1. On 5 and 6 November 45 promotion recommendations were sent forward on Tec 5 Carlos A. Mena, 32640084, and Tec 3 Eligio Lithgow, Jr., ASN 32409750 (both Class II volunteers). To date no acknowledgment has been received nor has action been taken. The desirability of making these promotions still remains.
2. Tec3 Lithgow has been in grade for more than 18 months. He is now serving as relief stenographer to the Chief Commissioner. In this capacity he is continually taking dictation, handling and processing AC/AMG problems on the highest level of this Commission. His responsibilities in this respect are equalled nowhere else in the Commission and fully justify his recommended promotion.
3. Tec 5 Mena has worked for the Office of the Chief Commissioner for five months, during the greater portion of which he has performed the duties of Chief Clerk of the Chief Commissioner's Office. He has clearly demonstrated his ability to carry out his highly important responsibilities in a most efficient manner. His promotion is urgently recommended.
4. Also recommended at this time are Pfc Peter P. Rosaschi, ASN 39903451, and Pfc Richard M. Winfrey, ASN 33861591, to Corporal. Pfc Rosaschi is the Chief Commissioner's call secretary handling all outgoing and incoming calls to the Chief Commissioner, as well as arranging for and clearing appointments. This task involves a thorough knowledge of the Italian language and requires careful, diplomatic clearance of calls with important personalities like the Supreme Allied Commander and the Prime Minister of the Italian Government. In brief, he serves as a general secretary to the staff officer and aide to the Chief Commissioner. Pfc Winfrey has been in the Office of the Chief Commissioner for the past two months and is assigned as Assistant File Clerk in which capacity he clears, checks, processes documents of all classifications that are handled by the Office of the Chief Commissioner.

Dear Colonel Thomas:

The bearer of this letter, Corporal Ralph Gesualdi, is, I understand, an employee of Consolidated Edison, and, upon release from the military service, will return to his post with you.

As his immediate commanding officer for a period of a year, and on the basis of frequent contact subsequently, let me say, at the outset, that Gesualdi has done a bang-up job in every sense of the word. That is the first half of the story.

The second half of the story is that he has not, for reasons beyond the control of the Allied Commission, been appointed to a grade commensurate with the job he was doing, or to the responsibilities which he assumed and carried with great credit to himself.

From the first week in November, 1943, to the last week of October, 1944, Gesualdi was under my direct supervision, as Assistant Adjutant General and Adjutant of Allied Military Government/Allied Control Commission/Allied Commission. Subsequent to that time, I have had frequent occasion to observe the quality of his work, as Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Staff, Allied Commission.

His job, at the beginning, was that of a registry clerk - keeping track of incoming and outgoing documents. He held at that time the rating of Pfo. Within two weeks after his assignment to Hq, Allied Military Government, I made him Assistant Chief Clerk of the Miscellaneous Section, Adjutant General's Section. With the merger of Hq, AMG and Allied Control Commission, the Miscellaneous Section became the Adjutant's Department, and a total of 73 enlisted men and civilian employees were assigned to it. The complexity of the operation you can well imagine, since it involved, among other things, the routing of all Allied Commission incoming correspondence, signals, the operation of a large internal message center, and the supervision of an extensive private courier service.

For over a year, Corporal Gesualdi was carrying the responsibilities and doing the job of a Master Sergeant or Warrant Officer (jg). After repeated recommendations (my files indicate a total of six) he was finally promoted to Corporal. During this entire period, working under the most disheartening conditions, he displayed qualities of leadership, intelligence and initiative far above the normal call of duty. His tact, sympathy, and skill in dealing with a difficult personnel situation were inspiring.

Consolidated Edison is lucky to get him back. Good administrative personnel does not grow on trees, and he is one of the best. I should be more than glad to have him serve under me at any time in the future.
