SUBJECT: Reduction of EM/ORs from this Hdq.

TO : Executive Commissioner (attn: Establishment Officer) ✓

Reference: 16008/2/G-1 dtd 17 Jul 44.

1. Preliminary returns from the Sub-Commissions of this Section indicate that the Directors by no means feel that the functions of their departments can be carried on with any immediate reduction in their present EM/OR strength.
2. We are in hearty agreement with the necessity to release soldier personnel for more operational duties in the forward Regions but at the same time we cannot shirk our present responsibility of supervising and directing the work which A.C.C. has already assumed thru this Headquarters.
3. The obvious solution is replacement by qualified civilian personnel and strenuous efforts are being made to infiltrate these among our present staffs. You are no doubt well aware, however, that the availability of such personnel is entirely inadequate for the demand and that a training period will be absolutely necessary before assuming that they can carry on, unassisted by the present trained personnel.
4. I understand that the R.C. & M.G. Section is anticipating the early release of the EM/OR personnel but I am sure that it is not their intention to proceed with such a program until they have provided this Section and this Headquarters with suitable substitutes.

Subject: Reduction of EM/ORs from this Headquarters.

To : Vice President, Economic Section.

1. Reference your letter ES/2A of 21 July commenting on letter 16008/2/G-1 of 17 July 1944. The reduction of EM/ORs in this Headquarters will be necessitated not by any desire to cut down the size of this Headquarters but by the movement of tactical forces and the conditions in the north of Italy after our occupation of that area. At the present time it appears that that occupation may not be long delayed. It further appears that conditions in Regions IX, X, XI, and XII may be in a chaotic state.

2. If the above situation comes about, any intention that we now have of making an orderly reduction in the staff of this Headquarters may go by the Boards. We may be forced to move a large percentage of EM/ORs into the field at the expense of Headquarters operation. Long efforts to obtain additional EM/ORs have failed and there are efforts being made for both British and American side to reduce the already slender strength of EM/ORs with the Commission and other rear area activities.

3. I recommend that your Sub-Commissions personally interest themselves in obtaining civilian help so that their operations may not be completely stopped in case of emergency. I further suggest that the members of the Economic Section on the Labor Board rapidly complete their work on the conditions of service for civilian labor of allied and Italians so that capable and qualified personnel may be induced to offer their services to the Commission.

4. I am writing this long explanation because I believe it urgent that every Sub-Commission and Section should do everything they can to assist the Establishments Branch in replacing with civilian labor the largest possible numbers of EM/ORs at the earliest possible date.

Subject: Assignment of Enlisted Men.

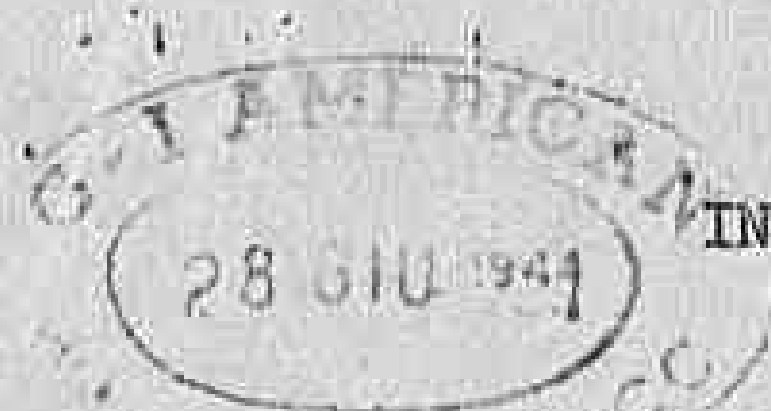
To : Director, Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission.

1. Reference your letter of 26 June, file IDP/312/1, on the above subject. Investigation reveals that the American enlisted men assigned to your Sub-Commission have always been carried assigned to the Headquarters Company, 2675th Regiment and that no change has been made. These men have been carried on detached service with Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and are still so carried. There has, as yet, been no change in the administrative procedure for these men.
2. I am of the opinion that the enlisted men of your Sub-Commission now located at camps in Southern Italy should be attached to the Region in which the camp is located for administration only. Since your Headquarters has moved to Rome you are well removed from location of these rear camps and it seems to me much simpler to have these men administered - paid - disciplined, etc., by the organization which is much closer at hand.
3. Any enlisted men included in the Headquarters of the Sub-Commission should be turned over immediately to the Headquarters Company in Rome and administered in the same way that all other Sub-Commissions at Headquarters are administered.
4. May I have your comments please with reference to the question of attachment of your men in the Southern camps, and if you agree with me, please attach a nominal roll showing at which camp various men are located.

SUBJECT : Enlisted Men Assignment

TO : Establishment Branch  
Allied Control Commission, APO 394

1. It is understood that arrangements were recently made to include the EM assigned to this Sub-Commission as part of Hq. Co. 2675th Regt. These arrangements were made without consulting the Director of this Sub-Commission and without his approval. The reason for this change is not understood.

2. It should be noted that the Hq of this Sub-Commission has constantly assumed the responsibility of administering to the EM assigned to it for duty. It has arranged the payment, quartering, rationing, clothing, physical inspection, immunization, and attended to all other matters concerning its Enlisted Men.

3. It should also be noted that the EM on duty with this Sub-Commission are located in our refugee camps scattered throughout Southern Italy and elsewhere. There are only 3 EM on duty at this Hq at present. It has been possible for this Hq to deal with all questions concerning the Enlisted Men mentioned in par 2 only because it is in constant communication with its many camps. It would not appear to be possible in the circumstances for Hq Co. 2675th Regt. to deal direct with EM in this Sub-Commission.

4. It is requested that the status of the EM on duty with this Sub-Commission be re-defined. Otherwise it is difficult to see how men in Southern Italy will receive further payments.

1. The above mentioned Other Ranks were, as a result of an incident on Friday, 30 June 44, placed under close arrest and, at the request of Col. Cripps, I proceeded to Rear Headquarters today to investigate the charges which had been leveled against the above mentioned Other Ranks. As a result of my investigation today, I have remanded all three accused for a summary of evidence to be taken on oath. This is being done by Capt. Moore, Legal Sub-Commission. The accused will be kept under close arrest until such time as I have had sufficient time to consider the summary of evidence.

2. The charges against these men are briefly summarized:

- a. Attempting to take away a Government vehicle without authority
- b. Disobeying a lawful command
- c. Using violence towards a superior officer
- d. Striking a superior officer.

3. These charges are all Court Martial offenses and, if the evidence produced is sufficient, they will be remanded for trial by Court Martial. It will, however, be necessary for me to return to Salerno to further deal with these accused after I have received the summary of evidence. 2450

SUBJECT: Reduction of Non-Commissioned Officers.

TO : All Unit Commanders.

1. Attention is directed to Par 15, Sec II, AR 615-5, which outlines the procedure to be followed in the reduction of non-commissioned officers for misconduct or inefficiency. Subparagraph a is quoted below:

"Misconduct or inefficiency. - a. General. - The misconduct or inefficiency believed to make termination of appointment necessary will be reported by the immediate commanding officer of the non-commissioned officer concerned through military channels to the appointing authority, who will carefully and expeditiously examine into the facts in the case, through a board of officers, or by other similar methods if he so elects, to determine the facts in connection with the alleged inefficiency or misconduct and whether or not there is just cause for the termination of the appointment."

2. Where a reduction is requested, unit commanders will supply particulars on alleged misconduct or inefficiency to the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission, on form inclosed and request that enlisted man be brought before a board of officers under the provisions of above-mentioned Army Regulation.

3. In the case of privates, first class, Par 13 c (1), Sec II, AR 615-5, provides that ".....the authority competent to appoint may terminate an appointment in the grade of private, first class, when in his opinion such action is in the best interests of the service....."

4. It is the obligation of unit commanders to exercise the above provisions for the replacement of incompetents by those meriting appointment, in order that the efficiency of the Allied Control Commission may be maintained upon a high standard of operation.

5. The attached form will be furnished as requested and will be used as merited.

Subject: Provisional T.O. for American Increment to Army Sub-Commission.

To : Army Sub-Commission, Leguile (Lecce).

1. Reference your letter of 6 April 1944, subject as above, and referring to your AQ/38 of 4 April 1944. The matter of American personnel was referred to Headquarters AAC with a recommendation that either a separate T.O. for the American increment be set-up or that the allotment to the 2675th Regiment be increased by the numbers of officers and enlisted men requested. General Lemnitzer, Deputy Chief of Staff and Commanding General of American troops forwarded and approved the request for increased allotment to the 2675th Regiment. He personally went to AFHQ to discuss the matter. A cable has been sent from AFHQ to the combined Chiefs of Staff containing the same recommendation.

2. Everything possible is being done by this Headquarters and by General Lemnitzer to handle this matter so as to protect American interests in this situation. It is my opinion that additional correspondence will abstract rather than assist in obtaining the American increment.

1. The W.E. Committee at H.Q. AAI has approved, subject to concurrence of A.F.H.Q., the amendments to the British W.E. substantially as set out in Appx 'B' of AQ/38 dated 4 Apr 44.
2. The approval of the American Provisional T.O. as set out in Appx. 'C' is now a matter of urgent necessity in order that the conditions set out under para. 2 of AGWAR signal, FAN 338 of 26 Feb can be fulfilled. A temporary American organisation within the framework of 2675 Regt., A.C.C. has not proven satisfactory. Sufficient officers, men and equipment has not been furnished as requested and I am advised that my request cannot be met out of personnel and equipment allotted to 2675 Regt. The American personnel should be regularised into a unit independent of 2675 Regt so that suitable personnel can be secured and trained for the duties required, which are entirely different from duties being performed by normal A.C.C. personnel. This would put them on the same basis as the British portion of the establishment.
3. I therefore request that :
  - (a) temporary approval be given at once for the American Provisional T.O. in order that the personnel etc., be provided to carry out the immediate work.
  - and
  - (b) final approval may be obtained as early as possible through the normal channels in order to regularise the position.

TO : Headquarters, A.A.I.

1. Reference the attached letter from the Army Sub-Commission, requesting a TO/WE, it is forwarded, strongly urging that either a separate T/O be established for the Army Sub-Commission or that the T/O of the 2675th Regiment be increased by the number of the American officers and enlisted men necessary to perform the tasks given to this Sub-Commission by AFHQ and by HQ, AAI.

2. It was intended originally and it appears logical that the Army, Navy and Air Force Sub-Commission, should have a separate T/O from Allied Control Commission. These sub-commissions function as directed by Army Headquarters. Their needs for personnel vary in proportion to the number and extent of the tasks given to them. The only ACC function which they perform is liaison with the heads of the Italian Government. This function can be performed by a very few officers and men. Their other functions are performed at the direction of and under the supervision of the Army Headquarters. These functions may be and have been increased to the point that ACC, and the 2675th Regiment, can not supply the necessary personnel, particularly enlisted, without disruption or complete cessation of other necessary activities. It is quite possible that further tasks will be given this Sub-Commission which will require revision of the T/O now requested.

3. The large number of unforeseen and additional tasks turned over to ACC requiring large numbers of personnel: Road maintenance for the Army, food warehousing and distribution, the processing of thousands of Italian Refugees and Refugees of foreign nationals (over 100,000 to date), as well as the necessity of carrying on the 2675th Regiment T/O, the personnel of the Military Sub-commissions, has become so serious as to threaten a breakdown in operation of other essential activities.

SUBJECT: American Officer Strength, ACC.

TO : MGS - AFHQ, APO 512.

Attention: Lt. Col. PANKHAY

Some two or three weeks ago, Col. Maxwell wrote to the Executive Commissioner in regard to personnel strength of ACC/AMC. At that time he stated that there would be no replacements coming from America to replace losses to the other theaters for whom we are furnishing officers and that the American Officer strength in this theater would be about 611. So far as I know, there has been no official publication indicating that ACC would be limited to a total of 611 officers. If there is such a limitation, please inform me at once.

General Sawbridge, G-1, AFHQ, on a visit here told us that there would be no objection to our filling vacancies as they occurred, from Limited Service personnel in Personnel Centers. This would seem to indicate that we could build up again to 829 officers which was the authorized strength of the 2675th Regiment. Thus far Personnel Centers have furnished us with Limited Service personnel on our request with such personnel with specified qualifications. I believe that we can get a considerable number of American officers qualified for duty in ACC by this method, however, I do not want to fill up the organization with Limited Service personnel and suddenly be confronted with the necessity of cutting down to 611 officers. In such an event they would undoubtedly require that we turn in to Personnel Centers officers physically qualified for combat duty. In some cases this would take key personnel and would be disastrous to the functioning of our activities. If it is necessary to function with 611 American officers I would much rather know it now than at a later date.

I have already recommended that you attempt to get from Personnel Centers in North Africa, certain types of qualified officers for Col. Gerry's group, which we are unable to furnish. I have not yet received a reply to that letter, but I am informed that a considerable number of Limited Service officers have been sent from here to North Africa. A Limited Service group seems to me to offer a chance for a large number of replacements and the possibility that we could regain the strength of 829 American officers.

Request that you confirm that the authorized strength in officers of the 2675th Regiment has not officially been changed and inform me as early as possible.

1. It is understood that approximately 60 EM/ORs are anticipated by Hq. A.C.C. for release by Region 3 under your telegram dated 12 March 1944 addressed to IES, DISTWO, a copy of which was forwarded to this Hq with note to submit full particulars of EM/ORs who can be released for operations.

2. During the past month Region 3 had a reduction in EM strength of 45, and also lost approximately 85 EM attached. These were experienced personnel trained in our operations. Their loss seriously interfered with our program. Adjustment has been made on the basis promised, that no substantial further reductions would be made.

3. The 85 EM and 85 ORs remaining constitute the absolute minimum required for current operations. Responsibility for the conduct of this Region during the present phase of reorganization cannot be assumed with less staff than now assigned.

During the six weeks immediately following the establishment of AMGOT headquarters in Palermo the volume of work was such that it was necessary for these men to work seven days weekly and usually three or four nights each week. This, they did cheerfully and without complaint, while other men in the headquarters were having one-half day weekly for recreation.

3. Because of a shortage of trained commissioned personnel in the early phases of the Sicilian campaign all of these soldiers have at various times been given responsibilities not ordinarily entrusted to enlisted personnel and they have always discharged these duties in a manner reflecting credit upon themselves and upon the service.

SUBJECT: Increased Allotment Enlisted Men to 2675 Regt., ACC.

TO : Commanding General, NATOUSA.

1. Request that the allotment of Enlisted Men to 2675th Regt., ACC (Provisional) be increased from a total of 1045 to 1605, with grades and ratings as indicated on the attached proposed T/O.
2. This request is made in order that the activities of AMG/ACC in Italy may be carried out with the efficiency necessary to the conservation of supplies and transport and personnel. The original allotment of 1045 EM's was based on the operation of AMG/ACC at a main headquarters and for Regions I to VI inclusive (see paper 5). At the time of the adoption of the above figure, Regions I, II and III were in the field and Region IV was in process of moving into the field. Region VI (Sardinia) had been activated with a reduced strength. It was recognized at once that the strength was insufficient for continued operation and a total of 2553 EM's was requested and disapproved until further operations could give a better picture of actual needs. This picture is now clear and it is believed that an absolute minimum of 1605 EMs are required.
3. Operations to date show that the handling and processing of Refugees require a considerable and varying number of officers and men not previously believed necessary. The receipt, warehousing and distribution of Civilian Supplies require a large total of officers and men to prevent losses of very large amounts of these supplies. Typhus control and other emergencies are continually occurring to further deplete the available men who can only be found by handicapping, or completely stopping other necessary operations. It appears certain that the ACC personnel in Regions cannot be drastically reduced for some time.
4. The accompanying T/O is based on the following:
  - a. ACC operation in Regions I to VI inclusive and a minimum of 75 EMs for each except Region VI.
  - b. AMG operation in Regions VIII to XII inclusive with a minimum of 150 EMs.
  - c. A total of 300 EMs at HQ ACC which is a reduction of 100 from the figure originally allotted to HQ.
  - d. The use of the men from Regions not yet active to reinforce the active Regions to the figures found by experience to be absolutely essential for present operation and for their operation for a considerable period after the Regions are returned to the Italian government. The EMs allotted to inactive Regions, also, constitute the reserve which must



used for the continuing emergencies such as Refugees, Displaced Persons, Civilian Supply, and epidemics.

5. The necessity for conservation of manpower, materiel, shipping and Supplies has been considered. The minimum number to make this all over conservation effective has been requested. If they are not allotted, additional personnel to the job must be detached from combat troops when emergencies arise. AMG/ACC personnel can and should be taken from personnel not completely fit for combat duty. Request urgent consideration of this matter on a high level.
