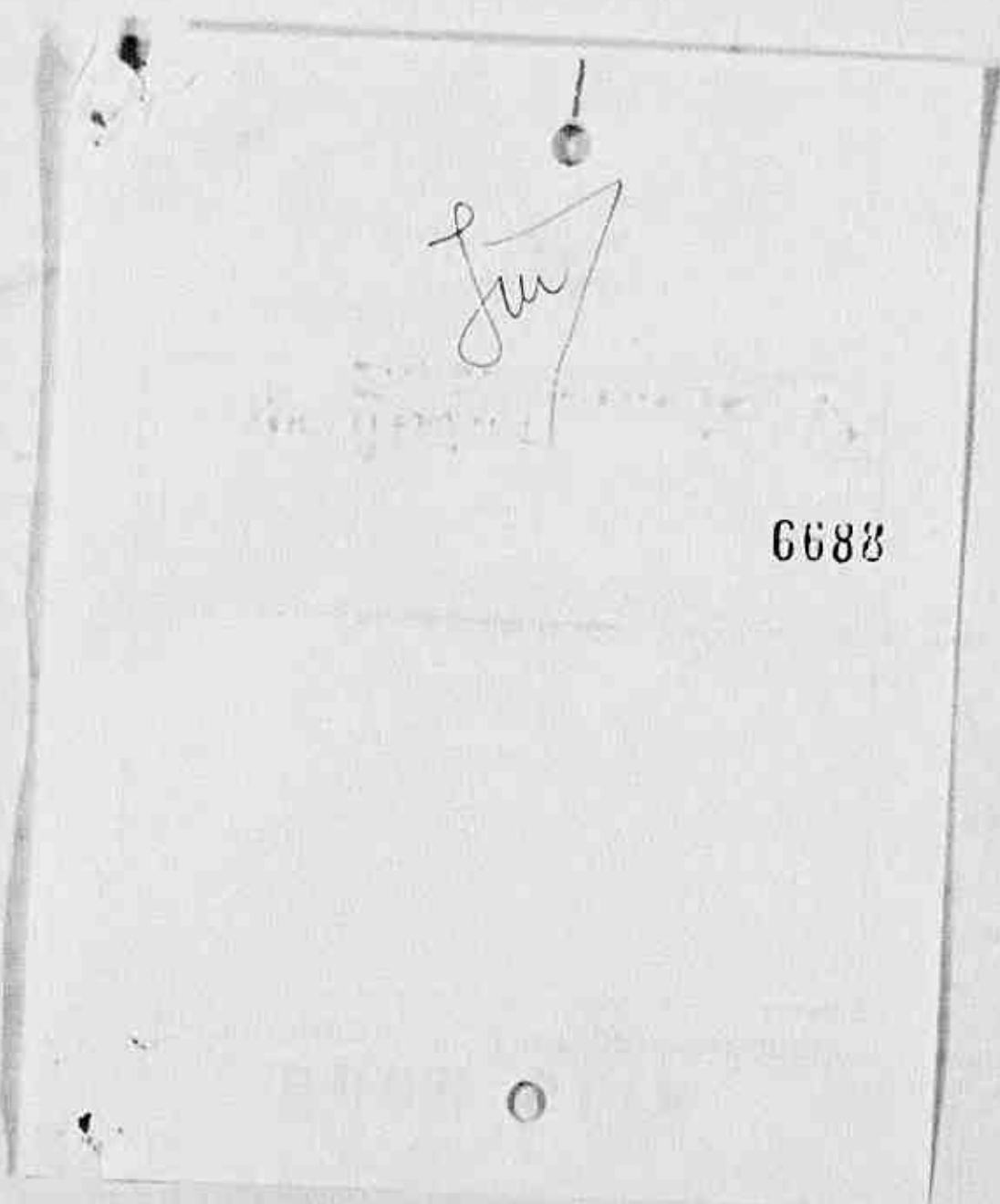

1. Reference your letter 10-40/62/FOOD, dated 30 August 45, addressed to Vice President, Establishments Section, and referred to this office.

2. This rule was introduced to stop the illegal use of taxis by Italian Civilian employees on unauthorized business. You may rest assured that the Dispatch Office is fully conversant with those Italian Civilian employees who require the taxi cab service in connection with their official duties, and it is hoped that you will have no cause for complaint that any of your employees who request taxis for such official duty are refused.

To ensure the satisfactory distribution of food in Italy it is essential that the above-mentioned employees contact personally the responsible officials of the Ministry of Food, Sepral, Federconsorzi, Istituto Poligrafico, Statistical Institute, Monopoli di Stato, Italian State Railways, COGENA, and their Allied and affiliated organizations in order to impart and discuss the directives issued by Food Sub-Commission and obtain promptly first hand information on the position of locally produced foods, food processing, imported foods, salt, sugar, meats, supplies for the Allied Forces, etc.

SUBJECT: Transport for Female Personnel

TO: Deputy Chief of Staff
Establishment Section

1. Further to this office's G4/120/9 of the 14 November 1944 regarding the taxi service to take female personnel home daily from this Headquarters.
2. All female employees were taken home last night between the hours of 5 p.m. and 5.50 p.m. without any serious dislocation to the transport system.
3. A few small points came to light, such as the forgetting of taxi numbers, etc., but these are being put right, and each female employee is being given a ticket showing the number of her taxi, and each driver a list of personnel for whom he is responsible.

It is understood that the data given to you includes females who live within a few minutes walk from this H.Q. building and therefore the 400 odd names might be less formidable when the names of those who can walk home have been abstracted.
