TO : Colonel J. Albright, G.S.C.,
Headquarters, AMG,
APO 512. (By Courier)

1. I am transmitting herewith floor plans and other pertinent data with reference to office space and billets requisitioned for the Headquarters, ACC, at NAPLES.
2. There is also transmitted herewith a complete roster of the enlisted men formerly at the Naples Staging Area, Shipment Nos. EM 690 GG, EM 690 HH, EM 690 II. The roster indicates the status of these men and their present whereabouts.
3. The billeting situation looks a bit more encouraging than when you were here last.
4. The Advanced Detachment is now occupying a building at 61 Via Medina. The building has been thoroughly cleaned and has all the facilities available to accommodate the large Headquarters Company (American)—approximately 600 men. For the British Headquarters Company, I have located a building at Calata S. Marco No. 4, badly in need of minor repairs and cleaning. This work is being started immediately, and the building should be ready for occupancy within ten days.
5. With reference to office space, I have secured additional offices at 68 Via Brigida. This could probably take care of the overflow from the Provincia Building and the Post Office.
6. The billeting situation concerning officers' billets came to a climax when PBS bluntly announced that AFHQ had frozen a large number of villas in the city for their own senior officers; that they, too, (PBS), of necessity, were freezing a number of buildings (a number of which were in our own area) to meet the demands from incoming units. Consequently, since we were turned down on most of our requisitions for villas, it became necessary to set out on a "defrosting expedition" and, accordingly, have this date contacted the officer in charge of billeting for the Forward Echelon of AFHQ at CASERTA. I explained our situation to him and am submitting requisitions for the following billets through AFHQ for our use:

If these requisitions are approved, I believe that the billeting situation for the officers will be practically solved.

7. I am encountering some difficulty in securing garage and parking space for both the American and British motor pools. My search has been within the AMG area, and preferably in close proximity of both the American and British companies, for obvious reasons. However, in view of the present difficulties encountered, I will probably have to resort to locating these motor pools at a greater distance away from the AMG area than I had hoped.

8. With reference to billeting at ACERRA for the Allied Military Government School now at TIZI-OUZOU, I am forwarding full particulars, under separate cover.

9. MESSING:

a. Officers

(1) The dining room of the Hotel Toledo-Regina can accommodate approximately 300 officers per meal (one sitting).

(2) The billets requisitioned for the general officers could operate their own messes, if they so desire. I am under the impression that quite a number of the high ranking officers of the AMG group desire this, as they can supplement the ration at their own choosing and taste; that the C.G., A.M.G., has had no objection to the practice of operating separate messes in that manner.

(3) The same as above for any number of other groups of officers desiring the same arrangement.

b. Enlisted Men

(1) Ample cooking and messing facilities are available at 61 Via Medina for the Headquarters Company (American).

(2) Messing facilities for the British Company at Calata S. Marco No. 4 are not as desirable as they are at 61 Via Medina, but could be arranged with a little effort.

10. The main telephone line to the Provincia Building has been repaired, and some phones in the building are already in operation in offices of Region IV, as follows:

11. Eighteen (18) drivers were sent by air yesterday to Palermo to drive transportation for Gen. Joyce, and ten (10) clerks are being sent by air to Brindisi this date. I naturally understood that this transaction was sanctioned by your Headquarters. This leaves us here with but twelve (12) extra drivers. Will you please advise me if you still want the remaining drivers and clerks to be sent to Palermo? I have not heard from the Italian flier who was scheduled to ferry the enlisted men over to your headquarters.

12. I shall continue to follow up the work started and would greatly appreciate any word from your Headquarters concerning the approximate time and date of your expected arrival.

SUBJECT: Billets for AMG School at ACERRA.

TO : CG, AMG

1. The Ospedale Militare and Scuola Elementare, approximately ten miles Northeast of Naples, has been requisitioned for the AMG school, floor plans attached. The building has been thoroughly cleaned and the grounds well policed, and contains the following accommodations:

It can conveniently house from 500 - 600 persons, and hospital authority stated that they have had as many as 800 patients at one time in there. It contains approximately 300 beds. The building also has a good deal of office space, ample cooking and messing facilities for 500 - 600 men, and also ample toilet facilities, which have been repaired and will be ready for use by December 5. There are four shower heads and five bathtubs, but these can be supplemented by installing additional showers in large stone house in the rear of the hospital. There is ample space in the rear of the hospital to hold formations (parades). There is only limited space for vehicles, however. Each room has a coal stove and the basement contains approximately 160 tons of coal and firewood, which should be ample fuel for both cooking and heating for the rest of the winter.

2. In addition to the Ospedale Militare, I have secured two billets as follows:

a. Clinica Privata de Chirurgia Ostetrica-Cinocologia,
Via Parco Spinotti.

- (1) This building is in excellent shape, immaculately clean, kept by three nuns. It contains seven rooms and can accommodate approximately twenty officers of the Staff and Faculty.
- (2) The nuns can be moved to Naples in the same hospital where the nuns were sent from the Ospedale Militare.

b. Villino Nuzzo,
Via Francesco Costaldi.

- (1) This is a seven room villa in excellent shape, fully

furnished (five bedrooms, kitchen, dining room,
bath, etc.)

- (2) A young couple now residing in this building are naturally desiring to stay. They offer to cook, keep house, and wash clothes of the officer occupants.

3. A search is being made for a suitable location for supply rooms and a motor pool. The ground is very soft all around ACERRA, only few streets are paved, and I am encountering difficulty in locating same. However, I am continuing my reconnaissance, and if nothing suitable can be located, I would recommend improvising a motor pool by the use of engineers to dig out a road leading from the hard pavement into the motor pool area, and to improvise the motor pool proper with hard rock and gravel. If I could be given a tentative date of the expected arrival of the AMG School at ACERRA, I could start this project and have it ready upon the arrival of the personnel.

Memo to the C/S:

I Reconnaissance Naples Area:-

1. a. Office space has been obtained in the Provincia Bldg. for approximately 140 officers and clerks. Offices are being cleared and furnished--records are being collected and stored in two large rooms. Several offices are available now.
- b. Complete occupation of the Bldg. will require Region IV to move. It now occupies the 1st floor and several rooms on the ground floor. A few rooms are, also, being occupied by Province or City of Naples Civil Affairs Hq. officers.

2. The Post Office Bldg. has some 30 offices under repair which should be available about 15 December. This should provide office space for an additional 50 to 60 officers. The exact date they will be available is dependant on the speed of work now in progress. Additional space can probably be obtained in this Bldg after further repairs are completed.

3. A school at Acena about 8 miles N. E. of the city, which had been used as a Military Hospital, has been obtained with the original idea of moving the Tied group there. Some of our E, M, are now billeted there to hold it.

4. Unlisted men and OR billets--One bld, which is adequate has been obtained for American E, M. Another Bldg. which is not suitable is available for O. M. Lt. Col. Richards is continuing the search for another place and has found a suitable Bldg. but may be unable to obtain it as PMS also wants it.

5. Officers billets are the greatest problem at the moment as PMS was instructed not to requisition for ACC--that Gen Joyce would not come to Naples. Since we are still Hq. AMG, we have one opening. Gen Holmes is working on the situation at AMHQ to release Bldgs. to ACC to house the majority of Sub-Commissions, even though the Italian Government and higher level ACC does not come to Naples.

Dear Colonel Albright:

I am in receipt of your letter of 26 November 1943, reference, move to Naples, which was delivered to me on November 28 by courier. Accordingly, I followed your instructions and immediately contacted PBS to inquire if they had received confirmation from AFHQ. Confirmation arrived at that Headquarters in substance somewhat as follows:

"No objection to move of Headquarters, ACC, from Palermo to Naples."

This was a "repeat message". The original message was apparently dated November 25.

In informing the Chief of Staff, Region 4 (Colonel Marshall) that Region 4 would have to move on General McSherry's orders, probably within two weeks, Colonel Marshall seemed to question this in view of the fact that he felt that his Region 4 was directly under the 15th Army Group, and that he had not been informed by the Headquarters of the 15th Army Group that he should move. I told him, of course, that I assumed that all that had been, or was being, so coordinated, (particularly in view of the fact that copy of the message from AFHQ concerning the O.K. on our move from Palermo to Naples, must, undoubtedly, have been sent by AFHQ to Headquarters, 15th Army). Lt. Col. Jackling (British) from AFHQ was present at the time and I conveyed the contents of your message to Colonel Marshall and he, too, was under the impression that even with the message from AFHQ stating "that there were no objections to the movement of your Headquarters from Palermo to Naples", that that alone did not necessarily mean that General McSherry's Headquarters had sufficient authority without coordinating the matter with Headquarters, 15th Army, to move Region 4.

In view of the above, to pacify all concerned and to refrain from any further entanglements and political complications, I recommend that a copy of an official order from your Headquarters concerning the movement of your Headquarters from Palermo to Naples, be sent to me at the earliest practicable date.

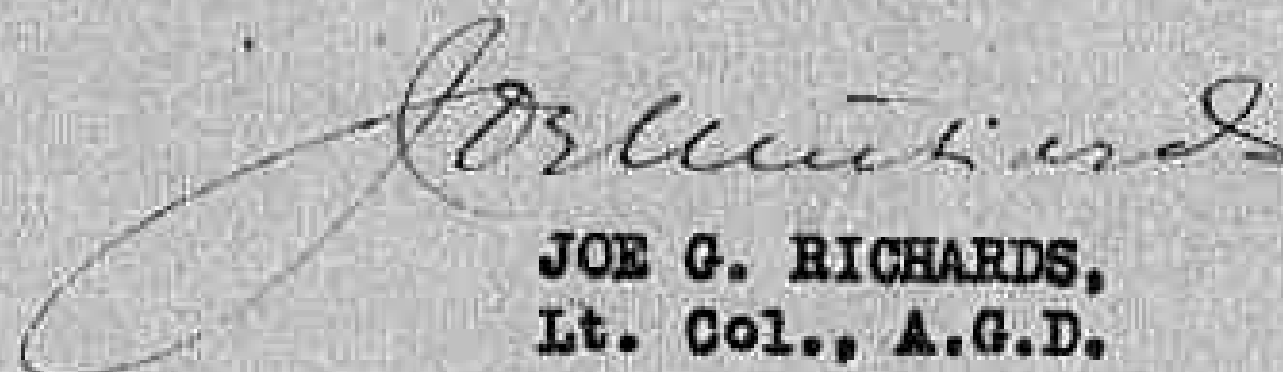

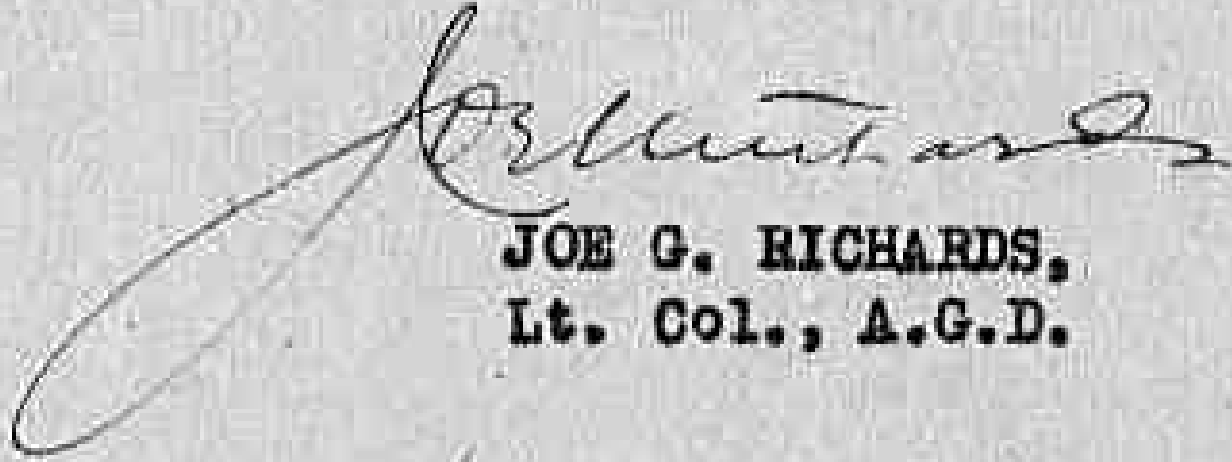

TO: CG,

1. Reference is made to letter, this office, subject: Billets for AMG School at ACERRA, dated 27 November 1943. The Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, informed me this date that the Ospedale Militare and Scuola Elementare, previously requisitioned for the AMG school, has this date been turned over to the French Army for use as a hospital.

2. In an attempt to protect the interests of the CG, AMG school, I this date contacted Colonel Oxx, Chief of Staff to General Pence (PBS), but was informed that the decision had already been made; that, as a matter of policy, priority has to be given to the combat units, and that buildings suitable for hospitals are to be used only for that purpose. Consequently, there seems to be no way in which we could force the issue regarding the retention of that sight for the AMG school at TIZI-OUZOU. I have taken no steps to inform the AMG school at TIZI-OUZOU, and the purpose of this communication is to bring this matter to the attention of your Headquarters, and am awaiting orders for any future action to be taken in this matter.

Information as to accommodation, facilities and services,
etc. in relation to Sorrento, Salerno and Capri.

SORRENTO

1. Accommodation. There are 4 Hotels with a total of 350 rooms. Of these, one (Victoria) is used for resuscitating 5th Army Officers. Remainder are occupied by British Red Cross, Convalescents etc.
2. Utility Services.
 - (a) Electricity - Satisfactory supply but there are frequent interruptions due to the system being on one circuit.
 - (b) Gas - No supply.
 - (c) Water - Supply to 1st floor level only. For higher levels, electric pumps ^{and} roof stores are necessary.
