Re the derequisitioning request of Baroness Baracco:

- (1) This appears to be an "Italian-friends-to-be-favored" case. Colonel Wedemeyer, COS of RAAC, is known to be a close friend of the Baracco family. So far as can be ascertained, no attempt has been made by the Baroness to derequisition either of her other two cars. In this connection, RAAC has stated that repossession of any of the Baroness' cars would meet the needs of the family.
- (2) From a technical standpoint, RAAC does not have the authority to direct AC to derequisition any of its vehicles (per G-4A).
- (3) Accordingly, it is recommended that this Headquarters turn down the derequisitioning request on war necessity grounds. Further, that this Headquarters, in order to accommodate the British Ambassador, should turn over the car to Sir Noel Charles on a loan basis only. No attempt should be made to transfer the requisition -- from American to British authority -- since the papers on such a transfer would have to pass through RAAC and this would accordingly invite further inquiry.

7. Prior to derequisitioning of a serviceable vehicle to its owner or the Italian Government, approval of this headquarters will be secured.
8. No vehicles will be rented from owners without prior approval of this headquarters.

After having in vain tried for five months to have one of his cars derequisitioned the Barone Alfonso Barracco wants to ask this section to please see if anything can be done to try and help him.

The car ALFA ROMEO, registered NA. 29102, was requisitioned by AMG in Naples on the 19 of October by Major Fletcher for Colonel Kincaid. In March the aforesaid car was taken over by the A.C.C.

The Barone Barracco who is a large agricultural land owner and runs his own estate of 46000 (fourth six thousand) acres has already taken the following steps in order to have his car derequisitioned. He applied first to the A.C.C. Food Sub-Commission in Naples. Colonel Legg, chief of this Sub-Commission, recommended to Regional Commissioner Region N. 3 to derequisition the car. The then Commissioner, Colonel Chapra, did his best, but the requisition papers were held by the A.C.C. Transport office who would not on any account give them up. He then applied to the Italian Minister of Agriculture, H.E. Gillo, who wrote to the transportation office of the A.C.C., knowing the importance of Baron Barracco work, and asking them to derequisition the car. The letter written on the 28 of July has not yet got an answer. As the car was by now in Rome the Barone Barracco himself applied to the transport office of the A.C.C. where they plainly told him that the car NA. 29102 was used by one of the high officials and that they were not interested in his or in the Ministers request.

The Barone Barracco, having had his three cars requisitioned, would be very grateful if something could be done about it, as transportation is a vital question to properly run and supervise his large estate.
