With the known shortege of dental officers. I think that service is a saving of manpower out for the Dental Corps J. I greatly fear that the requisition will not be filled and that we will have to carry this vacancy against our strength from now on. SUBJECT:- Transfer of Officers.

TO :- Regional Commissioners, Regions I to VIII. (Attention: Regional Public Health Officers).

1. With the rapid advance of the Armies, fresh forward territory

- 2. This Sub-Commission is very short of Medical Officers, having total of only thirt four including HQ staff.
- 3. It will be necessary, therefore, to transfer Medical Officers
- 4. Regional Public Health Officers of Regions I, II, VI and VII, must now consider the possibility of having to leave their Regions in the near future. They should, therefore, initiate plans to hand over their chaties to the Italian authorities.
- 5. Regional Public Health Officers of Regions III, IV and V should envisage the possibility of drastic reductions in their staffs and take action accordingly.
- 6. It is becoming increasingly important for Italian officials to resume their administrative responsibilities, and that basic principle should be impressed upon them.

GILL) to AMA & Army was requested by Public Health Sub\*Commission to to Establishments Branch on 30 Apl and 11 May 44. 1. Reference L.103 dated 20 May from Brigadier Lush, the shortage of medical officers is a constant source of worry to this Sub-Commission. On 15 April a request was made for a total ceiling of 62 instead of 56. No authority has yet been obtained.

2. Lt. Col. Williams is leaving today on a field trip and will endeavour to contact Lt. Col. Farrinacci. Brigadier Parkinson expects to go to AMG 8th Army shortly.

3. Both the Regions and this HQ are now cut to the bone as regards staff of medical officers, while 8th Army has 3 medical officers.
