1. RESCILISSIONS--

Previous instructions contained in letters AG 311.5 (7 May 43) O3-S-L-- , 15 May 1943, and AG 311.5 (29 Feb 44)O3-S---II, 16 March 1944, subject as above, are hereby rescinded.

2. PURPOSE--

The basic purpose for using code names is to insure secrecy concerning intentions and to safeguard information pertaining to military operations.

3. DEFINITIONS--

- a. Code names are specially selected words assigned:
 - (1) To provide discreet and brief names for plans, projects and forces.
 - (2) To conceal intentions in documents, communications and discussions pertaining to plans and operations.
 - (3) To designate places in conjunction with 1 and 2 above.

b. Code words assigned to major or special projected operations will be classified initially TOP SECRET. This classification may be later down-graded in accordance with paragraph 7, below. All other words will be classified SECRET and are not subject to downgrading but may be cancelled (See Paragraph 8, below).

c. Attention is invited to the distinction between code words and shipping designators (see letter AG 400.161 (19 Mar 43)OD-S-S-OT-, 1 June 1943, subject: Requisitioning and Marking Supplies for Overseas Shipment (Marking Directive), as amended by letter AG 400.161 (23 Aug 43)OD-S-S-OT-N, 29 August 1943, same subject).

4. ASSIGNING AUTHORITIES--

a. Joint Security Control, a subordinate agency of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, is the central U.S. agency charged with responsibility for the dissemination and coordination of code words for projected operations.

b. Within the U.S. Army, the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, is the coordinating and disseminating agency for all other code words.

c. The Operations Division, War Department General Staff, will allot blocks of code words from the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-word Index." (CBI-P 090) to commands under the War Department, including theater commands, upon their requests. Commands which are allotted blocks of code words are authorized to make assignments from these blocks subject to the provisions of paragraphs 5 and 6, below. They will also be furnished a copy of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-word Index" (CBI-P 090), which is the only authorized source for code words.

d. The selection and assignment of code words by agencies of the U.S. Army other than authorized assigning agencies and other than the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, is specifically prohibited.

5. METHODS OF ASSIGNMENT OF SECRET CODE WORDS--

a. Commands which require the assignment of a SECRET code word and which are not designated as assigning authorities will request the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, for a code word.

The meaning to be assigned the code word will be included in the request. The method of transmission of this request will be governed by the urgency of its requirement. Radio communication is authorized if necessary.

b. Commands designated as assigning authorities are authorized to assign SECRET code words from allotted blocks of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Services Code-Word Index" (CCBP OWS) at their discretion. The Operations Division, War Department General Staff, will be notified immediately of assignments by the most expeditious means available. The meaning assigned the code word and, in the case of geographical locations, the coordinates to identify properly the place will be included.

c. Limited dissemination of SECRET code words, together with their meanings, will be made by the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, to interested agencies and commands by a SECRET mimeographed publication entitled "Key Lists of Assigned Secret Code Names".

6. METHOD OF ASSIGNMENT OF TOP SECRET CODE NAMES--

a. Commands which require the assignment of a TOP SECRET code word for a projected operation and which are not designated as assigning authorities will request of the Secretary, Joint Security Control, Washington 25, D.C., a code word for the meaning, as included in the request. The method of transmission of this request will be governed by the urgency of its requirement. Radio communication is authorized if necessary.

b. Commands designated as assigning authorities are authorized to assign TOP SECRET code words for projected operations from the allotted blocks of the "Combined British--United States Inter-Service Code-Word Index" (CCBP OWS) at their discretion. The Secretary, Joint Security Control will be notified immediately by the most expeditious means available of the assignment, including the meaning.

c. Joint Security Control will make and control the dissemination, except within the subordinate commands of the assigning agency, of TOP SECRET words through TOP SECRET control channels.

7. CLASSIFICATION, DOWNGRADING AND DECLASSIFICATION OF TOP SECRET CODE WORDS--

a. Code words assigned to certain major or special operations will be classified TOP SECRET during the planning stage and until the operation is mounted--e.g., until landing of amphibious mounted troops participating in the operation, or in the case of airborne troops, until such time prior to the landing as is necessary for their proper instruction.

b. On mounting and during continuance of the operation, such code words will be classified as SECRET.

c. On completion of the operation operational code words may be downgraded to CONFIDENTIAL.

d. Eventually operational code words may be downgraded to RESTRICTED or declassified, as appropriate, for use in historical documents or published articles.

e. The downgrading or declassification of operational code words does not control the classification to be assigned to the document in which it is contained. As in the case of classified matter generally, each document must be graded according to its own content, apart from the code word contained therein, except where the code word is graded higher than the classification which would normally be assigned to the document itself.

f. The reclassification of operational code words in accordance with the above principles, and notification of agencies concerned, including the Operations Division, War Department General Staff and Joint Security Control, is the responsibility of the theater commander concerned with the operation.

8. CLASSIFICATION, LONGHALING, OR DECLASSIFICATION OF SECRET CODE NAMES

SECRET code names, excepting operational code names reduced from TOP SECRET, will remain in a SECRET classification until compromised or until they are no longer needed. SECRET code names no longer needed will be cancelled at the discretion of the assigning authority and notification made through regular channels to the Operations Division, War Department General Staff. They may then be published in historical reports and other documents without classification.

The proper use of all code words is enjoined on all personnel having access thereto. In the preparation of communications and documents, the following instructions apply:

- a. Communications and documents containing code words will be placed in a classification at least equal to the Classification of the code words contained therein. Classification lower than that of the code word contained is in direct violation to the provisions of AR 380-5.
- b. The meaning of a TOP SECRET code word will never be used in the same communication as the code word itself.
- c. The meaning of a SECRET code word will be used in a communication together with the code word only when it is absolutely essential to do so.
- d. When a code word is used in a communication or document, reference to related localities, forces, and plans should likewise be coded, if such code words are available.
- e. Code words will not be used:
 - (1) As an address for a communication
 - (2) As a return address on mail
 - (3) As an address for shipments
 - (4) As an indicator for filing systems
 - (5) As a designation of exchange offices, or other activities associated with a force, place, or plan identified by the code word.
 - (6) To indicate destinations in routine flight operations.
- f. Commands requiring knowledge of the meaning of code words in order to transact official business should request this information through command or technical channels, as appropriate. Within the restrictions imposed by the need for security, commanding officers receiving information on code words are authorized to supply subordinate agencies or their commands with as much of this information as may be actually needed to transact official business.

When persons not subject to military law require knowledge of code names in order to transact governmental business, such information will be supplied under the provisions of paragraphs 20 and 23b, AG 360-S, 15 March 1944.

10. COMPROMISE--

In the case of the compromise or possible compromise of a code word the organization having such knowledge will advise the Operations Division, War Department General Staff, (also Joint Security Control in the case of TOP SECRET code words) immediately by the most expeditious means possible. The assigning authority then will be advised and a new code word will be assigned and disseminated according to the procedure outlined above.



SUBJECT: Radio telephone service to UNITED STATES.

TO : Chief Commissioner.

1. The State Department, WASHINGTON, has given its consent to the re-opening of the Radio telephone service to the United States and we have now to nominate individuals in AG who will have authority to use it.

2. The service has so many restrictions attached to it that in my opinion it is almost worthless. For instance, the subject of conversation must not have bearing on the war effort or shipping, whilst only individuals already nominated the other end can answer a call.

3. However, the service may be put into operation at short notice now and I suggest for your consideration that in addition to yourself, your Vice Presidents and Political Advisers be authorised to make calls.

4. Permission can also be extended to diplomatic and consular representatives and the Italian Government. Political Section will make recommendations on these.

5. The establishment of this commercial undertaking appears to me to set a dangerous precedent.

MEMO TO: All Concerned.

SUBJECT: Security of Telephone Conversations.

1. An analysis of the subjects of telephone conversations for the two month period ending 31 October 1944, indicated security is being violated in that the conversations included information as to:

- a. Date, time group, reference numbers and plain text of many highly classified messages (violation of cryptographic security).
- b. Movement of troops and convoys with dates of departure and arrival and origin and destinations.
- c. Critical supply situation such as ammunition and gasoline requirements for armies in this theater and in France.
- d. Replacement and casualty situation in theater and requirements for additional personnel.
- e. Plans for various operations.
- f. Arrival and plans for military missions.
- g. Discussion of political developments.
- h. Movement of high ranking officers, officials and diplomats.

2. Violations of security committed in telephone conversations during the past month are of a more serious nature than those of the preceding period.

3. In all telephone conversations the operational necessity for a security violation must be carefully weighed. There may be occasions when operations will be unduly hampered by rigid adherence to security precautions.

4. Also in view of the fact that it must be assumed the conversing parties are familiar with the background of the material being discussed it should be sufficient in most cases to refer merely to reference number and paragraph rather than quote the entire message or even extracts of messages.

SUBJECT : Telephone Communications

TO : Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy
"X" Branch, Deputy Chief Sig. (att. Col. Horn)

1. In view of approval by your headquarters, (conversation Col. Horn, DOSO, and Capt. Robb, this headquarters, on 22 November) arrangements are being completed to provide telephone communication between this Headquarters and the Filpot Exchange. To avoid any possibility of misunderstanding, the entire program is outlined herewith.

2. This headquarters will arrange for a circuit from this headquarters to the Chiusi terminus of the private circuit of the Valdarno Electric Co which has authorized us to share this circuit with them.

3. At the Siena terminus of this private circuit, Toti (through arrangement with the Siena director, Ing. Paolotti) will install a new private branch exchange of the type which will permit the switching of incoming calls from the private circuit to the Siena automatic exchange. The attendant at the electric company's cabin in Siena will be instructed as to the number to dial (20737 or 20738) in order to switch these private line calls through the Siena automatic exchange to the Filpot operator.

4. The routine for making a call will be as follows:

a. From Chianciano

- (1) When receiver is picked up, Chianciano operator will answer. Ask this operator for "Valdarno Chiusi".
- (2) When Valdarno Chiusi answers, ask for "Valdarno Siena".
- (3) When Valdarno Siena answers, ask for "Filpot" or request operator to dial 20737 or 20738.
- (4) When Filpot operator answers, request the military number or individual desired.

b. From military installation

- (1) Get Filpot operator and request him to dial number 20929, the Siena Valdarno terminus of the private circuit.
- (2) Ask Valdarno Siena for Valdarno Chiusi.
- (3) Ask Valdarno Chiusi for Chianciano.
- (4) Ask Chianciano operator for Piemonte Region, AMG.

In connection with the above routine, it should be noted that calls may be made to civilian subscribers in Siena by requesting such number instead of asking for "Filpot" or "20737". It also should be noted that any calls from this headquarters for military installations outside of Filpot (such as trunk line calls to Lightning) will be on a recording and call-back basis. The call will be booked and when completed, the individual placing the call will be called back. Local Filpot calls will be completed without delay.
