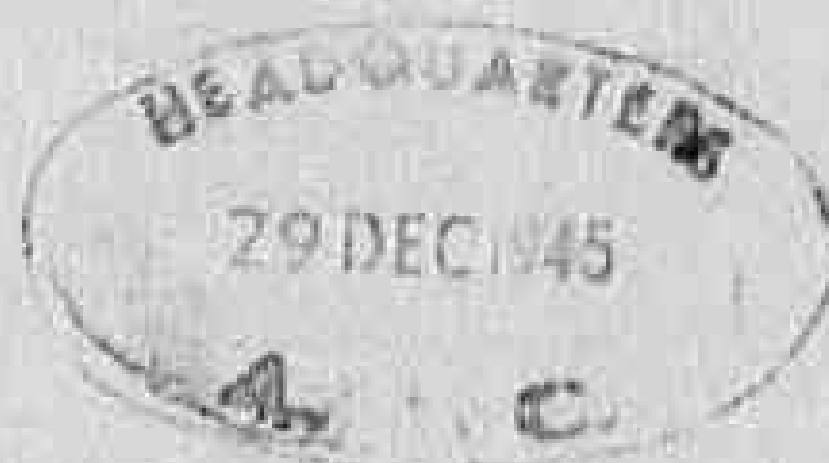

MEMORANDUM TO ESTABLISHMENT SECTION *49*

On 30 August Mr Piombino dispatched, with your approval, a letter to the Regional Commissioner, Lombardia Region, reference the issue of travel orders by them. It said in paragraph 1a, in part, "Your headquarters may not publish travel orders for civilian, Red Cross or military personnel to enter or travel within, either for duty or pleasure, the boundaries of Switzerland."

At 0900 hours this morning Major Hatcher called from Milano, regarding this letter. He raised the following point, on which he asked clarification from this headquarters:

There is a small pocket of Italian territory, part of the province of Como, which is entirely surrounded by Swiss territory. The road by which it is reached passes 20 kilometers through Swiss territory. This pocket is called "Campione d'Italia," and has some particularly interesting and in some ways rather difficult problems. The chief problem is that it was for some time a base for partisan activities.

He has two officers standing by with requests to go into that territory, but orders for them to do so will not be issued in contravention of the letter cited above. Therefore he asks an interpretation on the matter.

Major Hatcher says that Colonel Poletti is aware that such permission could be a source of evils, but undertakes to see that orders are issued only for proper operational purposes.

He requests, if possible, that either Captain Montant or myself call him back during the course of today at extension 2535 in the Montecatini building, Milano.

3. The above applies to travel orders for the following cities:-

MILAN, PADUA, VENICE, TURIN, GENOA,

In no circumstances will orders be issued for travel to any other city.

SUBJECT: Air-Travel Authorization

1. It seems quite generally assumed here that ALCOM's Senior representative may authorize the use of air-craft for travel between Sicily and the mainland. Presumably the Region Commissioner was empowered to do this.

2. The Liaison Officer has been notified of no such authority, and has refused to comply with requests from the Consulate and elsewhere to authorize air transport. Only in the case of military personnel of Sicily Region acting under ALCOM orders to proceed to a new station has he obtained air travel for them. He has done this only because he has believed himself directed to do so by the official orders themselves.

3. The Liaison Officer requests that he be informed what authority, if any, he has with regard to this matter. He naturally does not wish to continue to refuse authorization in a proper case if he has power to grant it.

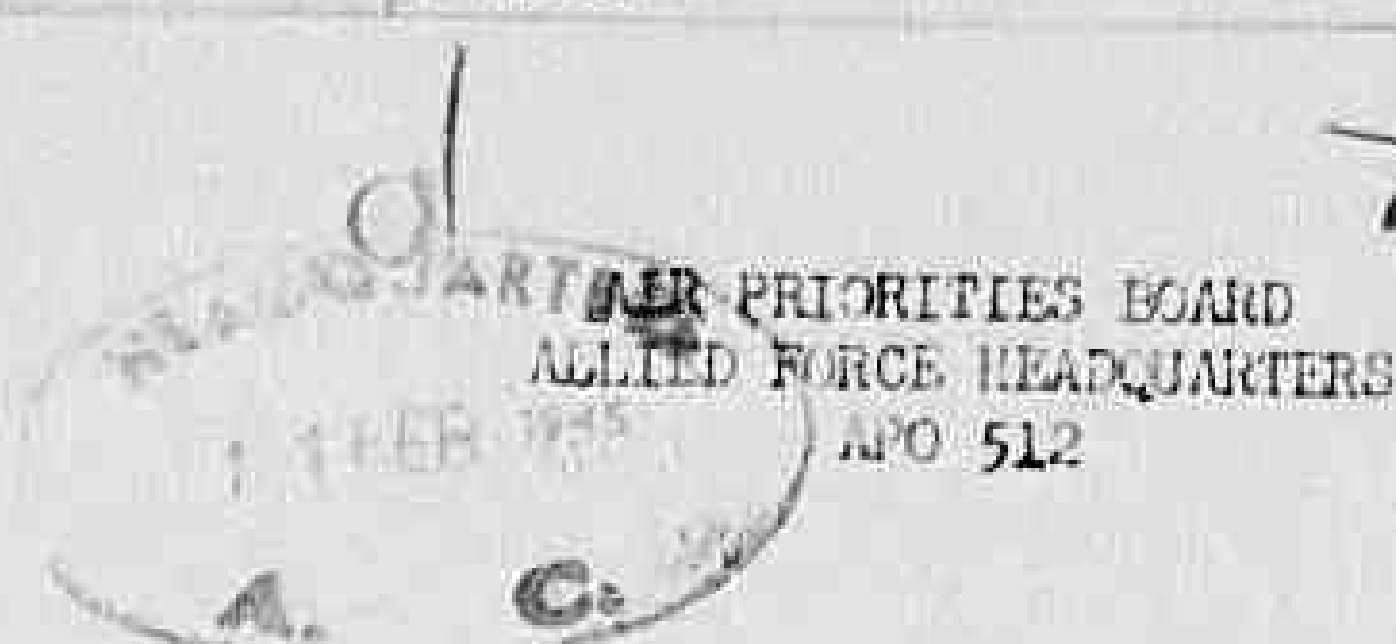

SUBJECT : Priorities for Air Transportation--Air Mail.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Pursuant to authority contained in AFHQ letter AG 33/009 OCT-0, subject "Air Priorities Board," dated 20 December 1944, Air Priorities Board Memorandum No. 90-3, subject "Priorities for Air Transportation--Air Mail," dated 27 September 1943, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

3. Official War Department, War Office and Diplomatic Mail, V-Mail and Airgraph Film.

a. Within the AFHQ Theater: Class I priority is established for the air transportation of all official War Department, War Office and Diplomatic mail, V-Mail and Airgraph film. This priority applies to such mail in the custody of Air Dispatch Letter Service couriers, Army Courier Service couriers, as well as to unaccompanied mail in properly labelled and sealed pouches. This mail will be loaded on the first departing scheduled flight, and will under no circumstances be off-loaded, except with specific authorization of this Board.

b. To Points without the AFHQ Theater: The same priority is established as for within the theater.

3. Troops Air Mail

a. Within the AFHQ Theater: Class II air priority is established for the movement of five hundred (500) pounds on each regular scheduled flight. It will be the responsibility of the respective postal authorities to allocate amounts within this weight limit for the transportation of mail of the various nationalities and for use by postal authorities at enroute stations. Mail in excess of 500 pounds will be moved on Class IV priority and will be loaded after passengers and cargo of the same priority classification.

b. To Points without the AFHQ Theater: Class II priority is established for the movement of five hundred (500) pounds of air mail (6 cent and 3c) on each regular scheduled flight, except to those destinations where movement of mail is governed by a monthly allocation of air space. Air mail in excess of 500 pounds, or in excess of a monthly allocation, and ordinary letter mail, will be moved on Class IV priority and will be loaded after passengers and cargo of the same priority classification.

MEMORANDUM:

NO. 90-17:

SUBJECT : Priorities for Air Transportation.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Air Priorities Board Memorandum No. 90-1, subject "Priorities for Air Transportation," dated 27 August 1943, and Memorandum No. 90-2, on the same subject, dated 30 August 1943, are rescinded, and the following substituted therefor:

2. Authority

Pursuant to authority contained in AFHQ letter AG 331/009 GGT-0, subject "Air Priorities Board," dated 20 December 1944, priorities for the transportation by air of passengers and cargo (cargo includes mail) will henceforth be assigned within the theater under the control of the Air Priorities Board, Allied Force Headquarters, as outlined herein.

3. Boundaries

The boundaries of the theater administered by the Air Priorities Board, Allied Force Headquarters, will be identical with those of the area administered by Allied Force Headquarters. No air travel will be initiated in this theater for passengers or cargo without first having a priority established by the Air Priorities Board or one of its accredited representatives.

4. Air Priorities Control Officers

At certain airfields within the theater, the Air Priorities Board will place trained priorities officers, whose responsibility it will be to represent the Board in the capacity of Air Priorities Control Officers. At all other airfields along the routes of scheduled flights, the Air Transport Officer will act as the official representative of the Board.

5. Basic Policies

a. Priority for air transportation will be granted only <sup>876</sup>if the movement of the passengers or cargo by air is necessary to the prosecution of the war; or is in the national interest of any of the United Nations, because such transportation will contribute to relief or rehabilitation activities in the areas affected by the war; or to the resumption of economic or other activities disrupted by the war that are necessary to the prompt re-establishment of peace time conditions; and as being of such urgency that transportation by air is essential.

b. A priority will not be granted for a specific flight, or on a specific carrier, unless essential to the accomplishment of the mission.

c. Transportation of passengers or cargo for which priority has been established will be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the carrier concerned.

d. The establishment of a priority is not a guarantee that air transportation will be furnished; more urgent requirements may necessitate the use of other means of transportation prior or subsequent to commencement of travel.

e. After a priority has been established and the booking of space confirmed to the passenger by the Allied Air Booking Center, the same priority will not be honored for a subsequent flight unless the original reservation is cancelled at least three hours prior to the scheduled departure of the original flight.

#### 6. Priority Classifications

Priority classifications will indicate precedence for movement in accordance with relative importance to the prosecution of the war or the national interest of the country concerned. These classifications, by number, will be made only by the Air Priorities Board and its designated representatives. The Air Priorities Board, via its official representatives, is the only agency within the theater authorized to establish priorities for air transportation. The Air Priorities Control Officer's or Air Transport Officer's decisions are to be considered final and will not be altered except with the authority or approval of the Air Priorities Board.

Class I - will include only passengers, cargo, and mail, the movement of which is required by an emergency so acute that precedence should be given over all other traffic and which should under no circumstances be delayed enroute for other traffic. This classification will only be granted when the urgency is such that a delay in transportation will seriously and directly impair the war effort.

Class II - will include only passengers, cargo, and mail, the transportation of which by air is absolutely necessary to the accomplishment of a mission essential to the prosecution of the war and which is of an extremely urgent nature.

Class III - will include only passengers, cargo and mail, the transportation of which by air is vital to the war effort, but not of an extremely urgent nature.

Class IV - will include passengers, cargo and mail, the transportation of which is of such importance

- (a) to the war effort; or
- (b) to the relief or rehabilitation activities in areas affected by the war; or
- (c) to the resumption of economic or other activities disrupted by the war that are necessary for the prompt re-establishment of peace time conditions

as to justify transportation by air, but not as urgent as traffic under classifications 1, 2, and 3.

7. Application for Priority

Units, formations and sections of the Navies, Armies, Air Forces and Civil Departments desiring air priority for passengers or cargo will make application in writing and in full detail to the proper Air Screening Agency as outlined in par. 4, AFHQ letter AG 334/009 GCT-O, dated 20 December 1944. Requests for air transportation should be made at least 24 hours in advance. In making requests for priorities, the following information will be furnished in writing:

For Passengers:

1. Rank, full name (First name, middle initial and last name) and serial number, where applicable.
2. Passenger's affiliation.
3. Phone or other contact where the passenger may be located.
4. Points of origin and destination, and if return trip is desired.
5. Latest arrival date necessary for the accomplishment of the mission.
6. Information to justify need for priority in accordance with AFHQ letter AG 334/009 GCT-O, subject "Air Priorities Board," dated 20 December 1944, and this directive.

For Cargo:

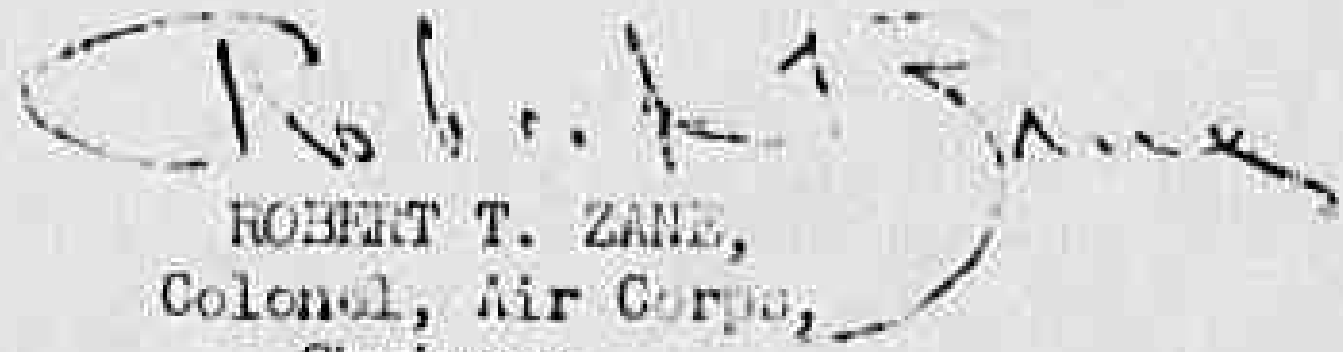
1. Consignor and Consignee.
2. Points of Origin and destination.
3. Individual through whom shipment may be located, and phone or other contact.
4. Number of pieces, total weight and dimensions, and contents.
5. Time shipment must arrive at destination.
6. Information to justify need for priority in accordance with AFHQ letter AG 334/009 GCT-O, subject "Air Priorities Board," dated 20 December 1944, and this directive.
7. Governmental department or agency in the interest of which shipment is to be made.

8. Priority Classification Number.

At the time priority is established by the Air Priorities Board or its representative, passengers and cargo will be assigned a priority classification number, followed by the three letter abbreviation of the station originating priority, followed by a three letter suffix indicating the agency in whose interest travel or shipment is being made. (Example: 3-AP-SC, indicates priority originating in Naples for a shipment for the Air Service (and.)

9. Priority from Points Outside the Theater.

Requests for priority for the transportation by air of personnel or cargo from points outside the theater to points within this theater will be handled in accordance with this Board's Memoranda Nos. 90-12, subject "Priorities for Air Transportation--Cargo and Passengers from the United States to this Theater," dated 20 September 1944, and 90-13, subject "Priorities for Air Transportation--Cargo and Passengers from the European and Middle Eastern Theaters of Operations to this Theater," dated 1 November 1944.

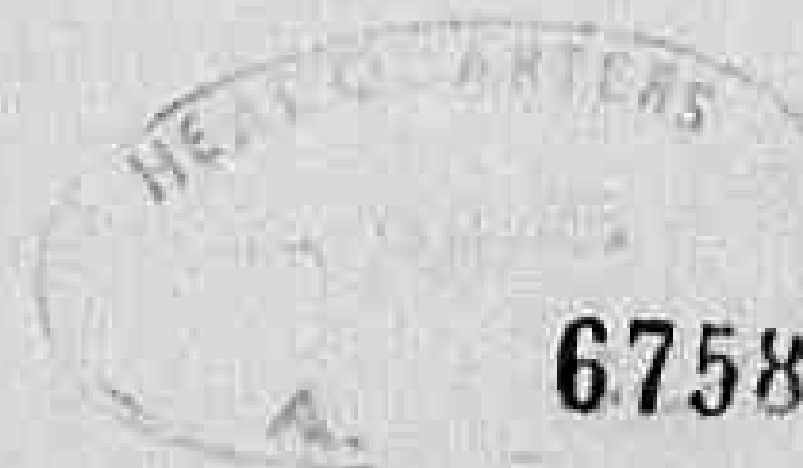
