SUBJECT; Dissolution of Interpreters-Translators Pool.

TO ; RC&MC Section.

1. Due to dispersion of offices and increase in size of this Headquarters the present Interpreter-Translator pool has become inadequate for its original purpose. That purpose can be better served at present by having Section pools or, where the volume of work warrants, interpreter-translators working in the individual offices. Either of the above methods may be used at the discretion of the sections concerned.

2. The personnel of the present pool, four civilians and three E.M. will be available on 16 September 1944 either for use by RC&MC Section or to form a nucleus for pools for the Economic and Administrative Sections, whichever the RC&MC Section may desire.

In order that arrangements can be made whereby certain of the civilians at present employed by this H.Q., and who will be unable to proceed to Rome, can be given fair notice, authority is requested to transfer to H.Q., Region III all records of civilians so situated.

H.Q. Region III have agreed to take over the accounts and records, and will take the necessary steps to discharge those civilians not required by them.

A similar arrangement was made by us in regard to the civilians employed in Sicily, on the move of this H.Q. from there.

It is understood that 7 days is the limit of notice given to civilians, and it is recommended that, in order to show appreciation for the work done, 14 days notice be given, as a special case, to all employees who by reason of the move of this H.Q. will have to be discharged.

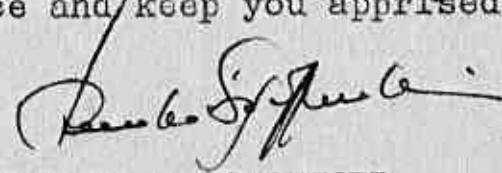
Refer your cable 5426 of 23 May and your letter
(Est 10 Ma-13) of 13 May.

1. In the light of the unavailability of additional officer specialists in the U.S. and the difficulty of obtaining qualified officer specialists within the Theater, we have not retracted our cable of 5 May suggesting an increase in the number of civilians. Our message was based upon your concurrence in cable of 3 May and your letter of 28 April indicating specific needs. We have indicated that personnel procured under Mr. Grady's original proposals and any additional personnel secured in accordance with the suggested increase be sent by the dates you have set. Since Mr. Grady and Col. Koenig have been taking the matter up while in Washington we assume that it will be worked out to your satisfaction.

2. At the same time we are making every effort to secure necessary personnel within the Theater. Your letter of 28 April was discussed with G-1 Natousa which is attempting to reach the needed officers. In addition to one engineer previously sent, we have requested the assignment of seven engineers whose records have been checked but whose availability has not yet been determined. One agricultural officer (Lt. Bergerson) has just been assigned and will proceed as soon as possible.

3. We assume that as a result of Major Aronson's contacts with Col. Lynch of PBS and Col. Berchtol of 5 Army additional suggestions will be made directly to you of officers qualified either for your vacancies or for vacancies in other pending operations, with the understanding that applications of the latter type would be forwarded to this office.

4. We are anxious to be of service and ^{will} keep you apprised of any further developments.
