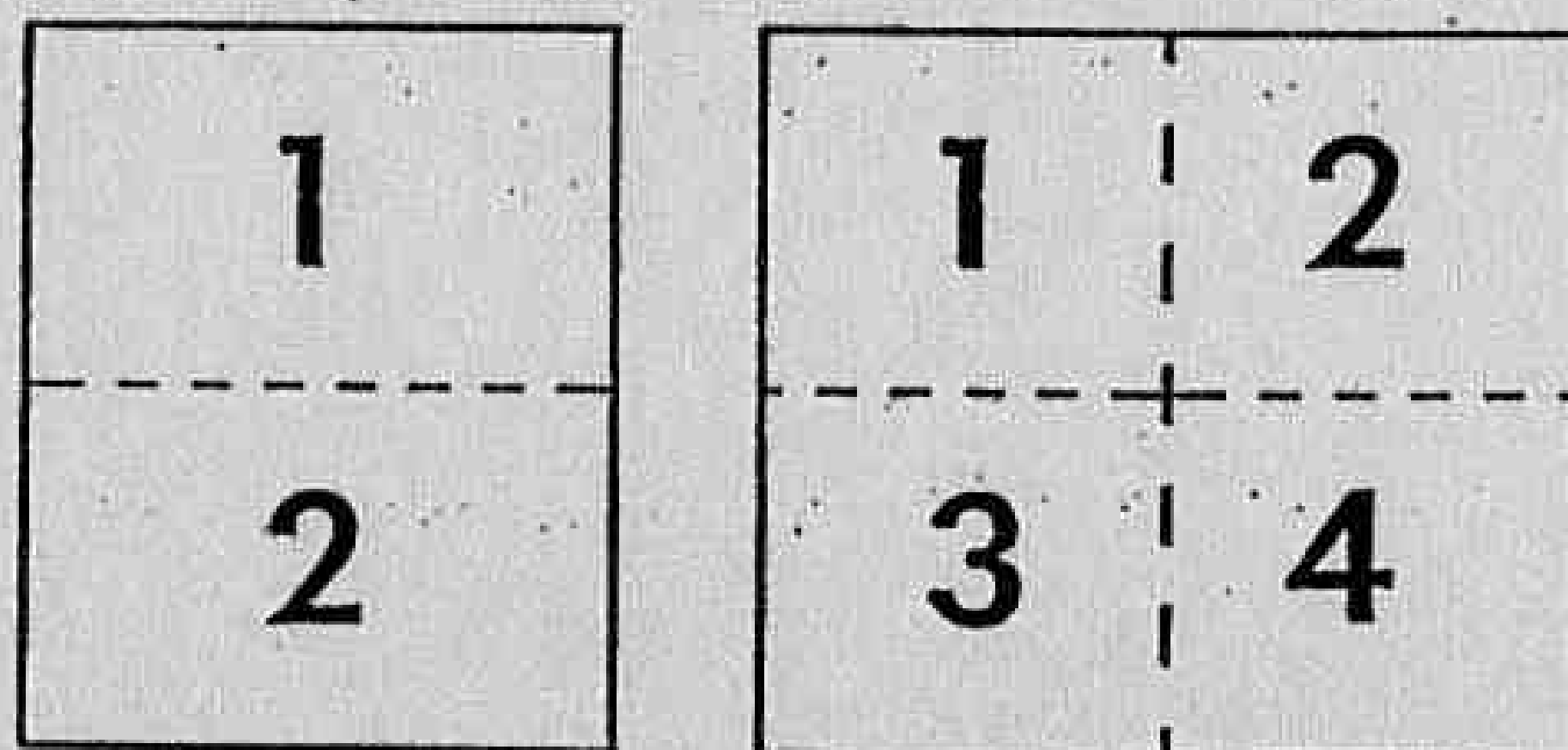
