2. At 13 appears a draft form of curfew pass, which it is proposed be issued by each one of the Sub-Commissions dealing with the Italian Armed Forces, i.e., Land Forces for Army personnel, Navy for Naval personnel, and Air Forces for Italian Air Force personnel.
3. The Provost Marshal, RAAC, has stated verbally that he will arrange to have recognized by the Rome Military Police a curfew pass issued as set forth in para 2, above, for Italian Military personnel.
4. This office will forward to RAAC a sample of the pass, as finally brought into use, and will endeavor to secure formal recognition of it, as indicated in para 3.
5. Each one of the Service Sub-Commissions would, accordingly, assume responsibility for the issuance of such passes.
6. Would you, therefore
 - a. Indicate any corrections or additions which you consider necessary on the attached draft form of pass
 - b. Indicate whether the procedure proposed above is acceptable to your Sub-Commission.

Public Safety Sub-Commission:

1. Attention is invited to letter from Adjutant, this Hq, reference the issuance of curfew passes for Italian officers of this formation (folio 8).
2. Attention is also invited to folio 9, giving remarks of RE30, Lazio-Umbria Region, and his recommendation that such passes be requested from the Questore, Rome.
3. Inasmuch as direct dealings with the Questore are not a province of this office, nor of the Adjutant, AC, and as it would probably be inadvisable for sub-commissions and staff branches of this headquarters to initiate the practice of dealing directly with the Questore in matters of this kind, would you be good enough to indicate the channels through which, in your opinion, such requests should be handled.

Establishment Branch. The Questore is the issuing authority for passes for civilians. We cannot subject members of the Italian Armed Forces to his authority.

It is suggested that curfew passes should be prepared by the Land Forces, Naval and Air Forces Sub-Commissions, respectively, and passed to RAAC for endorsement.

To : Deputy Chief of Staff, A.C.
Subject: Curfew Passes for Italian Military Personnel - Issue of.

1. The Navy Sub-Commission, A.C., does not concur in the recommendation that a separate type of curfew pass be issued for Italian military personnel in the Rome Area. At the present time there are no Italian naval officers attached to the Navy Sub-Commission, nor is it contemplated that any will be attached to the office in the future.

2. The issue of curfew passes is a military security measure. It is considered that the issue of passes for military personnel, Allied or Italian, should be centralized under the Rome Allied Area Command, instead of establishing separate agencies for this purpose, which is not considered to be a function of the Allied Commission. It is recommended that the matter be taken up officially with the Rome Allied Area Command and arrangements made of the issue of curfew passes to Italian military personnel, either on direct application or when requested by the Allied Commission. This procedure will ensure the uniform treatment of all applications on a strictly military basis, contingent upon the necessity for the issue of a curfew pass to a particular person in the interest of the war effort.

and 1st Ind. 36/11/EST thereon.

1. As Rome area has been handed over to the Italian Government the question of the hours of Curfew and the issue of Curfew passes rests with them.
2. Allied service personnel are governed by R.A.A.C. regulations and permanent curfew passes and casual-late passes are issued by Provost Marshals and Unit-Commanders respectively.
3. Curfew passes to other than Allied Service personnel are issued by the Questore, and to have any other authority also issuing them would cause confusion and duplication.
4. It is my considered opinion that Italian Military Personnel requiring Curfew passes should obtain them from the Questore, and the attached letters asking for them should be forwarded to him for issue of such passes.
5. In short, only the Questore should be empowered to issue Curfew passes for other than American & British Personnel.

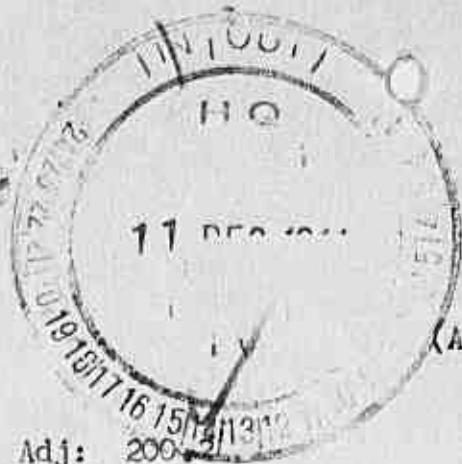

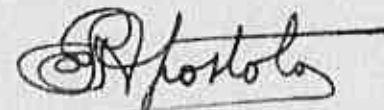
