2. This letter is forwarded to receive your viewpoints as to required and non-required officer personnel within your organization for future employment of officer personnel.

3. Definition.

a. Required Officer Personnel - Those officers with low Adjusted Service Rating Card (ASRC) scores, and whose individual services and qualifications are essential to the command as a matter of military necessity even though they may have high ASRC scores.

b. Non-Required Officer Personnel - Officer personnel with the highest Adjusted Service Rating Scores, whose individual services and qualifications are not essential to the command as a matter of military necessity or for whom a qualified replacement is available or is not required; and those officers for whom an appropriate assignment is not available.

4. It is requested that a review be made of the above personnel and that a report be furnished this Headquarters by 15 July 1945 listing personnel. For required personnel a separate letter will be forwarded giving reasons for the individual's retention predicated upon the operational requirement for the continued services of the individual. It is pointed out that this Headquarters will not be the final authority for the determination of personnel whose ASMC score is equal to or above the critical score who will be retained as required personnel. Justification for determination of any officer as required must include information as follows:

- a. Name, rank, ASMC of officer concerned.
- b. Adjusted Service Rating Score.
- c. A detailed description of position officer occupies, his duties in that position, his particular qualifications to fill it.
- d. A comprehensive statement that will substantially show why the position which the particular officer is now performing is of military necessity.

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1. My letter G-13/2447/A dated 17 May 45 is, of course, the subject of much discussion amongst British officers, and I have no doubt that you will hear arguments about the entitlement of officers to release and criticism of any policy which would retain officers beyond their release date.

2. It is not our intention to delay the release of any officer unnecessarily but there is hardly any single Region or Sub Commission which has not claimed that it is so short of officer personnel as to seriously affect its efficiency. It was very obvious, therefore, that the immediate loss of a further 107 British officers without any possibility of replacement would have had a catastrophic effect on the efficiency of the Northern Region. Twelve days only were given this Headquarters from the date of definite information regarding the commitment of releases to the day on which the first party is due to assemble. There was no time to refer Groups 1 to 3 to Regional Commissioners and Directors of Sub Commissions, but from Group 4 onwards letters will be addressed to Commissions concerned, listing needs of officers affected, and Regional Commissioners and Directors of Sub Commissions will be called upon to state whether they are prepared to recommend the release of the officers serving under them without replacement on due dates.

3. The following points have been raised owing to a misinterpretation of the position:-

(a) That the release of C.A. officers is not being treated in the same way as officers of other units. This is not so. Release regulations apply equally to all ranks of all arms of the Service, and C.A. personnel are subject to the same paragraph dealing with reductions as are personnel of other units.

(4) That the AG has arbitrarily ordered the retention of certain offshore. This is not so and it is not permitted by Regulation. Professors to cover the issue of release documents have been prepared for all British vessels of A.G. in Groups 1 to 3 and have been submitted to AG HQ. On the same professorship AG HQ has requested the retention up to the 31 July 1981. These offshore companies considered operationally necessary. In accordance with Release Regulation the approval or disapproval of our representations are sent with the A.G.O. in G. 1, and we await this decision.

(c) That the applicant's interest in the land is not a fee simple interest.

2. It is not our intention to delay the release of any officer unnecessarily but there is hardly one single Region or Sub Commission which has not claimed that it is so short of officer personnel as to seriously affect its efficiency. It was very obvious, therefore, that the immediate loss of a further 107 British officers without any possibility of replacement would have had a catastrophic effect on the efficiency of the Northern Regions. Twelve days only were given this Headquarters from the date of definite information regarding the commitment of releases to the day on which the first party is due to assemble. There was no time to refer Groups 1 to 3 to Regional Commissioners and Directors of Sub Commissions, but from Group 4 onwards letters will be addressed to formations concerned, listing names of officers affected, and Regional Commissioners and Directors of Sub Commissions will be called upon to state whether they are prepared to recommend the release of the officers serving under them without replacement on due dates.

3. The following points have been raised owing to a misunderstanding of the position:-

- (a) That the release of C.A. officers is not being treated in the same way as officers of other units. This is not so. Release Regulations apply equally to all ranks of all arms of the Service, and C.A. personnel are subject to the same paragraph dealing with retention as are personnel of other units.
- (b) That HQ AG has arbitrarily ordered the retention of certain officers. This is not so and it is not permitted by Regulations. Procedures to cover the issue of release documents have been prepared for all British ranks of C.A. In Groups 1 to 3 and have been submitted to AG HQ. On the 31 July 1968, these officers considered operationally necessary. In accordance with Release Regulations the approval or disapproval of our recommendations rests with the "C.O.C. in C.", and we await his decision.
- (c) That the establishment of a Board of senior officers to consider possible cases of hardship is a reversal of the Release policy and places upon an officer the onus of proving his entitlement to release. Again this is incorrect. This HQ has the power to recommend the retention of any officer considered operationally necessary without giving consideration to an officer's civil problems. At the same time it is appreciated that exceptional cases can demand exceptional treatment, and it is my intention that in very urgent cases the retention of an officer beyond his release date shall not be enforced if the general efficiency of the unit with which he is serving is not impaired by his release.

4. I would like you to know that the policy is based on the Release Regulations and was initiated by AG HQ with the approval of the Chief Administrative Officer, who has been compelled to apply the new ruling to the Allied Commission in Austria. The War Office has been kept fully informed. I have no doubt that similar action has had to be taken with respect to other Commissions and Military Governments whose work, for their sakes, may only

that be removing its goal owing to the end of hostilities.

5. I should like you to let it be known that cases of hostility will be treated with the utmost ~~contestation~~ and that everything will be done to remove officers as soon as **it is** possible. But I am sure all officers will realize that the work of the Commanding and Military Government must go on and is now as operationally important as ever the duties of the leaders of the combat forces before the end of hostilities.

(c) In opening the meeting Brigadier General Spofford referred briefly to the provisions of FAN 487 which had given rise to the Allied Commission plan for withdrawal and to this meeting. He also referred to the specific provision in FAN 487 whereby the Allied Commission was to retain the right to send representatives into Italian Government territory for any special tasks when Allied interests so required.

As a matter of procedure it was agreed that the points for discussion should be taken in the order shown in the tabular summary below. The following paragraphs accordingly follow that order.

1. Road Repairs.

Following on discussion of the request by G-4(B) that Capt. Hebbard be retained in Italian Government territory to act as full time Allied Commission Highway Engineer Liaison Officer at B.Q. Number 3 District it was agreed by the Allied Commission representative that as a temporary expedient Capt. Hebbard should be made available as full time Highways Liaison Officer until 15 May.

Commission Officers specially concerned with the production and movement of Calabrian timber should not be withdrawn for the time being it was explained by the Allied Commission representative that so far as movement was concerned this could be supervised by the transportation officers when Allied Commission already proposed to retain in Southern Region. So far as the production of the timber was concerned it was pointed out that specialist officers from the Agricultural Sub Commission (Forestry Section) could be sent down to Calabria to deal with particular problems which might require the assistance of Allied Commission Officers on the spot. The Allied Commission representatives pointed out that it was planned to leave 3 Allied Commission Public Health officers in Naples and that these would, in addition to work in Naples, be available for supervisory duties over all Southern Italy. 6. Port Operation.

On the question of continued close supervision over port operations the Allied Commission representative gave particulars of the Allied Commission Transportation officers proposed to be retained in Italian Government Territory and G-4 M & Tn. supplemented this by stating that details were being worked out with Transportation Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission for supervision, in the military interest, at those ports where it was impracticable for the Allied Commission to continue to provide supervision. It was left that these arrangements should be finalized as soon as possible and details made known to all concerned.

18. General Points arising out of the withdrawal.

The necessity for Allied Commission keeping teams of officers available at Rome particularly during the first few weeks after the withdrawal was stressed in order that such officers might be rushed to any point where it became apparent that the Italian administration was not functioning properly.

The suggestion was also made that before 1 April Allied Commission officers in Italian Government territory should make a special point of visiting Military formations within the area in order to answer questions which may be in the minds of such formations arising out of the impending withdrawal of the Allied Commission personnel and to put the staffs of such formations in touch with the appropriate Italian officials.

It was also pointed out that it was not necessary to have additional officers from the Public Health Sub Commission in Rome as they would be sent rapidly to those places where their services might be needed in the Allied interest. It was agreed that the matter should stand as that basis.

6. Port Controlling.

On the question of continued close supervision over port operations the Allied Commission representative gave particulars of the Allied Commission Transportation officers proposed to be retained in Italian Government Territory and G-2, in reply, supplemented this by stating that details were being worked out with Transportation Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission for supervision, in the military interest, at those ports where it was impracticable for the Allied Commission to continue to provide supervision. It was left that these arrangements should be finalized as soon as possible and details and documents to all concerned.

The point was raised that under the above

5. Medical Problems.

Representations were made by the Medical Sections that in order to safeguard the health of Allied troops stationed in Italian Government territory it would be necessary both from the preventative point of view as well as from the point of view of dealing with actual outbreaks which might occur, to ensure by close liaison that the Italian Public Health authorities were functioning properly. The Allied Commission representatives pointed out that it was planned to leave 3 Allied Commission Public Health officers in Naples and that these would, in addition to work in Naples, be available for supervisory duties over all Southern Italy. It was also pointed out that as and when necessary additional officers from the Public Health Sub-Commission in Rome would be sent rapidly to those places where their services might be needed in the Allied interest. It was agreed that the matter should stand on that basis.

6. Port Operation.

On the question of continued close supervision over port operations the Allied Commission representative gave particulars of the Allied Commission Transportation officers proposed to be retained in Italian Government territory and 3-6 H & T, supplemented this by stating that details were being worked out with Transportation Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission for supervision, in the military interest, at those ports where it was impracticable for the Allied Commission to continue to provide supervision. It was left that those arrangements should be finalized as soon as possible and details made known to all concerned.

The point was raised that under GSA signal M 51719 of 17 March H & T were not prepared to rely upon reports prepared by Italian agencies and the effect of this following on withdrawal of Allied Commission personnel was stressed. It was pointed out however that a signal in reply was in course of preparation and that it would be urged therein that in present circumstances this ruling must be modified.

7. Withdrawal of Supervision over Trucking.

On this point the Allied Commission representative drew attention to the numbers and disposition of Transportation Officers it was proposed to retain in Italian Government territory and it was agreed that the matter should be left on that basis.

8. Drainage Panel.

It was agreed that the legally qualified officer whom it was

proposed in the Allied Commission's plan to retain at Bari, would, with the assistance of his Assistant Italian officer (Food), be able to serve as liaison officer at the British Depot there as well as being available for the British Hqs in that area.

9. Local Resources.

The v had received from the Allied Military point of view for accurate reports as to local supplies continuing to be made available after the withdrawal has taken place was stressed and it was pointed out that while the Italian local authorities would be responsible for preparation of the detailed reports, it would be essential for the Allied Commission through the liaison and Food Officers to see to it that the Italian authorities carry out this work with speed and accuracy. It was directed that Allied Commission and Hqs should consult with each other at once on all aspects of this matter including the actual method to be adopted for procuring the supplies in question.

On the question of controlled items it was directed that Hqs should prepare for consideration by the next meeting of the FILAS a paper dealing with any possible conflict of present procedure with the terms of P.M. 187 and suggesting new methods of procedure where necessary.

10. Army Allied Army Command.

After details had been given by the Allied Commission representative of the Allied Commission officers who could continue to be available for duty within Rome Allied Army Command it was agreed that the points raised by JMC Sections on this matter would be completely covered by the Allied Commission proposals. (G-4 are however to ensure that PMS should amplify direct with the Allied Commission a request put forward by PMS that two engineers named Gentry and Thompson respectively should be retained in Rome.)

11. Marine Command.

After hearing the Allied Commission representative it was agreed that the Allied Commission proposals for retention of personnel in the Command of Naples would cover the points raised by JMC Sections.

12. Command outlying.

The fact that Allied Commission was arranging to retain one officer in Naples and one in Rome for liaison with Italian State and communication authorities was noted. In view of the withdrawal of Allied Commission officers it was pointed out that it would be necessary in certain cases for Allied Commission and military authorities to communicate in writing with Italian civilians who would be authorized to undertake duties in Italian Government territory and the necessity for relaxing present restrictions on communication with Italian civilians in

On the question of controlled items it was directed that FIAS should prepare for consideration by the next meeting of the FIAS a paper dealing with any possible conflict of present procedure with the terms of FIAS 487 and suggesting any methods of procedure where necessary.

10. How Allied Arm Command.

After details had been given by the Allied Commission representative of the Allied Commission officers who could continue to be available for duty within Rome Allied Arm Command it was agreed that the points raised by the Sections on this matter would be adequately covered by the Allied Commission proposals. (One are however to ensure that FIAS should amplify direct with the Allied Commission a request put forward by FIAS that two engine-ers named Gentry and Thompson respectively should be retained in Rome.)

11. London Committee.

After hearing the Allied Commission representative it was agreed that the Allied Commission proposals for retention of personnel in the Command of Naples would cover the points raised by FIAS Sections.

12. Communications.

The fact that Allied Commission were arranging to retain one officer in Naples and one in Rome for liaison with Italian State and Commissionary authorities was noted. In view of the withdrawal of Allied Commission officers it was pointed out that it would be necessary in certain cases for Allied Commission and military authorities to communicate in writing with Italian civilians who would be carrying out administrative duties in Italian Government territory and the necessity for relaxing present restrictions on communications with Italian civilians to allow of this was urged. It was decided that G-5 should take this up with G-2 in order that appropriate modifications in existing regulations be published.

13. Contingent Matters.

On stressed the necessity for adequate procedure being laid down to enable perishable supplies such as fruits and vegetables to continue to be utilized for the Allied Forces, and it was directed that Allied Commission should clarify, and issue to all concerned details of the procedure to be followed in this connection with the Italian local government authorities. Allied Commission are also to clarify the procedure for receipt and distribution of imported supplies including coal.

14. U. S. Navy.

It was agreed that liaison with the United States Navy at Palermo will be covered by the Allied Commission liaison officer who is to be retained there under the Allied Commission plan.

15. G-3.

G-3 pointed out that in view of the proposed withdrawal commanders of troops in Italian Government territory would not have Allied Commission officers at hand who they should consult to laid down in A.F.H.Q. directives concerning military aid to the Italians in case of disturbances and the exercise of the powers of the Allied troops in Italian Government territory and it was agreed that G-5 in conjunction with G-3 should go through the relevant directives and propose consequential amendments therein.

16. Administration of Allied Commission Officers and their Staffs being retained in Italian Government territory.

The Allied Commission representative pointed out that the difficulties in which Allied Commission would be placed in administering their isolated officers and their civilian staffs who would be retained in Italian Government territory and requested that these should be administered and transport be provided for them by the Military Headquarters in the places in which they would be located. It was agreed that, in general, the military HQs would give all possible assistance in the matter but that each case, particularly with regard to the use or provision of transport, would have to be worked out on its merits.

17. Procedures to be followed to inform all concerned of the final plans for withdrawal and as to the manner in which liaison with the Military authorities will be carried out etc.

It was agreed that all concerned may be fully aware of the final plan for withdrawal and of the disposition and duties of the liaison and other officers to be retained in Italian Government territory and the procedure to be followed in dealing direct with the Italian authorities it was decided that a memorandum based on information to be supplied by HQ Allied Commission should be issued by A.F.H.Q. prior to 1 April giving all relevant information. H.Q. Allied Commission was to supply this information to G-5 as soon as possible and are also to prepare a manual for the information and use of military authorities in Italian Government territory and the local Italian Governmental organization and the method and channels by which the Military authorities should obtain assistance from the Italian authorities.

18. General Public affairs arising out of the withdrawal.

The necessity for Allied Commission keeping tabs of officers available at Rome particularly during the first few weeks after the withdrawal was stressed in order that such officers might be rushed to any point where it became apparent that the Italian administration was not functioning properly.

ulice in which Allied Commission would be placed in administering their limited officers and their civilian staffs who would be retained in Italian Government territory and requested that these should be administered and transport be provided for them by the Military Headquarters in the places in which they would be located. Allied Commission are to supply this information to G-5 as soon as possible and are also to prepare a manual for the information and use of Military authorities in Italian Government territory showing the local Italian Governmental organization and the method and channels by which the Military authorities should obtain assistance from the Italian authorities.

18. General Points arising out of the withdrawal.

The necessity for Allied Commission keeping teams of officers available at home particularly during the first few weeks after the withdrawal was stressed in order that such officers might be rushed to any point where it became apparent that the Italian administration was not functioning properly.

The suggestion was also made that before 1 April Allied Commission officers in Italian Government territory should make a special point of visiting Military formations within the area in order to answer questions which may be in the minds of such formations arising out of the impending withdrawal of the Allied Commission personnel and to put the staffs of such formations in touch with the appropriate Italian officials.

They must, however, remember that they are Liaison officers and not executive officers and will not be able to carry out many of the functions of Provincial Commissioners.

Points which may require special attention are:

- a. Loss cases affecting Allied personnel or property.
- b. Epilations endangering Allied personnel.
- c. Requisitioning and declassification.
- d. Relations between Allied and Italian police forces.

4. Liaison officers will, in the absence of specialist AC officers, assist the Allied Forces Local Resources Board, or Allied Procuring Agencies, as may be necessary, in their relations with the Italian authorities.

5. Liaison officers will be stationed at centres of importance to Allied interests. They will assist, as necessary, relations between the Allied Services and the local Italian officials.

6. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian local government, and, even if asked, they will not give official advice, on behalf of AC, to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome.

7. The AC liaison officer will be responsible for discipline and administration of all AC officers in his area.

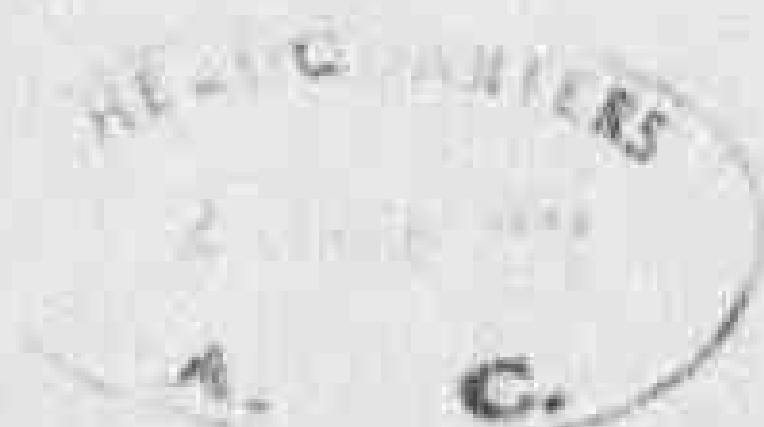

This includes all civilian requisitioned motor vehicles, instructions for the turning over of which to the local Italian Government authorities have not been issued. No vehicles, military or civilian requisitioned, will be retained by the officer or activity to which formerly assigned, nor transferred to another Region, unless specific authority therefor has been given by this Headquarters.

d. Property acquired by local purchase will be dealt with in accordance with instructions issued by G-4 (B). (Letter G-4/104/2 of 13th March 1943 refers).

e. Property in Region which has been neither requisitioned nor procured by local purchase will be considered to have been requisitioned and handled accordingly.

3. Records.

1. Reference is made to our letter to you, G-5: 381.1-3
of 10 March, and signal sent you today, subject as above.

2. This will confirm that an officer, prepared to come to
definite conclusions on behalf of Allied Commission, should attend
this HQ by 1100 hours on 22 March. A conference for the purpose
of discussing the detailed comments of staff sections on the
withdrawal plan will be held in the offices of this Section at
1400 hours on that day.

3. You have already been informed in our letter of 10 March
of the likely requirements for Allied Commission officer personnel
put forward by some of the interested staff sections of this HQ.

1. I beg to report to you the following moves. These have all been carried out, as if brought about by the posting of officers. They have not been publicly announced, or associated with any large scale operations.

2. Lt.Col. TURNER-COLE has proceeded to EAST in relief of Lt.Col. BARRETT (your Executive Order R-10, dated 3 February). The YARAHU Zone office has therefore been closed.

3. Major BARRETT ordered to report to the instructional course ALBERTA under your G-15/23/1/A, dated 10 February. The KALAHU Zone office has therefore been closed.

4. Lt.Col. IRISH ordered to be ready to report to U.S. ALBERTA group on or about 25 February, under your Ref/180/241, dated 17 February. The CATANAU Zone office is therefore being closed.

5. The FOGIA Zone office at LUCERA is being used for the concentration of the VENEZIA-GILIA Provincial Teams under Lt.Col. BARRETT.

6. Olive Oil Officers are being left out in the provinces. They are being specially accommodated and their presence in the field is not interfering with the closing down of other offices.

7. From the point of view of internal administration, the most important outstanding points are the truck pools under Allied Officers at CAMPOBASSO and FOGIA. These will be very isolated when the present reorganizing is carried out and the olive oil campaign comes finally to an end. It is hoped that you will have secured, by that time a formula for the hand over of trucks to Italian agencies.

1. The Combined Chiefs of Staff in their telegram 2381457 of 31 January 1945 transmitting the New Deal for Italy, directed that:

"The Allied Commission shall as soon as possible withdraw all its officers stationed in the field in the territory under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government. However, the Allied Commission should retain the right to send its representatives into territory under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government for any special tasks when Allied interests require it."

2. As a result of this the following action will be taken with regard to Allied Commission functions in SARDINIA, SICILY and SOUTHERN ITALY:

(a)

SARDINIA. All Allied officers will be withdrawn with the exception of the officers and staff of the Mining Division who will restrict their functions entirely to advice regarding the output of the Cardinian mines, and shipping and working of the ports in connection with the output of coal.

SICILY. All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn except:

- (i) Allied Commission Liaison Officer at PALERMO.
- (ii) Allied Commission Liaison Officer at CATANIA.
- (iii) CAG, LAMPEDUSA.
- (iv) CAG, PANTHERIA.
- (v) Certain technical officers.

(c)

SOUTHERN REGION. All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn except:

- (i) Provincial Staff for NAPLES Province in which Allied Military Government will continue.
- (ii) Allied Commission Liaison Officer at ROME.
- (iii) Certain technical officers.

(d) UNION-ARMED REGION. All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn from Regional HQ and the Provinces of ASOLI with the exception of:

(1) Allied Commission Liaison Officer (Public Safety) with Rome Allied Area Command.

(11) Certain technical officers.

The Provinces of UDINE, TREVISO and VERONA will continue under Allied Military Government; the Provincial staffs will remain and will report to command of Regional HQ, MANTOVA-VERONA (formerly ASOLI REGIONE) Region.

(e) ARMED-ARMED REGION. All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn from the Provinces of ASOLI (TREVISO, UDINE, VERONA, CHIESA), with the exception of a Transportation Officer (truck pool) at ASOLI. The Provinces of the ARMED (ASOLI, VERONA, CHIESA, PODRE) will remain under Allied Military Government with Provincial staffs. The Region, which in future will be known as ARMED-ARMED Region, will absorb the Provinces of TREVISO and UDINE, under Allied Military Government, with their Provincial staffs. The Regional Commissioner will also act as Allied Commission Liaison Officer for the Provinces of ARMED.

Details of officers to be retained will be found in Appendix "A".

3. Duties of the Allied Commission Liaison Officers in Italian Government territory will be to watch over the Allied and Italian interests in furtherance of the Allied war effort, and to assist the Allied authorities in their relations with Italian local authorities. They will give advice to the Allied military authorities on any matter pertaining to Italian civil affairs, but will not be concerned with the acceptance of advice or guidance to the Italian authorities. Neither will they assume functions which are properly those of military authorities. Personnel will normally confine their activities to the neighborhood of the HQ in which they are located, but in cases of emergency they will of course deal with all matters arising from civil affairs affecting Allied interests within the Regional boundaries.

4. Regional Commission will take steps to complete these issues by 1 April 1945. Further instructions will be issued by the Establishment Section.

(a) ARMED-ARMED REGION. All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn from the Provinces of ABRUZZO (TERAMO), AVULI, PESCARA, CHIENTI, with the exception of a Transportation Officer (truck pool) at AVULI. The Provinces of the ABRUZZO (TERAMO, CHIENTI, PESCARA, AVULI) will remain under Allied Military Government with provincial staffs. The Region, which in future will be known as ABRUZZO-CHIENTI Region, will absorb the Provinces of PESCARA and TERAMO, under Allied Military Government, with their Provincial staffs. The Regional Commander will also act as Allied Commission Liaison Officer for the Provinces of ABRUZZO.

Details of officers to be retained will be found in Appendix "A".

3. Duties of the Allied Commission Liaison Officers in Italian Government territory will be to watch over the Allied and Italian interests in furtherance of the Allied war effort, and to assist the Allied authorities in their relations with Italian local authorities. They will give advice to the Allied military authorities on any matter pertaining to Italian civil affairs, but will no longer be concerned with the execution of advice or guidance to the Italian authorities. Neither will they assume functions which are properly those of military authorities. Personnel will normally confine their activities to the neighborhood of the HQ in which they are located, but in cases of necessity they will of course deal with all matters arising from civil affairs affecting Allied interests within the Regional boundaries.

4. Regional Commission staff will take steps to complete these areas by 1 April 1945. Further instructions will be issued by the Headquarters Section.

SUBJECT: Withdrawal of Allied Commission Personnel from Italian Government Territory.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394.

1. Reference is made to your 4001/754/EG of 24 February and to appendix A to your 4001/EG of 19 February.

2. In order to enable you to proceed with your preparation for general withdrawal by 1 April, approval in principle is now given to the plan contained in the appendix referred to above. To meet Allied military interests and requirements however, it will be necessary for provision to be made to continue, after 1 April, to maintain in liberated Italy certain Allied Commission officers whose retention, for particular as distinct from general duties, may not have been contemplated in your plan. Particulars of the specific requirements in that direction and an indication of likely requirements in the light of study which has and is being made at this Headquarters are as follows:-

a. Road repairs - A full time Allied Commission Highway Engineer Liaison Officer will be needed for attachment at HQ Number 3 District. In this connection it has been requested that Capt. R.M.L. Hubbard be made available for this duty.

b. Electrical Power - A full time Allied Commission Liaison Officer is considered necessary for attachment at HQ Number 3 District to deal with electrical power matters. In that connection it has been requested that Capt. Ryan be made available for that duty.

c. Airistic Depot - Liaison will need to be provided specifically for the Airistic Depot Command at RAL.

d. Interned Diplomats at FALCONE - It will be necessary to maintain direct Allied Commission supervision over these diplomats by retention of an AC officer. 3707

e. Less specifically, supervision of timber production in Calabria, Port operations, and medical liaison have

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been raised as matters requiring the retention of Allied Commission officers.

A note on the reasons for retention has already been sent you and a copy, brought up to date in the light of information since obtained, is attached for reference.

In order to reduce the request to a practical question of numbers and timing you should arrange as soon as possible for an officer to come to this HQ to discuss the problems of the sections concerned in detail and who would be in a position to come to definite conclusions on behalf of AG.

Twenty-four hours notice should be given in order that we may arrange for the appropriate Staff Sections to be represented.

3. Detailed comments are still awaited from G-4(A), Maj. Sec and AFM8. It is unlikely that these comments will be available before the 15 Mar, and the visit recommended above should not occur before that date.

The following points have so far been brought out in discussions on your plan for withdrawal of Allied Commission personnel from Italian Government Territory:-

1. Road Repairs.

The state of the roads in Number 3 District is stated to be causing anxiety to the military authorities and in fact before the proposed withdrawal of AC personnel was mooted the British side had recommended that control of road repair should in fact be strengthened.

At a meeting presided over by A/DCMG at this HQ it was considered that if the Allied Commission officials were to be removed, a full time Allied Commission Liaison officer who is a Highway Engineer should be left in 3 District and be attached to that Hq. The name of Capt. R.H.E. Hubbard was mentioned by Chief Engineer 3 District as being a suitable officer and his retention in that capacity was urged as liable to give the best results.

As there would be no other Allied Commission Highway Engineer left in 3 District it was felt that DCMRP (Roads) should be established within the Works Pool and should be located at Naples, Salerno, Thurate, Bari, Foggia and Crotone. These would each have a staff of 1 Sgt, 1 Foreman of Works, 1 Interpreter, 2 Italian drivers, and 2 vehicles together with appropriate clerical staff and would be available to see that the works required were in fact carried out.

So far as the transport for road repairs at present on loan to Allied Commission is concerned, it was felt that in default of Allied Commission supervision this should be properly organized into civilian platoons with British cadres and should be located at strategic points.

Instructions have been given to WERS, 2 Hq and C(AS) to put up proposals at once for the establishment of the DCMRP staffs and for the provision of transport platoons referred to above.

2. Electric Power

Strong representations have been received that an AC Liaison officer should remain at Hq No 3 District to deal with Electric Power matters as it was felt that the complete withdrawal of Allied Commission (Electrical) personnel would mean that thefts of power which were at present being effectively controlled by Allied Commission would increase.

3. Timber Production Calabria.

As the timber production in Calabria is vital to the war effort and to the Sardinian coal industry it has been strongly urged that the Allied Commission officers specially concerned with that be retained for

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the time being.

4. Port Operation.

G-4 (A) have urged that it will be necessary to have close supervision over port operation at TORRE ANNUNZIATA and CASTELLAMARE while G-4 (B) have urged that in view of conflicting interests in the port at CHITONE, as between wheat imports and timber exports, it will be essential to have an Allied Commission officer stationed there. It is also pointed out that Reggio and Cagliari will continue to have ships discharging and that there is apparently to be no constant supervision at these ports.

It is emphasized that the whole bidding and maintenance procedure is likely to be jeopardized if port operation is not carried out efficiently and that apart from other considerations this would result in a considerable wastage of shipping. It is further pointed out that the whole set-up of the Transportation Sub-Committee has only recently been finalized and it is not clear how it can operate if it is dependent on ICE officials who can not yet be expected to be fully cognizant with the correct procedure to be followed.

The feeling here is that the case of Allied Commission port officers needs reconsideration and that any proposals put forward by the Transportation Sub Commission should be implemented in full in view of the importance of the consequences of self-administration of ports and the resultant effects on shipping.

A further point is that signal communication will fail where no military terminal exists. Shipping cables cannot be received or sent as I.C.S. personnel are not allowed to use military cipher and C-inC Med will not allow signals dealing with shipping to be sent in the clear.

5. Adriatic Depot.

G-4 have urged that liaison be specifically provided for the Adriatic Depot with its Command at Bari, and Adriatic Depot themselves have requested that a Legal Officer be retained in the Bari Area in view of the number of legal problems now confronting Commanders in that Area.

6. Duties of Liaison Officers.

It is considered that the Allied Commission Liaison Officers who remain should, in addition to the duties set out, have the specific duty of reporting actions of Italian civilians which come to their notice which detract from essential civil relief programs or retard operations and projects supported by the military authorities.

7. Interned Diplomats at TAORMINA.

G-2 point out that as long as German diplomats remain at TAORMINA it will be necessary to have an Allied Commission officer responsible for their supervision.

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6. Medical.

Surgeon this HQ points out that the proposed instructions for withdrawal do not provide for positive measures to safeguard the health of Allied troops, and is of opinion that to provide for adequate contact and relationship with the Italian Government a full or part time medical liaison officer should be maintained in all regions on the Italian mainland where large numbers of troops are present. In this connection he is of opinion that the Italian Government must be required to maintain, in close co-ordination with the Military, active programs for the control of infectious diseases, including malaria control, venereal disease prevention and Typhus control, and must provide safe water supplies and sanitary waste disposal in all areas contiguous to troop concentrations or those frequented by troops.

7. Quartermaster Matters.

On this HQ has recommended that Allied Commission personnel should not be withdrawn until other responsible and capable agencies have been established. So far as such agencies are concerned HQ has raised various points on which he requires information and these are set out in appendix 1 to this note.

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APPENDIX A

1. General Information

It is necessary in the handling of coal for this Section to know the name and address of the Italian agency which in future will be responsible for

a. Information of ship's discharges, stocks, etc., and preliminary screening of local requirements in Sicily, and

b. Day to day information of stocks etc., and preliminary screening of local requirements in Puglia.

It is essential that accurate and speedy information should be available to this Section, and having in mind the unsatisfactory state of civilian means of communication, it is for consideration whether the use of military channels may not be necessary.

It is further requested that before the AG personnel is withdrawn he be advised of the appropriate agencies in this Theater with whom the Quartermaster might take up such matters as local procurement of fresh fruits and vegetables, who will ascertain whether they are surplus to the needs of the immediate vicinity, and who should be contacted in reference to availability of other subsistence items such as seeds and cereals, who will supervise the operation of yeast plants, ice plants, etc.

This Section has been calling forward all subsistence supplies for the Allied Commission which have been distributed by the Allied Commission. Have arrangements been made for the continuity and supervision of imported subsistence to the areas in question?

The Transportation Officer (truck pool) at ANCONA. The Provinces of the MARCHE (ANCONA, MACERATA, PESCARA, CHIETI) will remain under Allied Military Government with Provincial staffs. The Region, which in future will be known as MARCHE-ABRUZZO Region, will absorb the Provinces of PESCARA and CHIETI, under Allied Military Government, with their Provincial staffs. The Regional Commissioner will also act as Allied Commission Liaison Officer for the Provinces of ANCONA.

Details of officers to be retained will be found in Appendix "A".

3. Duties of the Allied Commission Liaison Officers in Italian Government territory will be to switch over the Allied and Italian interests in furtherance of the Allied war effort, and to assist the Allied authorities in their relations with Italian local authorities. They will give advice to the Allied military authorities on any matter pertaining to Italian civil affairs, but will no longer be concerned with the description of advice or guidance to the Italian authorities. Neither will they assume functions which are properly those of military authorities. Personnel will primarily continue their activities in the neighborhood of the HQ in which they are located, but in cases of necessity they will of course deal with all matters arising from civil affairs affecting Allied interests within the Regional boundaries.

4. Regional Commission staff will take steps to complete those named by 1 April 1945. Further instructions will be issued by the Establishment Section.

(c) ARMED-MAJOR FORCE All Allied Commission officers will be withdrawn from the Provinces of ASUMI (MOROCCO), ALGERIA, TUNISIA, LIBYA, with the exception of a Transportation Officer (truck pool) at ASUMI. The Provinces of the MAREM (MAREM, MAREM, MAREM, MAREM) will remain under Allied Military Government with Provincial staffs. The Region, which in future will be known as MAREM-ASUMI Region, will absorb the Provinces of MAREM and MAREM, under Allied Military Government, with their Provincial staffs. The Regional Commission will also act as Allied Commission Liaison Officer for the Provinces of ASUMI.

Details of officers to be retained will be found in Appendix "A".

3. Duties of the Allied Commission Liaison Officers in Italian Government territory will be to watch over the Allied and Italian interests in furtherance of the Allied war effort, and to assist the Allied authorities in their relations with Italian local authorities. They will give advice to the Allied military authorities in any matter pertaining to Italian civil affairs, but will no longer be concerned with the assumption of advice or guidance to the Italian authorities. Neither will they assume functions which are properly those of military authorities. For example, they will normally confirm their activities to the neighborhood of the HQ in which they are located, but in cases of necessity they will of course deal with all matters arising from civil affairs affecting Allied interests within the Regional boundaries.

4. Regional Commission will take steps to complete these moves by 1 April 1945. Further instructions will be issued by the Establishment Section.

With reference to your 22/19/008 of 15th November 1944 and further reference to my letter of the above number dated 11th October 1944, para 7 - Date of Reduction. I do not now recommend that reductions should take place before January 1945. In particular with regard to the Finance office although every effort is being made to close down and hand over to the Italians, there are delays and in some cases added commitments.

For example, we received instructions to hand over to the Italians all Medical Stores and accounting. SARDINIA has now, however, been excepted from these instructions.

We have a large quantity of stores on charge and the last Medical Officer has been suddenly ordered away from the Region.

As a consequence these stores have to be accounted for and new arrangements for disposal made.

In addition the financing of the coal is not yet cleared up.

Apart from these points there is some additional work in connection with the arrival at Cagliari of new Naval Units.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Sardinia Region, Allied Commission

1. Reference your letter file 12/1007, dated 11 October 44, Subject: Reduction of Staff, Sardinia Region. Your recommendations in this matter are being carefully considered by this Headquarters, and pending such time as more officers are needed for mainland activities, any final reduction in accordance with your recommendations will be delayed.

2. The following comments of each interested subcommission in the Economic Section in regard to your proposed staff reductions should be of interest:

a. Agriculture S/C

Staff reduction agreed to. Italian agricultural agencies have assumed responsibilities and leadership to such a point that the Regional Agricultural Officer was withdrawn approximately one week ago. A food officer could call in local agricultural officials on matters affecting local agriculture.

b. Finance S/C

The remaining Finance Officer in Sardinia Region can be withdrawn sometime in December.

c. Food S/C

Food officers in Sardinia already down to required strength for reduction. One lieutenant colonel -- he should remain.

d. Transportation S/C

Major Matthews of Mining Division, this Subcommission, is considered competent to deal with industrial questions and should in any case remain in view of the importance of mining.

e. P. W. & U. S/C

The one officer in Sardinia deals with railroad and shipping. On the rail side, military railway service has just been handed over to ACC, and it is essential one officer remain to supervise for some time at least. Shipping requirements also require supervision.

3. The Civil Affairs Section is holding this matter in abeyance pending actual need for officers.

With reference to the discussions which have taken place with your Headquarters in regard to the withdrawal of the whole or part of A.C. personnel from Sicily, my views in the light of existing circumstances are as follows.

1. As regards the Civil Affairs side as opposed to specialists I consider that when the decision is taken to withdraw that withdrawal should be complete. I feel that it would be undesirable to leave a liaison officer or liaison officers for the purpose of contact with the S.C. for Sicily. I feel that it would be preferable for the Italian administration here to be entirely independent and for all Civil Affairs matters to be dealt with by your S.Q. through Italian channels.

2. The reasons against withdrawal immediately are as follows:

a. The work connected with the Allied installations on the island. These are principally the American Naval Base at PALERMO and the British Naval Base at MESSINA, CATANIA, AUGUSTA and SIRACUSA. Some of these are being or may be reduced in the near future. There is in addition a Military Sub-Area S.Q. on the island: RM Sub-Area S.Q. under No. 3 District. Work connected with these installations and S.Q. requires general liaison and coordination.

b. The existing food situation which, with grain stocks only sufficient to carry the island to the end of the year, make the position most delicate and, should serious trouble arise in the island, the war effort would be affected.

c. The Islands of PANTHERIA and LAMPEDUSA which are at present under AMG and controlled by Sicilia Region.

3. The reasons for immediate withdrawal might be as follows:

- a. The need for the employment of personnel elsewhere.
- b. External political influences of which I am not aware.

4. As regards Specialist Officers or representatives of A.C. Subcommissions it would appear essential that some must remain until arrangements are made either for more responsibility to be taken over by the Italian Government or for the replacement of officers by Allied civilian personnel. The question of which specialist officers are required in Sicily would appear to be a matter for your S.Q. rather than ours. For instance, instructions were received by this S.Q. that subject to my concurrence, my Public Works Officer would be withdrawn on 15 Oct. I whole-heartedly agreed (my REQ/210.1 of 26 Sept 1944) subject to necessary adjustments of the paper machinery, though there was some slight opposition on 8685 of my Public Works Officer. Shortly after dispatch of my reply a Captain (S) arrived from the Public Works Subcommission of your S.Q. and spent a considerable time in Sicily investigating the matter. As a result the decision to withdraw my Public Works Officer was cancelled. Further, since that date the Public Works Division here was to have been re-inforced by the addition of an American civilian, but this has now been cancelled.

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5. In my opinion the following could be withdrawn when it is decided to disband Regional H.Q. here, subject to certain adjustments as outlined below.

- a. Public Works - 1 officer. Reasons have already been given to your H.Q.
- b. Public Health & Welfare - 1 officer. The status of the Italian Regional Director of Public Health should be decided upon by the Italian Government before the A.C. representative is withdrawn.
- c. Agriculture - 1 officer.
- d. Labor - 1 officer. Should any complicated matters arise in regard to wages or conditions of employment it might be necessary for a representative of the Labor Subcommittee to be located temporarily in the Island.
- e. Rail Transportation - 1 officer. Traffic regulations, A.C. and military priorities, supervision of coal consumption, transfer of locomotives and rolling stock would require to be handed over completely to the Italian officials.
- f. Legal Division - 1 officer. Appeals and applications for grace in cases tried under A.C. would be dealt with by your H.Q. and any Allied Forces remaining in Sicily would have to deal directly with Italian judicial agencies.
- g. Public Safety Division - 2 officers.
- h. Supply Accounts Division - 1 officer. It is presumed that the arrangements being made with the Italian Government for the payment of various commodities would not require the presence of supply accountants in Sicily. These to be transferred to Southern Region.
- i. Commanding Officer, Co. "A"

6. I consider that the following could not be withdrawn unless or until they should be replaced by other personnel:

- a. Economy and Supply Division - 2 officers. There are at present 4 officers with this Division so that a reduction by two would be effected. So long as the importation of Allied food and other commodities is continued some Allied supervision seems desirable. Moreover, some organization will be necessary to deal with movement of civil food surpluses to the Mainland, and bids for shipping and control of P.O.L.
- b. Export Division - 1 officer. Extensive actual operation and control of exports are carried out by this Division. It controls all warehouses used in connection with the exportation of commodities to the UK and the US, and it is stated that under existing circumstances no other warehousing arrangements are possible.
- c. Finance - 1 officer. Would be required to make payments of A.C. expenditures, deal with the indebtedness due from Italian agencies to A.C., make payment to needy Nationals and deal with A.C. finance for Pantelleria and Lampedusa.
- d. Property Control - 1 officer. The administration of property and assets of Allied Nationals and the return of such property to its owners will require the work of some Allied representative, although it is possible that this work could be combined with similar duties in some other Region.
- e. Transportation Division - 1 officer. Some 500 trucks, largely captured enemy material, are operated under A.C. supervision for the benefit of the civilian economy of the Island. There are considerable A.C. financial interests involved.
- f. Mining Division - 1 officer. The procurement of supplies for sulphur and asphalt mining, many of them from Allied Military sources, the difficulties of transportation, the importance of such products for the prosecution of the war make the presence of an A.C. representative essential.
- g. Administrative - 1 officer. It is considered that at least one officer would be required to deal with such matters as accommodation, pay, discipline of SN/OWs and messing. His presence would also be necessary if there should be considerable replacement by Allied civilian personnel, as, generally speaking, normal

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accommodation and feeding arrangements in hotels are not possible. Command of AC military personnel would be vested in the ranking British or American officer left in Sicily.

7. The above proposals would make a strength of some 10 Specialist Officers to remain.

8. In my opinion Regional Hq together with Specialist Divisions should remain as at present constituted in Sicily until the end of the year, when the matter could be reviewed in the light of existing circumstances. I consider that, if the personnel are not then required for employment elsewhere, any decision taken should be determined by the needs of the war effort and not by external political influences.

9. In connection with this whole matter it may be mentioned that in existing circumstances the population and local Italian administration are averse to the withdrawal of the support given and influence exercised by the presence of an AC organization on the island. Similarly, the Allied Service authorities are not in favor of any withdrawal at the moment, in view of the food and labor situation on the island and the need for contact with the local Italian administration in respect of these and other matters.

Subject: Preparation for Dissolution

To : Regional Commissioner, Sicilia Region
Regional Commissioner, Sardegna Region

1. In view of the factors affecting the military situation, and of a potential shortage of personnel for the forward regions, it is considered advisable that you take such steps to bring up to date all records and accounts maintained in your Region, to the end that, if necessary, dissolution might take place as of the first of the year.
2. There is no definite plan now under consideration to take such a step, but the possibility is not remote, and prudent administrative practice would appear to make advisable adequate preparation therefor.
3. The Chief of Staff, therefore, has directed that you take such measures as you consider necessary to prepare for the possibility outlined in paragraph 1, above, and that this letter be acknowledged, as confirmation of the initiation of this action.
