SUBJECT : Officers for Olive Oil Collection

TO : A.D.C.O.S. Economic Section

1. Your letter ref. AGR/379.3 of 7 Feb 45 is acknowledged but the nominal roll of officers attached is not agreed by this branch, nor is the shortage figure of 17 officers, as stated in para 5 of your letter.

2. Following conversation 12 Feb 45 (Major Case - Capt. Bissell) the shortage figure has now been agreed at 4 officers (plus 3 sick) of the original commitment of 40 plus 12 to be provided by Agriculture Sub Commission.

3. To meet this shortage, one officer can be assigned within the next 24 hours and every effort will be made to provide the remaining three in the near future.

Your letter of 8th January to Colonel Fiske has been gone over by Colonel Parkin and Lt. Col. Jones. They are both in agreement that, for the time being, no action can be taken with regard to Colonel Hensley until either there are other developments in his case, or Colonel Fiske returns. And since the position with respect to Lt. Col. Irish is dependent on a determination of Col. Hensley's assignment, no action appears possible on that, for the time being.

As to a junior American officer, an assistant to Lt. Col. Revere, Col. Parkin has directed our personnel people (G-1 (A)), to get one, if necessary, from outside A.C.

Your letter will be brought to Colonel Fiske's attention immediately upon his return, and should any developments occur with respect to Col. Hensley, you will be advised at once.

My dear Pennell.

I am so sorry that I missed you when I was in Rome yesterday. There were three points which I wished to mention to you.

1. I gather from Colonel Hensley that he is not yet certain of his future and is again on his way to Rome.

For a number of reasons, I should like to have a senior U.S. officer to assist me and if Colonel Hensley is in fact, going, and Colonel Howell is available, I should like Colonel Howell sent to Southern Region, temporarily, as Executive Officer.

2. Lt. Col. Hershenson was undoubtedly very much more seriously hurt in the car accident than we first believed. He is still in the hospital for treatment and I gather that he is very worried in being kept in the hospital. At the end of the week, the hospital authorities will let him out for light duty in Naples, but they say he must still remain in touch with the hospital in Naples

for observation and treatment. It does not therefore look as if he will be available to go to Catanzaro for a long time. He has also told me that Piemonte Region have asked him whether he would be available to take on Turin; I have of course, replied that I should be ready to release him for such an important post. You will observe that this would appear to be another argument against Hershenson's being able to go South.

3. In the course of my visit last week to Reggio, I saw Lt. Col. Irish who wishes me to pass on to you the following messages:-

1. He would like to remain in Catanzaro until the Province closes down.

2. He did not wish to go back to the U.S. on rotation, but preferred to remain with A.C. to complete two years and he also added that he was hopeful to secure promotion.

My own feeling remains that it would be better for Col. Irish, if he were not left longer in Catanzaro. As you see however, I have no senior American officer who I could send down to replace him. Moreover, my present impressions are the

result of two very hurried visits and I should not wish to come to a rather important decision upon slight evidence. My plan would be to send Colonel Howell down to Cetanzaro to spend two or three days at the Headquarters and observe things quietly on the spot.

I hope that all the above points are in line with your own thoughts.
