2. I am personally acquainted with this Doctor as he has been application through me previously for the granting of a commission and was attached to 98 General Hospital, BARI. He was then considered unsuitable owing to his poor knowledge of English. This has considerably improved.
3. He has been of definite service to our Intelligence Branch in various capacities and his bona fides from a security point of view is vouched for by them. He is at present employed by the American Medical authorities in HOME as supervisor of their Prophylactic Stations.
4. Is it considered that the services of Dr. STORSSI can be utilised in the R.A.M.C. provided he proved suitable professionally? If so, he could be attached to 104 General Hospital 'F' V.D. Wing for a month and a report from the O.C. 104 General Hospital could be rendered on his suitability for a commission.

SUBJECT: Employment of American Nationals.

TO : Chief Commissioner (Through Chief of Staff)

1. The Civilian Personnel Policy Board recommends that the following policy be adopted by A.C.C. for the employment of American Nationals who apply to A.C.C. for positions:

a. Any American National (citizen) who has been brought from the United States to Italy or this theatre of operations by any public agency or private concern for the express purpose of carrying out any form of war work (such as Red Cross, O.S.S., P.W.S. etc.) and whose contract of employment has terminated or who has resigned in good standing, may be employed at a salary rate comparable to the United States Civil Service Classified salary schedules and will not be employed under the provisions of A.F.N.Q. wage schedules for the employment of civilians for the Allied Armed Forces.

b. All other American Nationals (citizens) who were not brought from the United States under the conditions described above will be employed under the provisions of A.F.N.Q.

2. A statement as to your approval or disapproval is requested.
