1. By authority of Paragraph 3, Special Orders No 185, 8 August 1945, HQ. 2675 Regiment, A.C., copy attached hereto marked Exhibit A. The following report is submitted.

2. The five (5) typewriters in question, Nos: 358225, 396788, 357349, 388584 and 396781; property of Ing. G. Olivetti & C., S.A., Ivrea, Piazza Castello 113, Torino, Italy, were stolen from offices of HQ. Bldg. sometime between the night of 30 June 1945 and morning of 1 July 1945, both incl. The theft was committed by some person or persons who were well acquainted with all possible means of ingress and egress to HQ. Bldg. Following the theft a certain ladder, normally kept in carpenter's shop at HQ. Bldg., was found propped up against a window in the basement of the Bldg. which window is about 30 feet from carpenter's shop, the latter also being in the basement. The lock on door of carpenter's shop had been forced open. The window heretofore mentioned is one of the many openings on the basement walls and are located, at the top, at a level with sidewalk at Via Gen. Marcello Prestinari. All of these windows have iron bars on them as a security measure, all bars look alike and appear strong and fast but the one in question was a false set of bars in that all the bars to this window are fixed to two rectangular iron frames, each frame covering half of the window opening; the center bar is split perpendicularly and forms the junction of the two frames above mentioned. The two frames are fastened to this window opening by hinges at either lateral side, thus allowing the frame to open as two sets of doors. This arrangement is made so perfectly that it is almost impossible to detect it's false nature. Bars to

This arrangement is made so perfectly ~~that~~ it is almost impossible to detect it's false nature. Bars to other windows are imbedded in the cement wall of the Bldg. itself.
3. Once in the portion of the basement where the window mentioned in para. 2 is located one has free access to the entire Bldg.
4. Guards were placed on duty at main entrance of Bldg. and in courtyard, two at each location, during all of the time that it is contended that the theft occurred. Since the false window referred to in para. 2 was unknown to everyone prior to this occasion and all bars on all windows appeared strong and fast, the Security Officer, whose statement is attached hereto and marked Exhibit B, did not place guards outside the Bldg.
5. Exhibit C, attached hereto, is an Affidavit of Italian Soldiers that performed guard duty at HQ. Bldg. during the period in question. Exhibit D, also attached hereto, is an Affidavit of Commandant of Italian Soldiers abovementioned, which

Affidavit is self explanatory.

6. Exhibit E and F, attached hereto respectively, are police reports made by Royal Carabinieri and Royal Italian Questura, indicating efforts made to regain typewriters and apprehend thief, but all efforts proved fruitless.

7. FINDINGS:

a. That burglar was familiar with false window and entered by means thereof, that he had knowledge of the ladder being kept in the carpenter's shop and used same to bring the typewriters to the window as base of window cannot be reached by extending arms overhead.

b. That the Security Officer was not injudicious in failing to place guards outside of Bldg. For reasons mentioned in para. 4 hereof.

c. That false window is now secured by a strong lock and chain.

8. RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. That no disciplinary action be taken or claims for damage filed against any of U.S., British or Italian military personnel or civilian personnel of this HQ. that are charged with security of the Bldg. or of the typewriters.

b. That the accountable and responsible officers be relieved of such accountability and responsibility.

STATEMENT OF IRA I. MUTCHNICK 2nd Lt. INF 01323600.

" I, Ira I. Mutchnick, 2nd Lt. Inf. 01323600, was Security Officer at Piemonte Region Headquarters, located at 20 Corso Oporto at the time five typewriters were reported missing.

Sometime between the hours of 1800 June 30, 1945 and 0800 July 1, 1945 someone broke into the Hq. and later investigation showed that five typewriters were missing from various offices. I was first notified at 0900 July 1, 1945 of the robbery by PTE. JEMMET A.E. who was at the building in the morning and noticed that several doors had been forced and that the doors that were usually locked were open.

On my investigation I found that the door located at the entrance of the civilian mess leading down to the cellar was open and that the door to the locksmith shop had been forced open. A ladder was taken from the locksmith shop and later found propped up against the window facing Via Gen. Marcello Prestinari. This window had bars on it but investigation showed that it was the only window in which the bars were on hinges and could be opened. The bars were open when I found the ladder at the window.

The typewriters reported missing were all of the small Olivetti type. The following typewriters were reported missing from the following rooms: No. 358225 from room 328, No. 396788 from room 432, No. 357349 from room 355, No. 388584 from room 327 and No. 396781 from room 226.

The security at this Hq. at the time the typewriters were reported missing consisted of two Italian soldiers, one whose post was at the entrance of the building and the others whose post was in the parking lot. This was the security provided at the time I was appointed Security Officer at this Hq.

This window had bars on it but investigation showed that it was the only window in which the bars were on hinges and could be opened. The bars were open when I found the ladder at the window.

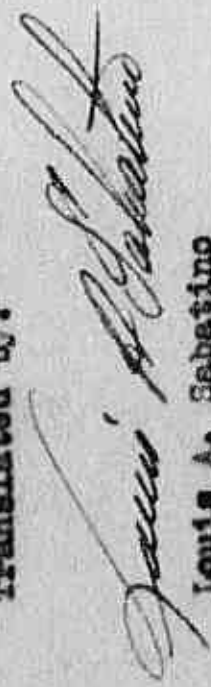
