
Dear Norman:



Captain Thompson was good enough to advise me yesterday of the failure of ATOUSA to take action favorably upon my recommendation.

1. The subject of Major Bergin's note, attached, is, as he says, distasteful. But you will see that I am bound to do something about it. I have already spoken, some time ago, to Colonel Fiske who promised to see it through. What else can I do?

2. I, also, am somewhat "tired of being ranked by various fishfaces". Whatever may be the moods of those on high, I do not see what I have done to deserve what is becoming - in view of promotions taking place - an insult. And a very large number of people in the Commission think so.

1. This subject may be distasteful to you. It is to me. But it is of some importance. Will you listen quietly for a few minutes.

2. If you stay on it does not matter very much perhaps on our level. Though I feel it will be good for the branch and for us and for you as well as for Ted whom we are both blocking. It is a grave injustice that you have not been promoted. I have mentioned it before to your Brig; if I did it now it would be put down to pure self interest. But it must be said that my promotion would certainly do your case no harm. And if you want ~~xxxxxxxx~~ a written ~~xxxxxx~~ statement that I do not want to be head of the branch and will always regard you as the master here it is. For other arguments on the basis of sentence one of this paragraph see ~~xxxxxxxx~~ (4) below. 397

3. If you do not stay on - and I am more concerned in this respect with your own statements than with other rumours - the thing becomes of ~~xxxx~~ greater importance for me. I shall probably be told what to do not having your freedom of choice in the matter. If I have to stay it will not be pleasant to be outranked by one or two likely candidates that will immediately suggest themselves. If I am reassigned I want the security of higher rank to give me a little choice in my destiny and again in the possible choice of my superiors. 38

4. General reflection. I realize that on the scale of absolute values I have no case. Nor do such things matter. On the scale of relative values I am getting very tired of being ranked by various fishfaces whose superiority I find hard to justify either on an absolute or relative scale. I have had 23 months (as these things are now counted) in this grade; rightly or wrongly the ratings have been good. And I scan the lists of promotions with some natural reactions which I will not bother to describe to you as you can imagine them. I am, oddly enough, human.

5. If you are at all impressed with this will you regard it as urgent.



1. On the 13 August 45 the Chief Commissioner, in his letter 10/94/EST, subject Allotment of American Officer Grades - Allied Commission, addressed to General Lemnitser, Acting Chief of Staff, MTOUSA, protested the distribution of officer grades as authorized in MTOUSA's letter of 30 July 45. The practical effect of the 30 July T/O was to completely block all promotions in grades above the rank of Captain.

2. On 24 August General Lemnitser replied, file AG 221.02/500 COS-0, subject Allotment of American Officer Grades, authorizing a favorable allotment which would permit promotions to the grade of Lieutenant Colonel.

3. Accordingly, on the 8 September 45 the Commission sent forward to Headquarters Command recommendations for promotion of 14 majors to lieutenant Colonel and 23 lieutenants to captain. These recommendations were forwarded in full compliance with all existing regulations and fully covered by vacancies existing at the time in accordance with the T/O as authorized in General Lemnitser's letter of 24 August 45. Actually there were 17 vacancies for lieutenant colonel and 36 in the grade of captain. Hence, there was no reason to believe that these promotion recommendations would run into opposition as a result of the T/O position.

4. On 10 September this headquarters was notified that before any officers would be considered for promotion they would have to ~~392~~ 393 394 the certificate volunteering to remain on active service for the duration plus six months. Certificates were obtained from 9 majors and 12 lieutenants. These were subsequently forwarded to Headquarters Command, but not in time for consideration before the MTOUSA Board which met on the 11th. Accordingly, they were held over until the Board meeting of the 22nd. Meanwhile, on the 19 September, Colonel Fiske personally talked with Colonel Hyde, Assistant G-1, MTOUSA, and was given verbal assurance that the Commission's recommendations for field grade promotions would be given favorable consideration. The Board approved the promotion of 17 lieutenants to captain and disapproved all other recommendations. This headquarters has been informed that such disapproval was made in anticipation of a new T/O.

5. It will be observed that while such action is entirely the prerogative of the MTOUSA Promotion Board, it was directly contrary to primary purpose behind the T/O as approved by General Lemnitser as a result of the Chief Commissioner's protest regarding blocking of field grade promotions.

TO : S.O. to Chief Commissioner

1. Reference is made to letter, Agriculture Division, Lombardia Region, 3 September 1945, Subject: Promotion of James F. Keim, Captain, Spec. Res., and to 1st Indorsement, HQ., Lombardia Region, thereon.

2. This officer was originally recommended for promotion on 18 October 1944 by letter from the Director, Agriculture Sub-Commission, HQ., A.C. He was at that time assigned to Lazio-Umbria Region. The Promotion Board had met two days previously. Despite the absence of a formal recommendation, he was then considered for promotion. Of these officers considered at that time for promotion, some 13 were recommended to MTOUSA -- None were promoted. *380*

3. This officer's recommendation was again considered at the meeting of the Promotion Board on 14 November 1945. No action was taken on the promotion of Captains to Major. *380*

4. At the meeting of the Promotion Board on 1 December, Captain Keim was again considered, but not recommended for promotion. Of 60 Captains then recommended for promotion to Major, only 11 were junior to this officer. This officer's WDAGO Form 66-1 showed, as of 1 December 1944, the following entries:

5 Nov. 43 - 31 Dec. 43                    Excellent  
1 Jan. 44 - 30 June 44                    Very satisfactory  
For the period 1 July 44 to 31 Dec. 44 he was rated "Superior".

5. At the meeting of the Promotion Board 15 February 1945, Captain Keim's promotion was again considered. Fourteen recommendations for promotions from Captain to Major were forwarded. No officer junior to Captain Keim was recommended.

6. Colonel Poletti's recommendation for Captain Keim's promotion was received on 25 March 1945.

7. There have been no vacancies in the grade of Major for the Promotion board to consider since its meeting of 15 February.

8. Captain Keim was recommended for award of the Legion of Merit. The Awards and Decorations Board, HQ., A.C., reduced this to a recommendation for citation in General Orders, which was awarded per G.O. 25, Headquarters Command, A.F., 1 September 1945.




3. While these figures do not meet your request, they do correspond to the current normal spread of grades specified by the War Department. This adjustment will allow a limited number of promotions in those most worthy cases.

4. It is realized that stagnating of promotions has an adverse effect on the morale of officers; however, this situation exists in all units in the theater. Current promotion policy precludes up-grading allotments to provide spaces for promotion, except in most exceptional cases, and where such up-grading is definitely justified in order to place the unit on a normal spread of grades corresponding to that authorized by the War Department.

1. I refer to MACUSA letter of 30 July 1945, AG 221.0 /500 C-0, subject as above, addressed to the Commanding Officer, 267th Regiment, AC, copy attached.

2. The distribution of officer grades set forth in this letter represents a sharp - and most disturbing - divergence from previous policy and one upon which the Commission, contrary to past practice, unfortunately was not consulted. The activities of the Commission, which you appreciate, are not comparable to those of the normal military unit. Hence, the relative number of officers of the various grades required, so that the Commission's tasks may be efficiently performed, cannot be laid down on a basis parallel to that of the average regiment.

3. In order to arrive at a reasonable distribution of grades, within the present authorized strength, the following points appear pertinent:

a. The previous grade breakdown for American officers of the Commission, as laid down in T/C letters from NATUSA and MACUSA, maintained a consistent percentage level, as follows:

b. Following the placing of the Commission's American officer T/C on a "grade immaterial" basis, 21st Dec '44, the promotion policy of the Commission was based on the understanding that, despite changes in overall strength, the distribution of grades would remain similar to that previously allotted.

c. The cessation of American Officer promotions, since April of this year, has not had a salutary effect upon the morale of American officer personnel of the Commission, especially since, on the British side, promotions have gone steadily on - some 47 promotions having been made since

that time, 42 of which have been in the field grades.

5. In order that American officers who have for long period filled highly responsible and important positions may be given ranks consistent with the tasks they are performing, I consider it vital that action be taken to revise the current allotment. As the matter stands, it is now often necessary to place American officers in subordinate positions, with the result that the efficient maintenance of a balanced Commission policy may well be impaired.

6. Set forth below is a proposed revision of our present allotment. You will note that it is not inconsistent with the distribution of past allotments, and that it furnishes a far more realistic comparison with the present British War Establishment:

c. Recommendations for promotion will include the above figures as the current authorized strength.

d. For purposes of promotion, a vacancy may be considered to exist when an officer or enlisted person has been designated for release by name, and orders have been issued setting release date. Any such individual selected for release by the unit or activity, or considered for release, will not be considered eligible

b. Personnel assigned to units or activities that are under orders for discontinuance will not be considered eligible for promotion.

5. Any previous instructions that are in conflict with the provisions of this letter are hereby rescinded.

MEMORANDUM TO: Chief Commissioner  
 SUBJECT: American Officers' Promotions.

1. The Establishment Section is redrafting a letter for your signature protesting the inequality of the new Table of Organization which was set up by MTOUSA for the 2675 Regiment on 30 July 1945.

2. Briefly, the situation may be summarized as follows: on the 30th of July, MTOUSA, file AG 221.02/500-CO, assigned a new Table of Organization to the Regiment without any prior consultation with AC. This new Table of Organization reverses the concentration of high rank as compared to the company grades that has always been allowed to the Regiment as an AC/AG organization. For example, both T/O's that were approved by NATOUS, 3 June 44 and 26 October 44, had 53% and 51% respectively, of the allotted grades concentrated in the field ranks (Major and higher) as contrasted with the new July 30th T/O which allows only 31% of the vacancies to the field grades. The effect of this reversal is to completely block all promotions in ranks above the grade of Captain. The promotion policy of the organization since inception has been based on a T/O in which the rank was concentrated in the higher grades.

3. Accordingly, to rectify this situation it is proposed that the July 30th T/O be revised to conform, percentage-wise, with the T/O's under which this organization has continually operated since inception. A brief table of comparison is presented below:
