

My dear Prigadier, 4 December 1945.

Since the departure of Colonel Foletti and his able assistant Capt. Neufeld from this Region I find that the backing of American Officers in certain directions has gone 'somewhat by the board'. This is due, I feel, to some extent to the long absences from Milan of Colonel Fiske and to some further extent to the unfamiliarity of Colonel Falck with general American administrative details.

This seems particularly so in the matter of advancement in rank of certain American Officers with whose interests, equally with British personnel, I am concerned.

I wonder, therefore, if through your good offices the case of a number of the more deserving could be taken up with Admiral Stone. I have given the names of the officers I have in mind below. Recommendations, rendered to the best of my belief in the proper form, have gone forward some months past to HQ 2675 Regt. None of these officers can be classed as surplus and will, therefore, be retained for the further six months as indicated in the cable received very recently from HQ on the subject of the retention of certain American Civil Affairs Officers.

Major Savin, my Provincial Commissioner in Sondrio, whose name is included, is spending a few days in Rome and I have instructed him to put his own case before you if you so wish. The others concerned being in very much the same position, so far as their anticipation of advancement, as is Major Savin's.

I regret troubling you again on this subject but I really feel that the interests of these officers at this juncture may be better served from Rome than from this end and I shall be greatful for anything you may be prepared to do on their behalf:

- 1. Your letter RIX/SE/P/G/5 dated 19 June 1945, relative to the promotion of Major Francis J. Burns, addressed to the Chief Commissioner was referred to this office for reply.
- 2. It is regretted that no promotions can be made at the present time. This is in compliance with a War Department order dated 10 May 1945, and let Indorsement thereto by Coneral McMarney dated 19 May 1945, which temporarily suspended promotions until further notice.

It is true that a number of promotions have been made but these all had been pending at AFHC for a considerable length of time. With respect to Captain Neufeld, recommendation for his promotion should be before our board at the next meeting. There are two or three items with respect to the Captain

There are two or three items with respect to the Captain which I think you should know. There are approximately 109 other american captains in the AC/AMG organization who are senior to Neufeld in point of length of service as captain. Neufeld was promoted to grade of captain on 30 September 43. He, therefore, has less than 17 months in grade and with 109 captains having more time in grade, I suspect the Board will insist on having a good reason why this officer should be preferred to the senior captains.

Another point is that AFHC recently returned a number of recommendations on the ground that the position which the officer occupied did not justify the grade for which he was recommended. A recent compilation of officers assigned to Lombardia Region carries Captain Neufeld as Personal Assistant to the Recional Commissioner. While I have no idea what his position is as shown on the recommendation, I am of the opinion that MTOUSA will never agree to the promotion to the grade of major on position of Personal Assistant to a Regional Commission.

I understand that the captain's recommendation will be before the Board at its next meeting, at which time we willbe informed as to how many recommendations for the grade of major can be sent forward. I am sure that the Board will give Neufeld proper consideration along with some 30 to 40 other captains who have been recommended all of whom are senior to Neufeld. You can rest assured that I will not permit his recommendation to be overlooked.

- 1. With the cessation of hostilities in Europe, a reduction in the Mar Department troop basis will follow. 



: Commanding General, MIOUSA, through channels.

- 1. Capt. Willis E. PRATT, 0-521390, and Capt. Sam V. NOE, 0-521655, were recommended for promotion by the Promotions Board of A.C. in February, 1945, and their names were submitted to AFHQ on 21 March, 1945. Their names, with others, were returned to the Promotions Board, A.C., on 18 April, on account of the overstrength of A.C. in number of Majors according to the new T.O.
- 2. It is submitted that a serious injustice has been done to these men, and that the offectiveness of their work is thereby diminished.
 - 3. The injustice is indicated by the following facts:
 - a) Of the 54 captains premoted to majorities since 15 December, 1944, 34 have been junior to Captains PRATT and NOE.
 - b) On the list of captains submitted on the same list with them on 21 March, the captain who was promoted was slightly junior to them - not senior.
 - c) The large majority of captains presented to major since 15 December, 1944, held positions of less responsibility - as follows:

CAD'BI 5 Legal Officers (not Regional heads) Frovincial Legal Officers Provincial Agricultural Officers Public Health Officers (not Regional heads) Public Safety Officers (not Regional heads) Provincial Public Safety Officers Provincial Supply Officers Miscellaneous - (Adjutant, Merehouse director, P.W. Staff O. Co. Hq. Comdts, By Trans.O, Insurance G, Ass't Prop. Cant. 0, oto.) Total, at least 33 out of 54.

d) Among the 54 captains promoted to major since 15 December only five are listed as serving with 5 or 8 Army. Capt. PRATT is 5 and 8 Army Education Officer and Capt. MOE 5 Army Education Officer. Both men have been operating in Army and Corps areas. This is in addition to their responsibility as Regional Education 4182Officers.

- e) Of Regional Staff Officers in AMG regions, 72 are majors, lieutement colonels, or colonels. Of the 18 company grade Regional Officers, 13 are junior to Captains NOE and PRATT.
- 4. The responsibilities of Regional (and Army) Education Officers involve population control of about one-fifth of the population, responsibility for the bulk of the public property, and responsibility for by far the largest number of civil servants handled by any division of ANG.
- 5. The effectiveness of the work of those two Regional Education Officers is hampered by their lack of rank for the following reasons:
 - a) The Italian civilian officials with whom they deal (Rectors of Universities, Proveditori agli Studi, etc.) have civil service grades corresponding to anny ranks higher than those of the Regional Education Officers, are acutaly conscious of army rank, and cannot have adequate respect for officers who are not recognized by their own army as worthy of higher rank.
 - b) The other Regional officers with whom the Regional Education Officers have to deal on terms of equality are almost all of field grade.
 - a) The effect on the morale of these two officers is scute, and has seriously affected the health of one, and the enthusiasm for his work of the other.
- 6. There is no question as to the merit of both officers. They have been recommended in the highest terms by their Regional Commissioner and SCAO's. This Subcommission considers their work to be of the highest quality they are intellegent, resourceful, efficient, energetic, responsible and Loyal.
- 7. It is submitted that had the above facts been taken into due consideration, these officers would have been promoted before the present calling was placed on number of majors in the 4.0.
- 8. It is suggested that they be promoted to the rank of major as of 17 April, 1945, the date on which another captain (Henry HUDSON) whose name appeared on the same list of recommendations from A.C. was promoted, despite the fact that he was alightly junior to them in time in grade and holds a position of less responsibility.
- 9. If the suggestion in paragraph 8 cannot be followed it is recommended that some other means be found and that in these two highly exceptional cases immediate promotion be granted.



SUBJECT: Promotions

To : Regional Commissioner, Toscana Region

- addressed to Brigadier M. S. Lush, C.B., C.B.K., M.C., Chief of Staff, Allied Commission, concerning the premotions of U.S. officers. The allegations which you make are of a very serious nature, reflecting on the integrity and/or administrative efficiency of senior American officers of the Commission who deal with premotions. I shall see to it that an exhaustive investigation is conducted and every conceivable effort made to ascertain the facts.
- 2. It appears that these allegations are six in number:
- a. That promotions are manipulated in favor of officers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotions.
- b. That practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted without regard for the comparative importance of his position.
- c. That practicully every officer in the Legal Subcommission has been promoted.
- d. That certain regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a region have been promoted out of proportion to promotions in regions actually functioning as such.
- promotions are sidetracked because the promotion recommendations are lost at the Headquarters of the Commission.
- f. That a promotion lobby exists at Headquarters Allied Commission which is operated to the disadvantage of Toscana Region, which does not have such a lobby.

(Promotions - Ref/11/Est, 22 Feb. 45, Cont'd.)

- 5. It is my earnest desire that all of the facts bearing on the above allegations may be adduced. I should, therefore, be grateful to you if you would provide me with factual evidence on which the allegations are based and with all pertinent supplemental information in your possession which will aid in the investigation.
- 4. As you are no doubt aware, recommendations for promotions of U.S. officers are passed upon by a board of officers at Headquarters of the Commission, consisting of myself and the following: Colonel Parkin, Executive Officer, U.S. and Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Colonel Chapman, Director, Public Safety Subcommission and Senior U.S. Officer at Headquarters of the Civil Affairs Section; Colonel Densmore, Chief Staff Officer, Economic Section and sometimes Acting Vice President, Economic Section. In order to set some limit to the scope of the investigation, I propose that it be confined to the period of the last five months, which is to say, from 19 September 1944, on which date I was appointed Director, Establishment Branch, in addition to other duties, to the present.
- 5. The officers concerned are most desirous that the investigation be full and complete and that the facts, with respect to the six allegations, be established beyond any reasonable doubt. I trust, therefore, that you will be specific and detailed in the evidence you supply and the information you furnish.

Dear Brigadier,

- 1. The manner in which the promotions of American officers has been handled in HQ. AC has caused much dissatisfaction among American officers in the field. There appears to be ample reason to believe that promotions are manipulated in Tavor of the conficers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotion. First, practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted, regardless of the comparative importance of his position. Then, too, practically every officer in the Legal Sub-Commission has been promoted. Also certain Regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a Region, have been promoted out of proportion to the promotions in Regions actually functioning as such.
- 2. As an example of an unaccountable promotion, Major (now Lt. Col.) Curry CARTER has, with the exception of a very short time, been doing duty in my Region either as an assigned or attached officer for more than six months. I have not recommended him for promotion. His work while quite satisfactory does not compare either in importance or in quality with that of at least three Heads of Divisions, and one Provincial Commissioner, in TOBCANA Region who have been recommended but not promoted. Moreover, he has not had as long a time in grade as either of the three Majors (two Heads of Divisions and one Provincial Commissioner) recommended by me for promotion.
- 5. One of the usual causes of sidetracking promotions is losing the recommendation in HQ. AC. This has happened several times. One must conclude that this is done either wilfully or through gross inefficiency.
- 4. The officers of this Region are fully occupied with their duties in the provinces and at Region Headquarters. This Region has not and cannot maintain a promotion lobby at HQ. AC. It must depend upon HQ. AC to look after its interests. This appears not to have been done.

5. Among other promotions recommended but not acted upon are the following most deserving cases:



MEMORANJUM:

To : Colonel C. M. Parkin.

- 1. Reference the basic communication, it should be remembered by Colonel Jenny that promotions are in the channels of command and that the processing of promotions as laid down in ACC Establishment Memorandum No. 10, dated 25 March 19kk, clearly defines the steps which are to be taken. I see no reason why this should be changed and concur heartily in the 1st Indorsement of the Economic Section.
- 2. Your attention is invited to Par. 2 in the basic communication wherein Colonel Jenny in effect is criticizing the highest American authority in the Allied Commission when he censures the promotion of two lieutenant colonels. It seems to me to be cuite out of place for a subordinate officer to criticize the integrity and the judgment of his superiors when it is obvious that the Promotion Board of the Allied Commission is not influenced by personal considerations.
- 3. Reference Par. 5, I most emphatically disagree with the recommendation that ratings, i.e. efficiency reports, be made out by the heads of sub-commissions for those in the regions. The Regional Commissioner or his Executive must be regarded as being in the same category as a Battallion Commander. Colonel Jenny's position is that of a Staff Officer. The reports from the regions by officers who are in intimate daily contact with their subordinates are far more precise than they would be if rendered by a remote headquarters. Furthermore, imagine the delay in the rendition of efficiency reports if they would have to be siphoned through the various Sub-Commissions!
- He Reference Par. 6, again this is a most flagrant criticism of higher authority in its promotion policy. Colonel Jenny says: "We do not think he was entitled to a promotion and cannot understand on what basis the recommendation for promotion was made." If the plural personal pronoun in reality means Colonel Jenny, why doesn't he so state? If he would make inquiry, he could find out or be told the basis for the recommendation for the promotion.
- 5. I think it's about time Colonel Jenny realized that there is a higher authority in this headquarters than the Director of the Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission.





- 2. It is considered that officers assigned to Regions should in fact be under the command of the Regional Commissioner for all purposes except certain technical instructions from the Sub-Commissions and that centralization with respect to promotion recommendations will undermine the position of the Regional Commissioner. Suggested change would violate the basic principle of a command function, that is, recommendations for promotions of officers.
- 3. It is submitted that if contacts between negional Commissioners and Pirectors of Sub-Commissions are frequent and working relations on a 100% cooperative basis the situation complained of would not present itself.



1. As suggested by you at our conference on the evening of 10th of Jan. 1945, I wish to submit the following recommendation:

> Promotion recommendation of Technical Regional Officers should be approved by the respective Sub-Commissions before action is taken. by A.C.

- 2. On several occasions in the past recommendations were made by Regional Commissioners to promote Regional Engineers without the knowledge of Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission. Recently an extremely embarrassing situation has arisen when two Regional Engineers, Lieutenant-Colonels, were promoted to Colonels without the knowledge or approval of this Sub-Commission and at a time when the promotion of the Director of the Sub--Commission still was pending.
- 3. It is recommended that a procedure be set up whereby all recommendations for promotion of Technical Officers in the various Regions, when they arrive at this Headquarters, be automatically referred to the appropriate Sub-Commission for concurrence before action is taken at this Headquarters. Likewise, if the Sub-Commission recommends one of its Regional Officers for promotion, such recommendation should be submitted to the Regional Commissioner for concurrence before action is taken.
- We believe that we are in a far better position to judge the merits of the services of our Technical Officers in the field than is the Regional Commissioner.
 - 5. It is also recommended that the rating given to

> Regional Engineer Officers be submitted to this Headquarters for concurrence, or modification if we do not agree.

6. We are particularly perturbed about the promotion of one of the Lieut-Colonels who, in our opinion, should not have been promoted. In the first place he has not been doing any active work for many months, being assigned to an inactive Region. Furthermore, we do not think he was entitled to a promotion and cannot understand on what basis the recommendation for promotion was made. The principal point in his favor was "time in grade".

Difficulty in transferring Engineers from one Region to another.

7. It is our responsibility to assign Regional Engineers to forward regions when required. Since we are short of officers. It is necessary to draw upon rear regions and in many cases to handicap those regions to some extent by assigning what we consider the best available offider at the time the request is made. Very frequently we find Regional Commissioners cojecting to the transfer and the officer is not transferred with the result that the forward region does not get the personnel required. This, too, needs correction and Regional Commissioners of rear regions should be given to understand that forward active regions have first call on officers when they are urgently needed.

As I stated to you the other day the American Promotion Board has not passed any recommendations from the grade of captain to major since your original talk with me prior to your trip home. It is true that a number of promotions have been made but these all had been pending at AFHO for a considerable length of time. With respect to Captain Neufeld, recommendation for his promotion should be before our Poard at the next meeting.

There are two or three items with respect to the Captain which I think you should know. There are approximately 109 other describes captains in the AC/AMG organization who are senior to Neufeld in point of length of service as captain. Neufeld was promoted to grade of captain on 30 September 43. He, therefore, has less than 17 months in grade and with 109 captains having more time in grade, I suspect the Board will insist on having a good reason why this officer should be preferred to the senior captains.

Another point is that AFHC recently returned a number of recommendations on the ground that the position which the officer occupied did not justify the grade for which he was recommended. A recent compilation of officers assigned to Lombardia Region carries Captain Neufold as Personal Assistant to the Recional Commissioner. While I have no idea what his position is as shown on the recommendation, I am of the opinion that MTOUSA will never agree to the promotion to the grade of major on position of Personal Assistant to a Regional Commission.

I understand that the captain's recommendation will be before the Board at its next meeting, at which time we willbe informed as to how many recommendations for the grade of major can be sent forward. I am sure that the Board will give Neufeld proper consideration along with some 30 to 40 other captains who have been recommended all of whom are senior to Neufeld. You can rest assured that I will not parmit his recommendation to be overlooked.





- 1. Regional Commissioner, ABRUZZI-MARCHE Region, has discovered that the recommendation for the promotion of Lt. Col. CCHEN was signed by Lt. Col. LATIMER, dated June 1944 and forwarded to this Hq in October 1944.
- 2. It Col LATIMER was, in both June and October 1944, the Regional Public Works Officer. In June 1944 he was not in any sense senior American efficer in the region since there was an American Regional Commissioner, either Colonel WHITLEY or Colonel MARSHALL.
- 3. In October 1944 it is possible that Lt Col LATIMER was, so far as grade is concerned, the senior American officer in the region. Even so it seems undesirable for a specialist officer in that capacity to recommend for promotion a specialist officer in another branch without consulting either the Regional Commissioner or the Executive Officer.
- 4. No inquiry was ever addressed to this sub-commission on the subject of promotion.
- 5. It might be desirable to bring these facts to the notice of the relevant authorities so that they may prevent a recurrence of the present unsatisfactory situation.



- I refer to letter ES/37 dated 18 3ep 44, addressed to you by Econ Sec. I entirely agree with the statements made in pares 2 & 3 thereof. To my own knowledge 2 legal officers "fell between two stools" owing to transfer from one Region to another at a vital moment. At the same time it is only fair to say that G 1 has kept in close touch with Sub-Commissions in the Admin Sec over the relative merits of specialist officers in the field.
- I think the perfectly justifiable complaints of Econ Sec would be met if Directors of Sub-Commissions were permitted to put in recommendations for promotions in cases even of specialist personnel assigned to Armies or Regions where they are satisfied that a man should be promoted but might be passed over for one reason or another (eg. transfer from one Region to another at short intervals so that the Regional Commissioner has not sufficient data to go on) and the Director is satisfied that an injustice would be done by a recommendation not being put in.
