



SUBJECT: Functions of Sub-Commissions, Economic Section

To: Executive Commissioner

Below appears a brief summary of the major functions of each of the six sub-commissions of the Economic Section, submitted in compliance with your verbal request.

A. Commerce (Foreign Trade) Sub-Commission: Secures clearance of Italian exports with the Combined Boards where Reserved Commodity List items are involved; reviews lists of exportable surpluses to determine whether they conflict with import programs and whether they can be applied to local military requirements; studies and makes recommendations as to all action to be taken by Allied Commission on proposed trade agreements and export-import arrangements; assists the Italian Government in developing its policy and organization with respect to trade controls. These functions are undertaken with the objective of the re-establishment of private trade to the maximum extent, under appropriate Italian Government controls to insure that Italian external resources are used to the best advantage from the standpoint of rehabilitation of the Italian economy and the provision of essential civilian supplies to that end.

B. Finance Sub-Commission: Controls the custody and disbursement of Allied Military lire to the Allied Forces, AC/AGC, and other Allied organizations; keeps the accounts involved therein; renders reports thereon to higher authority; receives and transmits to the Italian Government and AC/AGC, for guidance and compliance, directives from higher authority laying down Allied policies on financial matters; gives policy directions to and supervises the operations of AGC Finance officers in AGC territory, in connection with the Italian public financial administration and Italian private financial institutions; maintains contact with the Italian Ministries of the Treasury and Finance, and with the Central Bank (Bank of Italy), and advises them, when requested, on financial problems.

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C. Food & Agriculture Sub-Commission: Assists the Italian Government in providing an agreed dietary level for the Nation, acting in an advisory capacity in Italian Government territory, and in an operating and supervisory capacity in Allied Military Government territory. Acts to insure maximum utilization of domestic resources by restoration of agriculture, forestry and fisheries production; and to provide the necessary supplementary imported food-stuffs with which to maintain established ration scales. Acts to insure additional resources for the Allied Military forces wherever practicable, and the availability of surpluses that can be exported to re-establish foreign credits whenever practicable -- all these functions being designed to relieve the dependence upon imported relief supplies. Advises the Italian Government with regard to policies and procedures that affect the production, procurement, and utilization of essential food and feed.

D. Industry and Utilities Sub-Commission: Formulates and recommends policies and plans affecting Italian industrial production; estimates potential production, basing thereon recommendations and procedures, and, as necessary, screening qualitatively requisitions submitted by AMG Regional authorities, by other Sub-Commissions, or by the Italian Government, for all supplies of an industrial nature, including priorities attached thereto. Is responsible for planning power rehabilitation throughout Italy. In AMG territory is responsible for the use of Italian facilities for maintenance and reconstruction of military roads and bridges, and of all public works necessary to the prevention of disease and unrest; advises and assists the Italian Government on all Public Works problems as requested.

The Fuels Dept. (Coal) screens Italian demands and assists as liaison with the Italian Government in the procurement and allocation of coal. Shipping arrivals (averaging 80 per month) are coordinated by coal shipping experts of the Department to avoid congestion at Italian ports. The Fuels Dept. (POL) screens demands for POL under the national programs made by Italian Government and arranges for procurement of supplies through agreed channels. Until such time as Northern Regions are handed back to the Italian Government, it is temporarily necessary to make definite allocations to Northern Regions in addition.

E. Labor Sub-Commission: In Italian Government Territory, advises and assists upon request of the Italian Government with regard to policy and legislation concerning:

Page Three

- a. Basic labor laws and regulations governing wages, hours and working conditions.
 - b. Industrial relations and the formation of free associations of employees and employers.
 - c. Manpower and recruitment, registration, placement and movement of all labor, and employment exchanges.
 - d. Labor inspection and the enforcement of labor standards, safety and working conditions.
 - e. Social security measures and social security agencies.

In AMG Territory, establishes machinery for handling civilian labor requirements of Allied Military forces; coordinates the civilian labor program with the Allied Military Labor Program; arranges for the abolition of Fascist labor organizations; determines the civilian wage policy; supervises labor relations, particularly as concerns labor union organizations; establishes labor offices; supervises social security agencies and the implementation of Italian Government decrees.

F. Transportation and Shipping Sub-Commission: Advises the Italian Government on all Transportation matters (except those concerning Air Transportation). In particular supervises movement programmes to ensure that the carriage of freight by rail is carried out in accordance with established priorities and that the movement of essential civilian supplies to be moved by Italian coastwise shipping is carried in the most economical manner with the shipping available.

Advises the Italian Government on all matters pertaining to the Italian State Railways including the railway reconstruction programmes. Screens the request for train services by the Italian Government. Advises as to the most effective use of available road haulage vehicles and Government Truck Pools and advises on haulage programmes. Carries out transfers of Allied imported and ex-Army vehicles to the Italian Government. Advises as to the use of ports and warehouses, the rehabilitation of the ports, and the method of obtaining equipment for the latter.





2. The figures given in Appendix B show the combined American and British requirements for the suggested set up in the future. Assuming that the policy of parity will be continued the breakdown will be as follows:-

3. On completion of the hand-over of territory to the Italian Government a short period will be required to close the administration and records of Regional and Provincial headquarters. Immediate action, however, is being taken to furnish AMHQ with the particulars of personnel who will become surplus so that they may be disposed of by release in accordance with U.S. and British Release Schemes, or by employment in other theatres.

4. It is felt that the time given us to prepare this report, virtually a pro-posed new TC/GR, has been short and therefore minor amendments may be necessary when the future policy of A.C. has been determined.

I have just had a meeting to settle the split up of the War Materials Disposal and Italian Prisoner of War Sub-Commission. The following decisions were taken subject to your approval:

- (1) Lieut. Colonel GARNETT (B) with 17 officers (8 British/9 US) will form the War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission of the Economic Section. 8 of these will form HQ in Rome, 6 in MILAN, and 4 in the field. 9 British officers are now in the Sub-Commission; 6 US officers including a Deputy Director will have to be found. Colonel Parkin has directions on this.
- (2) An Italian Prisoners of War Division will be set up in the Civil Affairs Section under Lieut. Colonel REEKS (A) as chief of the Division, and 4 officers. 3 of these officers are now with the Division and a British Major is to be appointed. G-1(B) has directions on this point.
- (3) The date will be 1st September with agreement that there shall be a physical overlap of 7-10 days.
- (4) I propose to return to the charge with AFHQ on transferring the responsibility for Italian POW to the Land Forces Sub-Commission. It is abundantly clear from our experiences in the last 6 months that this should be done.


