1. It has become apparent that the whole of the traffic accepted at the POM Conference is not materialising for conveyance. A constant check of British Military despatches shows that these tonnages are being taken up, but detailed figures are not available for other traffics.

A rough check has been made of AC traffic, however, on the basis of the number of wagons reaching ROME northbound over lines 83/90. An average load of 12 tons per wagons has been taken, with the following results :-

2. Over the past ten days at least there has been no shortage of wagons in the south and you are requested to investigate the reasons for the very low tonnages moved.

3. Mov Areas were instructed at the last AQMG (M) Conference to do all possible to assist in the supply of wagons for AC traffic. Although no reports of difficulties have reached this HQ, the above results are not at all satisfactory.

4. It is appreciated that certain statistics will eventually become available under the AC scheme for the rendering of returns of traffic loaded by Station Masters, but these are merely likely to confirm and localise the rough figures quoted above. What is required is action now to achieve movement of the programmed tonnages as soon as possible.

SUBJECT / Establishment of Transportation Officers

TO : Economic Section

1. In accordance with G-1 B/31/2/A of 7 March 45 the ceiling for transportation officers in AC was fixed at 130; this included 121 on TO/WE and 9 Austria officers. Details of the allocations to Transportation Sub-Commission and regions are given at the end of this memorandum. These allocations were not fixed in consultation with this Sub-Commission and were, in fact, directly contrary to what had been recommended; The Regional Commissioners had also requested higher ceilings for transportation officers and since the G-1 British letter was issued have complained verbally and in writing about the number allotted to them.

2. Investigations have shown that even at the present stage when the existing regions are sided by the attachment of officers assigned to northern regions, we are not making full use of the transportation facilities allotted to us. Appendix A gives a copy of a strong letter from AFHQ showing how far we fail to utilize the rail capacities that are allotted to us each week by AFHQ. We have recently set up a new system for recording tonnages passing by rail as compared with that programmed; it is hoped that the first week's figures will be available shortly for the whole of Liberated Italy, but it is probable that they will confirm rather than confute the AFHQ complaint. In addition to this specific complaint, we have received a number of others, both written and verbal; for example a signal was received from Elba where we had failed to utilize the facilities granted. In a letter of 17 March AFHQ submit a strong complaint from the Port Commandant at Brindisi of trouble due to lack of AC supervision. Verbal complaints have been received about the waste of shipping space set up for the movement of charcoal and

In addition to this specific complaint, we have received a number of others, both written and verbal; for example a signal was received from AFHQ dated 15 March about the movement of Italian personnel from Elba where we had failed to utilize the facilities granted. In a letter of 17 March AFHQ submit a strong complaint from the Port Commandant at Prindisi of trouble due to lack of AC supervision. Verbal complaints have been received about the waste of shipping space set up for the movement of charcoal and wine; in this case it was found that the cargoes were not available when the ships arrived at the ports nominated. There have been other complaints too numerous to detail here. It should be explained that civilian traffic competes (at AFHQ POM meetings) with military traffic and both usually have to accept cuts in the bids made. AFHQ sees that AC is not taking up the tonnages allocated to them, they will not unreasonably reduce the allocation to AC and increase the allocation to military services who can use it properly.

3. The Acting Vice President of Economic Section has recently stressed the grave economic situation in Italy and it is realized that transport is in some ways the key to the situation. Ocean-going transport is limited, and we must therefore make the best use of the shipping space allocated to us and we must see that there is no hitch at the ports.

Similarly, for international transport it is absolutely essential that full use should be made of existing road and rail facilities.

4. Consideration of the above factors forces us to the conclusion that most of our failures are due to inadequate supervision in the field. Although we are doing all in our power to allocate the maximum responsibility to the Italian authorities it would appear that these authorities are not competent to see that the best use is made of the capacity given to them unless they have considerable Allied Commission assistance and supervision. We cannot ignore their failures since in the field of transport they have a direct and immediate bearing on the war effort. It is felt that to provide proper supervision of transportation work in the field we should have further officers as shown in the table below. The basis for the calculations has been:

- a. A Regional Headquarters, Transportation Section of at least 3 officers, consisting of a Chief Transportation Officer, a Deputy, and a Motor Maintenance Officer; in addition a Rail or Shipping Officer, in accordance with the geographical location of the Region, and the type of transportation work on which the emphasis lies, or will lie in future regions.
- b. One Transportation Officer per Province.
- c. One Additional Transportation Officer per town of over 500,000 inhabitants.
- d. Additional allocations where AC transportation responsibilities will be particularly heavy, e.g., Genoa.

Executive Commissioner presided.

1. ESTABLISHMENT SECTION

Headquarter Commandant. The following reductions were proposed and Col. Robertson agreed that they could be effected without loss of efficiency:-

Plake put forward a proposal to appoint an officer as Custodian of A.C. Property. SUBJECT: Officer Personnel Requirements

TO : Man Power Commission through Economic Section

1. Arising out of meetings on the 5th and 6th of February, 1945, it is desired to state the situation of this Sub-Commission with regard to specialist officer personnel and in this connection it should be stressed that specialist industrial personnel are essential to the functioning of Industry Sub-Commission and that officers with specialist training only are suitable for the duties which they have to perform and the weighty decisions which they must take, once Northwest Italy is free.

2. It is realised that it will be extremely difficult to obtain from any existing officer-pool the number of specialist officers required. Attached as Appendix A is a list of officers at present engaged at H.Q., A.C. Arising out of meetings on the 5th and 6th of February, 1946, it is desired to state the situation of this Sub-Commission with regard to specialist officer personnel and in this connection it should be stressed that specialist industrial personnel are essential to the functioning of Industry Sub-Commission and that officers with specialist training only are suitable for the duties which they have to perform and the weighty decisions which they must take, once Northwest Italy is free.

1. at this date Displaced Persons and Reparation Sub-Commission hold 55 officers on their books with one officer (Lt. Col. KERR) awaiting re-assignment out of an Establishment of 57 officers.
2. Of the above 55 officers, 6 officers have been earmarked or assigned for Austria. (appendix "A"). Major DUFOUR and Captain YARLEY have actually reported to the Austria Planning Set Up. I understand that further officers will be required for Austria and it is impossible to part with the above or give up more, unless replacements are forthcoming immediately. Camp Commanders require training like other men, and as their duty will be supervising Italian Military personnel it is essential that they be Allied Officers and NOT Civilians.
3. I have now studied in detail my requirements when North West Italy is occupied (Phase I), and the results are shown in appendix "B". (under Phase I) a total of 64 officers.

It will be observed that in Phase I, five Group H.Q. are requested for ten "Centres" (each of 5,000)

They have the additional function of liaison with Military, Region and Provincial Headquarters.

In Phase II they will control a further 12 Centres (each of 5,000) and 20 Frontier Reparation Posts (each of 1,000)

4. For Phase II an extra 26 officers will be required for the 12 additional Centres and 20 Frontier Reparation Posts as shown in appendix "B" (under Phase II)

5. I consider that if these officers cannot be obtained from within the ceiling allowed to the Allied Commission, immediate application should be made to A.F.M.G. for further officers for this very important commitment.

2. Of the above 55 officers, 6 officers have been earmarked or assigned for Austria. (Appendix "A"). Major DUFUR and Captain L. R. R. have actually reported to the Austria Planning Set Up. I understand that further officers will be required for Austria and it is impossible to part with the above or give up more, unless replacements are forthcoming immediately. Camp Commanders require training like other men, and as their duty will be supervising Italian Military personnel it is essential that they be addressed as "Supervisors" and NOT Civilians.

I have now stated in detail my requirements when North West Italy is occupied (Phase I), and the results are shown in appendix "B", (under Phase I) a total of 64 officers.

It will be observed that in Phase I, five Group H.Q. are requested for ten "Centres" (each of 5,000)

They have the additional function of liaison with Military, Region and Provincial Headquarters.

In Phase II they will control a further 12 Centres (each of 5,000) and 20 Frontier Repatriation Posts (each of 1,000)

For Phase II an extra 30 officers will be required for the 12 additional Centers and 20 Frontier Registration Posts as shown in Appendix "B" under Phase II.)

The attached "weekly record" may be useful to you for the Manpower Committee. It shows:

1. G-4 Spare Parts Section indented for no less than 6,059 spare parts last week and received 5,591. Those parts received have to be checked, identified and binned.
2. Regions demanded 4,786 spare parts, of which 1,117 were issued. This happens to be a low figure of "availabilities" during this week.
3. The Accounting Section, under Junior Commander Green, enters each item on a bin card, both on "receipt" and on "issue". There are some 4,000 bin cards maintained in this Section. *Checklist is attached.*
4. Captain Rowlands takes these indents to the Ordnance Depot and sees that they are met, as far as possible, on the spot. (Those for controlled stores he gets counter-signed at Caserta on the way). Our last consignment ten days ago was some five tons of spare parts, and today, Captain Rowlands is escorting five lorry loads of tyres, plus additional spare parts.
5. I should be glad if the Manpower Committee would be good enough to visit this Spare Parts Section at any time and see the work for themselves.
6. *There are some 60,000 spare parts in stock now.*

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Deputy Chief of Staff (Establishment Section), Allied Commission.

1. Since 10 September 1944, the following events have occurred which have greatly increased the work of the 2875th Regiment, and consequently the Establishment Section:

a. The 1st Truck Battalion, 2875th Regiment, was organized 6 October 1944. This battalion will have eight (8) companies which almost double the work of the Adjutant and Personnel Adjutant office of the Regiment. The supplies for this battalion will equal $3/5$ of the present supplies of the Regiment, which means that the S-4 office will very soon require an increase in officer personnel.

b. Most of our supplies for the PX (SS) and the Regiment are required to be hauled from Naples since 25 September 1944, as the supply point here in Rome never have sufficient stock on hand.

c. The records of approximately 300 trucks of the Transportation Sub-Commission have been turned over to the Regimental S-4 office for accountability. I regret to report that an inspection of these records show that they are in very poor shape. A great deal of research will be required by officers who will have to complete the survey for the lost and stolen vehicles.

d. At present, AC Headquarters is undergoing a reorganization which is throwing additional duties on the Establishment Section.

COMMENTS ON THE MANPOWER COMMISSION REPORT

1. There are numerous deficiencies and omissions in this report which I would like to question, however, the following are noted after a superficial reading of his report:

✓ a. I cannot find the Headquarters Company of the 2675th Regiment on the chart. This company should be directly under the Regiment and at no time under the Headquarters Commandant. Nor do I see a breakdown of the personnel required for this Headquarters Company - which has been feeding and housing for some time approximately 500 enlisted men.

✓ b. The plan does not mention maintenance. This is one of the black spots on the record of both ACC and the Regiment. Certainly the Regiment is responsible for the maintenance of War Department vehicles and yet, in the breakdown of the Regiment, there is no mention made of the Motor or Maintenance Officer. Even if the maintenance were to be controlled by the Transportation Sub-Commission, Regimental Headquarters must have a Motor Maintenance Inspector for its own protection.

c. The proposed set-up would place the Regiment under control of a British officer; that is to say, somewhere in the line a British officer would seek to dominate and dictate the policies and interpretations of the Regiment - which is certainly contrary to our Army Regulations. The reason for this statement is in the following: The normal channel of command for the Regiment is to the next higher United States Army Echelon. In administration, the Regiment is not answerable to ACC but to the next higher American authority. We have numerous incidents where ACC has gone outside of the channel of communication in order to secure personnel, awards, property and so forth. In practically every case, higher headquarters have admonished, reprimanded, or disapproved such requests of ACC and stated that the normal channel of communication is through the Regiment. It is a well-known fact that the various companies of the Regiment are constantly being interfered with and that efforts are made to dominate the companies by British officers, with statements that the companies for the Regiment do not amount to anything.

d. It is interesting to note in this so-called Manpower Report that in the reduction of 111 enlisted personnel the Establishment Branch absorbs 105 of this total. Consequently, we are led to believe that the Sub-Commissions apparently will not suffer any loss in enlisted personnel. A detailed chart showing the reduction of the various parts of the Establishment Branch which caused the elimination of 105 enlisted men would be desired in order to see how this would affect the efficient operation of the Regiment and the proposed new set-up. In short, in this report the Regiment seems to have been given the responsibility of doing a job for the Establishment Branch with just one half of the personnel. We cannot countenance such a reduction, coupled with additional responsibilities, unless we can see what decreases have been made in the ACC Establishment Branch.

e. The reorganization of the Establishment Branch, insofar as the head of it and the Commanding Officer of the Regiment were concerned, was given a trial run from December 1943 to 20 March 1944. When the Regiment was split and the Forward Echelon established, Colonel Parkin delegated authority to Colonel Albright to establish and control the Forward Echelon of the Regiment. Colonel Albright himself has stated that it was an impossible job to maintain both positions as Commanding Officer of the Regiment and Establishment Officer. This position of Colonel Albright is certainly established without doubt because upon the arrival of the Regimental Headquarters in Italy on or about the 20th of March the following discrepancies were noted. May I state that these discrepancies in an ordinary Army outfit would cause the instant dismissal and trial by court martial for all concerned who were responsible for these deficiencies.

(1) On 31 December 1943, 151 efficiency reports were mailed to the Forward Echelon. No reply having been received on 25 February 1944, approximately two months later, a tracer was sent asking where these reports were. On 3 March 1944, the tracer was answered, in which it was stated that reports would be forwarded as soon as received. On 25 March 1944, a report was made by the Adjutant concerning the status of efficiency reports as of that date. It must be kept in mind that these reports were to be processed and forwarded on the 10th of January. The Adjutant's Section found that the Rear Echelon had sent forward to higher headquarters 89 efficiency reports. The Forward Echelon had sent forward during the same period a total of 3 efficiency reports. There were found in the files of the Forward Echelon 175 efficiency reports on which nothing had been done since they had left the Rear Echelon on the 31st of December 1943.

(2) The following excerpts from reports of various sections of the Adjutant's office are quoted in order that you may see the terrible condition in which the records of the Forward Echelon were kept:

FILES SECTION: "Upon taking over the files I discovered that no work had been done for a week on the files. Correspondence in the files was incomplete, therefore making much of the correspondence worthless. Much correspondence which should have

been placed in the files was placed in the 201 file of the officer concerned and no copy put in the files, which has, since I have taken over, caused much confusion. I have since discovered that this condition prevailed because of the system of letting anyone file correspondence and giving everyone access to the files."

"While cleaning out the Forward Echelon files, I want to note the finding of the following: Service Records that had been sent to Forward Echelon and had later been inquired about by Rear Echelon, on which we received a reply that they had no record of the Service Record. Correspondence on which no action had been taken (Appointment of EM for Aviation Cadet Training; Letter of request for relief from active duty)."

"The Dewey Decimal System had been set up, but much correspondence was incorrectly filed. There was no particular place for piece of correspondence similar to others. No Secret file was available that I have been able to find. I have found much Secret correspondence in the regular files. The publications were few. Requisitions to secure various NATOUSA, PBS, etc., publications are not to be found."

STRENGTH AND MORNING REPORTS: "Entirely too many headquarters issuing orders placing personnel on a change of status. To enumerate, there were 16 doing this. Namely, as follows: Hq Fwd Ech 2675th Regt ACC, Hq Rear Ech 2675th Regt ACC, Hq ACC, Hq ACC (Rear Links), Hq of Regions 1 to 9 incl, Hq AMG, Hq AMG 5th Army, Hq AMG 8th Army."

"There was no attempt whatever made, in so far as distribution was concerned, of these orders by the latter 12 issuing headquarters to see to it that each company concerned received a copy of these orders. As a result of the above, two companies were reporting the same man as assigned. This was done in 110 cases of the 400-odd men who were transferred to the 2d Replacement Depot recently, and I don't know in how many other cases of officers and enlisted men the same thing happened. (In connection with this, if the 9th MRU submits every other day a strength report of this Regiment to Hq AAI, as the 21st MRU used to do to AFHQ, the strength reported by the MRU to AAI will be incorrect, because they will take this figure from the Co Morning Report)."

"Headquarters Forward Echelon did not exercise enough authority over the companies with regard to correct submission of Morning Reports and all other returns pertaining to strength. This resulted in much confusion at all times, much of which is not straightened out as yet. It appears to me as though it was

thought here that a morning report was something that was made out the first thing in the morning and then forgotten about. As a result, the companies did as they pleased and those at present that have a large strength don't know the exact status of each man in their organization."

"The Commanding Officer Forward Echelon Headquarters Company did not know that the personnel on duty at Salerno were part of his organization. Officers leaving this station permanently or temporarily were not signing the book in Headquarters ACC. The same is true when they returned to this station from duty outside the Headquarters."

ENLISTED MEN'S SECTION: "Many members of this organization had not been paid for a long time and no effort was made to pay these men up in full. Some of them had received partial payments, but this was only for a period of once every three months. This situation is not necessary for finance offices are conveniently located and there are enough clerks to take care of the making of vouchers and payrolls. This error was partly due to unit commanders and clerks who were lax in their responsibilities. As soon as the Forward and Rear Echelons were consolidated into one headquarters, an effort was made by this headquarters to get the enlisted men of its command paid up in full. Unit commanders were contacted and telephone calls were made to all the lax companies in which enlisted men had not been paid in a long time. A sincere effort is now being made to pay up all men of this command in full to the last pay period."

"Another error found in this organization was the inefficiency of index file system on enlisted men. The cards on file were not accurate as to names, grades, serial numbers, and organizations to which enlisted men were assigned or attached. The location of an enlisted man was also difficult to determine, and no record had been kept of where or when an enlisted man had joined another organization for duty or for temporary assignment. This headquarters again has sought to remedy this situation. Personnel and higher headquarters have been contacted, and unit organizations within the command have been notified to submit reports to this headquarters so that an accurate and systematic record can be kept on all enlisted men within this command."

consolidation of offices and Sub-Commissions where possible, consistent
with the present situation".

The Committee examined the reports of all Sections, Sub-Commissions
and Branches of the Allied Control Commission, except those of the Service
Sub-Commissions, and interviewed the heads of such Sub-Commissions and Branches.

The Committee now submits its report.

1. In the opinion of the Committee the present organisation of the
Headquarters of the Commission, although suitable for the initial stages of
the amalgamation of AMG 15 Army Group and the Allied Control Commission, has,
by the experience of the last seven months, entailed certain redundancy of
work and personnel which, now that the Headquarters are concentrated in one
place and in view of the present situation, could and should be avoided.

In accordance with the terms of reference laid down by the Acting Chief Commissioner, viz.,

"To consider the re-organisation of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission, with the mission of making the greatest possible number of Officers and EM/ORs available for field assignments and with a view to securing optimum efficiency with the most economic employment of available manpower. Consideration will be given to effecting the elimination of all activities not absolutely required for the accomplishment of the mission of the Allied Control Commission, and also to the consolidation of offices and Sub-Commissions where possible, consistent with the present situation".

The Committee examined the reports of all Sections, Sub-Commissions and Branches of the Allied Control Commission, except those of the Service Sub-Commissions, and interviewed the heads of such Sub-Commissions and Branches.

The Committee now submits its report.

1. In the opinion of the Committee the present organisation of the Headquarters of the Commission, although suitable for the initial stages of the amalgamation of AMC 15 Army Group and the Allied Control Commission, has, by the experience of the last seven months, entailed certain redundancy of work and personnel which, now that the Headquarters are concentrated in one place and in view of the present situation, could and should be avoided.

2. In the opinion of the Committee the existence of four parallel Sections and several independent Sub-Commissions, all having direct channels to the Chief Commissioner, has placed on him too heavy a burden of administrative detail. Furthermore, there appears to have been confusion of thought and practice with regard to the channel of command.

3. In order to overcome these difficulties the Committee recommends the institution of an Office of the Chief of Staff in the line of command from the Offices of the Chief Commissioner (and his Deputy) and the Sections and

and Service Sub-Commissions.

4. The Committee recommends the abolition of the Section now called Regional Control and Military Government Section and the setting up, under the Chief of Staff, of four Sections, the heads of which will be equivalent to Deputy Chiefs of Staff, viz:-

Civil Affairs Section
Economic Section
Political Section
Establishment Section

5. The Committee recommends that the Civil Affairs Section shall deal with those functions now operated by the Administrative Section together with the Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee Branch, and the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, now dealt with by the present R.G. & M.G. Section: that the Economic Section be responsible for its present Sub-Commissions and in addition the Communications Sub-Commission and the Property Control Sub-Commission: the Political Section to remain with its present functions: the Establishment Section to deal with the matters now dealt with by the same Branch of the R.G. & M.G. Section, with the exception of domestic transport and the Message Centres: the Regions for command purposes and the Army AMG's for functional purposes to depend from the Chief of Staff.

6. In view of the present military situation and the distance of AAI HQ, and Army AMG's, and in the future the Northern Regions, from Rome, the Committee recommends the establishment at AAI HQ of a Deputy Chief of Staff (Forward). This officer, with a small staff representative of the Sections, will administer to the immediate needs of the Army AMG's and Forward Regions.

7. Channels to the Chief Commissioner from the Sections will be through the Chief of Staff: from the Regions and Army AMG's through the relevant Deputy Chief of Staff to the Chief of Staff. Communications from the Service

the Patriots Branch, Italian Refugee Branch, and the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, now dealt with by the present R.C. & M.G. Section: that the Economic Section be responsible for its present Sub-Commissions and in addition the Communications Sub-Commission and the Property Control Sub-Commission: the Political Section to remain with its present functions: the Establishment Section to deal with the matters now dealt with by the same Branch of the R.C. & M.G. Section, with the exception of domestic transport and the Message Centres: the Regions for command purposes and the Army AMG's for functional purposes to depend from the Chief of Staff.

6. In view of the present military situation and the distance of ALI HQ, and Army AMG's, and in the future the Northern Regions, from Rome, the Committee recommends the establishment at ALI HQ of a Deputy Chief of Staff (Forward). This officer, with a small staff representative of the Sections, will administer to the immediate needs of the Army AMG's and Forward Regions.

7. Channels to the Chief Commissioner from the Sections will be through the Chief of Staff: from the Regions and Army AMG's through the relevant Deputy Chief of Staff to the Chief of Staff. Communications from the Service Sub-Commissions (Naval, Army and Air Force), will be through the Chief of Staff to the Chief Commissioner.

8. The Committee recommends that a change in nomenclature is desirable in the title of the Administrative Section in order to describe the proper functions of that Section, and to remove confusion of thought, especially among other military organizations, which has arisen from its present title. The Committee considers that the title "Civil Affairs Section" best describes its functions. The Committee also recommends a change in title of the Interior

Sub-Commission to Local Government Sub-Commission.

9. In order to avoid confusion which might arise from other changes of title, the Committee recommends that the following titles be adopted:-

Chief Commissioner.
 Deputy Chief Commissioner.
 Joint → Chief of Staff and Vice President.
 Deputy Chief of Staff and Vice President, Civil Affairs Section.
 Deputy Chief of Staff and Vice President, Economic Section.
 Joint Vice Presidents, Political Section.
 Deputy Chief of Staff and Director, Establishment Section.

The Committee recommends that the Director of the Legal Sub-Commission shall also carry the title of Chief Legal Adviser to the Chief Commissioner.

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organisation, the Committee recommends the changes, amalgamations and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached.

11. The plan of the re-organisation recommended is defined graphically on the attached chart (Appendix "A").

12. The most important changes are:-

- (a) the absorption by the Chief of Staff of the Secretary General's Office;
- (b) the absorption by the Public Relations Branch of the Information Division and Archivist;
- (c) the amalgamation of the Public Safety Sub-Commission and the Security Branch to be called Public Safety Sub-Commission;
- (d) the transfer from the Public Health Sub-Commission of the Medical Supply Branch to the Warehousing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission;
- (e) the absorption by the Finance Sub-Commission of the Property Control

10. Subject to approval of the above basic change in organisation, the Committee recommends the changes, amalgamations and reductions in the Headquarters Staff of the Allied Control Commission shown in Appendix "B" attached on the attached chart (Appendix "A").
11. The plan of the re-organisation recommended is defined graphically on the attached chart (Appendix "A").
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 - (b) the absorption by the Public Relations Branch of the Information Division and Archivist;
 - (c) the amalgamation of the Public Safety Sub-Commission and the Security Branch to be called Public Safety Sub-Commission;
 - (d) the transfer from the Public Health Sub-Commission of the Medical Supply Branch to the Warehousing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission;
 - (e) the absorption by the Finance Sub-Commission of the Property Control Sub-Commission;
 - (f) the re-organisation of the Transportation Sub-Commission amalgamating therewith the Warehousing Branch of the Food Sub-Commission, the Petrol Section of the Commerce Sub-Commission and the Medical Supply Branch of the Public Health Sub-Commission;
 - (g) the incorporation of the Headquarters transport pool in the Transportation Sub-Commission;
 - (h) the amalgamation of the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the Italian Refugee Branch, to be called Displaced Persons and Refugee Sub-Commission;

(1) the reorganization of the Establishment Branch, to be called Establishment Section;

(3) the abolition of the War Material Disposal and Italian POW Sub-Commission and the absorption of its functions as follows:-

(1) War Material Disposal by Industry Sub-Commission;

(ii) Italian POW by Army Sub-Commission.

13. In considering the amalgamation of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the Italian Refugee Branch, the Committee has recommended reductions in the field as well as in HQ.

14. The Committee, at your request, reconsidered its original recommendation made in its interim report that the Communications Sub-Commission should come under the Economic Section. The Committee fully appreciates the unique position of this Sub-Commission and its responsibility for civil censorship. Nevertheless, the Committee maintains its recommendation that this Sub-Commission should be absorbed into the Economic Section. If you do not agree to this proposal, the Committee recommends that it be placed in the same position as the Service Sub-Commissions. See para 15.

15. The Committee fully appreciates the special position of the Service Sub-Commissions, who are under the operational command of their respective service commanders, but considers that channels of communication to the Chief Commissioner on Allied Control Commission matters should be through the Chief of Staff.

16. In considering the re-organization of the Establishment Branch the Committee was influenced by the peculiar position of the Headquarters of the 2675th Regiment established by NATOUSA. The position has caused much confusion and redundancy of work and personnel. The Committee therefore strongly

14. The Committee, at your request, made in its interim report that the Communications Sub-Commission should come under the Economic Section. The Committee fully appreciates the unique position of this Sub-Commission and its responsibility for civil censorship. Nevertheless, the Committee maintains its recommendation that this Sub-Commission should be absorbed into the Economic Section. If you do not agree to this proposal, the Committee recommends that it be placed in the same position as the Service Sub-Commissions. See para 15.

15. The Committee fully appreciates the special position of the Service Sub-Commissions, who are under the operational command of their respective service commanders, but considers that channels of communication to the Chief Commissioner on Allied Control Commission matters should be through the Chief of Staff.

16. In considering the re-organization of the Establishment Branch the Committee was influenced by the peculiar position of the Headquarters of the 2675th Regiment established by NATOUSA. The position has caused much confusion and redundancy of work and personnel. The Committee therefore strongly recommends that the Director of the Establishment Section should be the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, provided that the Director is an American officer. If this can be done the amalgamation of C-1(A) and C-4(A) of HQ ACC with the HQ staff of the 2675th Regiment will be possible. This will make a balanced, economical and practical organization for the Section. The Committee realizes that the approval for this change will have to be obtained from NATOUSA and recommends that representations should be made as soon as possible.

17. The Committee has taken into account the Allied civil officials now serving with the Allied Control Commission: it recommends that the introduction of any further Allied civilian staff should be in substitution of officers now holding the posts who will then be available for services in the field.

18. Certain re-organisation in the Economic Section is still under consideration by the Vice President (vide 12(e) above) and will affect the final figures in Appendix "B". The Committee has thought it wise not to wait for the conclusion of these considerations.

19. The Committee recommends that a standing Committee be maintained for the periodic review of the organisation and internal administration of the Allied Control Commission.

20. The Committee wishes to record its appreciation of the invaluable work performed by the Secretary, Lieut. Colonel J.L. Jones.

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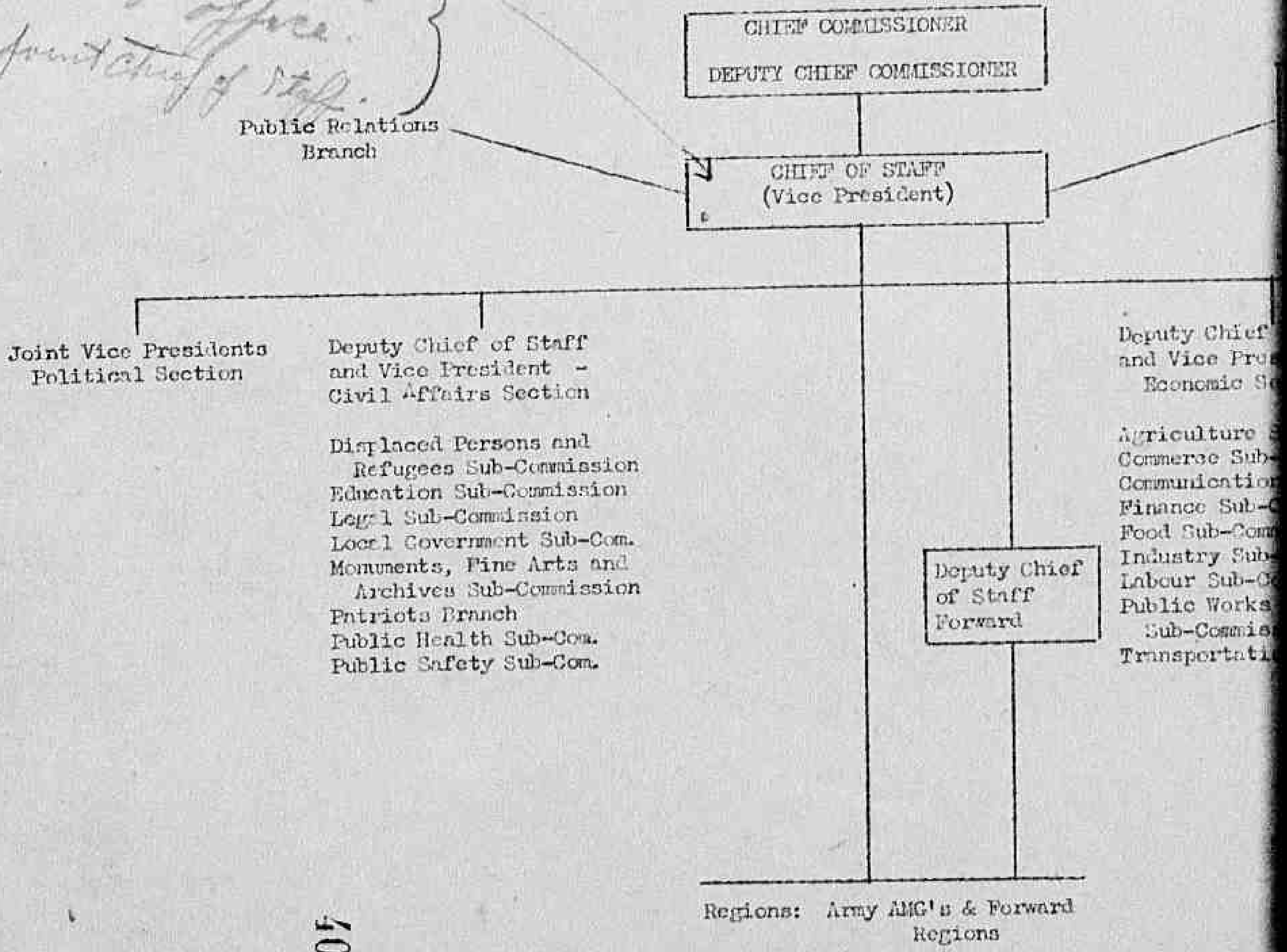

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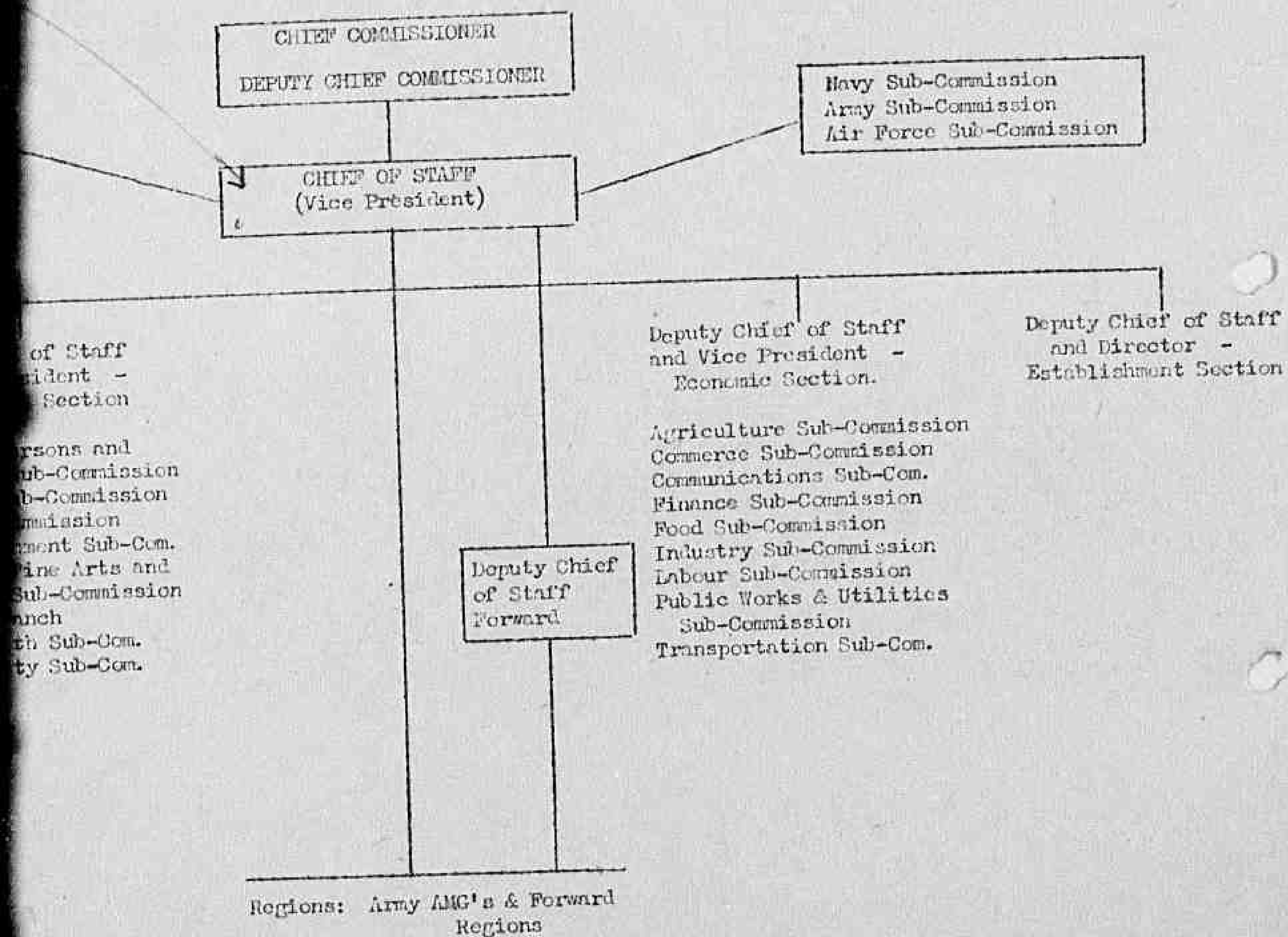
