INACTIVATION OF THE 1st TRUCK BATTALION, TRUCK OPERATING GROUP, ALLIED COMMISSION (ITALIAN ARMY PERSONNEL)

1. Announcement is made of the inactivation of the 1st Truck Battalion, Truck Operating Group, Allied Commission (Italian Army Personnel) as of 2400 hours this date.
2. This battalion consists of a battalion headquarters and eight companies, designated as 1st to 8th Truck Companies inclusive, of Italian Army Personnel.
3. Allied military personnel will be withdrawn in compliance with Letter, AFHQ, file AG 547/177 CGO-O, Subject "Provision of Personnel for Truck Transport and Maintenance Groups AG", dated 11 July 1945.

SUBJECT: Personnel required to operate additional G.T. Companies and Q.M. Truck Companies.

TO : AFHQ, C-5 (Attention Col. Butterworth).

1. Reference is made to Para. 6b. of Appendix 'C' of AFHQ Log Plans Paper - Log P.164, dated 29 November 1944, and also to our letter AG/Tn/R/1 dated 5 Dec 1944.

2. It is known that 1700 vehicles are due to arrive by phased programme during the next three or four months. It is also known that a requisition for an additional 3000 vehicles has been approved by AFHQ, and it is therefore assumed that these vehicles will materialise at some future date.

3. In order to inaugurate a training ~~exercising~~ programme necessary for the provision of experienced drivers, it is imperative that immediate action be taken to have Allied Commission's Italian ceiling, both A & B, raised.

4. It is proposed by AG, that a proportion of the total of 1700 vehicles should be operated in the following form:-

- a. 8 G.T. Companies of 4 operating Platoons each = 1856 load carrying vehicles.
 b. 16 Q.M. Truck Companies of 50 trucks each = 800 vehicles.

These formations will, therefore, account for 1856 vehicles. The balance of 2,844 vehicles will be operated by civilian organisations.

5. It is requested that personnel necessary for the formation of the 8 G.T. Companies be provided as set forth in War Establishments as follows:

MA/317/1, II/116/2, II/117/2, III/121/3, MA/317/0,
 III/122/1, III/116/2, III/117/2, 121/2, and 122/3.

This will entail the following totals:-

NOTE:- The figure 3344 is arrived at by duplicating the total ORs in view of the fact that the vehicles will operate on a 24-hour basis.

It is also requested that a H.Q., CRASC be provided for the administration of the above transport companies.

6. It is proposed that the G.T. Companies personnel be trained by the British military authorities, and that, when trained and ready for operation, these companies should be placed under AAI for administration and maintenance, being attached to A.C. only for operational purposes.

7. Personnel for the 16 Q.M. Truck Companies will be trained by A.C. at the A.C. school of driving instruction.

8. It is urged that the training of the G.T. Companies personnel by the military authorities commence at the earliest possible moment, and that similarly QM Truck Companies personnel for training by AC be provided immediately in the following

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increments and on the following basis:-

2 Companies by 20 December, 1944

4 Companies on each successive fifteen days.

9. Tools and equipment, including control vehicles, necessary for the training and operation of the above-mentioned GM Truck Companies are listed and requested in our letter AG/TM/R/25 of even date.

TO : Commanding General, Communications Zone, NATOC, APO 750.

1. Authorization has been granted to Allied Control Commission to organize a truck battalion consisting of a Battalion Headquarters and eight (8) Companies, from Italian Army personnel. This battalion will operate in rear of the Fifth Army in the distribution of civilian supplies.
