1. We have been approached regarding a possible requisition of
Torresina, a property belonging to an Ing. Ticea, in Palestrina, Rome Province.

2. It is said that 165th Field Regiment R.A. are proposing to take
over. It will involve moving some 210 people and the housing of this people
is an extremely difficult problem if not an impossibility. For this reason
the Prefect has approached us.

3. While it is realised that the needs of the Army are of first
importance, we should like to avoid this state of affairs if an alternative
is possible.

SUBJECT : Draft Instructions re Military
Travel Authorisations.

TO : Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission.

1. The attached draft instructions differ little from the instructions previously issued except that all classes of persons exempted from the requirements to obtain M.T.A's are listed (para.2).

2. The draft instructions have been discussed with Political Section and Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission and the following suggestion is submitted :-

Para 3 Owing to the paucity of A.C.C. officers in some Regions,
after "officer" in line 4
add, "or such other officer or agency as ~~may be~~ ^{deputed}"
Delete from "and" in line 4 to "supervision" in line 5.

3. With regard to the distribution list attached to the instruction it would seem that the two A.M.G. organisations mentioned at the end of the list should be deleted and H.Q., A.C.C. substituted.

4. With regard to paragraph 2 of the covering letter to the instructions, it will be noted that a wider distribution of the instructions in A.C.C. is suggested.

5. As far as A.C.C. is concerned, the instructions regarding M.T.A's are contained in Executive Memorandum No.61, dated 25 May, 1944 (copy attached), which was given the widest possible distribution.

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6. Nothing is known at this Headquarters of the point raised in the last sentence in paragraph 2 as two Sub-Commissions only are authorised to transmit applications to A.F.H.Q., viz:-

Displaced Persons and Repatriation S/C
in the case of Refugees
Public Safety Sub-Commission
in all other cases.

These Sub-Commissions do not forward applications to A.F.H.Q. until FSS/CIC have been consulted.

7. With regard to paragraph 3 of the covering letter, the present practice was adopted, and Executive Memorandum No.61 sent out in a simplified form, in order to reduce the work in Regions to a minimum.

8. It will be noted that this Headquarters screens all requests before the requisite application forms are completed, photographs obtained, and FSS/CIC make their enquiries. Much useless work is thus eliminated.

9. In channelling all applications through this Headquarters, applications are transmitted to A.F.H.Q. in a proper form and a uniform procedure is followed for the whole of liberated Italy.

10. It is strongly recommended that the present procedure be continued, and that A.F.H.Q. be asked to make the necessary amendment to their draft instructions.

Communications with SHARP
Functions of JICANA SectionI -- COMMUNICATIONS WITH SHARP

1. In compliance with request of SHARP, all messages transmitted to that headquarters will be addressed to the Bureau of Supreme Headquarters concerned, in cases where the address of the nation section in that headquarters is known.
2. Messages of operational nature for SGE, G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, Engineer Signal Division, Air Defense Division and Headquarters Command, will be addressed to Forward Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force in cases where there is doubt as to the address of the action addressee.

II - FUNCTIONS OF JICANA SECTION

1. The Joint Intelligence Collection Agency, North Africa, hereafter referred to as JICANA, is a joint agency of the U.S. War and Navy Departments attached to and operating under the Supreme Allied Commander as a separate staff section of his command.

2. The principle mission of JICANA is to furnish the War and Navy Departments such military intelligence as they desire for planning and like purposes. In addition, it will provide such lateral dissemination of pertinent intelligence between the various agencies, both military and civil within the Theater, as directed by the Supreme Allied Commander. Specifically, the duties of JICANA will be:

- a. To initiate procedure which will search out and procure from any and all intelligence agencies, both military and civil within the Theater, all available intelligence of value to the War and Navy Departments. This procedure in all cases, will utilize appropriate existing Theater agencies and channels. Where no such appropriate agencies or channels exist, the intelligence will be procured by personnel or procedure directly available to JICANA.

- b. To select from the available intelligence pertinent items for transmission to the War and Navy Departments.

- c. To function as the collecting and disseminating agency for the Supreme Allied Commander concerning such intelligence as he desires from the War and Navy Departments, civil agencies, and other theaters.

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AFHQ Staff Memorandum Number 81

(cont'd)

3. JICANA will not engage in counterintelligence activities, but will procure such counterintelligence as is of value to the War and Navy Departments, from the proper agencies within the Theater.
4. JICANA will be kept informed of and assist in the coordination of the intelligence activities of all Military and Naval Attaches, permanent and temporary Military and Navy Observers, within the Theater.
5. The efficient coordination of effort requires the occasional interchange of officers between the War and Navy Departments and JICANA for temporary duty. Such officers will transmit oral or written material of a secret or urgent nature and will be given highest travel priority.
6. All highly classified material forwarded by JICANA by Air Pouch or other means shall be accorded the highest priority.
7. Nothing in this directive shall be interpreted as preventing the direct flow of intelligence from agencies within the Theater to Washington, provided copies of such intelligence communications as are within the scope of JICANA are furnished concurrently to JICANA. Such copies will indicate distribution made by the originator.

TO: Commanding General, Rome Allied Area Command.

1. The Transportation Sub-Commission does not under any circumstances requisition civilian motor vehicles for ACC. The language of the letter was ill advised.

2. Pursuant to authority vested in this Headquarters by Headquarters MATOUSKA, this Headquarters has for the past fifteen months done its own requisitioning of civilian vehicles. This question came up while General Johnson was in command of RAAC and was duly regularized to the satisfaction

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of all concerned in a conference held by representatives of RAAO and AGC Headquarters. At present, requisitioning is done by our G-H (A) through your G-H, so in effect this Headquarters does not actually complete the requisitioning. We agreed to this procedure in order to establish a definite channel for requisitioning and in order that the records of all requisitioned vehicles might remain in one central filing point.

3. The writer has recently had several discussions with your Chief of Staff along these lines and it is believed that we are in complete agreement on the above procedure.

4. This Headquarters is anxious to cooperate in every way possible with your Headquarters and, to that end, the writer is available for any conferences or discussions you may desire on this subject.

SUBJECT: Civilian Travelling Allowances.

TO : Vice President, Establishment Section.

1. For some time there has been considerable discussion about the payment of a uniform rate for civilian employees of this organization while travelling away from their Headquarters and normal billets.

2. Recent events, including the substitution of Italian civilians for officers in many assignments, necessitate the publication of uniform per diem rates. It must also be considered that this substitution of civilians for military personnel will increase in the near future.

3. There are two categories of civilians involved, namely:

a. Italian civilian drivers. These are at present paid time and a half and furnished rations while out on trips. This is considered adequate and the system is working satisfactorily. Therefore, no change is contemplated.

b. Italian civilian engineers, economists and other professional men who travel for the purpose of making inspections and for other duties which would normally be performed by an officer. This is the category for which no uniform per diem scale exists in A.C.C. The Italian Government, however, has in effect the daily travelling allowances based on the monthly salary of the personnel involved. These are as follows:

The following is extracted from AMG 5 Army Sitrep for period 20-24
September :

* Considerable confusion is being caused by the ordering away by Establishments Branch of officers' in Region VIII provinces not yet fully occupied for re-assignment to forward Regions. It is appreciated that Region VIII officers must be earmarked for new duties in the North, but the policy of pulling them out from newly occupied communes with the innumerable problems that arise in the period immediately after the tide of war has passed and sending them down south to a concentration area for re-assignment seems completely unrealistic. It is realised that there is a great shortage of military transport in ACC and it is therefore not expected that new provincial teams should come up with more than three or four vehicles; however the Spezia team who reported this week-end have only one jeep between seven officers. Their usefulness is therefore very limited. This is the lowest point we have yet reached and it is hoped that future teams can be better equipped.*

1. I have before me a letter from Headquarters Rome Allied Area Command enclosing the copy of a letter from Pfc. Carmine De Vito bearing your lat indorsement to the Provost Marshal, Rome Allied Area Command. This letter states that Pfc. De Vito is assigned to the task of requisitioning civilian motor vehicles for A.C.C. and requests permission for De Vito to carry a pistol in the performance of his duties.

2. Headquarters RAAC have taken exception to this letter on two counts: primarily they object to the statement that De Vito is authorized to requisition vehicles. It is my belief that he simply locates them for requisition by G-4, AGC.

3. It is unfortunate that such a statement should be made to RAAC at this particular time, since the writer has been in consultation with the Commanding General and the Chief of Staff of RAAC with a view toward regularizing all the requisitioning in the city of Rome.

4. You are reminded that only one requisitioning agency exists within the framework of this Headquarters, that agency being G-4 (A). He is authorized to screen and process all requests for requisition of vehicles. The actual requisitioning is then done through the prescribed and established channels, viz. G-4, RAAC, and the Prefect of Rome Province.

5. It is requested that, if in fact your Sub-Commission is requisitioning vehicles, it cease that practice and handle all requisitions of vehicles through the abovementioned channels.

SUBJECT: Motor Transportation Liguria Region.

MEMO TO: Executive Commissioner, A.C.C.

1. You will find attached hereto comments by the various officers concerned in the furnishing of motor transportation to Liguria Region.

2. Their remarks may be summarized as follows in reply to Col. Feeney's letter: It will be noted that 14 passenger-carrying vehicles were assigned. Inasmuch as the strength of Liguria Region is 65 officers and the Region is composed of only four provinces, this would seem to be sufficient organic military transportation.

3. Liguria Region, upon the division of Region X, was assigned one third of the vehicles originally assigned to Region X, that is to say that Piemonte Region received two thirds of the original assignment and Liguria Region received one third. Piemonte Region consists of seven provinces and considerably more territory.

4. Inasmuch as the Regional Commissioners of Regions IX, XI, XII and Piemonte Region have expressed to the Establishment Branch their complete satisfaction with the manner in which issues of motor transportation were made to them, it appears unusual that Liguria Region received all of its vehicles in the poor condition they report.

5. You will note from the comments of the British and American G-4s and of the Headquarters Commandant that it is impossible, without having access to the vehicles and their maintenance forms, to state the exact condition in which they were issued.

6. Transportation Sub-Commission has assumed the responsibility for maintenance of motor transportation within regions and has a Maintenance Officer with Liguria Region. They have received a copy of Col. Feeney's letter.

7. As to paragraph 9, I do not know of any region that has sufficient transportation to move as a unit. Present regulations do not prohibit the requisitioning of civilian transport. In fact, an Army order

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states that vehicles will not be requisitioned by combat units, but will be left for requisitioning by ADC. It is true that Liguria Region cannot requisition in its present location.

8. As to the request for additional transportation, you are familiar with the fact that we have practically stripped this Headquarters as well as the rear Regions of War Department vehicles and are now at about the limit of our issues.

SUBJECT: Committee for Disposal of Real Estate

TO : Headquarters, Allied Control Commission, APO 394, U. S. Army.

1. Cases have arisen where properties have been released by various holders, to the owners, when it developed later, that another agency could well have used them. At present there is no satisfactory way of canvassing other agencies before releasing real estate. To correct this situation and to insure that no occupant releases any of its facilities without providing others a chance to bid them in, it is the desire of the Commanding Officer to establish a committee under the chairmanship of Lt. Col. H. H. Griffith, Real Estate Officer of PBC, to constitute a clearing house for all releases.

2. It is proposed that when any using agency proposes to give up a property, it will report the matter to the committee so that it shall not be released until all members of the committee have signified that they have no need for it. If another organization desires to utilize the property, transfer of it to that organization can be effected. If more than one agency desires to acquire the property, it will be the responsibility of the committee to determine which one has the greater interest and to recommend transfer to that one.

3. It is not contemplated that the committee will concern itself with the original search for, or requisitioning of property. Its sole function will be to insure that no property is released without others having an opportunity to acquire it.

4. If you concur in this plan, will you be kind enough to furnish the name, address and telephone number of your nominees. Upon receipt of reply from the various addressees, Colonel Griffith will call a meeting of the committee to determine the procedures under which it will operate.

5. I am sending similar letters to General Officer Commanding, Number III District; Flag Officer, Western Italy; Commanding General, AFSC/ETO; U.S. Navy; French Territorial Command and Headquarters Command, AFHQ.

SUBJECT: Removal of Allied Garrison from Sardinia.

TO : O-5, A.F.H.Q., APO 512.

1. Reference proposed withdrawal of Allied Garrison from Sardinia, the following points arise:

- a. Source of supplies and rations.
- b. Movement of A.P.O.
- c. Reduction of A.C.C. strength.
- d. Communications.

2. Supplies and rations may be drawn from Naples or the near vicinity from either American or British sources. This will be arranged by this Headquarters between Region VI and Southern Region.

3. Official and personal mail can be routed through Southern Region Headquarters at Naples and taken from there by courier to Sardinia. This also will be arranged by this Headquarters.

a. There are, at present, Italian cruisers that run, on alternate days, from Naples to Cagliari, Sardinia, and these could be used for transportation of mail, supplies and rations.

b. The total strength of A.C.C. officers and enlisted personnel left in Sardinia when the Allied Garrison has been removed will not exceed twenty.

5. Signals have previously been handled over the Naples-Cagliari cable by military personnel. With the departure of all military personnel, it is understood that the cable will be handed over to the Italian Government, and although we may use the cable, the question of security arises. All messages sent over this link must therefore be sent in the "clear".

6. Due to the fact that (a) the "cruisers" communications will be slow and (b) that all signals will be sent in the clear, it will be necessary in some instances to request a special courier plane for urgent messages.

7. Paragraph 6 above seems to be the only instance in which your Headquarters can be of service to us. It is requested that you advise us as to the possibility of such special courier service should the need arise.

1. The following is a copy of letter 370.43 of 22 August received from HQ SOS.

" 1. It is requested the Allied Control Commission be advised it is now the plan of this Headquarters that the Allied Garrison of Sardinia will be completely closed prior to 1 December 1944, insofar as U. S. participation is concerned.

" 2. A complete close-out plan has been received from Sardinia. This plan, which has been correlated with data presently available to this Headquarters, indicates that all U. S. troops and installations will be evacuated from the island by 15 November 1944. Included in the plan submitted by Sardinia is a statement concerning the U. S. contingent, Co. "F", 2675th Regiment, ACC, with a total strength of 40, and a small group of U. S. personnel representing the ACC/ASC (Army Sub-Commission) which are maintained from U. S. Stocks.

" 3. With the realization that these units may remain in Sardinia after the close-out date, it is recommended appropriate action be taken by ACC so that functions of the unit will be properly co-ordinated with the closing of Sardinia, and further support by this Headquarters will not be necessary subsequent to 15 November. "

TO : Commanding General, Allied Garrison of Sardinia

1. 42nd Bombardment Wing will be withdrawn on order from USAF in September or October 1944.
2. Upon departure of the Commanding General, 42nd Bombardment Wing, Colonel C. K. Harding will assume command.
3. The following instructions will be carried out by Commanding General, 42nd Bombardment Wing prior to his departure from Sardinia and Colonel C. K. Harding subsequent to assuming command thereof.
 - a. All AAF installations in Sardinia will be closed at earliest practicable date.
 - b. All ACC operations will be reduced to a minimum.
 - c. AFM Signal section will submit plans for withdrawing AAF signal personnel and equipment and will submit recommendations for continuing operation of communications remaining.
 - d. Railways now being operated under Army direction will be turned over to civilian authorities as soon as practicable.
 - e. All troops to be withdrawn.
 - (1) Navy Base installations at Maddalena will be closed before 15 December 1944.
 - (2) AA & CD Units will be withdrawn as soon as (1) above has been accomplished.
 - (3) All other troops will be withdrawn upon direction of Commanding General, NAFUSA.
 - f. The final withdrawal and disposition of U.S. Army installations is the responsibility of Commanding General, NAFUSA.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Executive Officer (American)

1. The night of 3 September, in order to check up on irregularities of various sorts which had been reported in connection with the use of the duty car, the undersigned personally acted as Staff Duty Officer.

2. The points which arose in connection with use of the duty car were two:

a. Italian civilian employees working after hours, requested, on their own authority, the use of the duty car to take them to their homes. Due to the lack of commercial transportation facilities, it is considered that this is not unreasonable. However, the following points arise in this matter:

(1) If no restriction is placed on this particular use being made of the duty car, it is quite possible that excessive use will be made of it.

(2) The undersigned is of the opinion that this use of the duty car should be allowed, if at all, only on the request of an officer, and not solely on the authority of the employee. It might be well to require the officer's request to be made in writing. (See Par 3 b.)

b. A request was received from the Staff Duty Officer at Hq Region IV for the use of Hq ACC duty car on the plea that the Region IV duty car could not be reached. While cooperation between the two headquarters is to be expected, the fact that this has occurred several times in recent weeks might well be made the basis of representations to Region IV. It is considered that that unit should take steps to provide sufficient transportation for the use of their Staff Duty Officers, rather than to form the habit of calling on this Hq for assistance.

c. The tendency to regard the night duty cars as available for any purpose for which an officer sees fit to request them appears still to be prevalent. If use of this transportation is to be confined to operational needs, such as the transport to their quarters of officers who have been working late, or the picking up or delivery to the airport of officers travelling, it will be necessary to take stronger steps to enforce compliance with the current directives on the subject than are now employed.

1. Reference proposed withdrawal of Allied Garrison of Sardinia, the following points arise:
 - a. Maintenance of American and British personal mail service.
 - b. Maintenance of official mail services.
 - c. Establishment of adequate signal communications, to replace the services now afforded by Allied Garrisons.
2. With the withdrawal of all allied troops (with the exception of ACC) from the island, it will be necessary for mail for American and British personnel to be routed through Southern Region HQ, and at that point transferred to whatever courier service may be established between Naples and Cagliari. (See par 3).
3. Official mail, until now, has been transported by ADLS between Naples and Cagliari. With the departure of all AAF installations from the island, this will no longer be available. An Italian cruiser has been also employed on an alternate-day run between Naples and Cagliari, and the continuance of this operation seems to be by far the best and most satisfactory means of handling official and personal mail.
4. Signals have been handled over the Naples-Cagliari cable, hitherto operated by military personnel. With the departure of all military units, it is understood that the cable will be handed over to the Italian Government. Use may still be made of this signal link, but the question of security arises.
5. It is recommended that steps be taken to secure the services of a British cipher team (2 - 3 men) and the assignment to ACC of a "one-time" cipher, for the handling of traffic between HQ ACC and Region VI. This matter is, I believe, within the scope of the Communications Sub-Commission, and might well be taken up with them, with regard to:
 - a. The assignment of cipher personnel.
 - b. The perfection of arrangements whereby Region VI traffic may be passed from military to Italian channels at either Rome or Naples.
 - c. The arrangement of any necessary details of payment for these services (should the signal facilities used be commercial). 311

1. Reference the attached note from Italian Refugee Branch, the communication in question was received on 29 August, the day delivered to addressee.
2. I conducted a personal check of communications received from 8th Army, which showed the following:

3. We do not maintain a record of the date any particular envelope was mailed from 8th Army; however, a periodic check is made of mail communications with all Regions by sending test letters, a copy of which is attached. The most recent one shows the following: one letter which was received at 8th Army at 1230 on August 12th was received back at 1230 August 17th; a second such letter, received at 8th Army on 13 August 1940 hours was received back at 1500 on 16 August. The second letter had air service, as it was classified "Secret".

4. It has been noticed in the past, and may be seen from the tabulation in Par 2, above, that very frequently correspondence is not dispatched on the date written. Such a delay might account, at least in part, for the apparently excessive transmission time of the refugee report.

5. In reply to the question implicit in Par 1 of 5, Italian Refugee Branch's note, the indicated length of time required for communications from AMG 8th Army to reach this Hq is, on the average, 3-4 days, maximum 5 days, minimum 2 days.



"At or about 1500 hours 19 June 1944, I observed the Alfa Romeo vehicle, Rome License Number 345, parked in front of the building occupied by Headquarters Allied Control Commission in Rome, Italy.

I was with Tec 5 QUATELLA, when he discovered the vehicle parked about one block north of the San Giorgio Hotel at about 1930 hours 19th June 1944. It was occupied by two soldiers and three Italian women. The soldiers were in American uniform bearing a U.S.A.-CANADA shoulder patch, each wore Sergeant chevrons.

We then called a Military Policeman and went over to where the car was parked and asked where they got the vehicle. They replied that they had been in possession of the vehicle since the occupation of Rome. I informed them that a vehicle similar to that one had been stolen and asked them to show proper papers. They replied that they had no paper and that the car was the property of their Commanding Officer. MEMO TO: Colonel Clough

You were out when the officer came back to see you regarding the automobile transaction about which I spoke to you yesterday. In view of the fact that his brigade (Br) moves to a port tomorrow I agreed to what we decided yesterday with some provisos.

The facts are as follows-sometime in November of 1943 in a small town near Campbaesso an AMG officer obtained through requisition a Fiat Car from an Italian doctor. He turned this car over to a lieutenant in the 11 Brigade (Br Inf). There is no record of this transaction at Hq. 11 Brigade nor is the name of the doctor or AMG officer known.

The requisitioned car soon would not run and was left in a garage in the town in which it was requisitioned - no record of what garage. Later on a Lt Young (Br) of 11 Brigade and an interpreter named O. Brunner bought a car of same make and model and salvaged from the requisitioned car certain necessary parts.

This car is at Casserta in a garage. Attached is a receipt for the car. These purchasers of the second car have spent 20 lbs sterling for repairs. This car however needs a new steering apparatus otherwise is ready for use.

The Brigade C.O. required a letter from this Hq before these men left with their outfit, clearing them on the transaction, in view of the fact that they had taken certain parts from the requisitioned car. These parties want to obtain the amount they spent on the car. I told them that we would take over the car, investigate its condition and if after we investigated the car's condition we felt that we could have it reconditioned so as to be able to use it, we would then appraise the value of the car. If we then felt we could refund their money or any part of it we would do so and charge the amount up to repairs on the car. It would then be the property of ACC.

If the doctor who owned the original car called on us for either payment for his car or its return we would be in a position to do so. This seems unlikely to happen in view of the vague records available. They want a letter written to the C.G. 11 Infantry Brigade C.M.F. notifying this organization of the fact that they cleared through ACC. A copy should be sent to Staff Capt 11 British Infantry Brigade C.M.F. and to Signor O. Brunner Hq 28 Infantry Brigade (Br) C.M.F.

If you want me to I will prepare the letter in accordance with above statement and submit it to you for signature.

2. Subject to your approval it is proposed that in this region Projects should be instructed to arrange for accommodation and food to be available for such drivers at prices related to the travelling allowance of 50 lire a day to which, it is understood, drivers are entitled.
3. It is thought that the provision of accommodation and food by A.C.C. is likely to lead to unnecessary complication e.g. Requisitioning, deduction from wages in payment for food and accommodation provided, ration scale for drivers (none at present exists), issue of ration conflicts with civil ration scheme and ration 3088 extra accounting involved for ever diminishing staff, etc. etc.

1. The Excelsior and Vesuvius Hotels having been requisitioned by this Headquarters, are now turned over to you for rehabilitation as use as billets. The Excelsior to be reserved for senior officers of this Headquarters.



3. As a result of this discussion the eligibility clause of the rules and regulations of the Club was amended to read as follows:

"This Club is for the use of officers of the Armed Forces and Merchant Marine of the Allied nations, Warrant Officers of the United States Army and men and women of officer status, in uniform, of the following organizations: American Red Cross, R.M.S.A., U.S. O. and C.Y.W.B."

4. This would seem to make ineligible the people about whom you have inquired.
