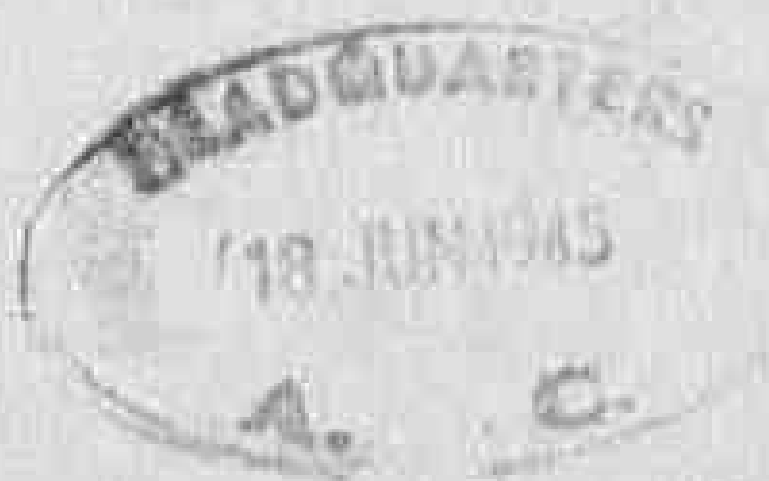

I venture to put on paper the points I made with you in conversation this morning in regard to the posting of Captain McCain away from his present work as one of only two Archives Officers in this theatre.

(1) Capt. McCain's appointment to his present work was the result of very strong American feeling that the American point of view in regard to Archives work should be adequately represented in Europe. There are at present only three such representatives--two in Germany and

Capt. McCain in Italy.

SUBJECT : Transportation Officers

TO : G-5 AMHQ

1. Reference is made to AMHQ letter 24 (Nov 6) B/ORG/AC dated 7 June.
2. Transportation Sub-Commission at the moment lacks three movements control officers for Genoa, Verona and Padua.
3. In addition, four British officers (Age/Service Ops 10, 12, 13, and 16) and two Canadian officers, all of whom are trained movements control officers, are expected to leave shortly.
4. In view of para 5 of the above mentioned letter, please may five trained movements control officers be made available immediately for the Allied Commission, in order to fill the present deficiencies and to replace the Canadian officers.
5. My replacements also be earmarked for the British officers. In view of the necessity for a proper handover by departing officers, may the replacements be made available at least 15 days before the officers are called forward for release. Otherwise, it may be necessary to invoke the deferred-operationally vital clause at short notice, which is not unsatisfactory for all concerned.

1. Northern Italy, with its heavy concentration of industry and its dense population, has fallen into Allied hands extremely rapidly. Moreover, the political and economic situation, at any rate on first impression, is such that a comparatively short period of AMG is anticipated.

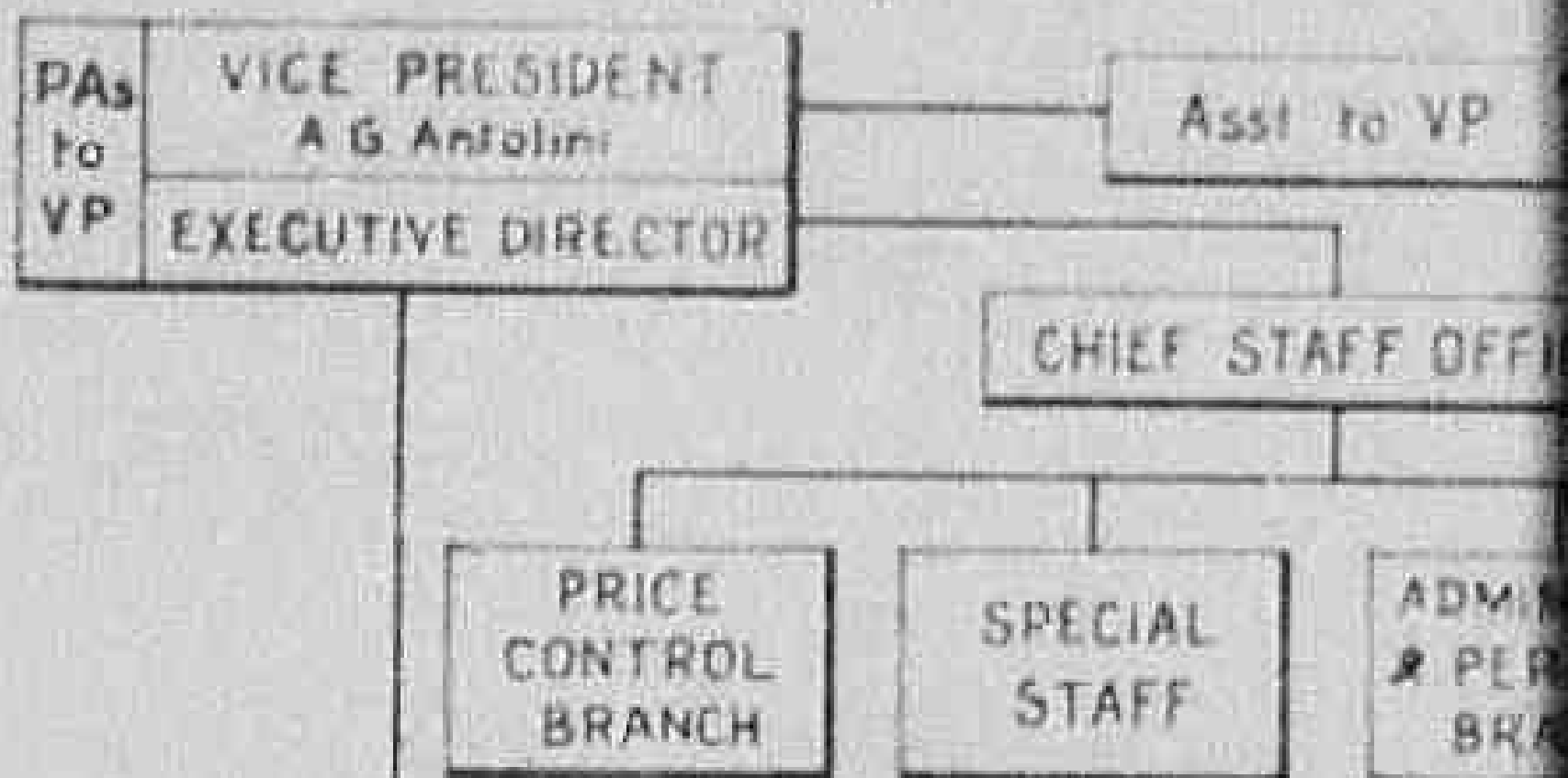
2. It is essential that the economic situation should be carefully and rapidly surveyed in order that it may be turned to the best use, both for the Allied war effort if this be so decided, and for the preservation of the economic life of Italy. This duty is supplementary to the duty of supervising the day to day administration in AMG territory.

3. In order to fulfil these responsibilities the Economic Section of the Allied Commission needs a substantial increase in their personnel. These needs were explained to the Chief Administrative Officer at a meeting held at AFHQ on 2nd May when the reorganisation of the Economic Section and the plan for the rehabilitation of Italian industry were considered. Lieut. General Robertson gave his approval in principle to additional officers for the Economic Section.

ORGANIZATION CHART ECONOMIC SECTION



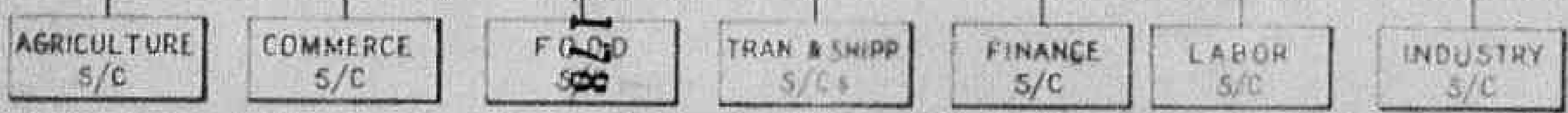
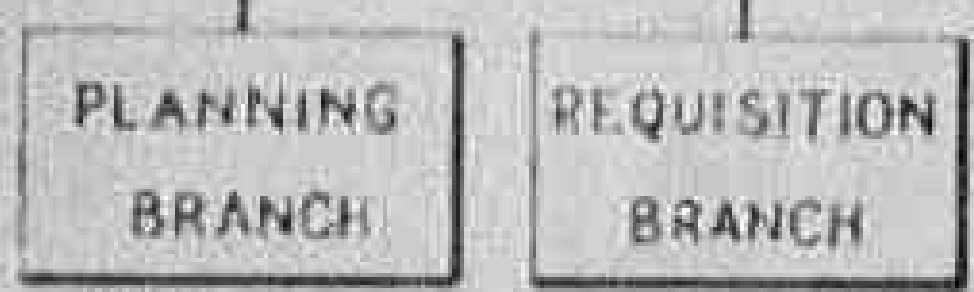

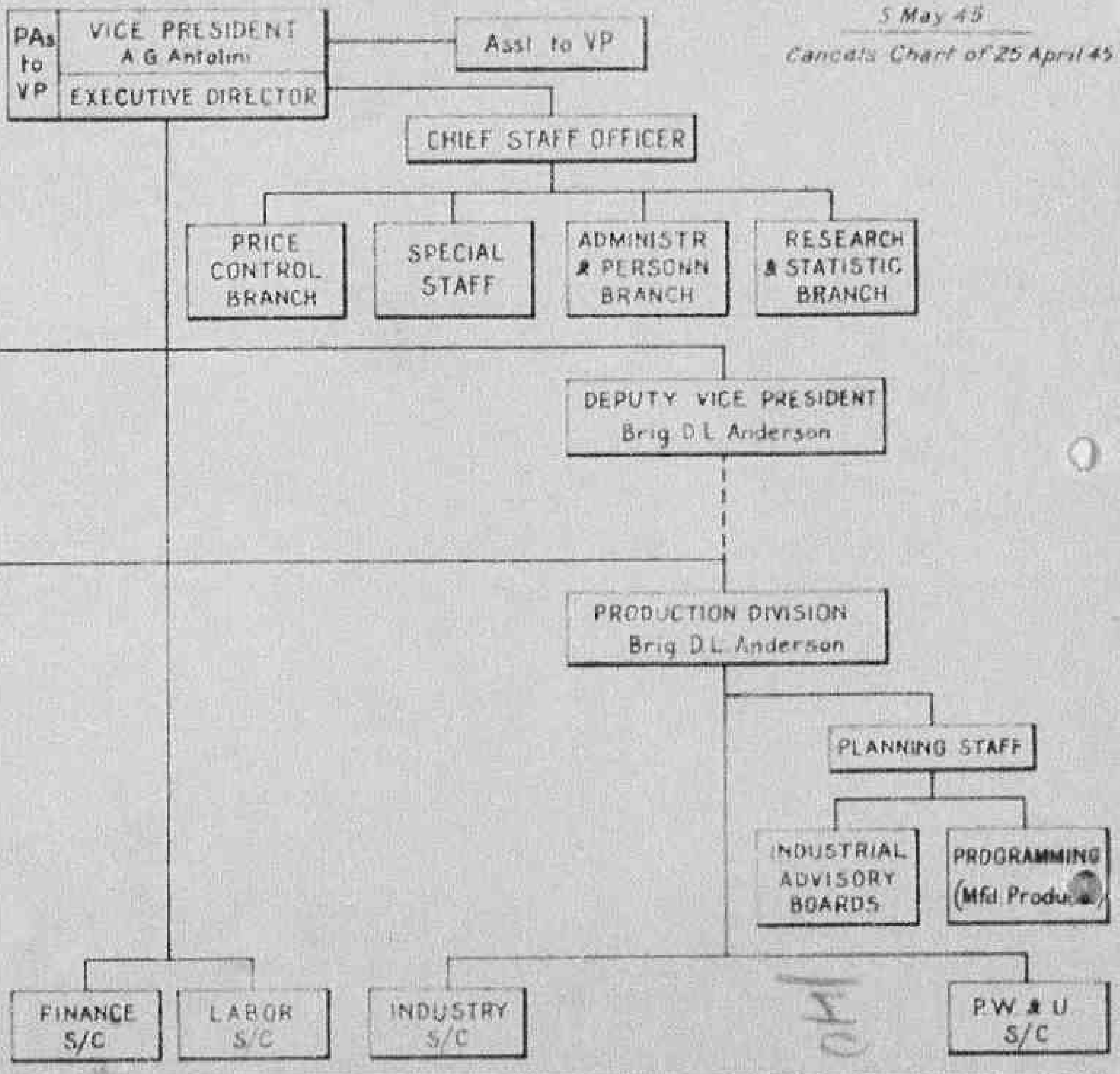

1. We are faced with a critical position in regard to displaced persons and refugees in Northern Italy. We expect one million to pass through our hands. We have asked AFHQ for an additional 67 officers but without success. It is therefore necessary to find some of these additional officers from the Headquarters of the Commission. The Chief Commissioner has given orders that 10 shall be made available at once from the Establishment and Civil Affairs Sections, and 10 to be made available on 5th May from the Economic Section. These officers will be attached temporarily to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and will return within 8 weeks to their proper stations.

2. The Chief Commissioner realizes that this will cause extra work and difficulty to Heads of Sections and Sub-Commissions. He feels sure, however, that Vice Presidents will realize the vital necessity of tackling the refugee problem swiftly and adequately and that they will make the sacrifice willingly and promptly.

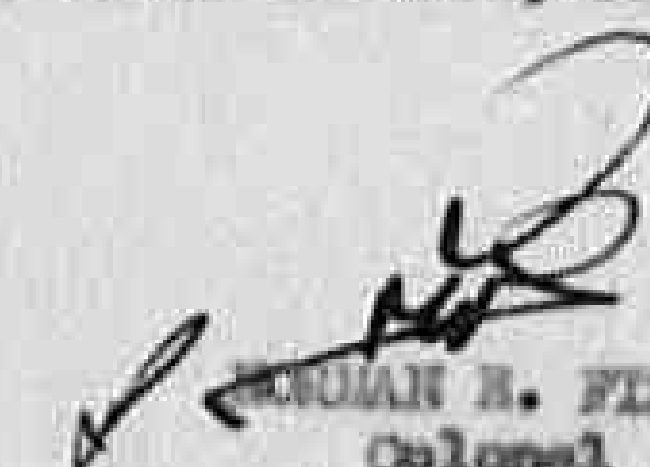

SUBJECT: Message Centre - Personnel.

TO : Acting Vice President, Establishment Section.

1. Attention must be drawn to the personnel position in the Message Centre, where the services of two good Clerks and a Messenger are URGENTLY required.
2. When ceilings were fixed by the Manpower and Reorganisation Committee in September 1944 the number of personnel allowed to Message Centre was 49.
3. In actual operation it was subsequently found practicable to operate efficiently with fewer military personnel and accordingly replacements were not demanded when certain re-assignments took place.
4. During the past two or three months, however, such drastic changes have taken place by reason of re-assignments, personnel proceeding on leave to USA and UK etc., that the position has now become critical. The present effective strength is 36 (i.e. excluding personnel on leave in USA/UK).
5. It is appreciated that those men on leave, if and when they return to this HQ, will be re-assigned to the Message Centre, but this does not provide a solution to the immediate problem. In this particular department replacements, even if only temporary, are essential. By moving experienced personnel around within the Message Centre an efficient standard of work has been maintained, but it is virtually impossible to make further changes without causing complete disruption in service, the effect of which will be apparent throughout Headquarters.
6. The Message Centre, it will be appreciated, is unlike any other department in HQ in that the entire Commission is dependent on its efficient operation and service.
7. Please therefore take IMMEDIATE ACTION to provide the Message Centre with a Messenger and two Clerks, the latter, if so desired, on temporary assignment.
