90THE MISERY OF BEING WAUGH

A certain Sidney Waugh, officer of AMG in Italy since the beginning of the Mediterranean campaign, published a series of diffusions on Italy, such as :

- 1) mistrust as to Italy's becoming a democratic Country
- 2) Italy may be the cause of a new World war because of her natural aversion for the Allies
- 3) the Italian population ready to welcome Mussolini if he resuscitated
- 4) if the American soldiers could express their opinion they would wish for the disbanding of the Italian Army
- 5) murdering of American soldiers by Italians
- 6) Italian partisans heroes of the "sixth day"

To note : This person, so-called sculptor and winner of the "Premio Roma" in 1929 declares to know Italy very well because he lived here before the war and also knows the language perfectly.

What can one answer to this sequel of shameless lies ? We would not have taken any notice of this "accouchement" of Capt. Waugh's delirious brain if it had not been accepted by such an important newspaper as the NEW YORK TIMES. We would have no objection to all this if this person did not belong to the Allied Military Government "controlling" our Country from his comfortable armchair.

We make a man to man appeal to all qualified American correspondents that the calumnies of this person ("messere") be denounced to the public opinion of the United States of America.

We ask Admiral Stone to send Mr. Waugh to a less dangerous place than among Italian "marderers".

We are poor, beaten and discouraged, perhaps because we are worn out. But even if we had won, and especially because we had won, we would certainly not have flung such calumnies at a poor and beaten people.

Maybe because, more than gentlemen, we are, "malgre' tout" men, and therefore human.

What, however, is surely at the bottom of it all is, that this Mr. Waugh lived a long time in Fascist Italy and, having enjoyed it thoroughly, has perfectly acquired the exquisite Fascist style and morals.

(U.P.) - Today's NEW YORK TIMES publishes an interview with Capt. Sidney Waugh who has been with the AMG in Italy ever since the beginning of the Mediterranean Campaign.

Capt. S. Waugh, a sculptor who was awarded the "Premio Roma" in 1929, knows Italy well having lived there before the war and speaks the language fluently, has expressed his mistrust that Italy will become a democratic Country and fears that the obvious aversion of the Italian people towards the Allies may lead to another war in the near future.

Capt. Waugh is convinced that, even though the Italians executed Mussolini, they would be more than ready to welcome him again if, by some miracle he came to life and presented himself as the saviour of Italy. He also said it is useless to try and hide with weak lies the undeniable fact of the antagonism existing between American and Italian soldiers and added that all the men in V Army - excluding those of Italian origin - "could freely express their opinion, they would ask for the disbanding of the Italian Army and for the Country to be treated as the vilest of the conquered Nations which, Capt. Waugh asserts, she undoubtedly is."

He also states that Italians continue to murder American soldiers and that they must continually look out for all sorts of acts of tyranny and dishonesty.

"Actually the Italians don't make the slightest effort to hide their dislike of the Americans. Their hope and claim that Italy become once more a first class Power, instead of a fourth or fifth which she is in reality, may cause a new war in Southern Europe if the Allied Powers are not more than careful."

Capt. S. Waugh ended up by saying that the so-called Italian Partisans gave very scarce signs of life before the break-through of the "Gustav Line", and that they really appeared on the scene only after Germany's defeat had become a fact.

COMMENT

It is extremely serious that an Officer of the AMG, regardless of his duties towards his uniform and his post, permits himself to utter such a lot of lies and nonsense.

We have no need to belie this individual as this has already been taken care of by responsible American men such as Gen. Mark Clark, Commander of the V Army. The remainder is a disciplinary matter to be handled by the American AMG to whom this shameful incident (the shame of which falls solely on the individual responsible of conscious calumny) may be a lesson: that it is never profitable to anyone to send a dishonest wretch around the World.

1. Attached is a copy of a letter dated 11 Aug 1945 written by the Air Forces Sub Commission Rome and signed C.J. Eggstaff, Lt.Col. Air Corps, which was handed to an Italian named D'Onofrio.

2. Armed with this, this Italian civilian made his way into AFHQ for the purpose of demanding an interview with his sons, who are apparently ex members of the Fascist Republican Army, and as such are said to be held in PW status.

3. No action has been taken by this HQ.

4. Please take steps to ensure that in future civilians are not given unaddressed notes of this sort which are liable to lead to their making irregular approaches to this HQ.

It is said that the new Allied Provincial Commissioner for Florence, Colonel LESTER J. HENSLEY, American, is showing great mistrust to all the civilian Italian Authorities, and that his behaviour is rude. Everybody is convinced that he feels great contempt for the Italian people.

At a meeting in the office of the Prefect, in the presence of the President of the C.T.L.N., all the technical staff of the Prefecture and the Province, representatives of the C.G.L.P as well as agriculturists, tradespeople and manufacturers, for the study of problems connected with national reconstruction, Colonel Lester J. Hensley is supposed to have said that all that the Italians are able to do is chattering, and that, for the reconstruction problems, nobody but himself was to deal with them in the province.

Col. LESTER J. HENSLEY asked the identity card of H. E. Cora, a well known Italian diplomatist, also well known by the Allies, who, a few days ago, came to pay his respects to him, and also because he had had very friendly relations with the former Provincial Commissioner, Col. Radice, a most courteous and well mannered man. Offended, H. E. Cora cut short the interview and left.

Among other things, Colonel LESTER J. HENSLEY asks that all the letters sent to him by the R. Prefecture be written in English, which will make it necessary to take a certain number of interpreters.

In reference with the note of May 9th of the Comando of the C.C.R.E., a letter of May 15th, by H.E. Ambassador GIULIANO CORA confirmed that Colonel HENSLEY, American, Allied Provincial Commissioner in Florence, was rude to the above mentioned diplomatic official.

H.E. Cora who had gone to pay his respects to Col. Hensley was requested by him to show his papers, under the pretence that in Italy, you never know whom you may be speaking to; The Ambassador stated he had nothing to ask and that he had only come to call, because of the friendly relations he had had with the predecessor of the Allied officer; he got up abruptly, turned round and left.

The Ambassador added that this is Col. Hensley's usual attitude, for he usually speaks rudely and contemptuously to the Italians.



Dear Henaley:

I have recently received a letter from the Theater Commander bringing to my attention the disclosures by you of certain information concerning the alleged mistreatment of German women held in Prisoner-of-war Enclosure 334 at Scandicci. This information was apparently turned over to Mr. Myron Taylor, who in turn contacted the Theater Commander.

This resulted in embarrassment to the Theater Commander and necessitated a great deal of time-consuming investigation by officers of Headquarters British and the Peninsula base section. I am informed that the facts developed by this investigation disclose that you were not well informed and that the information given by you to Mr. Taylor was not factual.

The Theater Commander directs that under no conditions are you to give information of this character to persons not in the military service. Whenever you have knowledge of conditions that, in your opinion, require action by higher authority, you should bring the matter to the attention of the proper commander through military channels.

Please acknowledge receipt of this letter.

1. Recently Mr. Myron Taylor telephoned the Theater Commander repeating certain information he had obtained from a Colonel Lester Hensley, the Provincial Commissioner for Florence Province, regarding alleged mistreatment of German women held in Prisoner-of-War Enclosure 334 at Scandicci.

2. Colonel Hensley's action resulted in embarrassment to the Theater Commander and necessitated a great deal of time-consuming investigation by officers of this headquarters and the Peninsula Base Section. The facts developed by this investigation disclose that Colonel Hensley was not well-informed and that the information given by him to Mr. Taylor was not factual.

3. General McNaury directs that you caution this officer against giving information of this character to persons not in the military service. If this officer has knowledge of conditions that, in his opinion, require action by higher authority, he should bring the matter to the attention of the proper commander through military channels.



1. Attached hereto are copies of correspondence regarding a seizure of olive oil in Foggia Province. The truck carried 3 qtls hidden in a false bottom and 8 gals in tins. An Italian civilian accompanying the shipment was in possession of a letter from Lt Col Richard DEACHIRCK (Air Corps) to Capt Clayton TRIGGS (Displaced Persons Sub-Commission). The letter mentioned a consignment of oil and refers to the Italian in charge of it as a "swell guy" who would be a nice fellow for Captain TRIGGS to know. It proceeds to say that Col DEACHIRCK will see Captain TRIGGS on the 12th October and will "bring him more oil".

2. It is possible that Lt Col DEACHIRCK knew nothing of the hidden 3 qtls and is merely referring to the 8 gals which were in the vehicle and that the 8 gals and the further consignment are intended for private consumption. Even then Lt Col DEACHIRCK has transgressed orders by sending a private letter by an Italian and by purchasing amassable food stuffs. But a far more sinister implication arises if the letter actually refers to the 3 qtls of hidden oil and if the 3 qtls are intended for re-sale on the black market in Rome for a personal profit which might amount to 50,000 lire to 100,000 lire..

3. Under the circumstances, it is suggested that it would be in the interests of all concerned for a very thorough inquiry to be made into the circumstances. It may be possible to intercept the second shipment and thus discover the scale of these operations. A telephone message has been sent to you to-day suggesting this course.







SUBJECT: Promotions

TO : Regional Commissioner, Toscana Region

1. Reference is made to your letter of 28 January addressed to Brigadier M. S. Lush, C.B., C.B.E., M.C., Chief of Staff, Allied Commission, concerning the promotions of U.S. officers. The allegations which you make are of a very serious nature, reflecting on the integrity and/or administrative efficiency of senior American officers of the Commission who deal with promotions. I shall see to it that an exhaustive investigation is conducted and every conceivable effort made to ascertain the facts.

2. It appears that these allegations are six in number:

a. That promotions are manipulated in favor of officers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotions.

b. That practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted without regard for the comparative importance of his position. 492

c. That practically every officer in the Legal Subcommission has been promoted.

d. That certain regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a region have been promoted out of proportion to promotions in regions actually functioning as such.

e. That willfully, or through gross inefficiency, promotions are sidetracked because the promotion recommendations are lost at the Headquarters of the Commission.

f. That a promotion lobby exists at Headquarters Allied Commission which is operated to the disadvantage of Toscana Region, which does not have such a lobby.

3. It is my earnest desire that all of the facts bearing on the above allegations may be adduced. I should, therefore, be grateful to you if you would provide me with factual evidence on which the allegations are based and with all pertinent supplemental information in your possession which will aid in the investigation.

4. As you are no doubt aware, recommendations for promotions of U.S. officers are passed upon by a board of officers at Headquarters of the Commission, consisting of myself and the following: Colonel Parkin, Executive Officer, U.S. and Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment; Colonel Chapman, Director, Public Safety Subcommission and Senior U.S. Officer at Headquarters of the Civil Affairs Section; Colonel Densmore, Chief Staff Officer, Economic Section and sometimes Acting Vice President, Economic Section. In order to set some limit to the scope of the investigation, I propose that it be confined to the period of the last five months, which is to say, from 19 September 1944, on which date I was appointed Director, Establishment Branch, in addition to other duties, to the present.

5. The officers concerned are most desirous that the investigation be full and complete and that the facts, with respect to the six allegations, be established beyond any reasonable doubt. I trust, therefore, that you will be specific and detailed in the evidence you supply and the information you furnish.

Dear Brigadier,

1. The manner in which the promotions of American officers has been handled in HQ. AC has caused much dissatisfaction among American officers in the field. There appears to be ample reason to believe that promotions are manipulated in favor of certain officers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotion. First, practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted, regardless of the comparative importance of his position. Then, too, practically every officer in the Legal Sub-Commission has been promoted. Also certain Regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a Region, have been promoted out of proportion to the promotions in Regions actually functioning as such.

2. As an example of an unaccountable promotion, Major (now Lt. Col.) Curry CARTER has, with the exception of a very short time ~~400~~, been doing duty in my Region either as an assigned or attached officer for more than six months. I have not recommended him for promotion. His work while quite satisfactory does not compare either in importance or in quality with that of at least three Heads of Divisions, and one Provincial Commissioner, in TOSCANA Region who have been recommended but not promoted. Moreover, he has not had as long a time in grade as either of the three Majors (two Heads of Divisions and one Provincial Commissioner) recommended by me for promotion.

3. One of the usual causes of sidetracking promotions is losing the recommendation in HQ. AC. This has happened several times. One must conclude that this is done either wilfully or through gross inefficiency.

4. The officers of this Region are fully occupied with their duties in the provinces and at Region Headquarters. This Region has not and cannot maintain a promotion lobby at HQ. AC. It must depend upon HQ. AC to look after its interests. This appears not to have been done.

Moreover, it is especially requested that the recommendations made for the promotion of Heads of Divisions and Provincial Commissioners be given prompt and favorable consideration.

1. Captain CONAN and I did occupy room number 526 at the Excelsior Hotel, Florence, Italy, on the night of 18 October 1944.
2. We left the Hotel the morning of 19 October 1944.
3. Except that the room had been slept in, it was in exactly the same condition at the time we left as it was at the time we entered it.
4. We checked in, if I recall correctly, late in the afternoon. We washed and immediately went to dinner in the dining room of the Hotel. We then took a little walk, conversed in the sitting room for a while with friends, and retired to bed at about 9 p.m. The next morning we arose at about 7 a.m., washed, had breakfast and left.
5. Whether the damage referred to existed prior to our occupancy I did not observe, whether it was done by any subsequent occupants I, of course, am not in a position to say. It is certain, however, that during our occupancy not a thing was touched by Captain CONAN or by me.
6. I feel, that not only have we been charged with something about which we haven't the slightest knowledge, but apparently have also been convicted of it without the usual formality of an investigation to determine the facts.
7. In conclusion, I desire to voice my innocence, my resentment of being practically convicted without the benefit of a proper investigation or hearing, and suggest that because of the apparent gravity of the charge, that a full and immediate investigation be conducted. -

In response to the letter of 31<sup>st</sup> October 1944, of the Headquarters Florence Command, wherein certain charges are made against Captain GULOTTA and COVAS, I submit the following facts:

1. Capt.Gulotta and I did occupy room 526 at the Excelsior Hotel,Florence on the night of 18<sup>th</sup> October 1944.
2. The room at the time of occupancy was in good order so far as was apparent to the eye.-
3. The room at time we left, the morning of 19 October 1944, was in the exact same condition with the exception that the beds were undone.
4. If any wires had been cut or anything missing prior to our occupancy it was not apparent to me.
5. That Captain Gulotta and or I cut the wires referred to and removed from the room one light bulb,one bulb holder, and one plug I most vehemently deny.
6. The charge made imputes to me ~~maliciousness~~,vandalism and larceny apparently made without any previous investigation as to who the culprit may have been,if those things did happen.-
7. Further,not only are we charged with something we know nothing about but we apparently have been convicted of it because the letter of Headquarters Florence Command date 31<sup>st</sup> October 1944 states:

"4.-Request appropriate disciplinary action and that the named Officers be required to pay full cost of repairs and/or replacements needed and that this Headquarters be advised of final action taken.."

8. I feel that the charge is entirely unjustified, the tone of the above mentioned letter unwarranted and request an immediate and full investigation of all facts as the charge of larceny against an Officer of the U.S.Army is most serious and should be either proven or we should be completely exonerated.-

I made a note of these items and reported them to the management. I assumed the damages were caused by the officers who occupied room 526 as I check all rooms against the room property inventory sheet before the room is reported as ready for occupancy. I had done this in the case of room 526 before it was occupied on Oct. 18, 1944."

1. I refer to your letter 67/16/GOS of the 20 November to DCOS Establishment Section, which has been forwarded to me.

2. On the night of 17/18 November during my tour as Duty Officer, Lt. Col. Friend James telephoned me at about the time stated and gave me a message which he wishes delivered to Major Talbot. He stated that Major Talbot could be contacted at Brigadier Lush's villa. There was never any mention of delivering the message to the GOS Office in the morning.

3. Immediately after receiving the message I telephoned the GOS's villa and spoke to an orderly who stated that Major Talbot was out. He left the telephone on my instructions to enquire where Major Talbot could be located urgently and was replaced almost immediately by Col. Graffey Smith, to whom I explained that I had an urgent message from Lt. Col. Friend James to Major Talbot. Col. Graffey Smith, upon being told to be expecting that such a message might be delivered and I therefore gave him the text, at which he remarked that he was also interested and would deal with the matter. Having no other means of locating Major Talbot on the evening in question, I considered that the message was left in most capable hands.

4. It should be observed that the message was given to me in a most cryptic form with no reference to Siens or to a "political" meeting.

SUBJECT: Reprimand under the 10th Article of War.

TO : Lt. Col. T. V. Smith, Education Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, APO 394, U. S. Army.

1. On or about 15 September 1944, while a member of this command, you wrote and mailed a letter to Miss Nancy Smith, Matteson, Illinois. In this letter you made statements that were in violation of Military Censorship regulations.

2. The purpose of Military Censorship is to prevent information getting into the hands of our enemies, and thereby to prevent loss of lives, battles, or even the loss of the war. It is apparent that you have failed to realize the seriousness of your violation. The mere fact of your signature on the lower left hand corner of the envelope, which you posted, is a certificate that you read, understood and complied with Military Censorship regulations.

3. As an officer of the Army of the United States, you must conform loyally to all regulations, or else be delinquent in the discharge of your duties. I trust that you realize the absolute necessity among military men for obedience, and that you will give unselfishly of your best efforts in the accomplishment of our present mission. I shall expect you to always conform loyally to all regulations.

4. For your action, I reprimand you and admonish you that any future repetition will be dealt with promptly and effectively.
