TO: Provincial Commissioner, Bologna Province, Region IX, AMG

1. The mentioned vehicle was requisitioned by me with the consent of the Provincial Commissioner, Teramo Province. The facts were made known to the Provincial Commissioner and the Executive Officer of Teramo Province, and I was advised that proper requisition was made for this car.

2. No other transportation was made available for me at the time I was ordered to report to Region IX.

3. The alleged "Prof" Angelo Santorio is one of the biggest and most "unmitigated" liars with whom I have been privileged to come into contact. At the time this car was requisitioned by me, and shortly thereafter he told me and the then Provincial Commissioner of Teramo Province many and varying tales about this automobile.

4. At the time this car was requisitioned, a young (unknown) Italian man and woman were "joyriding" in Teramo City, using valuable Italian or Allied Military gasoline for this purpose. When the alleged "Professor" appeared shortly after the requisition of the car who made several different statements concerning for what purpose this car actually in Teramo. In view of the fact that this officer was without transport, and due to the fact that this said alleged "Professor" made many false and untrue statements (all of which was known by the then Provincial Commissioner of Teramo Province, as well as the Executive Officer) this car was requisitioned by me.

5. Under your verbal orders received from Capt. L. A. E. Eadings, I have today handed this car to this officer, and request the return of my receipt from the alleged "Professor".

CORRESPONDENCE

1. GENERAL COMMENTS.

a. Letters from this headquarters like those from any business office make an indelible impression of the efficiency of the office on both military personnel and civilians. All official correspondence should be prepared neatly, concisely, promptly, and accurately for unless communications are so prepared outsiders may conclude we do not know our business.

b. Each letter should refer to one subject. Where you must write on two or more subjects to one headquarters or to one individual, compose two or more letters.

c. All clerks are reminded they should never reveal the contents of official communications except to those entitled to know them.

d. When, in order to clarify or support statements in your letter you must refer to printed authorities do so in respect to Orders, Bulletins and Memoranda, by referring to the paragraph number, section number, title and number, and date. For example:

Par 2, S/O 12 Hq Region IX, dated 12 August 44.

A reference to a letter or indorsement, telegram and so forth may include as much of the following as is necessary to insure easy identification: symbol, file number, subject, and date of communication. Normally references will be included in the first paragraph of the communication. For example:

Reference your letter, file number RIX/ACR/7/1, dated 22 July 44, or
Reference your letter, file number RIX/ACR/7/1, subject: Buoli,
Bologna Province, dated 22 July 44.

2. MECHANICS OF ARRANGEMENT.

a. Use standard letter size paper (8" x 10 1/2") where possible. Type on original on bond paper, using onion skin or tissue paper for carbon copies.

b. Use only one side of the paper in all communications except for prescribed forms and mimeographed or other reproduced matter.

c. Unless otherwise instructed clerks will make two carbon copies of both letters and indorsements, except that all letters and reports to the Regional Commissioner will be submitted in triplicate.

- (2) Letter sub-paragraphs with underscored lower case letters commencing with a and indent as far the paragraph spaces from left margin. Sub-sub-paragraphs will be indented two spaces from the left margin and indicated by arabic figures in parenthesis beginning with (1). For example:

(1) Care in the following things will aid you in turning out good military letters:

2. No matter how good the paper may be, it must be free of following points:

- (1) Keep your type clean.

3. Single space all letters and indentments unless otherwise directed.

4. In closing, the signature of the writer in proper form will appear preceded by the words "Sincerely" for all staff officers and without the "order line" when signed by officers exercising a command function.

A letter or memorandum from a Hqs. special division or Provincial Commissioner addressed to the Regional Commissioner will close as a letter from an officer exercising a command function.

As a general rule communications leaving a headquarters will be signed for the commanding officer by his Adjutant or other designated staff officer or their assistants.

Use the phrase "By order of Lt. Col. BLANK" when writing to a subordinate unit or individual under his direct command.

Use the phrase "For the Regional Commissioner" or "For the Provincial Commissioner" in all other cases.

DUTIES OF HQ. OFFICERS

OBJECT

1. The object of this memorandum is:
 - a. To define and co-ordinate duties of HQ officers.
 - b. To enable all officers to know which HQ. officer they should approach on a particular matter.
 - c. To facilitate quick taking over of duties due to changes in appointments and assignments.

DUTIES

2. Executive Officer is the chief staff officer of the Region and will:
 - a. Ensure that the orders and policies of the Regional Commissioner are carried out.
 - b. Co-ordinate the work of Special Divisions.
 - c. Supervise internal administration of the Region.
 - d. Act as Commanding Officer of British personnel (see also G-1 and OC British Detachment).
 - e. Authorize engagement of civilian employees.
 - f. In the absence of the Regional Commissioner act as his deputy.
3. Assistant Executive Officer will assist the Executive Officer in carrying out his duties and in addition will:
 - a. Alot office space.
 - b. Receive officials visiting headquarters.
 - c. Co-ordinate the work of Co. I, Brit. Det. and Italian Platoon. He will act through the unit commander concerned.
 - d. Be responsible for cleanliness and maintenance of Hq offices, and barracks area.
 - e. Supervise work of Milling, Requisitioning and Purchasing officers.
 - f. Supervise Italian workmen and office cleaners.
 - g. Be responsible for the efficient guarding of Hq.
 - h. Packing up and moving of Regional Hq.
4. Adjutant will be responsible for:

DUTIES

2. Executive Officer is the chief staff officer of the Region and will:
 - a. Ensure that the orders and policies of the Regional Commissioner are carried out.
 - b. Co-ordinate the work of Special Divisions.
 - c. Supervise internal administration of the Region.
 - d. Act as Commanding Officer of British personnel (see also G-1 and OC British Detachment).
 - e. Authorise engagement of civilian employees.
 - f. In the absence of the Regional Commissioner act as his deputy.
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 - a. Allot office space.
 - b. Receive officials visiting headquarters.
 - c. Co-ordinate the work of Co. I, Brit. Det. and Italian Platoon. He will act through the unit commander concerned.
 - d. Be responsible for cleanliness and maintenance of HQ offices, and barrack area.
 - e. Supervise work of milleting, Requisitioning and Purchasing officers.
 - f. Supervise Italian workmen and office cleaners.
 - g. Be responsible for the efficient guarding of HQ.
 - h. Packing up and moving of Regional HQ.
4. Adjutant will be responsible for:
 - a. Handling all official Regional correspondence in accordance with regulations and approved policies. In cases where no policy has been established he will initiate action to secure a policy covering such cases.
 - b. Authentication and distribution of all orders and instructions except those matters reserved for signature by the Regional Commissioner. 1143
 - c. Maintenance of the official files of the Region.
 - d. Operation of message center.
 - e. Operation in accordance with approved policies of activities at headquarters pertaining to:
 - (1) Classification of all individuals joining the Region, their subsequent assignment, reclassification, and reassignment (coordination with British G-1, OC Brit. Det. and American Company Commander).
 - (2) Procurement and replacement of personnel.
 - (3) Leaves of absence and furloughs (coordination with Br. G-1 and American Company Commander).
 - (4) Internal arrangement of headquarters (in conjunction with Ass't Ex. Officer).

- f. Custody of the records of all personnel belonging to the Region which are not kept in some subordinate unit.
- g. Preparation and submission of reports on strength as required by Allied Control Commission Headquarters, and not submitted by unit commanders concerned.
- h. Operation of office procedure as regards administrative matters including recommendations as to similar arrangements in headquarters of subordinate units, general regulations and routine administration not specifically assigned to another staff section or unit.
- i. Furnishing the Regional Commissioner advice on morale.
- j. Other duties as directed by the Regional Commissioner and Executive Officer.

5. 4-1 British will under the directions of the Executive Officer, deal with the following:

- a. All "A" and MS matters concerning British Officers and in particular:
 - (1) Officers records.
 - (2) Officers pay and allowances.
 - (3) Casualty and other returns on British Officers.
 - (4) Courts of Inquiry.
 - (5) Summaries of evidence.
 - (6) Audit.

- b. Monthly reports, sitreps and similar matters.
- c. Defascism: deal with all correspondence on this subject and distribute to Special Divisions. Consult with and co-ordinate action taken by them.
- d. Patriots: Duties as for Defascism.
- e. In the absence of the Adjutant act as his deputy.
- f. Other duties as directed by Regional Commissioner and Executive Officer.

6. C.O. Co. I is responsible for:

- a. Administration and discipline of American personnel.
- b. Obtaining, maintaining, safeguarding and accounting for all American equipment, supplies and vehicles (including civilian vehicles requisitioned through U.S. Army channels). (See also duties of Motor Transport Officer).
- c. Drawing and distributing American rations and PX items.
- d. Pay of all American personnel.
- e. Maintenance of officers and enlisted mens 201 files.
- f. Submission of reports pertaining to American personnel.
- g. Investigation and reports of traffic accidents, personal injuries, and death.
- h. Cleanliness and maintenance of EM quarters and American store rooms.
- i. Ensure satisfactory standard of messing for EM/OR. (Coordinate with O.C. Br Det).

7. O.C. No. 9 Det. is responsible for administration of Brit. Det. and in particular:

- a. Discipline of British OR.
- b. ORs pay and allowances.
- c. Operating the mess.

- Army reports, sitreps and similar matters.
- Defascism: deal with all correspondence on this subject and distribute to Special Divisions. Consult with and co-ordinate action taken by them.
- Patriots: Duties as for Defascism.
- In the absence of the Adjutant act as his deputy.
- Other duties as directed by Regional Commissioner and Executive Officer.
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- a. Administration and discipline of American personnel.
 - b. Obtaining, maintaining, safeguarding and accounting for all American equipment, supplies and vehicles (including civilian vehicles requisitioned through U.S. Army channels). (See also duties of Motor Transport Officer).
 - c. Drawing and distributing American rations and PX items.
 - d. Pay of all American personnel.
 - e. Maintenance of officers and enlisted mens 201 files.
 - f. Subdivision of reports pertaining to American personnel.
 - g. Investigation and reports of traffic accidents, personal injuries, and death.

 - i. Ensure satisfactory standard of messing for EM/OR. (Coordinate with O.C. Br Det).
7. O.C. No. 9 Det. is responsible for administration of Brit. Det. and in particular:

 - d. Casualty and other returns on OR.
 - e. Casualty and other returns on Italian soldiers attached to this Hq.
 - f. Indenting and accounting for British stores, equipment and vehicles including items requisitioned through British Army channels.
 - g. Drawing rations for British personnel.
 - h. NALFF supplies.
 - i. PRJ account.
 - j. Maintenance of British vehicles.
 - k. Traffic accident reports.
 - l. Accounting for POL drawn from British sources.
 - m. Cleanliness and maintenance of ORs quarters and British store rooms.

8. For Transport Officer is responsible for:

- a. Co-ordinating the working of the British and American motor transport of the Region and detailing transport for duty as required.
- b. Under respective unit commanders be responsible for operating and maintaining all British and American vehicles including civilian requisitioned vehicles.
- c. Account to the respective unit commander for spare parts, tires, and POL supplied from Army sources.
- d. Consolidate returns on British and American vehicles as required by C-4, ACC.
- e. Ensure compliance with purely ACC instructions (e.g. use of windscreen labels) regarding both British and American vehicles.

9. Billeting Officer is responsible to Assistant Executive Officer for obtaining accommodation for Regional Hq. offices, stores and personnel. He will comply with instructions given in Region IX Administrative Memorandum No. 3, to be issued shortly.

10. Requisitioning Officer is responsible to Assistant Executive Officer for all requisitioning of civilian property and will comply with A.C.C. Establishment Memorandum No. 14.

11. Purchasing Officer is responsible to the Assistant Executive Officer for all purchases of supplies/stores and will comply with A.C.C. Establishment Memorandum No. 5 and such other instructions as may be issued by the Finance Officer.

SUBJECT: Unauthorized disposition of Civilian Vehicle.

TO : Regional Commissioner

1. On July 11, 1944, civilian automobile, 1939 Model Fiat Sedan, Motor # 031994, Chassis #032057, License #69910, Roma, belonging to Prof. Angelo Santoro D'Emidio, Via Vittori Colonna 32, was requisitioned by the P.C. of Teramo Province.

2. When the requisition was presented to the Regional Requisitioning Officer, the car was ordered returned to the owner, as Prof. Angelo Santoro is a well known Cancer Specialist.

STAFF WORK

The principles set forth in the following extract from standard instructions at an Army Service school are adopted as working rules of this headquarters:

- "1. The doctrine of 'completed staff work' is a doctrine of this office.
2. 'Completed staff work' is the study of a problem and presentation of a solution, by a staff officer in such form that all that remains to be done on the part of the head of the staff division, or the commander, is to indicate his approval or disapproval of the completed action. The words 'completed action' are emphasized because the more difficult the problem is, the more the tendency is to present the problem to the chief in piecemeal fashion. It is your duty as a staff officer to work out the details, no matter how perplexing they may be. You may and should consult other staff officers. The product, whether it involves the pronouncement of a new policy or effects an established one, should, when presented to the chief for approval or disapproval, be worked out in finished form.
3. The impulse which often comes to the inexperienced staff officer to ask the chief what to do, recurs more often when the problem is difficult. It is accompanied by a feeling of mental frustration. It is so easy to ask the chief what to do, and it appears so easy for him to know your job. It is your job to advise your chief what he ought to do, not to ask him what you ought to do. He needs answers, not questions. Your job is to study, write, restudy and rewrite until you have evolved a single proposed action--the best one of all you have considered. Your chief merely approves or disapproves.
4. Do not worry your chief with long explanations and memoranda. Writing a memorandum to your chief does not constitute completed staff work, but writing a memorandum for your chief to send someone else does. Your views should be placed before him in finished form so that he can make them his views simply by signing his name. In most instances completed staff work results in a single document prepared for the signature of the chief, without accompanying comment. If the proper result is reached, the chief will usually recognize it at once. If he wants comment or explanation, he will ask for it.
5. The theory of completed staff work does not preclude a 'rough draft' but the rough draft must not be a half-baked idea. It must be complete in every respect except that it lacks the final signature.

...is, no matter how perplexing they may be. You may and should consult other staff officers. The product, whether it involves the pronouncement of a new policy or effects an established one, should, when presented to the chief for approval or disapproval, be worked out in finished form.

3. The impulse which often comes to the inexperienced staff officer to ask the chief what to do, recurs more often when the problem is difficult. It is accompanied by a feeling of mental frustration. 4. Do not worry your chief with long explanations and memoranda. Writing a memorandum to your chief does not constitute completed staff work, but writing a memorandum for your chief to send someone else does. In most instances completed staff work results in a single document prepared for the signature of the chief, without accompanying comment. If the proper result is reached, the chief will usually recognize it at once. If he wants comment or explanation, he will ask for it.

5. The theory of completed staff work does not preclude a 'rough draft' but the rough draft must not be a half-baked idea. It must be complete in every respect except that it lacks the requisite number of copies and need not be neat. But a rough draft must not be used as an excuse for shifting to the chief the burden of formulating action.

6. The 'completed staff work' theory may result in more work for the staff officer; but it results in more freedom for the chief. This is as it should be. Further, it accomplishes two things:

- a. The Chief is protected from half-baked ideas, voluminous memoranda, and immature oral presentations.
- b. The staff officer who has a real idea to sell is enabled more readily to find a market.

7. When you have finished your 'completed staff work' the final test is this:

If you were the chief would you be willing to sign the paper you have prepared, and stake your professional reputation on its being right?

If the answer is in the negative, take it back and work it over, because it is not yet 'completed staff work.'

REPORT ON REGION IX FOR MONTH OF JULY 1944

PART I GENERAL

1. The re-activation of Region IX began with the appointment of Lt. Col. ALFRED C. BOWMAN as Regional Commissioner (HQ ACC Gen Order #16, dated 26 June 44).

2. The territory to be administered by this Region has NOT yet been reached by the Armies and this report deals solely with the preparations which have been made to move forward when the time comes.

Location of HQ

3. The first task was to find a headquarters which had good road communications with Rome and was located conveniently for sending Provincial Teams forward as required.

4. It was found that the majority of towns which satisfied these considerations were either considerably damaged or already full of troops. After extensive reconnaissance over a wide area it was decided to establish Main Headquarters at Orvieto and to Maintain a small Rear Headquarters in Rome to keep in close touch with HQ A.C.C.

5. At that time HQ Region VIII was at Orvieto, and in addition to extending hospitality, gave valuable help to Region IX Advance Party.

6. A temporary headquarters was set up 13 July 44, and on 18 July Headquarters was established in the CASERMA AERONAUTICA.

Personnel

7. The first officer assigned to the Region, other than the Regional Commissioner, reported for duty 29 June 44. Close liaison was maintained with G-1 Branch, A.E.C. and officers and men began to arrive as quickly as the other Regions could release them.

After extensive reconnaissance over a wide area it was decided to establish Main Headquarters at Orvieto and to maintain a small Rear Headquarters in Rome to keep in close touch with HQ A.C.C.

5. At that time HQ Region VIII was at Orvieto, and in addition to extending hospitality, gave valuable help to Region IX Advance Party.

6. A temporary headquarters was set up 13 July 44, and on 18 July Headquarters was established in the CASERMA AERONAUTICA.

Personnel

7. The first officer assigned to the Region, other than the Regional Commissioner, reported for duty 29 June 44. Close liaison was maintained with G-I Branch, A.E.C. and officers and men began to arrive as quickly as the other Regions could release them.

My dear Colonel Bowman:

I have your letter of the 14th of August, subject transport, about which you talked to me when I was at Orvieto. I believe that I explained to you the general transport situation.

Many of the vehicles that were furnished to you required extensive repairs and it is probable that any that we are able to obtain later will be in the same category. Region IX is really in excellent shape as compared to what we will be able to do for Regions X, XI, and XII.

The consolidation of the Southern Regions instead of releasing transport made the requirements for additional transport. From the standpoint of the ACC officers, they must travel farther and oftener, many times in mountainous terrain, where they need good W.D. vehicles. If we expect Italian officers to be able to govern, they too require transport, and the few requisitioned vehicles which are capable of traveling any distance will be insufficient to them.

Region IX should make every effort, once they are in the Region, to find suitable civilian vehicles for requisition to mount the Regional officers. No doubt this transport should be difficult to locate at first but if you put all of your officers on notice to attempt to find such transport, I have no doubt they would be successful.

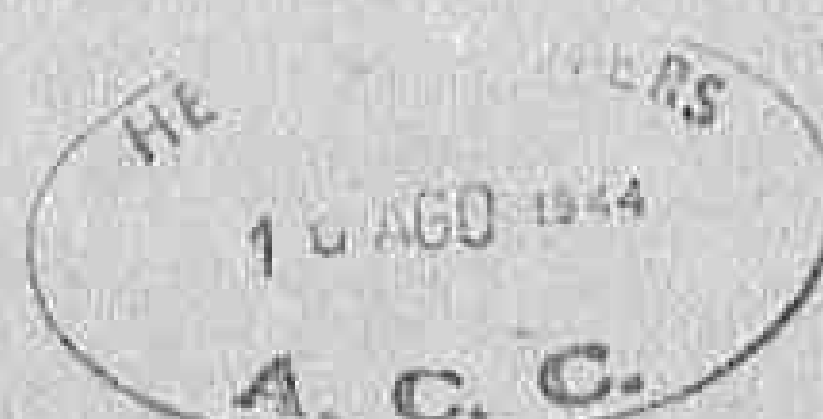

Subject: Transport

1. Although G-4, British and American, have so far been faithful to all commitments for the furnishing of domestic transport to Region IX., allotments are generally admitted to be less than adequate.
2. In addition, it is acknowledged by all concerned that vehicles supplied are almost universally "marginal", so far as mechanical condition and equipment are concerned. Many require extensive repairs, and some are useable only for the lightest tasks, even when repairs are complete.
3. The British, American and Italian mechanics at this headquarters have continuously and industriously engaged in the repair and rehabilitation of vehicles issued, with commendable results. All provincial teams thus far sent out have somehow been made mobile, and this headquarters still has enough transport for its own use.
4. All of these efforts continue, but the pinch is beginning to be felt, and shortages of domestic transport will be aggravated by requirements of Italian troops and Red Cross personnel now joining us, and Italian civilian "experts", etc., expected later. Region IX. will, when it becomes operational, carry on an intensive drive for requisitioned vehicles in its own territory, but meanwhile, shortages are likely to be acute, and will seriously affect efficiency, if not relieved.
5. The consolidation of Regions II, III and VII, releasing a number of officers for duty elsewhere, should also make available a very considerable number of civilian non-commercial type vehicles, which will only be surplus if allowed to remain in those Regions, but would be very useful if made available to Region IX. and other Regions now in the process of forming.

6. A few officers heretofore coming forward from rear Regions have been permitted to bring personal transport, but this is the exception and not the rule. There should, at the present time, be in the Regions mentioned a considerable surplus of light transport which it would seem too bad to hold there, or to de-requisition, while the need in forward Regions is so great. Regional Commissioners in rear Regions have in the past quite naturally shown themselves reluctant to permit any of this transport to go forward, but it is believed that this attitude would be overcome if the extent and seriousness of the need were made known.

7. It is strongly urged that surplus transport in the Regions now to be consolidated be made available to Region IX. and other forward Regions, either,

- (a) by collecting such transport in a pool or pools and assigning it to forward Regions, on some fair basis, or
- (b) by permitting officers ordered forward to proceed in transport heretofore used by them, or substitute vehicles selected by the Commissioner of the Region from which they come.

On the whole, the second course would probably prove simpler and more satisfactory.

8. Region IX. will attempt to rehabilitate and use any transport offered, regardless of condition, and will gladly send necessary drivers to any designated place in Continental Italy for the purpose of picking it up.

MEMORANDUM TO: Col. Farren.

The following is a summary of what I understand to be the conclusions reached, and instructions received, at our conference yesterday with the Executive Commissioner:

1. You are to prepare (with a copy for me) two complete separate lists of earmarked officers:

a. Officers to be permanently assigned to Region IX, and

b. Officers to be assigned to Region IX, with the understanding that when Region XII is occupied, they will be ordered forward.

2. You will proceed at once to select, obtain clearance for, and order forward, sufficient Provincial Commissioners, Provincial officers and specialists, to constitute three provincial teams (including a team for Region IX's largest and "capital" province) such officers to arrive with kit and equipment, ready for duty, not later than the date specified by the Executive Commissioner.

I suggest that among the most pressing immediate personnel needs, which should be given first attention are:

1. At least one additional Provincial Commissioner, as such.

2. One additional officer of provincial commissioner caliber, preferably with experience as provincial officer in a devastated metropolitan area.

3. One officer capable of sustaining the responsibilities of Regional Civilian Supply Officer (Lt. Col. Buck has been earmarked for this duty, and I very strongly desire that no change be made in this selection).

4. One (Civilian Supply) Transportation Officer. (Lt. Molfetto was originally ticketed for this position, but upon his arrival all concerned, including Lt. Col. Bourdass, Major Washer, and Capt. Moretti, were satisfied that he has not the necessary experience nor technical qualifications. He has been accepted and assigned to a headquarters organic supply position. A substitute as Transportation Officer is needed at once.

5. One Regional Legal Officer (this is essential if necessary proclamations and orders are to be obtained and arranged, and the Regional Commissioner properly advised as to his legal duties immediately upon entry into the Region).

6. One Regional Public Health Officer (Major Snedeker has been earmarked, is highly acceptable, and is believed to be presently available).

I am proceeding to Orvieto today but will return early next week to heckle you further.

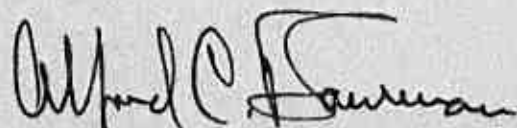
Each of the following officers is commended for:
