SUBJECT: Military Courtesy and Discipline.

TO : All concerned.

1. There is a marked laxity on the part of ^{US} Officers and Enlisted personnel throughout MTOUSA in observing the basic principles of Military Courtesy and Discipline. Saluting is far from the standards prescribed, and discrepancies range from careless and improper execution, to complete failure to render the salute. Improper wearing of the uniform is common. Unbuttoned jackets, wearing of torn and dirty articles of uniform, improper wearing of or failure to wear the proper headgear, dirty and tarnished insignia, unpolished boots and shoes, and unbuttoned pockets are frequently observed offenses.

2. Such derelictions are inexcusable and are a reflection upon the Army of the United States. The appearance and behavior of our officers and enlisted men in foreign lands make an impression upon the inhabitants by which they will judge our nation. Therefore, every effort must be exerted by every officer and enlisted man to correct the existing deficiencies and to reach and maintain a high state of military courtesy and discipline. It is the duty and responsibility of every commander personally to constantly direct and supervise the proper observance of these basic principles which are part of the foundations of the Army. Vigorous action will immediately be taken to correct present conditions, and the proper standards of military courtesy and discipline will be maintained. Laxity will not be tolerated.

3. Any orders or instructions heretofore issued in this theater relaxing in any way or for any reason the above requirements with respect to conduct, uniform, or saluting are hereby revoked.

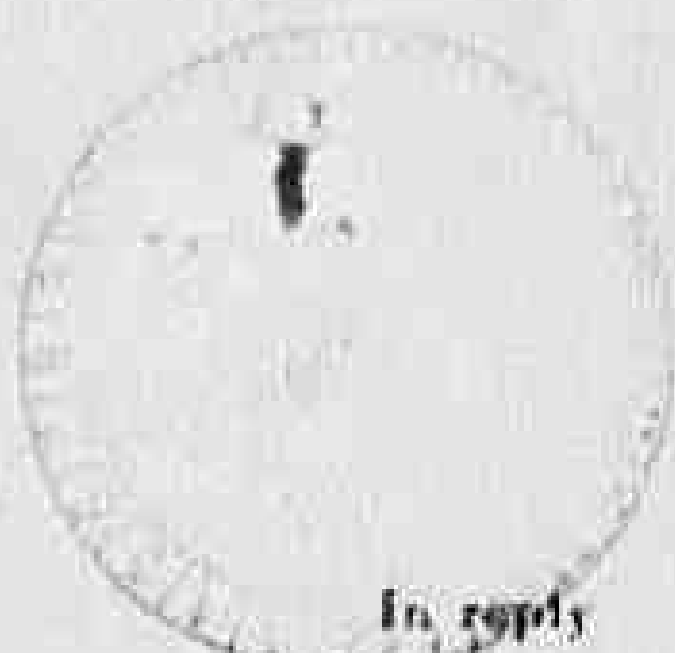

All files, data and suggestion of action taken by Board of Officers: Corsica Claims will be turned over to U. S. Claims Service.

2. On 30 November 1945 the U. S. Claims Service will assume the responsibilities previously held by the Board of Officers: Corsica Claims which was constituted to investigate, pass on the validity and accomplish any necessary Reciprocal Aid documents, or any other papers essential to final disposal of unseized real estate or personal property claims, and for certifying to receipt of public utility services, resulting from United States Armed Force's occupancy of Corsica. No claim arising from the use and occupancy of real estate or from procurement matters, subsequent to 2 September 1945, will be handled on a reciprocal aid - lease basis. Such claims will be processed only under the provisions of pertinent Army Regulations.

3. The U. S. Claims Service is authorized to call on such major commands and such special staff sections for information and statistics as may be necessary to accomplish this work.

SUBJECT: Discharge of Military Personnel to Accept War Department
Employment.

TO: All Concerned.

1. In view of the shortage of trained military personnel consequent to redeployment, it is desirable to employ a considerable number of discharged officers and soldiers in a civilian status. To accomplish this object there has been prepared the attached notice describing generally the terms of employment offered. Such notice will be given the widest possible publicity among members of the military service eligible or shortly to be eligible for discharge. Blank forms for application may be obtained from Civilian Personnel Offices of all major commands.

2. At the earliest possible date major commands will survey their headquarters and subordinate units and will determine, in the light of present conditions, what positions in their service can best be filled by American civilians. Such positions will then be reported for analysis to the Civilian Personnel Division, Adjutant General's Section, Headquarters, Southern District, Peninsular Base Section, APO 782. Commands will be notified of approved classifications.

3. Commands will, insofar as possible, fill their approved vacancies from applications submitted to them. Those positions not filled, and applications for whom no positions exist, will be transmitted to the office designated in paragraph 2, above. That office will attempt to match vacancies with applications, and will recommend hirings accordingly.

4. Commands will decide which applicant is best qualified for which position in their employ. However, no position will be created merely to employ a particular individual, and present suitability for the position rather than past grade or rank in the military service will determine qualifications.

5. American civilian employees will be employed and administered in accordance with current directives as set forth in Civilian Personnel Regulations, Headquarters MTOUSA. Each command is cautioned, however, to make sure that sufficient funds are allocated for the payment of such personnel before they are hired.

NOTICE

CIVILIAN JOBS IN ITALY FOR DISCHARGED SOLDIERS

1. The United States Army offers to employ in the Mediterranean Theater of Operations a considerable number of discharged military personnel as Civilian Employees. Employment is offered on the following terms:

a. Positions to be filled: Clerical positions, all types, and selected administrative and technical positions. Further information may be obtained from the office indicated below.

b. Nature of Positions: In accordance with Schedule A-1-7 of US Civil Service Rules, temporary and ungraded (but pay is same as for comparable classified positions).

c. Persons eligible to apply: All persons in the military service who under existing regulations are eligible for discharge.

d. Form of Applications: US Standard Form 57, which may be obtained from the office indicated below or from the headquarters of major commands. All applicants will fully state their work experience attained prior to military service. In the case of enlisted personnel particular care will be taken to describe duties and abilities involving responsibilities above those usually associated with enlisted grades.

e. Time of Making Application: As early as possible. Individuals cannot be hired as civilians until finally separated from the service, but earlier application, if accepted, will permit employment as a civilian directly upon separation.

f. Channels for Application: From the applicant to the Civilian Personnel Officer of the major command to which his unit is assigned. Accompanying it in memorandum form will be the applicant's sick record, assignment record, character and efficiency ratings, together with any additional comments which his immediate commanding officer may think appropriate.

g. Hirings: By the major commands, from the best qualified of the applicants whose applications are on file with them, and to the extent that position vacancies exist.

h. Salary: A basic rate per annum as specified for the position by the Federal Employees Pay Act of 1945, plus overseas allowance of 25% of basic pay, plus overtime. Salary is payable in 13 equal installments a year.

1. Overtime: Payable for all time over 40 hours weekly (but not in excess of 6 hours per week) at the rate of time and one-half on the portion of any salary not exceeding \$2,950 per annum, and at lesser graduated rates on the portion of any salary above that figure.

j. Length of Service: One year minimum unless the applicant is sooner released for the convenience of the Government.

k. Annual Leave: 26 days per year, granted during the year if employing service consents - if not, available at termination of employment.

l. Sick Leave: As required but not exceeding 15 days per year with pay.

Medical, dental and hospital care furnished by the Government without charge.

Workmen's compensation provided in accordance with US Employees Compensation Law.

m. Billots and Meals: Furnished by the Government in places designated by the Government, at cost to employees of \$13 per month for room by payroll deduction (or \$8 per month if two persons in room), and \$.75 per day for food, plus any mess service charge. These rates are subject to change.

n. Place of Work: At any point or points in the theater, and with any command, as the Government may designate.

o. Miscellaneous Facilities: Including EX, Post Theaters, rest camps, etc, will generally be open to civilian employees. Local rules may vary somewhat.

p. Transportation to the States: At termination of employment will be furnished by the Government as far as Port of Debarkation in the US (Travel allowance from Port of Debarkation to point of enlistment is provided at time of discharge). Travel to US will be free unless employee was discharged for cause or quit without consent of employing service before his term was up. In either such case he will pay for return trip himself.

q. No Contract: No contract is given to War Department civilian employees. The terms of employment given above summarize salient points of applicable regulations and directives, all of which are subject to change by the issuing authorities.

r. Publications: The following publications are applicable to employment in this theater: Federal Employees Pay Act of 1945, War Department Civilian Personnel Regulations and Circulars, and Civilian Personnel Regulations of Headquarters MTCUSA.

TO: All Concerned.

1. Letter, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 28 October 1945, and letter, this headquarters, file AG 322/312 C-0, dated 7 November 1945, subject: "Planning for Close-out of Headquarters Command, Allied Force", are rescinded.

2. The following assumptions are applicable for future planning:

a. The Mediterranean Theater of Operations will not be combined with the European Theater of Operations.

b. Headquarters MTOUSA will continue to function substantially as at present and in its present location.

c. Peninsular Base Section will continue operations as at present.

d. Rome Area, MTOUSA, will continue to function as at present.

e. Headquarters Command, Allied Force, will continue to function as an Allied area command and insofar as its US responsibilities are concerned will perform the mission of furnishing housekeeping facilities for the US personnel in Headquarters MTOUSA and in integrated sections of AFHQ.

f. Occupational air forces in Italy will pass to operational command of USAFE on 1 December. (Responsibility for administration is at present undetermined.)

g. Naples Air Forces General Depot, which has replaced AAFSC/MTO as an air force major command and whose mission is substantially to liquidate surplus air force stocks in the theater, will continue assigned to this headquarters until its mission is complete and it is closed out.

3. It is desired that the Commanding Officer, Headquarters Command, Allied Force, prepare plans for the reorganization of the US element of his command with a view to economizing in personnel by reducing his requirement to the numbers necessary to meet US service responsibilities and a proportionate share of Allied responsibilities in the Headquarters Command area.

Naples Air Forces General Depot, which has replaced AFSC/MTC as an air force major command and whose mission is substantially to liquidate surplus air force stocks in the theater, will continue assigned to this headquarters until its mission is complete and it is closed out.

3. It is desired that the Commanding Officer, Headquarters Command, Allied Force, prepare plans for the reorganization of the US element of his command with a view to economizing in personnel by reducing his requirement to the numbers necessary to meet US service responsibilities and a proportionate share of Allied responsibilities in the Headquarters Command area.

SUBJECT: Marriage Applications and Dependents of Military Personnel.

TO: All Concerned.

1. Letter this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 17 September 1945, is recorded and the following substituted therefor:

a. Personnel applying for marriage in this theater, who are eligible for return to the United States, or transfer to another theater, will not be deferred solely for the purpose of processing their marriage applications unless they sign the following certificate:

"I hereby waive my rights, present or future, that I may have for return to the United States, or transfer to another theater of operations, until my marriage application has been processed and finally approved or disapproved. If my marriage application is approved and my marriage consummated, I further waive my rights, present or future, that I may have for return to the United States, or transfer to another theater of operations, until such time as transportation for my civilian alien dependents to the place of my permanent residence becomes available.

b. Personnel now in this theater who have civilian alien dependents in this theater will be retained in this theater until such time as transportation for their dependents to the place of permanent residence of such personnel becomes available. Such personnel will be retained regardless of any eligibility for return to the United States or transfer to another theater of operations.

2. The certificate provided for in paragraph 1a above, will be filed in and will become a part of the individual's permanent 201 file. Personnel signing such certificate will be appropriately reassigned for completion of their period of service in this theater.

3. Military personnel who have previously signed Class II volunteer statements solely for the purpose of marriage and pursuant to the letter referred to in paragraph 1, above, will not be retained in the theater under such statement beyond the time transportation for their dependents to the place of permanent residence of such military personnel becomes available unless they sign a new Class II volunteer statement.

4. Commanders will inform all personnel of their commands who submit marriage applications and those who now have dependents in this theater that the present emergency facilities in Naples cannot be increased. Unit Commanders will urge and assist members of their commands to make adequate plans for care of their dependents at their present residences and will discourage movement of dependents to Naples and other ports of embarkation within the theater until such dependents are notified that transportation for them is available.

5. This directive is made necessary by the following factors:

- a. Length of time required for processing marriage applications.
- b. Length of time required for securing of necessary passports and visas for non-citizen dependents.
- c. The fact that many individuals have departed from the theater without making any arrangements for transportation, expenses, living facilities, care, or performing any obligations owed to their dependents, thus leaving them in very cases, as an additional burden to the government and to military facilities in this theater which are now overburdened by shortage of operating personnel in the theater.

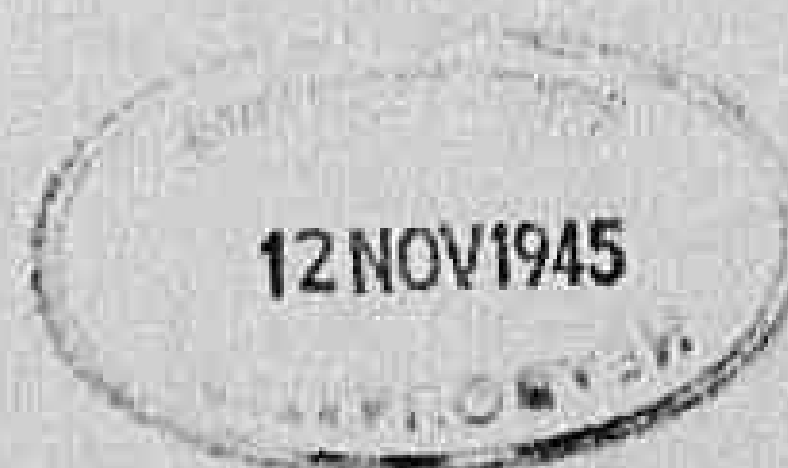

SUBJECT: Authority for Payment of Per Diem and Monetary Allowances for Quarters and Subsistence.

TO: All Concerned.

Letter, this headquarters, file AG 245.4/142-0, dated 20 May 1945, subject: "Authority for Payment of Per Diem and Monetary Allowances for Quarters and Subsistence", as amended by letter, this headquarters, same file and subject, dated 18 July 1945, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. Insofar as per diem for officers and monetary allowances for quarters and subsistence for enlisted personnel are involved, all orders issued in this theater directing military personnel to travel by aircraft or placing them on a temporary duty status will be prepared in strict conformance with the provisions of AR 35-4810, 8 October 1945; AR 35-4820, 19 April 1945; Section IV, WD Circular Number 269, 7 September 1945; and Section III, Circular Number 69, this headquarters, 1945. (WD Circulars 260 and 356, 1944, as amended, are superseded by AR 35-4820).

2. Attention is invited to the following special provisions of pertinent regulations:

a. Orders directing travel and temporary duty for officers and enlisted personnel will not specify the method or rate of reimbursement, except as provided for in paragraph 3c (2), AR 35-4820, and paragraph 3, WD Memorandum Number 35-44, 4 July 1944, governing attendance of officers at service schools, etc.

b. All orders issued in this theater will quote the applicable Army Regulations when authority exists to reimburse military personnel for expenses incurred when traveling by aircraft or on temporary duty.

c. The following model remarks will be used as appropriate in orders:

- (1) For travel of officers by aircraft within and outside the continental limits of the United States:

"Within the continental United States the provisions of paragraph 25, AR 35-4820, 19 April 1945, apply; outside the continental United States the provisions of paragraph 26, AR 35-4820, 19 April 1945, apply, except no per diem is authorized for periods of travel and/or temporary duty performed wholly within this theater."

- (2) For travel of enlisted personnel by aircraft within and outside the continental limits of the United States when no detention period on a temporary duty status is involved:

"For payment of per diem to enlisted personnel, provisions of paragraph 5, AR 35-4810, 8 October 1945, apply, except no per diem is authorized for periods of travel and/or temporary duty performed wholly within this theater."

- (3) For travel of enlisted personnel by aircraft when a detention period on a temporary duty status is involved:

"For payment of per diem to enlisted personnel while traveling by aircraft provisions of paragraph 5, AR 35-4810, 8 October 1945, apply, and for payment of allowances on a detention status while on temporary duty, provisions of paragraph 16, AR 35-4810, apply, except no per diem or allowances are authorized for periods of travel and/or temporary duty wholly within this theater."
