TO : Establishment Section. (3)

1. Reference DPR/20/Q of 18 September 1945.
2. A reply to the above is urgently requested as the respective Missions have NOT been permitted to draw E.F.I. rations for the past two issues.
3. It is also reported that Col. Gulliksen, Head of Norwegian Mission has been refused E.F.I. rations. This is not understood as Col. Gulliksen is billeted at the Flora Hotel and is presumably on the ration strength of H.Q., A.C.

SUBJECT : Rations - Accredited Military Missions United Nations.

TO : Establishment Section. (2)

1. Copy of H.Q. Comit. letter HQC/3/5 of 30 August 1945 is forwarded for your information.

2. No representative from Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission was invited to attend this conference until the conference was actually in progress and at the request of the H.Q. Comit., Major Simcock, D.P.R.S.C. Liaison Officer to the various Missions accredited to the Allied Commission was asked to attend in order to verify the names of certain Russian representatives who were reputed to be drawing PX and British NAAFI Rations from RAC.

3. Two months ago Lt. Col. Brown of D.P.R.S.C. interviewed Colonel Robertson on the question of NAAFI Rations for the representatives of the various Missions and made it clear that Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission, although assisting the A.C. by issuing the normal rations to the Missions through the medium of the Displaced Persons Centre at Cine Citta, could not and was not organized to set up a NAAFI supply store for their benefit.

The Allied Military Staff at Cine Citta, caring for a population of 1000 or more Displaced Persons, consists of 2 Officers and a varying strength of 12 - 20 BORs and as in any Unit NAAFI supply for the Staff is the responsibility of the Commanding Officer. To expect the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission to be responsible for the purchase and resale of NAAFI Rations is not considered justified when there exists an efficient and competent organization within A.C. to handle the feeding and administration of its members.

4. The undertaking said to have been agreed to by Major Simcock is NOT possible and has been accepted without reference to the Director of D.P.R.S.C.

5. No doubt RAC are justified in their ruling and it is requested that in order to comply with their order the rationing of the various Missions, as per attached schedule, be taken over by the appropriate Department of H.Q., A.C. or that the present system remains in force.

4. The undertaking said to have been agreed to by Major Simcock is NOT possible and has been accepted without reference to the Director of D.P.R.S.C.

5. No doubt RAAC are justified in their ruling and it is requested that in order to comply with their order the rationing of the various Missions, as per attached schedule, be taken over by the appropriate Department of H.Q., A.C. or that the present system remains in force.

6. The D.P.R.S.C. will supply H.Q. Comdt. a weekly nominal roll and strength return of representatives entitled to be rationed.

7. It is requested that this question be given your early attention in order to avoid injustice to the various accredited members of the United Nations Governments.

SUBJECT : HAAFI and Free Issue Rations.

TO : Director, Displaced Persons & Repatriation S/C.

1. Reference is made to the conference on the above subject which took place in this office yesterday at which your representative, Major Siscock, was present.
2. Definite instructions have been received from HAAFC that this Headquarters is not permitted to draw any of the above rations for personnel who are not on the ration strength of this Headquarters. Consequently, your representative undertook to supply HAAFI rations for the personnel of all Missions attached to your Sub-Commission who at present draw their British Army rations from you at CINK CITTA. In order to accommodate you in this matter, your representative requested that this Headquarters should continue, and that the new arrangements would come into force with effect from 5 September 1945.

SUBJECT: Diplomatic and Consular Representatives
of Allied and Neutral Nations

MEMO TO: Colonel Norman E. Fiske

1. Members of the Advisory Council draw rations from the DID and American Quartermaster in equal shares.
2. Representatives of United Nations draw a special scale laid down in ACC/43-1/Pool of 2 October, which is roughly four times the normal civilian scale.
3. Neutral Legations draw four times the normal civilian scale from the Italian Gov't. The Swiss have been asked if, in their capacity as Protecting Power, they would prefer to draw rations as in Para 2, but have decided to remain on their present scale.
4. The French Representative to AC draws British Rations, and the Soviet Representative draws American Rations. Both are entitled to purchase goods at the NAAFI, and both Representatives and their ADC's have PX cards.
5. Military Missions to the Displaced Persons Sub Committee draw British Rations if they have establishments of their own, or live in the AC Hotels. All are entitled to purchase goods at the NAAFI.
6. At the present time there are no outstanding problems in regard to the rationing of Diplomatic and Consular Representatives, with the possible exception of the Swiss, who have asked informally for a supplementary ration of sugar and oil, while confirming that they wish to remain on their present scale. This matter is now under consideration.
