1. Reference your 208/COS of 23 November, which, together with all the other pertinent correspondence, buck-slips, etc., in the matter, is attached.
2. This appears to be another one of these cases in which someone will finally have to give a decision as to whether or not the automobile in question shall or shall not be de-requisitioned.
3. The requisition appears to be legal; there are no grounds for de-requisitioning on that basis. It then resolves itself into a question of whether or not it would be politic to do so, and that, I submit, is a matter for high-level decision.
4. Would you, therefore, take the matter up with the powers that be, and let me know what they decide.

SUBJECT : Car for "Risorgimento Liberale"

TO : Chief of Staff, A.C.C.

1. I am very much embarrassed by a case of requisitioning by an officer of M.M.I.A. which directly cuts across my own (apparent) duties. By agreement with the requisitioning authorities of Region IV (Via Tomacelli) it was established in July that authorised daily newspapers in Rome would be permitted to have one car each. This is not very much, and it was clear when the agreement was made that we could scarcely give less, since without any transport at all a news paper, even if authorised, would be hamstrung! There was of course no agreement or intention to provide cars or petrol; but merely to give one "permit to circulate" to each authorised newspaper.

2. On 22 September 1944 Major Pinkley of the M.M.I.A., (using his own requisition form) seized the car belonging to the "RISORGIMENTO LIBERALE". The Editor appealed to me. After failing (very conspicuously) to make any dent whatsoever on Major Pinkley, I wrote to General Browning as per attached copy. The verbal reply was that this was an American matter in which he could not intervene, and I should consult Colonel Kerr. No dents (even by Miss Bett) can be made in Colonel Kerr who, in defence of his arguments, quotes General Wilson's Special Order on requisitioning of July and adds that ACC anyway disposes of some 800 cars, all of which were doubtless not serving essential purposes, and that one of these might therefore be allotted to the "Risorgimento Liberale".

3. Meantime the "Risorgimento Liberale" naturally dogs my footsteps. I cannot get back their car or provide them with another. Am I to tell them that the Allies disagree amongst themselves and the ACC has no power? This seems to be a matter of principle, because M.M.I.A., in these circumstances, seem to be able to requisition any car, even if ACC has earmarked it. Furthermore, this type of incident creates a very bitter feeling of resentment and a sense of being treated with marked injustice in the minds of newspaper men who could, if they choose to do so, give voice to their indignation in vitriolic terms.

4. May I please have your comments on what action is to be taken in this and similar future cases of this nature.

Memorandum

On September 22nd, the offices M.M.I. A. (Via Veneto, ex-ministry of Corporations) requisitioned the car Fiat 1500, license 3205, belonging to Margherita Guasti (Viale Madaglio d'Oro, 122) hired on August 1st by 'Risorgimento Liberale' for the service of the redaction.

The car was taken from the Silvestri Garage (Via Alberico II, 29) where it was being repaired; there were no tyres, for these were also being repaired by the vulcanizzatori Gasetti and De Santis.

On August 7th, Risorgimento Liberale got a temporary circulation pass valid till August 31st, which should have become a permanent one after September 1st. The arrangements for this transformation were delayed because the car was taken on August 15th and recovered on the 30th having lost its number and its circulation pass of which it was necessary to get a duplicate.

When the car was requisitioned, we had already been granted an allotment of gasoline (100 liters, for November), and a circulation pass, on the condition that M.M.I.A. should give back the car.
