- 1. The Chief Accountant, H.Q. Allied Commission, Pinance Subcommission, commenting on the report of the Provincial Finance Officer for Lucca for the month of January, 1945, referred to a letter from H.Q. Allied Commission, reference G4/401/A, dated 8 January 1945, concerning the termination of authorisation to rent motor vehicles and asked the Finance Officer to confirm that the hiring of motor vehicles has now ceased.
- 2. By letter of 16 March 1945 from H.Q. Allied Commission, (Colonel Farkin), reference G4/41/A, it is stated that H.Q. Allied Commission does not feel that expenditures for rented vehicles can be met out of A.F.A. funds, and states that the Allied Commission will not be responsible for claims arising out of rented vehicles.
- 3. This matter is puzzling inamuch as the Regional Commissioners Conference in Rome on Thursday, March 8th, the question of authorisation to hire was brought up and at that time Brigadier Grafftey-Smith indicated that in his opinion there was no insuperable obstacle to the payment of rental for hired cars.
- 4. It is felt that possibly the reluctance to authorise the hiring of cars arises out of the belief

that it is a device to obtain motor transportation over and above that authorised for requisition. This is not the case with A.M.G. Fifth Army. Cars are rented in lieu of requisition and it is thought that this is a more economical and more effective way of procuring motor transport. The fact is that motor vehicles will appear when renting is in prospect but remain hidden when the prospect is requisition.

5. It is requested that this question be re-opened and that permission be granted to rent motor vehicles in lieu of requisition where, in the discretion of the S.C.A.O., of requisition where, in the discretion of the S.C.A.O., rental appears a more economical and more effective means of rental appears a more economical and more effective means of acquiring transportation. This letter is sent pursuant to acquiring transportation between the undersigned and Colonel telephone conversation between the undersigned and Colonel Fiske.




 In accordance with verbal request that this section enumerate advantages and disadvantages of whether civilian vehicles should be made available on a rental basis, the following is submitted;

### a. Advantages.

- Vehicles now kept in hiding by civilians would be offered to AC personnel if price of rental were satisfactory.
- (2) Number of vehicles available would probably increase considerably and better cars would be made available to AMD officers in the forward areas.

## b. Mandvantages:

- (1) Assurate records would be difficult to keep. Hiring would be strictly a Regional affair, but should claims arise about vehicles, such as stolen or having become unroadworthy in the service of AC, claims would be made against AC and this hendquarters would have to deal with them with little or no knowledge of the actual happenings.
- (2) Hiring of vehicles would also limit the use of the vehicle. In principle the vehicle really should not be taken out of province it was hired in. This would not be so if vehicle was requisitioned.
- (3) Hiring also limits the readjusting of vehicle strength; one province or Region may have too many vehicles and

others too little. If vehicle was requisitioned, transfer of vehicle can be made to adjust such conditions.

- (4) Many hired vehicles would have to be made roadworthy by the use of American and British W. D. parts, tires and tubes especially. If at any time vehicle becomes unroadworthy, these same parts would have to be removed, therefore the owner would not receive the vehicle back in the same condition as originally hired by AC.
- (5) Responsibility and proper accountability cannot be placed on any officer if vehicle should be wreaked or stolen, whereas if vehicles are requisitioned, they can be considered W. D. property and treated as such.

3. After careful analysis of advantages and disadvantages, this section feels that the present method of obtaining vehicles (requisitioning) be continued until it is proved that vehicles are not available, in which case immediate steps can be taken for rental of vehicles needed.
