SUBJECT: Requisitioning of Nicaraguan Diplomat's Car.

With reference to previous correspondence concerning the requisitioning by the AC of an automobile belonging to Mr. Tomas Francisco Medina, former Nicaraguan Minister at Rome, the Department of State has now asked that inasmuch as reimbursements for transactions of this type are submitted to the Italian Ministry of the Treasury, it is hoped that this case may be sent to the Ministry of the Treasury for settlement.

The Department of State has indicated that the Nicaraguan Embassy in Washington has now asked for the good offices of the American Government in obtaining just and fair compensation for the requisition of this vehicle.

3185 The Swiss Legation, Foreign Interests Division, presents their compliments to the G.C.C., and referring to previous correspondence, has the honor to report herewith an extract of a Note received from the American Embassy at Washington D.C. concerning the Packard automobile belonging to the former Minister of Finance in Italy, Mr. Thomas Dr. MEDA.

"... according to the memorandum of the Swiss Legation at Rome, transmitted on August 10, 1945, the Allied Control Commission requested the automobile on June 25, 1944, and requested to purchase it on the terms of sale offered by the owner, through the Department of State, when requested to do so by the Swiss Legation.

The Swiss Legation on December 9, 1944, asked that the requisition be revoked, but the car was not actually returned until June 7, 1945, after a year of use, and the Swiss Legation very properly would have accepted its custody on behalf of the owner, but only with the reservation to the owner of the right to claim indemnity for its irregular requisition and use. It is to be regretted that the memorandum of the Swiss Legation did not reach Washington until a year after Marcusz made his bid apparently unaffected.

The authorities of Marcusz consider it necessary that the Swiss Legation, Rome, return to the Allied Commission that, in view of the circumstances, the acquisition of custody of the automobile in question does not infringe any clause of the last clause of the order to the sum of \$ 150. This charge changes since September 1st, 1944, to the date of re-

tion and use. It is to be regretted that the
memorandum of the Swiss Legation did not reach
Washington until a year after the automobile property
had been subsequently selected.

The authorities of Nicaragua consider it
necessary that the Swiss Legation, Rome, re-
fer to the Allied Commission that, in view
of the circumstances, the acceptance of just in
any way abrogate the just claim of the owner
to the sum of \$1500.00 for damage caused
since September 18, 1944, to the date of re-
quisition, which were the terms of the requi-
sition. The owner believes that the au-
tomobile had not been improperly requisitioned
in June 1944 and used "on other than war
military purposes over such distance would be
irrational."

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could have sold it to some other purchaser on the terms mentioned above, if the A.G.C. did not insist to buy it at the price offered, though such arrangements often prevail in Italy for cars of sufficient marketability for transportation. The buyer considered that the price asked was not at all exorbitant, since the automobile was a large model with six wheels and tires, replacement parts and many accessories,

The Swiss Legation thanks the United Commission in advance for their kind attention in this matter and present the assurance of his high consideration.

1. Reference AFID/2704/1(Mint.) of 26 March 45, Subject: "Derequisitioning of Cars", this Headquarters has received several requests for return of subject vehicle. An airgram from U.S. State Department in Washington has also been received on this subject.

2. Subject vehicle, Packard license No. O210, was transferred to ADOS but owner refused to sign an AB 361 and also refused to sign a U.S. derequisition form. Therefore vehicle is still on U.S. requisition paper.

3. If vehicle can be returned to Rome in its present condition, the ADOS receipt will be returned and vehicle will remain on U.S. requisition paper until it is disposed of.

4. It is felt that in order to avoid any diplomatic complications it would be most helpful if vehicle could be returned.

5. This matter has been the subject of much correspondence and very considerable delay. May it now please be regarded as urgent.

SUBJECT: Derequisition of Automobile

TO : Commanding General, Allied Force Headquarters

1. I am transmitting a copy of a communication received from the Swiss Legation in Rome by the Political Section of the Allied Commission. The vehicle referred to is one of the six selected by a representative of AFHQ from among the requisitioned cars in the Commission Headquarters Pool and transferred with a view to its being derequisitioned by the United States and rerequisitioned by the British.

2. In the circumstances, I feel that it would be well to return this vehicle and to select another in its place. The question of its status can then be gone into by the Commission and any resultant political difficulties overcome.

3. At the time that the selection was made, I raised the point that the status of this car was not clear and that it may have to be derequisitioned and returned to the custody of the Swiss Legation.

The motorcar "Packard eight 1937 Model Sedan" motor No. 135-825, vehicle No. 1090-1473, chassis No. 46-22, license No. Roma 0210, H.P. 110, property of Mr. Francisco Medina, late Minister for Nicaragua accredited to the Royal Court, which was deposited at the garage "Casa dell'Automobile S.A.", Piazza Verdi 4, Rome, under the protection of the Swiss Legation, was requisitioned on the 25th of June 1944, by Lieutenant Colonel James J. Carnes, H.Q. A.C.C. O-15340.
