territory and this new aspect of the case it is difficult
to see how we can carry out our investigations further from
this end. May I suggest that the Russian Office concerned
may be contacted with a view to effecting a successful
conclusion to this matter.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Signor Antonio DI DEMETRIO, Romanian Consul General
in Trieste. Requisition of his car.

1. The Romanian Legation in Rome has informed the Italian Ministry for Foreign Affairs that on the 30th May 1945 the Yugoslav Authorities of occupation in Trieste requisitioned from the SARTI Garage, via Brunner 14, the "Plymouth" car, license plate "TS 13819", belonging to Signor Antonio DI DEMETRIO, honorary Consul General of Romania in this city.
2. In reporting the matter to the Legation, Consul DI DEMETRIO was informed that from various enquiries made, it appears that the car was requisitioned on the grounds that it was considered property of the Consulate General of Roumania in Trieste.

The Romanian Legation, instead, has confirmed that the "Plymouth" automobile bearing license plate "TS 13819" is the exclusive property of Mr. Antonio DI DEMETRIO, and would be grateful if the matter could be examined by the Allied Commission with a view to obtaining the restitution of the car to its rightful owner who, moreover, at the time of the German occupation in 1944, had been deprived of another car Fiat Artilia, with five tires, which was the property of his wife.

3. This Ministry, therefore, would be grateful if the Allied Commission would approach the competent Allied Authorities on the matter and would appreciate an early reply.
