I would like to bring to your attention that in accordance with Establishment Memorandum No. 31 dated 28th November 1944, only one car is assigned for the use of me and my staff.

As my staff is composed of eight officers who daily have many occasions to travel from place to place within and outside the city on official business the one car, which is assigned to me, is obviously not sufficient and creates difficult transportation problems and delays. Furthermore, not all of the officers of my staff are housed together not always in the position provided by the Dispatch Office, which on occasions might entail the simultaneous use of three or four cars.

In view of the foregoing, I would appreciate it very much if you could arrange that two additional cars be requisitioned and assigned for the permanent use of my staff.

1. Reference memorandum from Office of U.S. Political Adviser, AFHQ dated 12 February, of which you received a copy, and our G-5 062.2 to you, dated 17 February.

2. The Office of the British Resident Minister now inform this Section that word has been received from the Foreign Office that it does not intend at the present to take up with the Russian Government the question of the distribution of British films in Soviet territory. It is the position of the Foreign Office that permission should be granted to distribute Soviet films in Italy, and the request of the British Resident Minister's Office that the suggested approach of the Allied Commission to the Soviet Representative be delayed, is now withdrawn.
