Personally appeared before me, the undersigned, authorized by law to administer oaths, one S/Sgt John L. Galanga, 350261 01, Co. "O", 2675th Regt., AC (Ovhd), who having been read AW 24 and his rights explained to him thereunder, and being duly sworn, deposes and says:

JK At present I am a member of Co "O", this Regiment, where I am on duty as Air Dispatcher at Milano. For the past three months I've been performing this duty which is specifically that of booking air passage on AC Italian air courier for military and civilian personnel attached to all AMG-AC Sub-Commissions, Northern Regions and Headquarters Allied Commission.

During these three months of duty I have found that Hq AC in Rome and AMG-AC SubCommissions and Northern Regions have been sending Italian civilian personnel by air-travel resulting in overburdening my office. I have found the following to be examples of such instances:

- a. Italian civilian secretaries are being sent by AC-AMG air-travel on the basis of "Urgent Business."
- b. Sometimes two members of a family are sent simultaneously in the same AC-AMG air-craft to perform an assignment which could easily be accomplished by one.
- c. Italian political parties have been sending by AC-AMG air-craft two to four agents at one time for party purposes.

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- d. Italian Red Cross personnel have been using AC-AMG air-travel too extensively.
- e. AC-AMG and Northern Regions are putting Italian civilian husbands and wives on T/D and authorizing AC-AMG air-travel.
- f. US and British military personnel have been taking lady friends on T/D and utilizing air-travel for transportation.

I have noted that on few occasions when I have back-logged civilians who claimed their urgencies were of great importance that of those who returned after five days of waiting not one of them made any reasonable effort to obtain other means of transportation. I was curious to know why they didn't seek other means of transportation during the five day waiting period and they invariably replied that air-travel was more convenient. Fortunately during this period of three months we have had no air-craft accidents.

With reference to a,b,c,d,e, and f above my recommendation is that such classes of travelers should travel only by rail or motor vehicle, if available. Only in this manner can the present congestion be eliminated.

SEATS ON AIRCRAFT PALERMO-ROME

Referring to the letter from the A.C. Liaison Officer, Palermo, reference EM/rf dated 7th August, it is stated that, after conferring with the A.C. Despatch Officer, it is agreed that the two seats be handed to the Italian Booking Office, Palermo, with the condition that these are reserved for A.C. or Allied personnel with correct travel orders until the closing time of the booking office on the day previous to the flight.

2. It is considered better to give both seats to the booking Office, than one to the High Commissioner.

3. Please confirm your agreement of this, when the necessary action will be taken with the Italian Air Ministry.

1. The fact that this office has in effect been assigned two places on the Palermo - Rome Italian plane has proved to be a burden to the Liaison Officer without, it seems, being of any real benefit to any one. In barely one case out of ten is the request a proper one, and in those cases where the request is proper, the travel has usually already been authorized by competent orders really needing no implementation at all at this office.

2. A second reason it would seem desirable to relieve this office of this burden is that it will facilitate the closing of the office (when the time comes for such action) if as many as possible of the duties have already been shifted elsewhere. This duty seems one that can be disposed of now.

3. My suggestion is that the two Alcom seats from Palermo to Rome be released: one to the High Commissioner of Sicily, the other to the local Italian air service office, with the understanding that personnel travelling on competent Alcom orders shall be given preference to any other person. I am certain that both these Italian offices will gladly accept these seats on this condition. In those rather rare cases in which air transport is needed on Alcom business, and orders have not already been issued by your Headquarters, the Liaison Officer will issue the orders here.

4. The Liaison Officer's duties will this way be limited to issuing orders to persons travelling on Alcom business. He no longer will be in the business of authorizing

He no longer will be in the business of authorizing air travel, and therefore will no longer be bothered by business men, officers of the Guardia Finanza, and pretty girls who want to fly to Rome.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Colonel Parkin,

1. The operation and particularly bookings for AG courier planes is not working out to the satisfaction of the northern Hq.

2.

(a) Lombardia Region have been receiving many more requests for travel to Rome by courier plane than their is space available and they have asked assistance in the establishment of some form of priority allocation to handle this problem. They have also asked that the job of booking passengers from Milan be taken over by Colonel Piskes Hq. there. This does not appear to be practical due to the very limited personnel of this advance Hq.

(b) Venezia Region and Lombardia Region have both complained that on arrival at Treviso and Bologna the plane is so crowded that they are unable to put on passengers. As an example two Lt. Colonels, a Major, and a Italian officer (Lt.) for the second day today at Treviso were unable to get on the plane to Rome.

3. It is suggested that either a definite allotment of seat space and baggage weight be made to each one of the northern regions served by the plane or that the present circular route be altered and a plane run daily direct to Milan and return and another to Treviso and Bologna and return.

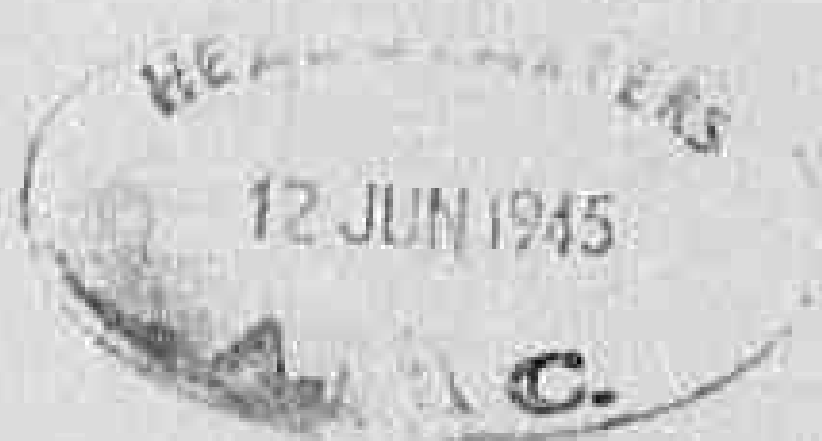

SUBJECT: Delivery of Registered Mails.

TO : Commanding Officer of Company "M" and Company "R",
2675th Regiment, Allied Commission, APO # 394, U.S. Army.

1. Commencing 11 June 1945, this office will institute a twice monthly courier for the purpose of delivering registered mails to your commands. Trips will be made on the 11th and 26th of each month, weather permitting. Enlisted personnel from this office will make these trips on Italian courier planes operating under the provisions of Establishment Memorandum # 9, Headquarters Allied Commission, dated 10 May 1945.
2. This courier will deliver the registered articles to designated unit mail clerks ONLY. Hand to hand receipts will be obtained for same. Unit clerks will obtain the proper signature on POD Form 3849, "Notice of Arrival of Registered Mail" and retain such receipts in a permanent file at the company headquarters.
3. Inclosed herewith are forms for the designation of unit mail clerks for the purpose of receiving registered mail. The unit mail clerk should have his copy in his possession at all times. In the event that the unit mail clerk cannot produce his copy of the authorization, the registered articles will be returned to this office and held for delivery by the next registered mail courier. The original copy of the authorization should be given to the registered mail courier making the trip on 11 June 1945 who will return it to this office for file.
4. The CO of Company "M" should make arrangements for the designated clerk to meet the plane at the TRAVISO airport where the transfer of registered mail will take place. Expected time of arrival and name of courier will be furnished by signal prior to each trip.
5. It is requested that the CO of Company "R" make necessary arrangements for overnight accommodation of the courier on each trip.

1. Letter R5/501/13, dated 11 April 1945, from Umbria-Marche Region, intimates the discontinuance of the courier service between the Headquarters of that Region and this Headquarters with effect from 14 April 1945, the reason given being that there is an excellent E.L.S. between the two cities.

2. This may appear to be satisfactory from an official mail point of view, but it would appear that Regional Headquarters has omitted to take into consideration the movement of personnel and stores, etc. During the past week, 12 passengers were booked from this Headquarters to Umbria-Marche Region, some of whom had full kit to be transported.

3. It is considered necessary that this courier service should be maintained at least three times a week owing to the movement of personnel and the accumulation of baggage awaiting shipment. Up to now the Region has been in a position to carry out this courier service and no call has been made on this Headquarters. If, however, the Region is unable to continue to run this service, application is made herewith for an additional 15-cwt. truck to be assigned by G-4 (B) to HQ Motor Pool in order that this service may be continued three times a week.

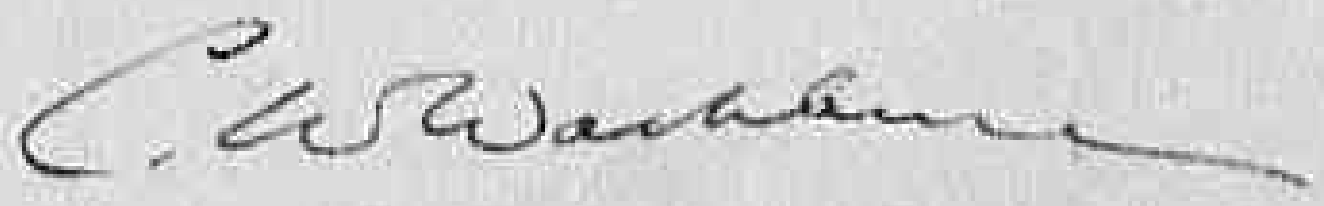

Reference is made to the letter of Major W.D. HAYNE, Admin. Officer AMG, Fifth Army Hq. of February 16, 1945.

1. This Subcommittee had been repeatedly asked by the Education Officer Fifth Army, Florence City, to send to Pisa the two professors mentioned in the above referred letter. He stated that they were urgently needed and that 5th Army gave its approval for their coming. In a note of January 26 he further sought the advice of this office in regard to the treatment concerning the two professors, being of the opinion that they were to be suspended from their positions unless they returned immediately.
2. On January 31, 1945 he was informed that this office in response to his request was sending some of the Professors to Pisa.
3. Education Subcommittee was asked then by your office to state whether the Professors had accomodation at Pisa and whether their trip was approved by 5th Army. This was done.
4. In view of the request having been initiated from Fifth Army, Florence, this Subcommittee cannot be held responsible if the necessary arrangements at that end had not been made for the professors in transit.
5. It is moreover pointed out that none of the professors were led to expect that either accomodation or rations would be provided for them by Fifth Army.

1. Courier services from this Headquarters are operated on a schedule. All drivers are fully conversant with the schedule which they are required to maintain to the best of their ability, and very strict orders have been given to drivers that they will not deviate from the route nor disregard the time schedule.

2. Two officers, Lt. Mackelsen and Lt. Halder, delayed the FLORENCE courier for thirty minutes at SIENA on Wednesday, 20 December 44. At the Regional Message Center they again delayed the driver for half an hour before he could proceed to AMG 5th Army. Even then they did not turn up so he proceeded to 5th Army without them. On his return to Regional Message Center, they ordered the driver to take them to their billets. This the driver quite rightly refused to do as it was contrary to orders issued to drivers. He said he would carry out the order if they would give it in writing. The Provincial Commissioner of FLORENCE Province then gave the order in writing.

3. Courier Services are not for interior domestic use, but for the carriage of official passengers and mail between this Headquarters and other Headquarters. Will you therefore please investigate and take whatever disciplinary action may be indicated.

1. On several occasions this Headquarters has requested that the names of passengers on the daily courier be telephoned in order that, where necessary, arrangements can be made in advance for their accommodation, etc. Owing to road conditions the courier may arrive at anytime between 1700 hours and midnight.
2. This information is requested in the interest of the persons travelling and it is imperative that it be furnished, particularly for civilians en route for other destinations such as, Lucca, Pisa, Arezzo. Hotels in Florence are almost all taken over by military and civilian restaurants are difficult to find in the black-out.
3. Civilians have recently arrived at this Headquarters on their way to other towns and considerable inconvenience and unnecessary discomfort has been caused to them, both in their accommodation and messing overnight and in furnishing transport to their final destination.
4. It is requested therefore that instructions be issued that prior arrangements be made by the Subcommittee concerned for their accommodation and their transport from this HQ to their final destination before travel orders are issued, as this HQ cannot undertake to provide transport from its very limited resources.

5. Prof. Delio CANTIMORI arrived here yesterday 17th Dec but nothing had been arranged for his stay overnight and while he carried travel orders and permission to travel to Pisa by military transport considerable time was lost and trouble caused before he could continue his journey.
