Clarification second sentence paragraph 2 cited EX 50262 regarding civil affairs officers which reads: "date agreed on must be subsequent to date officer becomes eligible for relief from active duty" follows.

"date officer becomes eligible for relief from active duty" is date critical score is equal to or below officers adjusted service rating score. One whose MOS is included on list of scarce categories officer specialists may be retained 6 months beyond date of his separation eligibility without his consent. One officer may be continued on extended active duty beyond 6 months period referred to in preceding sentence with his consent by signing specified volunteer statement.

If an officer whose MOS is on list scarce categories of officer specialists consents to remain on active duty for a period which expires less than 6 months from date of his separation eligibility he may be retained without his consent for remaining portion of 6 months period but not longer

1. In compliance with paragraph 2 of basic communication, this correspondence is being referred to your headquarters per REPCO radio J 12624.

2. There is an extreme scarcity of qualified officers for duty in the Allied Commission and not one of the officers can be released for temporary duty elsewhere without placing an increased load of duties and responsibilities on the remaining officers. All of these officers are holding positions for which replacements are not available. As can be seen from the attached description of assignments and locations, their duties range from director of a sub-commission to regional specialist officers, to officers in scarce categories. When Admiral Stone, the Chief Commissioner of the Allied Commission makes a personal appeal to Gen. Spofford, Deputy Chief of Staff, G-5 AFHQ, it can be clearly understood how urgently necessary it is that these officers be retained for full duty.

3. Unless this headquarters receives information of the contrary, it will assume that no further action will be taken to send any of these officers on detached service to the University Training Command, Florence.

5. If members of your Sub-Commission know of other Allied personnel who might be able to speak effectively on one or more of these topics, will you please likewise notify the Education Subcommission?

1. Herewith is file of correspondence re the attendance at a proposed course of studies in personnel utilization and work simplification of Allied Commission officers. The course is to be run by MTOUSA, and expected to last about two weeks. Upon its completion, the officers detailed to it will return to A.C.
 2. MTOUSA has previously asked for the names of officers with industrial or engineering backgrounds to be placed on TD there, these officers to remain at MTOUSA for an indefinite period. This matter has been cleared, with the submission of Lt. Colonel Rorimer's name. In addition, MTOUSA requested several other officers whose names had not been submitted.
 3. General McKinley has discussed this at some length with General Nelson, the Deputy Theater Commander. General McKinley is anxious that advantage be taken of the course by detailing to it the officers whose training along these lines would be of most advantage to the Commission, i.e., those in key administrative positions. In discussing the matter today, General McKinley stated that, should the courses be given, as contemplated, it was in his opinion essential that clearance from the employing activity of the officers to be detailed be regarded as desirable, but not necessary. The very point that the officers in question are holding key jobs points up the value of their attendance at the course. General McKinley further stated that, at present, the course was projected, might not be held, and that as yet no firm date for the opening thereof had been set.
 4. Would you discuss, at the next Executive Commissioner's meeting, or with Col. Fiske, in the light of the point that attempts to clear a two-week period of TD for these officers have not met with success, General McKinley's suggestion that the detail of these officers be made a matter of high-level directive, rather than to engage in further attempts to secure consent from their Sections and/or Sub-Commissions.

SUBJECT: Request for Specialist Officers in Piemonte Region

TO : Economic Section, HQ AG

1. Reference is made to an action memorandum of the Economic Section dated 21 December 1944, /ES on the subject: "Request for Specialist Officers in Piemonte Region".

2. The memorandum of the Commerce Officer, Piemonte Region, dated 25 November 1944, Ref. No. 320 with the endorsement of the Regional Commissioner referred to was apparently submitted to this Sub-Commission for information only and no action appeared to be required thereon. This Sub-Commission is in agreement with the functions laid down for Regional Commerce officers in the memorandum but does not consider that it would be possible to meet the request of the Regional Commissioner to assign at least one Commerce officer to each province in addition to one Commerce officer for the Regional HQ, owing to the limited number of officers available on the T/O of the AG.

3. In response to an inquiry from the Regional Commissioner, Toscana Region dated 23 November 1944, ES/664/1, with regard to Regional Staff Organization and in particular to the setting up of a Supply Division, this Sub-Commission put forward its recommendations in the form of a memorandum to the Economic Section, dated 8 December 1944, AG/5018/Commerce, which, if adopted, would serve as a basis for the organization of Economic Divisions in all Regions and would effect a considerable economy of personnel, as against the proposal put forward by Piemonte Region.

4. This memorandum was discussed in the Staff Conference of the Economic Section of 15 December 1944. As all Sub-Commissions of the Economic Section would be interested, if the proposal were approved, copies were circulated to each, but, since to date no decision has apparently been arrived at, no further consideration has been given to the problem.

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5. While this Sub-Commission is at all times prepared to give consideration to the internal organization of Regions insofar as it may affect Commerce operations in the field, it does not feel that actual procurement of the personnel required to implement such organization is a matter with which it ought to be called upon to concern itself.

SUBJECT: Regional Staff Organization

TO : Economic Section, HQ AC

1. Ref. 517/30/COS of Dec. 5th 1944 to Economic Section, enclosing XVIII/664/4 of Nov. 29th 1944.

2. Commerce Sub-Commission is in agreement with the recommendation made by the Reg. Commissioner of Reg. VIII that at regional level, activities so interrelated as general supply, food, industry and commerce should be combined in one division of separate sections. It is however pointed out that other activities such as transportation, agriculture and finance and Public Works & Utilities are also closely interrelated with those previously mentioned that they should be combined as separate sections in the Regional Supply Division, or Regional Economic Division.

3. Regarding the query raised in para 3 of XVIII/66A/4 with respect to P.O.L. the responsible section at Regional level should be Commerce.

4. The activities of all specialist officers at Regional level should be limited to the functions pertaining to their particular section and should be subject to the technical and operational instructions of their Sub-Commission with whom they should correspond direct.

The functions of the officer in charge of the Regional Supply or Regional Economic Division should be to act in an advisory capacity to the Regional Commissioner and to coordinate the activities of the specialist officers in the Division at Regional HQ and the operations of the Provincial Supply Officer.

5. The functions of the Provincial Supply Officer should also be clarified. Since the burden of economic operations has rested upon the Provincial Supply Officer, in the populous and industrial areas of the North, the responsibilities can be divided into two categories, subsistence and non-subsistence, with a Provincial officer over each category separated as from the Provincial Transportation Officer, Provincial Finance Officer, etc.

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a) These two Supply functions can be named:

- (1) Food Officer, who can handle agriculture problems related to food supply, in coordination with the Regional Agricultural Officer;

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(2- Materials Officer, who handles P.O.I., nonsubsistence materials, controlled items, industry, coal, charcoal etc.

b) Such arrangement would clarify relationships with the Regional Sections and define responsibilities.

c) It would lighten the burden of the Provincial Supply officer in the creation of, and liaison with, Italian Provincial agencies, Consorzio Agrario, S.E.P.R.A.L., Chambers of Commerce, C.I.P., etc.
