SUBJECT: Future of Milan Press Camp.

TO : Lt. Richard Pollard, PRO, Milan

I had just written you a letter on the future of the Hotel Plaza after September 15th when I received your signal of August 30th stating that II District was taking over the hotel on that date.

Your signal changed my earlier letter. You should proceed to make arrangements to close the Milan Press office on September 15th and so inform the correspondents. In this connection your attention is called to the attached AFHQ directive dated 11 August on facilities for press correspondents. You will note that it says that "correspondents" can be billeted at any British and/or American Military hotel in Italy by application to the local HQ concerned. The definition "Correspondents" was purposely left vague by PRO AFHQ in order to let the political correspondents accredited to AC share this arrangement. It is not, however, specifically so stated in the directive but we hope political correspondents will be given the same facilities as war correspondents.

We shall inform PRO AFHQ by copy of this letter that the AMG Press Camp in Milan is being closed as of September 15th and after that date correspondents will be on their own for accommodations as per the directive.

AFHQ PRO says that the radio team, unless you hear to the contrary, should be returned to Rome. It is possible that it might be sent to Trieste.

As for the three enlisted men on your staff I do not know from whence they came. We could use one or two writers on our staff here. If any of them are writers

SUBJECT: Assistance

TO : Executive Commissioner

The Review of Allied Military Government and the Allied Commission In Italy should be off the presses within 10 days. At that time we shall be faced with a temporary problem of emergency proportions which we are not equipped to handle. It is the problem of distribution. There will be 100,000 copies in English and 100,000 copies in Italian.

Of the English edition at least 40,000 copies will be taken off our hands at once by the armed forces but we will have the task of sending out individual copies to hundreds of selected names and small bundles to a list of institutions etc.

There also will be a copy distributed to every member, past and present, of the Allied Commission. I suggest that the Adjutant of 2675 Regiment take care of the American distribution and C-1, British, of the British distribution.

On the Italian edition, we have planned for an immediate bulk disposal of 40,000, but there remains a mailing list of 40,000 plus additional hundreds of special names.

We need help in the way of space, equipment and personnel for this rush job because the essence of the project is wide and quick distribution.

Specifically, we need one officer, preferably a lieutenant experienced in office administration, two enlisted men likewise experienced, and ten civilian typists. A large room would be necessary to work in plus the required number of typewriters. The job should take about two weeks.

SUBJECT: Financial Allowance for P.R.C.

TO : Executive Commissioner  
HQ Allied Commission

1. The attached letter from my Public Relations Officer was written on my initiative and at my request.

2. The public relations problem in this area, it will be appreciated, is much more critical than that elsewhere. In my own view, public relations constitutes about fifty percent of the job to be done, and I have been gratified for this reason to be supplied with a competent, professional officer and to receive, as I have, the hearty cooperation of a large, well organized P.W.B. (A.I.S.) staff.

3. It is apparent, however, that the position of the Public Relations Officer here, vis-a-vis a hundred-odd military and civilian P.W.B. people, plus frequently descending hoards of Allied press representatives and the local press, is unusually difficult financially. I feel that any small amount which my P.R.C. may be required to spend here will be broad cast upon the waters, which will produce beneficial results for Great Britain, the United States, and our operation, even beyond the biblical rate of return. I therefore concur in his request for a financial allowance or provision for reimbursement for expenses.

4. Capt. Ellison is quite willing to sustain the burden of keeping a record of his expenditures, even though this may a very great nuisance at times. It would obviously be preferable to give him an allowance similar to that granted to Regional Commissioners, but

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this is not of the essence. The main thing is, somehow, to relieve the pocketbook of an impetuous British captain from a burden and drain far beyond that which an officer of his grade is normally expected to sustain.

5. I shall be grateful for your sympathetic consideration.

While I was in Naples yesterday I talked with General McChrystal regarding the transportation problem in Milan. He promised to do what he could. This morning Col. Atley told me that he was writing to Lt. Col. Delbert Clark of 5th Army requesting him to furnish two jeeps, two drivers and one officer for use of the war correspondents in Milan. I imagine they will be attached to a District although this is something about which Col. Fiske would know better. I suggest in couple days, after he has received Col. Atley's letter, you get in touch with Col. Clark and make direct arrangements with him.

For your information Admiral Gladford has sent a cable to the Navy Department in Washington asking that the transfer of Lt. Robbins from Italy to the Pacific be delayed at least five months. We hope that the order will be cancelled and Lt. Robbins will be able to return to Milan as PRO officer, AMG in that region.

3. Each release describes the work of the individual in the Allied Commission and briefly explains the work of the Commission. Thus, at one and the same time, we are able to give news about the soldier to his family and friends and tell about the Allied Commission in a manner not usually possible in ordinary news releases.

TO : Executive Commissioner:

1. A considerable number of Allied newspaper correspondents are moving about in northern Italy gathering articles for their papers.
2. In many instances they visit cities where AMD has regional or provincial headquarters and quite naturally they turn to AMD for assistance in obtaining food, billets and other assistance. In some instances they have been turned away or accorded scant attention. This has affected their opinion of AMD operations.
3. It would be appreciated by PRB if instructions could be issued to Regional and Provincial Commissioners requesting them to assist Allied correspondents by arranging facilities for messing, billeting and transport whenever possible.



1. To meet the PRD field staff and to determine its adequacy and competence, the Director, PRD spent March 11-15 in the north. March 12 was spent with the 5th Army and March 13 with the 6th Army. I was accompanied by Maj. Floyd Weidman, PRD, G-5. Following are my observations and recommendations:

2. Major T. L. Bullock (B), is Deputy Director of PRD in charge of the field staff. He has been with AMG since its earliest days. He is energetic, competent and fairly well liked both by the Americans and British. He knows his job but has been handicapped by lack of support from headquarters. He has correspondence on file dated November and December 1944 asking to be relieved of his post unless support in the way of direction, qualified staff and sufficient transport were forthcoming.

3. Captain H. Ellison (B), is PRD, 6th Army. He only began his assignment a few weeks ago. He is young and comparatively inexperienced but is anxious to make good. He has gained the confidence of his regional superiors and will, I think, do a creditable job. As a result of our visit he has a much better idea of what is expected of him.

4. Rock Ferris, American civilian on loan from PRD, is PRD, 5th Army. He is a pleasant young man of artistic temperament but entirely unsuited to the job, either by training or personality. He is more of a personal aide to the Commanding General, AMG, 5th Army, than a PRD for AMG, 5th Army. Instead of being located at the Press Camp, 5th Army, to maintain contact with the correspondents he lives with the General in the city. The job of PRD, 5th Army, is one of the most important field positions we have and it is vitally important that we put a strong man in this job. It should be someone who can go straight through to the final destination of the 5th Army and keep the correspondents constantly advised of AMG activities in the Army's territory. To make the change (and I strongly recommend it be done) will require delicate handling on high levels. I shall be glad to discuss my ideas on this subject with you.

5. Transport facilities for the PHO field staff are entirely inadequate and cripples operations. To move around with the correspondents and to develop their own material, the field staff must be mobile. At present we have one jeep for PHO, 8th Army, which is adequate, and a pick up for Major Bullock, which is inadequate as these cars are not allowed on roads controlled by 5th Army. PHO, 5th Army, is entirely without transport. What is needed are two jeeps, one for the Deputy Director, who must travel into both army territories, and one for PHO, 5th Army. I strongly recommend two jeeps be made available immediately.

6. Major Bullock needs an experienced clerk-writer to help him in his office and to keep it running while he is in the field. He would like to have S/Sgt. Cash (P), now in PRB. I would be agreeable if a suitable substitute can be found for Cash at headquarters. Cash, incidentally, is anxious to move north to the final destination of the 5th Army.



1. Unofficial information has been received that Mr. Rock Ferris of the Psychological Warfare Branch, an American civilian authorized to wear uniform, would be willing to come into A.M.G. to do public relations work.

2. It is understood that this gentleman has particular qualifications fitting him to be a public relations officer, being a newspaper editor at home. While we would prefer to have a commissioned officer do this work, there is no reason administratively why a civilian in Mr. Ferris' status could not do all that we desire.

3. Information is requested as to whether his services can be made available to us and if so, that he be so assigned.

4. The need for a qualified public relations officer for A.M.G. Fifth Army is very great. We have had but two in more than a year. The first, Captain Harwell, was relieved by order of General Macfarlane when he abolished public relations officers except in his own office. The second, Lieutenant Atkinson, was relieved after some difficulty by orders of the public relations officer of the Allied Commission.

5. During the recent visit of the Congressional Committee the only criticism made of A.M.G. was that we were not letting the American public and, I may also add, the British public, know about what we are doing. It is impossible for a public relations officer singlehandedly to cover the work of the Fifth and Eighth Armies, A.M.G. and no one knows this better than Major Bullock who is now engaged in that work.
