It is my view that a proper request from the Italian Government for Allied intervention should be acceded to only if the disturbance or disorder endangers allied personnel, allied property, or installations, whether allied or italian, which would have adverse affect upon the prosecution of the war.
- 2. The measure to be adopted in the event that such a request is acceded to, is the reinstitution of Allied Military Government in the political subdivision or subdivisions effected, that is to say, province, commune or governorate.
