4. The substance of this directive will not be made known to other than personnel who are directly concerned with the issuance of trip tickets and the enforcement of these regulations.

I-- DRIVER'S TRIP TICKETS AND P.M. SERVICE RECORD FORM NUMBER 48

1. Within the theater there is a definite misunderstanding, negligence, or lack of knowledge concerning the proper use of Driver's Trip Tickets and P.M. Service Record (WD Form Number 48).

2. a. Driver's Trip Tickets and P.M. Service Record (WD Form Number 48) will be used as prescribed in paragraph 4a, Chapter 1, TM 9-2510, Motor Vehicle Inspections and Preventive Maintenance Services. These forms will be requisitioned through normal supply channels.

b. The Inspector, driver, and official user of the vehicle will complete in detail, legibly, appropriate parts of this form.

3. Trip Tickets will be issued for one specific trip or detail only. Vehicles making numerous daily trips from depot to depot, port to depot, etc., will be considered as being on one detail for the day; however, each trip will be recorded in the "Trip or Last General" section of the trip ticket.

4. a. Officers will directly supervise the dispatching of vehicles.

b. Great care will be exercised in the selection of dispatchers.

c. Officers issuing recreational trip tickets will be held strictly responsible for the conduct of the person to whom the trip ticket is issued and that the vehicle is used for authorized recreational purposes.

5. These instructions are effective 10 May 1945; Military Police will be instructed to strictly enforce this.

6. Confidential instructions are being issued to each major command to supplement the foregoing.

II-- DISCHARGE OF ENLISTED PERSONNEL 42 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER

1. The following extract of Section I, War Department Circular 125, 25 April 1945, is published for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"a. Enlisted men 42 years of age or over, whose service is honorable, and who voluntarily apply in writing to their immediate Commanding Officers for discharge, will be sent to a separation center for discharge under the provisions of AR 615-365 (Continuance of the Government) and this Circular. Such applicants overseas will be referred to the appropriate separation center in the United States

in excess of rotation quotas.

"b. Military necessity or other requirements or limitations will not be a bar to discharge; however, this authority will not be used in lieu of disciplinary action, nor when discharge under other Army Regulations is appropriate, nor when the individual concerned is under Medical or Surgical treatment.

"c. The provisions of this Circular do not apply to Enlisted Women of the Women's Army Corps".

2. Clearance with State Directors of Selective Service is not required.

3. Commanders exercising discharge authority will maintain accurate records of the number of personnel discharged under this authority.

III- POSTAL REGULATIONS


The first quoted paragraph immediately following the semicolon in paragraph 2 a, MTOUSA Circular 59, 1945, is rescinded and the following inserted in lieu thereof:

"Immediate notice will be given on WD AGO Form 971 to emergency addresses and all correspondents showing the temporary APO number and postmaster assigned, and on WD AGO Form 971-1 to publishers to discontinue mailing publications until further advised of a permanent address. Just prior to departure from the theater the unit mail clerk of the former organization will be advised of the temporary APO number and postmaster assigned, and an NAP Form 11 showing the same information will be completed and mailed."

4. a. Officers will directly supervise the dispatching of vehicles.

c. Officers signing recreational trip tickets will be held strictly responsible for the conduct of the person to whom the trip ticket is issued and that the vehicle is used for authorized recreational purposes.
