1. Request that an Army Aircraft Type L-5 C be authorized this Headquarters for the following reasons:

(a) This office requires the above type aircraft for the efficient accomplishment of its duties which include the entire country of Italy and the Venezia Giulia Region (Trieste). The aircraft is used for frequent liaison trips, and is necessary for quick transportation to the various liaison offices operating from this Headquarters.

(b) It is understood that this type aircraft is available in substantial quantity at RAFOD, Capodichino Airport, Naples.

(c) This service has formerly been provided by two British light aircraft which have been turned back to their base depot.

(d) This office includes in its establishment a qualified U.S. Army Artillery Liaison Pilot and a Staff Sergeant Field Artillery Aircraft Mechanic, who have had approximately three years experience in operation of the above-described type aircraft.

(e) 3rd Echelon Maintenance of the above requested aircraft will be furnished by Air-Transport Command, in the event that necessity arises.

(f) Any spare parts which may eventually be required will be obtained from A.O.P., 88th Division.

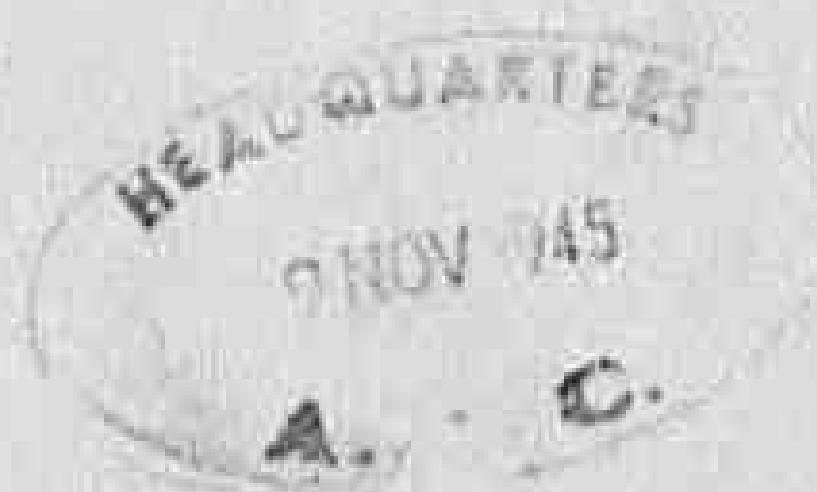

Since the liberation of Northern Italy I have received correspondence from the Regional Commissioner Venezia Region and from various Provincial Commissioners concerning the location of Graves of crashed British Airmen and escaped Prisoners of War.

The information is generally obtained from Italian sources and is most valuable in tracing missing personnel.

Unfortunately the activities of The Imperial War Graves Commission does not cover this work, but ~~is~~ connected with the taking over from the Army of permanent British War Cemeteries, constructing them on permanent lines and maintaining them in perpetuity.

In consequence I have to forward such correspondence to the D.D.G.R. & E. Records Section, c/o 56 Area C.M.F., Naples.

Would it be possible to notify Regions that any information relative to British fallen should be sent to the organization referred to in the preceding paragraph. In doing so considerable time will be saved.

1. The following instructions are issued, in order that a common policy may be observed by all commands in connection with the celebration of the end of hostilities against JAPAN.
2. Victory against JAPAN is the culmination of many months of bloody, bitter battle, of profound thanksgiving, and of joy and happiness. It must be remembered, however, that much still remains to be done before our task ⁽³⁷⁾ is finally completed.
3. 1 day will be set aside to be observed as a holiday. The day selected will be announced to all commands by ALLIED FORCE HEADQUARTERS. Those who cannot take a holiday on the announced date because they are performing essential services will be given a holiday later.
4. Commanders of formation, units, etc, will arrange a program for the day, similar to the programs conducted on V-E day. It is suggested that the ceremonies be brief, and that as much time as possible be devoted to entertainment, rest, special meals, recreation, etc.
5. Extra issue of rations and post exchange/EFI supplies will not be made, but units will make their own arrangements for supplementing the normal fare.
6. It is desirable that, as far as possible, men should be discouraged from

visiting larger towns. However, there is no objection to visits to the beaches or organized recreational areas.

7. Apart from the specific points mentioned, observance of the end of hostilities is discretionary with the commanders concerned. Insofar as possible they should be guided by the experience gained in the observance of the V-E Day celebration. All informed.

1. Attention is called to the fact that many Sub-Commissions, Sections and Branches are disregarding the repeated notices in the Daily Bulletin in reference to submitting signal traffic for transmission as early as possible during the day. On Saturday night last, 4 August 1945, about thirty (30) outgoing signals were received by this office for authentication between the hours of 1700 and 1800 and about fifty-one (51) were received by the Night Staff Duty Officer between 1800 and 1900 hours. A good many of these messages were marked PRIORITY, and in some instances the reference numbers on these messages were obtained from the Cable Typing Pool the day before. This procedure is a direct violation of AFHQ Letter, subject: "Proper Use of Classification and Precedence", file AG 311.5/199 SIG-O, dated 11 June 1945 and other publications on this subject.

2. It is believed that a good many of these messages could easily be sent as letters for delivery by ELS or ADLS and other various messenger services, especially in those areas where a shortage of electrical facilities exist and delivery by ELS or ADLS would be more convenient and speedier.

3. A notice in the Daily Bulletin emanating from the Office of the Executive Commissioner on this subject is suggested as it seems that repeated notices from this office are of no avail.

1. Some weeks ago there was a move afoot to modify the office hours at AC. At that time the Economic Section favored changing the hours to 0830 to 1700 because of the hot weather and in order to permit enlisted men ample time to attend university classes, etc. It was also a step toward permitting enlisted men the time off which has been authorized in strictly military organizations. The entire question seems to have died.

2. There now arises another condition which justifies a reconsideration of the matter of office hours. A recent law affecting U.S. Civil Service employees provides for a 40-hour week with overtime to be paid for additional hours worked. At the present time, FEA employees in AC are working 48 hours but are being paid only for 44 hours; that is, 40 hours straight time and 4 hours overtime. They are beginning to complain and, while the matter is under discussion with Washington, I submit that, in view of the desirability of shortening the hours for other reasons, the total work week be reduced to 44 hours to prevent payment of additional \$26,500 overtime per annum to FEA employees. This amount approximates the monthly FEA payroll on a 44-hour week basis.

3. As a solution I recommend office hours from 0830 to 1730 daily Monday through Friday, and 0830 to 1630 on Saturday, with 1½ hours for lunch as at present.

2. I have today received a certified official letter marked "Immediate" from the War Office in London which was posted on 5 June. This letter is addressed to me at "Finance Sub-Commission, H.Q., Allied Commission, A.P.O. 394." The letter has been not only to the Allied Commission for Austria but also to the British element of the Control Commission for Germany and two other organizations called SECC (BR) and MCC. One reason for the error may be the use of an American APO number which obviously means nothing to the Army postal authorities in England.
3. I do, however, strongly urge in view of the present multiplicity of commissions that our designation, in so far as an address is concerned, should be officially changed to 'Allied Commission for Italy'.
4. I shall be grateful to receive your comments on this suggestion.

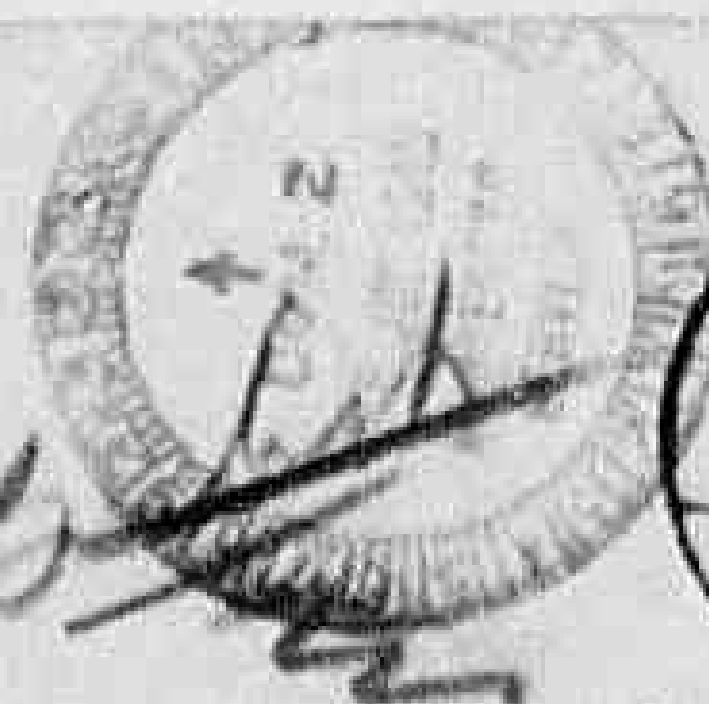
