Subject: Italian Medical Officers.

To : Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, ACC.

1. Reference your IDP/130/59-4 dated 9 June 1944.
2. Administrative Instruction No. 2E, AFHQ, Adv. Adm. Ech., C.M.F., 3152/9/A1 dated 11 Feb. 44 with amendments, states the terms and conditions of employment and payment of Italian paroled prisoners of War. The provisions cover Italian Medical Officers, who are classified as paroled prisoners of War.
3. The rates of pay will be found in attached Appendix "B".
4. An Italian prisoner of War does not hold a parole status unless he has signed the form of declaration attached as Appendix "A".
5. The provisions of Administrative Instruction No. 2E do not provide for advancements against credits of the paroled prisoner of War.
6. It is suggested by the Finance Sub-Commission of ACC that the Italian Medical Officers in question be gotten off Prisoner of War status and released to the Italian Army for duty with the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission. This would put the Italian Medical Officers in question on the payroll of the Italian Army but working for your Sub-Commission.
7. As a temporary measure it is suggested by the Finance Sub-Commission of ACC that small sums of money be advanced to the said Italian officers. These advances to be handled as operating expenses.

Subject: Employment of Italian Doctors.

To : Vice President, Administrative Section.

1. In reply to your letter ACC/3018/PM of 9 April 1944, subject as above, and the attached copy of letter from Public Health Sub-Commission, dated 5 March 1944, Italian Medical personnel may be employed in the professional classification as indicated on the attached copy of letter from the Labor Sub-Commission.

2. The question of rations and billeting will have to be decided for each specific case dependent on the actual employment. If they are employed for duty with Headquarters ACC in Naples or in Salerno it is not considered practicable or possible to give them any special rations or billets; they would be in exactly the same position as other Italian civilian employees. If, on the other hand, they were employed for duty in Refugee and Displaced Persons Camps, it would probably be necessary to furnish them billets and rations in the camp. Any other contemplated use of Italian civilian medical personnel would have to be settled as individual cases.

3. This information was given verbally to a Senior Officer of the Public Health Sub-Commission in mid-March with the promise that he would convey it to the Director of the Sub-Commission. On this promise no answering letter to Public Health letter of 5 March has been previously written.

SUBJECT: Proposed Qualifications for Medical Officers (Civilian)

TO : Colonel Albright, Establishments Officer, A.C.C.

1. Properly qualified medical officers (Italian - civilian) can be paid from L. 4,000 to L. 9,600 per month as direct employees of the Public Health Sub-Commission. Allied Control Commission under authority contained in AFHQ Adv. Adm. Ech. Administrative Instruction No. 24, dated 24 January, 1944, which established that rate category for professional workers. It is understood, of course, that such civilians will be professionally qualified and serve at the professional or technical level justifying the salary.

2. Based on the predication that professional medical service is required in the camps and that it is the intent to employ persons competent for such service, it is believed that the requirements should be as follows: "The person to be selected must be a recognized practicing physician, meeting all the requirements of the profession in Italy." This requirement should be for doctors.

3. If it is desired to employ nurses (Italian - civilian), they may be employed under the category entitled "Laboratory and Dispensary Assistants". This classification was informally agreed upon by the Wage Sub-Committee of the Allied Resources Board at a recent meeting. The rate of pay is from L. 90 to L. 110 per day. There is a surplus of qualified and professionally recognized Italian civilian nurses reported to exist. Standards for camp work should be no higher than those recognized in Italy. If evidence or qualifications can be submitted, in the form of a certificate or otherwise, the person may be employed and still meet the standard for this position.

4. All persons employed must serve for seven (7) days at the minimum rate quoted above, after which they may be raised to any level that does not exceed the maximum rate.
