TOP SECRET.

1. There are at present as reported on 19 September within ITALY 101 Soviet persons with Soviet Missions as follows (A) Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council for ITALY officers 5 other ranks 2 civilians 30 (B) Soviet Representation on the ALLIED COMMISSION officers 10 other ranks 1 civilians 3 (C) Soviet Military Mission sometimes called Displaced Persons Repatriation Mission officer 16 other ranks 34.

2. Not all of these are officially accredited to Headquarters ALLIED COMMISSION. Some have appeared in ITALY without the knowledge or consent of HQ ALLIED COMMISSION. In case of one (C) above numbers have been recruited from liberated Soviet Prisoners of War and have assumed without permission status of fully-accredited representatives.

3. All obtain food petrol etc from our supplies. Missions in one (A) and one (B) above have behaved properly but Mission in one (C) has given trouble by travelling widely throughout ITALY opening unofficial offices in various towns and carrying on extensive propaganda under the guise of caring for Displaced Persons of which very few can now remain.

4. It is considered essential that the numbers of personnel of these missions be reduced and that all remaining be properly accredited to Headquarters ALLIED COMMISSION by MOSCOW.

Maximum numbers considered necessary for Russian Missions total 40 of which only 2 officer interpreters and 4 other ranks are necessary for work of military Mission in para no (C) above as this is virtually complete.

5. Also essential that movement of members of Russian Missions is brought into line with all other Allied and UNITED STATES and British personnel. This means that no movement outside permanent location allowed without travel permit issued by AHQ or HQ ALLIED COMMISSION. It cannot be agreed that permits can be issued for entry into 13 CORPS or any area where Polish troops are located.

6. Request you represent to Soviet authorities that numbers in excess of above be withdrawn and HQ ALLIED COMMISSION be furnished with list of officially accredited representatives it is desired to retain within total allowed. Also request you inform the Soviet authorities that those remaining must obtain travel permits as in para 5 above before movement will be permitted.

7. Stress that this control of movement means no victimisation of Missions but is the same treatment accorded British and American officers. Will be grateful any suggestions you have to make on this whole subject.

SUBJECT: Travel of Russians in Italy. 15 September 1945.

TO : Chief Commissioner,  
Headquarters, Allied Commission,  
APO 394.

1. Reference is made to your letter, subject Russians in Italy, file 68/49 Est dated 6 September 1945. In connection with this subject there are enclosed a memorandum prepared in British No. 2 District and a paraphrase of a signal from Distwo dated 13 September.

2. If you are not already doing so, it is suggested that when authority for travel is given to persons included in categories within paragraph E(i) and E(ii) of your letter, that your "travel permit" be issued on a special distinctive form which is easily recognizable and that authority to sign such permits shall be confined to one office which can maintain records of all authorized travel. In connection with persons in category E(iii) it is suggested that they be issued a permanent or semi-permanent distinctive permit which will define their status, and conditions, including authorized localities, under which they may circulate.

3. You are well aware of the embarrassment being experienced at AFHQ as the result of certain irregular activities on the part of some Russians. SACMED is desirous of imposing as few restrictions as possible on the proper movement of authorized agencies but it is inevitable that unauthorized activities by a few must be reflected in increased restrictions and more careful accounting for the whereabouts of all. It is therefore proposed that all who cannot produce proper credentials for being at the place they are at the time shall be taken under control and returned to their proper station. Subsequent action will depend upon the seriousness of the irregularity.

SUBJECT: Memorandum for GOC on Russian Military in 2 District.

GENERAL

1. A number of Russian military appear from time to time in 2 District. When asked to produce papers they generally either promise to do so and then fail to return with them, or produce some vague letter often stating that the bearers are employed on repatriation duties.
2. AFHQ (CI) have been requested to furnish a list of accredited Russian missions and nominal roll. In the same way as has been done in the case of the French. AFHQ state that they are unable to do this, but have requested 2 District to supply names and particulars of any Russians not with in the area. This is being done.

SPECIFIC INSTANCES

3. Lieutenant Leonard SONESCERO, dressed in Russian uniform and carrying papers signed by Major MATEVSEN IV whose office is in MILAN, claims to be representing a Russian Repatriation Mission whose HQ is at ROME, 120 Via Montanara. He states he has been in Italy 18 months and is known to be in close contact with the BERGAMO Provincial CIN Commandant PETROLINI. His activities, not known except for a request made to provincial Commissioner for permission to distribute posters, calling on Russian citizens to return home (in Italian), appear to be confined to the BERGAMO, BRESCIA and SONDRIO Provinces. Major MATEVSEN is alleged to be in charge of a Russian Repatriation office in MILAN - 10 Corso Matteotti.

Names of those persons representing this mission are being obtained, for forwarding to AFHQ.

4. Two Russian Military personnel, a Colonel and a Captain, names unknown, together with an unidentified woman, are making frequent visits to the Communist Party HQ at MILAN. They arrive in a LANCIA No 0493 ROMA bearing a CP starting. Investigations are in hand to endeavour to identify these persons.

5. A Russian Military Mission appears to be touring PRIMORD with its HQ at TURIN. It appears to be composed of one General, 6 officers and one male civilian and 3 women in uniform.

6. A Russian Military Mission consisting of

and 2 O/Rs has installed itself in QMDO to deal with repatriation of Italian prisoners from RUSSIA. Names of the mission have been forwarded to AFHQ.

Major MATVEEV is alleged to be in charge of a Russian Repatriation Office in MILAN - 10 Corso Matteotti.

4. Two Russian Military personnel, a Colonel and a Captain, names unknown, together with an unidentified woman, are making frequent visits to the Communist Party HQ at MILAN. They arrive in a LANCIA No 0493 ROMA bearing a CO marking. Investigations are in hand to endeavour to identify these persons.

5. A Russian Military Mission appears to be touring PIEMONTE with its HQ at TURIN. It appears to be composed of one General, 6 officers and one male civilian and 3 women in uniform.

6. A Russian Military Mission consisting of

Lieut DOLGANOV Benjamin

(?) Lieut BOBRIK Mosevich

and 2 OEs has installed itself in GENOVA to deal with repatriation of Italian prisoners from RUSSIA. Names of the Mission have been forwarded to AFHQ.

7. On 9 Sep a party of four Russian Officers and four OEs namely:-

Capt Kraschenko Youra

Lieut Silins Constantin

Sgt Petrovich

Interpreter LOPAK

Secretary CHETOFF

Major SZEMKO (not covered by letter of credit see below) travelling in Panhard Y926 RUE and Huber 220 RUE, arrived in TURIN having apparently crossed from FRANCE at an unrecognised crossing point. They carried a letter of credit from the Russian Economic Mission in Paris requesting French British and US authorities to assist them in accomplishing an economic mission in TURIN, MILAN and ROME.

Details were reported to AFHQ on 10 Sep who replied that the party was to be escorted back to the French frontier and instructed that before re-entering ITALY clearance from SACMED must be obtained from the appropriate Allied authorities in PARIS.

Before these orders could be carried out the party left the hotel in TURIN and have not since been traced.

CONCLUSION

6. To summarise - it would appear numerous Russian missions are active within this HQ's area dealing either

- (a) with repatriation of Russians or
- (b) with repatriation of Italians or
- (c) with economic matters or
- (d) with distribution of posters.

However reports from all sources confirm that all missions are in constant contact with the local communist HQs.

RECOMMENDATION

9. It is recommended

- (a) That protest should be made against the present unorthodox behaviour and procedure of the Russian Missions.
- (b) That AFHQ be again pressed to obtain from the Russians fuller details of the accredited Missions with names of members of these missions.

PRIVILEGES AND FACILITIES ACCORDED THIS  
SOVIET DELEGATION IN ITALY.

For reference in connection with determining what privileges and facilities should be expected for British and US personnel accredited to the Allied Control Commissions in Italy, and Bulgaria, there is presented herewith a summary of information concerning the privileges and facilities accorded to the various Russian delegations in Italy. The information given applies to the Russian Embassy only to the extent stated.

1. PERSONNEL.

Soviet personnel (not including wives or children) are assigned or attached to the respective delegations in Italy as follows:

- (a) Allied Commission : 1 Representative, 5 Officers assistants,  
1 Other Rank - Total 7 persons.
- (b) Advisory Council : 1 Representative (temporarily the same  
as for the AC), 1 Officer Assistant, 8  
Civilian Assistants, 10 Other Ranks,  
Total - 20 persons.
- (c) Military Mission : 1 Representative, 17 Officer Assistants  
(2 more about to be accredited), 4  
Persons and Repre-  
sentation Sub-  
Commission of AC).
- (d) Embassy : 13 Civilians.

2. FUNCTIONS.

- (a) Under directive of the S.A.C. dated 26 January 1944, the Soviet Representative to the Allied Commission is limited to consultative functions, with access to information on all aspects of the Commission's work and with the right to make suggestions to the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner). Under directive of the Combined Chiefs of Staff of 23 September 1944, the staff officers attached to the Soviet representation to the AC are limited to observing the work of the various sub-commissions.

- (b) In addition to their observational functions, the persons 1/1 of the  
Military Mission to the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission serve  
Soviet refugees and ex-prisoners of war, visit camps and arrange for repatriation  
of Soviet nationals.

- (c) The Soviet representative on the Advisory Council participates on  
an equal basis with other representatives in planning of meetings and in the

(a) Allied Commission : 1 Representative, 5 Officer assistants,  
1 Other Rank - Total 7 persons.

(b) Advisory Council : 1 Representative (temporarily the same  
as for the AC), 4 Officer assistant, 3  
Civilian assistants, 10 Other Ranks,

(c) Military Mission : 4 Representatives, 17 Officer assistants  
(to the Displaced Persons and  
Refugee Sub-Commission of  
the Commission of AC).

(d) Embassy : 13 Civilians.

## 2. FUNCTIONS.

(a) Under directive of the S.A.C. dated 26 January 1946, the Soviet  
Representative to the Allied Commission is limited to consultative functions,  
with access to information on all aspects of the Commission's work and with  
the right to make suggestions to the Deputy President (Chief Commissioner).  
Under directive of the Combined Chiefs of Staff of 23 September 1946, the staff  
officers attached to the Soviet representation to the AC are limited to observing  
the work of the various sub-commissions.

(b) In addition to their observational functions, the personnel of the  
Soviet mission to the Displaced Persons and Refugee Sub-Commission screen  
Soviet refugees and ex-prisoners of war, visit camps and arrange for repatriation  
of Soviet nationals.

(c) The Soviet representative on the Advisory Council participates on  
an equal basis with other representatives in meetings at meetings and in the  
recommendations formulated by the council.

(d) It follows from the fact that the function of the Soviet  
Representative on the Allied Commission is merely consultative, that no procedure  
is provided to ensure that he will have an opportunity to consult with his  
government prior to the taking of decisions by the Commission, or even to ensure  
that he or his staff may have of contemplated decisions before they are taken,  
except insofar as this occurs through attendance at meetings.

## 3. ACCESS TO INFORMATION.

(a) Meetings.

The Soviet representative on the Allied Commission attends the  
Plen Presidium's meetings (attended by heads of sections and sub-commissions)  
which are presided over by the Deputy President. For these he is permitted  
to be accompanied by an ADC and an interpreter. To attend any deliberated  
for these meetings. Members of the Military Mission attend meetings of the  
Displaced Persons Sub-Commission when invited to do so in consultation with members  
affecting Soviet interests. The Staff Officers assigned to the other Sub-Coms,

have the privilege of attending Sub-Commission meetings but do not frequently do so. Prior to each meeting of the Advisory Council, an agenda is circulated, but it is not the practice to circulate prior to the meeting papers for consideration.

(b) Documents.

All documentary information relative to the work of the Commission is made available on the initiative of the Commission to the Soviet Representative. He and his staff do not see:-

- (1) Unpublished copies of cipher messages, and  
(2) Matter which is likely to prejudice relations with the Soviet Government. Top secret matters which it would be undesirable to show to junior officers is shown only to the Soviet Representative. Soviet officers assigned to Sub-Commission are not permitted to observe the work of Sub-Commissions other than those to which they are assigned. They are, upon request, shown documents at the discretion of the head of their Sub-Commission, but do not frequently avail themselves of this privilege.

All information affecting the Advisory Council that the delegation to it requires is made available to it on request.

(c) Information from Italian sources.

The extent to which the Soviet members of the various delegations interview personnel of the Italian Government and private Italian citizens is not known. No restrictions are placed upon such interviews.

b. Movements.

(a) Freedom of movement.

- (1) South of the line ANCONA-STRAVIA-YOBILIO, members of all Russian delegations have complete freedom of movement within Italy. Travel orders, whether or not travel is to be by US or British facilities, are obtained through the appropriate US or British Liaison Officer at Rome, and issued by Headquarters Allied Commission.

- (2) For travel north of this line, consent of 15th Army Group (Administrative Memorandum 1055, AMHQ, 8 December 1944, now requires a conference of AMHQ also) is obtained for Soviet personnel, liaisoned through the appropriate Liaison officer. Two such visits have been made north of this line by members of Soviet delegations at ROMY during the last six weeks. The military liaison has on at least one occasion sent officers into the forward areas without US or British authority.

(3) For inter-departmental travel, including that of Soviet

to the Soviet Headquarters. Soviet officers assigned to Sub-Commission are not permitted to observe the work of Sub-Commissions other than those to which they are assigned. They are, upon request, shown documents at the discretion of the head of their Sub-Commission, but do not frequently avail themselves of this privilege.

All information affecting the Advisory Council that the delegation to it requires is made available to it on request.

(c) Information from Italian Sources.

The extent to which the Soviet members of the various delegations interview personnel of the Italian Government and private Italian citizens is not known. No restrictions are placed upon such interviews.

4. Movements.

(a) Freedom of movement.

(1) South of the line ANCONA-SIENA-FIORENTINO, members of all Russian delegations have complete freedom of movement within ITALY. Travel orders, whether or not travel is to be by US or British facilities, are obtained through the appropriate US or British Liaison Officer at ROME, and issued by Headquarters Allied Commission.

(2) For travel north of this line, consent of 15th Army Group (Administrative Memorandum No. 55, AMHQ, 3 December 1944, war requirement concurrence of AMHQ also) is obtained for Soviet personnel, Lieutenant General / U through the appropriate liaison officer. Two such visits have been made north of the line by members of Soviet delegations at ROME during the last six weeks. The Military Mission has on at least one occasion sent officers into the forward areas without US or British authority.

(3) For inter-theatre travel, including that of Soviet diplomatic couriers, authority to travel is obtained by the appropriate British or US liaison officer at ROME from AMHQ, and travel orders are issued by HQ Allied Commission. Authority has in every case been obtained, though there have been some delays due to the making of applications at the last minute. Such authority consists of travel orders for use within the theatres, or when US or British facilities are used. No authorisation for the exit itself is required for allied service personnel on duty, or for accredited diplomats and consular officials. (Letter, AMHQ AG 371.2/015 GEN-O, 7 November 1944). As to travel to RUSSIA from the Soviet Union, an Allied Forces Permit for the trip, which may be issued by US Military Mission or the US Military Mission in MOSCOW without AMHQ concurrence, is now theoretically required, except as to diplomatic and consular officials (Letter AMHQ AG 371.2/CH1 GEN-O, 5 January - August 1945) but this requirement has not yet actually been enforced.

(b) Entry of Soviet planes into the theatre requires clearance by HQ MAP, which, however, is immediately given as a matter of routine.

(b) Transportations.

(1) Vehicles permanently assigned to the Soviet delegations by U.S. and British authorities are only two in number - one for the delegation to the AG and one for the Military Mission.

(2) The following Russian-owned vehicles are maintained:

Military Mission	4
Delegation to Advisory Council	5
Diplomacy	1

(3) All of the above vehicles except the embassy vehicle require maintenance, motor fuel and lubricants from AG.

(4) The Soviet representative on the AG and the Soviet Military Mission also have the use of vehicles in the AG HQ Commissariat's pool.

5. Communications.

(a) Radio.

The Soviet authorities maintain a transmitedter in MEZ, with which they can communicate directly with SOGOK. The Soviet delegations can send messages by US or British channels whenever they wish by sending them to the sub-jacket matter to the Liaison Officer, AG, but have only rarely used this facility.

(b) Courier and Letter Delivery Service.

U.S. and British services are made available through the AG, but the Soviet Delegations appear to have little official correspondence. They are also permitted to maintain their own courier service, for communications inside and outside the theatre.

6. Supply.

(a) Supply for the respective delegations from non-Russian sources is as follows:

5. CONSTRUCTION.

(a) Buildings.

The Soviet authorities maintain a transmitter in Rome, which they can communicate directly with Moscow. The Soviet delegations can send signals by US or British channels whenever they wish by submitting the subject matter to the Liaison Officer, AC, but have only rarely used this facility.

(b) Courier and letter delivery services.

U.S. and British services are made available through the AC, but the Soviet Delegations appear to have little official correspondence. They are also permitted to maintain their own counter services, for communications inside and outside the theatre.

6. SUPPLIES.

(a) Supply for the respective delegations from non-member sources is as follows:

- (1) Allied Commission : US rations; M.A.R.T. facilities for all.  
UK facilities for 2.
- (2) Advisory Council : Foodstuffs for 10, M.R.F. facilities for 3.
- (3) Military Mission : British rations; M.R.F. facilities,  $\frac{1}{2}$  U.S. Government at approximately 1/2 scale.
- (4) Embassy : Italian rations from the Italian Red Cross on the civilian scale.

(b) The AC has not been requested to import supplies or equipment from the United Nations. On occasions the Russians have asked AC for special foodstuffs and sugar was given them for the publication of complete calendar the Defense of Stalingrad and Red Army Day. The Russians were also permitted to exhibit in Rome a Red Army Day documentary film.

7. EXCISES.

(a) Official securities given.

P.R.P. includes units in its general propaganda programme covering the United Nations. On occasions the Russians have asked AC for special agency news files were included by P.R.P. in news releases to the Italian newspapers and radios when such release was under UN control. Since the substation of the Italian News Agency and paper. The Soviet Agency is allowed to import files for private agencies to Italione.

(b) Other Russian activities.

There is little doubt that the Russians have given support, behind the scenes, to the Communist newspaper, UTTA. The Russians also distributed on one occasion moving pictures to the Italian public through a commercial agency, without previously obtaining permission from allied authorities.

6. SOVET INSTALLATIONS OUTSIDE ITALY.

- (a) No aircraft or airforce personnel are now maintained in ITALY by the Soviet Union.
- (b) A part of the St. Idraons' Camp, TARANTO, is under Soviet control, for repatriation of ex-POW.
- (c) One officer is attached to the Allied Registration Unit, NAPLES.

7. ARMED FORCES.

The privileges and facilities enjoyed by the respective national components of the various Allied Commissions may depend to some extent upon the armistice provisions establishing each commission. For comparison, these are briefly summarised:-

- (a) The Italian armistice does not name the nations to be represented on the Commission, but simply provides for a Control Commission "representative of the United Nations" and placed the commission "under orders and general directions of the Allied Commander-in-Chief".
- (b) The Bulgarian armistice provides for an "Allied Control Commission" which will undertake until the conclusion of the peace the control over the execution of the armistice terms "under" the general direction and orders of the Allied (Soviet) High Command, acting on behalf of the "Allied powers". The nations to be represented on the Commission are not named, but the fact that the armistice is signed on behalf of the USSR, the United Kingdom and the US implies the representation of all three.
- (c) The Hungarian armistice expressly provides for the participation of representatives of the United States and the United Kingdom, and further provides that during the whole period of the armistice the representative of the (Allied) High Command shall be chairman, and that until the cessation of hostilities with REGARD the Commission will be under the general direction of the United (Soviet) High Command.




