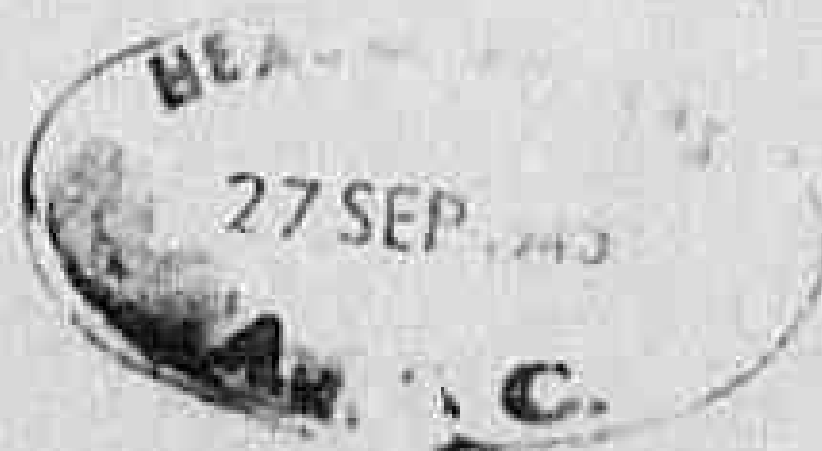

My dear Maurice:

I sent you a telegram today about Colonel Carl M. Gervers and this is in amplification of the telegram.

The position is that Carl came across to see me yesterday evening from Verona and has been across again this morning. He is not a bit happy in the Austria set-up and is desperately anxious to get back with us. He thinks that General Lewis and General Florie would in fact be prepared to let him go as they have several senior officers for whom they would have to find occupations.

I should be exceedingly glad to have Carl back with me and he would be very useful. In saying this I want to make it absolutely clear that I have received magnificent support from Tom Page and that I have complete and friendly confidence in him. I know however that he himself feels that he has not sufficient time to do really and effectively the two tasks of Regional Public Health Officer and Deputy Commissioner. The matter is rather urgent because if something is not done very quickly to release Carl he will be swept into Austria and then it will be very difficult to get him out.

1. It has come to my attention that S/Sgt. Hans P. Busch, ASN 32690533, is being considered for assignment outside Florence as producer of operas in cities to be liberated in northern Italy.
2. Working against such obstacles as lack of operatic personnel, meager stage facilities, a psychological depression among Italian entertainers and difficulties in recruiting an adequate orchestra, Sergeant Busch has done a magnificent job of producing and directing the Florence Opera Season.
3. Various of his Italian colleagues, both opera singers and musicians, have commented to me and my associates on the professional genius and personal popularity of Sergeant Busch. I believe there would be no trouble in gathering much voluntary testimony on the behalf of these entertainers to request that Sergeant Busch be permitted to continue working with them.
4. It is my belief that after having watched from the first the growth and development of the Florence Opera Season under Sergeant Busch, that he should receive consideration for continuation of his morale-building duties in other cities further north.

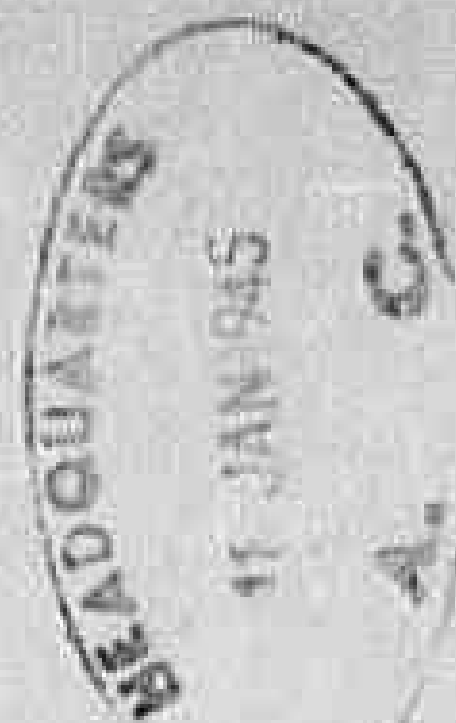

Dear Colonel Parkin,

I should like to take this opportunity to tell you about some of our personnel problems. It is realized that almost every headquarters and unit in the Army always desires more and better personnel. The Fifth Army A.M.G. has been utilizing the services of every A.C. officer on a Provincial or Regional team who might be waiting until his Province or Region reverts to A.C. control. It is believed that the Headquarters of Fifth Army A.M.G. will need more staff officers to execute the policies of the Army Commander in the territory to the north.

About five capable experienced officers per week are requesting transfer to A.M.G. or A.C. These officers are from Anti-Aircraft units that are being dissolved. The following routine will be effected concerning the requests for transfer from now on. The officer will be asked to submit a formal request for transfer through channels with an extract copy of his from 56-1, and the request will come to this Headquarters. An endorsement will be placed upon the request stating exactly why and where this officer can be used. The transfer will then be forwarded to your Headquarters. We will try to approve the requests of Company grade officers only. Within a few days an Administrative Instruction from this Headquarters showing the functions, organization and duties and responsibilities of each Division chief will be sent to you. At that time we shall try to show a table of organization which we would desire for Fifth Army A.M.G. This will also include information concerning the Enlisted Men and the vehicular needs.

This officer has for the last eight months been in charge of the distribution of medical supplies throughout Italy and has played an important part in the setting up of ENDIMEA.

He is now dissatisfied with the Italian Government as regards the functioning of this organisation and has expressed himself to me in forceful terms regarding the matter and suggested taking an attitude towards the Ministry of the Interior which I could not allow.

A meeting was called as a result of a letter received from the Italian Government which was attended by representatives of the Ministry of the Interior and Major Wilhelm asked if he might attend as he wished to ask certain questions. I refused permission as I considered that they might produce political repercussions. As a result he has asked for retirement to inactive service as he feels that a situation has arisen of incompatibility of ideas relative to his duties and functions.

Such an attitude taken by a member of the staff will not ensure smooth working within the Sub-Commission and will be definitely harmful to its relationship with the Ministry of the Interior.

In view of the foregoing I strongly recommend that this officer's request receive early consideration and that he be relieved from his present duties.
