My dear Colonel,

I have your letter of 28 July reporting your action on my 13C/AMG/102 requesting assignment of specific officers.

Before proceeding to cases, I wish to express to you and all concerned my appreciation of your prompt and for the most part definite disposition of my requests. Whatever else may be said about it, you have let us know what to expect and for this we are grateful.

Knowing that you have carefully considered all cases, and that wherever you are unable to furnish us with an officer requested there must have been good reason for your refusal, I desire to make only the following comments:

OFFICERS - AMERICAN

Par. 4 On principle, because of the peculiar character of this territory and our position as "trustees", I dislike any arrangements which overlap the western boundary of Venezia Giulia. There is not a great deal of Monuments and Fine Arts work here, and I should prefer, if and when he is available, the assignment of one officer full time, even though he might be withdrawn after six or eight weeks, by which time I would assume the important part of his job would be completed. I do not press this point.

Par. 14 If Capt. Ault is a reclamation expert it is only by reason of his experience in Emilia Region last winter. As a matter of fact, he is just a plain, good officer who will do any job well because he is

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intelligent and works at it. I desired to have him for the express purpose of rehabilitating the fishery and forestry industries in this area, both of which have a direct and important bearing on its economy. This is particularly true of fisheries, increased activity in which can go far toward relieving the American and British governments of the burden of importing practically every item of foodstuff required. Ault is just the man for the job and if I can't have him I must have a live wire "doer". Just any agricultural officer will not do.

Par. 20 I don't want Major Steadman. He has served under me before, and trying him again would not be satisfactory either to me or to him. He is the only substitute you mention whom I definitely don't want.

Par. 26 Natale I also particularly desired for a specific purpose--the reconstruction and rehabilitation of Pola, which is similar in many ways to Rimini, in which he operated with such great success last winter. This is a special job calling for a special kind of experience and personality which Natale has. If he cannot come here to do it, there really is no one else in Public Works and Utilities Sub-Commission who can take his place, and I shall probably give up the Pola project as such.

If Venezia can possibly do with another officer, I should appreciate getting Natale. .

Pars. 27, 28, 29, 30 This will reach you after August 4th and I hope that Lummus, Schmitt, Barnes and Borden will be available and on orders. Lummus I particularly desire for Trieste City to replace Col. Kucera whom I expect shortly to send up to Gorizia which was his original destination. The other officers are also needed.

#### OFFICERS - BRITISH

Par. 2 We are prepared, in order to get Tomkins, Willis, and Eddings, to release three other British police officers. My deputy, Colonel Robertson, will be in

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Rome in a day or two and will give you the names.

AMERICAN ENLISTED MEN


Please place the available enlisted men on orders to us at once. We are in very great need of their administrative and clerical assistance in order to get our housekeeping into proper shape as soon as possible.

As I stated above, Colonel Robertson will be in Rome next week. His primary mission will be to discuss the matter of the new proposed table of organization (war establishment) for this operation, but I have also discussed the matters set forth in this letter with him and he will call on you and elaborate on them.

I hope that you will also participate in the discussions of the proposed war establishment. We must presumably look forward to the day when Allied Commission and possibly even your regiment may disappear, but this headquarters remain. At that time provision must be made on the American as well as on the British side for the procurement of personnel, and particularly the trained and specially qualified personnel needed to do this job right. It seems to me that this is not a matter which can be solved by the provision of a British war establishment alone, but some similar provision must likewise be made on the American side.

Reference letter order Headquarters Command Allied Force, dated 27 June, subject: Orders (156 June) detailing officers on DS with University Training Command and telephone conversation Mitchell to Parkin this date. Mitchell stated that Maj Gen Nelson agreed that eleven of the twenty two officers would report at once and that the 66-1s would be searched to provide eleven more officers if available.

2. The following is a list of the eleven officers retained with reasons set opposite their names as to why they are not available:

Lt Col E.P. Morton is the Liaison Officer at Palermo, Sicily. By direction of AFHQ, the Liaison Office is to be maintained in Sicily and a suitable replacement for Col Morton on that job is not available.

Lt Col H. Spencer is the Regional Sanitation Officer for Lombardia Region. Because of the continuous and drastic reduction in Public Health specialist officers, there is no other officer available to take his place and certainly none as well qualified.

Major E.J. Curran is a Food Officer at Headquarters Allied Commission and is responsible for the coordination of the transportation of food and the processing of transportation requests by the Italian authorities.

Major T.R. Fisher is the Labor Officer for Liguria Region. At no time in the past year and a half have there been enough Labor Officers. Additional Labor Officers are required at present to handle the increasingly difficult labor problems in the North.

Major G.R. Koopman  
Major J. Lund are Provincial Officers in Piemonte and Lombardia Regions respectively. Capable Provincial Commissioners are difficult to find and these two Majors are doing excellent jobs in Lieutenant Colonels' vacancies.


My dear Colonel,

Banning occupies a position of Deputy Chief Accountant and is the Senior American Officer in the Allied Commission Accounting Department. His knowledge and experience in United States Government procedure are indispensable to the Allied Commission. The Finance Adviser, G-5 A F H Q, has knowledge of his activities in the United States.

Major James M. Merritt, 0268972, is the Senior American Officer in the Agriculture Sub-Commission, Allied Commission. He is presently in the United States on a special mission concerning the Italian Import Program. This program is of much importance in view of the recent liberation of Northern Italy. Plans and Operations, which he is to return with for the economic rehabilitation in the agricultural field, are of vital importance to the Allied Military Government, Allied Commission.







2. The following points are pertinent to Lieut. Rancourt's TD with AMG IV Corps:

a. AMG IV Corps requested an experienced hotel man, to run a hotel in Milan.

b. An officer, experienced in such work, had been requested early in the year from the U.S., and it was reported, at the time Lt. Rancourt left Hq, A.C., that this officer had left the Continental U. S. by sea early in April. It was therefore anticipated, at the time of Lt. Rancourt's attachment to AMG IV Corps, that his temporary duty was to be of a duration not exceeding 10 days to two weeks, since, by that time, the arrival of his replacement was anticipated.

c. It has now developed that Lt. Rancourt's replacement, the officer referred to in Par 2 of the attached signal, will not be available as a replacement.

d. Lt. Rancourt has been with IV Corps for nearly a month. (Auth: Par 14, SC 118, dated 26 April 45).

e. Lt. Rancourt's activities in Milan consist of supervising the operation of the Albergo Continentale, the IV Corps Field Officers Hotel. The Continentale is not an AC/AMG hotel.

f. Lt. Rancourt's duties at Hq A.C. consisted in handling American rations, and supervising the operation of the Columbia Club.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission.

The shortage of personnel in the Signal Center was called to my attention on the morning of 5 May. This status was brought about by the rotation of two men, for whom no replacements had been received, and by the fact that, until a few days previously, we were not able to requisition enlisted personnel because of our enlisted overstrength.

A requisition was prepared immediately and taken to Headquarters Replacement and Training Command by Lt Simmons personally before noon 5 May. He made a personal appeal for prompt delivery of the enlisted men and through personal contacts at the 27th Replacement Depot, the best men available were assigned. In order to obtain quick delivery, a 1st Sergeant and a vehicle were dispatched from this headquarters on the morning of 6 May and returned in the afternoon of 7 May.

The replacements have been working in the Signal Center since the morning of 8 May and have had sufficient training in the fundamentals of Signal Center operation. Within ten days they will be able to carry their share of the work. During this emergency situation, Lt Simmons, in addition to his regular duties, has been taking his eight hours' shift with the two trained enlisted men so that there would be no breakdown or delay in the functioning of the Signal Center.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Piemonte Region.

1. There are no enlisted men available for assignment at the present.
2. It is expected that some will be available in the near future. They will be assigned proportionately to the four Northern Regions and consideration will be given to the deficiencies, measured according to the total number of American officers assigned to those regions.
3. Attention is called to your request for 8 stenographers. The four Northern Regions combined do not have 8 stenographers assigned to them and it is not expected that there will be eight available for assignment. Attention is also called to your request for 80 driver-mechanics. The four Northern Regions have at the present time a total of 52 enlisted men assigned including transportation sergeants, dispatchers, mechanics and drivers. With no possible stretch of imagination can 80 additional driver-mechanics be assigned to Piemonte Region.
4. Piemonte Region needs will be given proper and proportionate consideration in the assignment of any further enlisted men to the Northern Regions.

SUBJECT : Staff of Naples Commune.

TO : H.Q. Allied Commission.

1. With reference to the Staff for Naples Commune and the duties laid down in A.F.H.Q. order A.G. 091-1/081 G.E.G/o dated 29 March 1945, this HQ. is given a dual role, namely the control of A.M.G. territory in Naples Commune, with a population of about 1,000,000 persons, and liaison and intelligence for the 8 Provinces of Naples, Salerno, Benevento, Avellino, Campobasso, Cosenza, Catanzaro and Reggio.
2. I assume that our object is to help military operations and the requirements of the armed forces and therefore, that control must be kept over the civil population to ensure that the port functions and that the supply of the L of C is uninterrupted.
3. On this assumption the first essentials, as I understand it, are to keep check, as regards the Provinces, and control, as regards Naples Commune, on:
  - (a) - Food
  - (b) - Transport (distribution of food)
  - (c) - Law and Order
  - (d) - Labour and Employment
  - (e) - Intelligence (Propaganda).
4. As regards these headings,
  - (a) - There is no food officer. I understand that Major Palmer is to remain at Castellammare outside Naples, with the special important role of dealing with the grain issues for all South Italy. At the present time the Director of Sepsal is constantly referring small matters to me and I have no means of weighing up or checking demands.
  - (c) - Legal Officers are inadequate (see note of 21st April, from Legal Officer attached).
  - (d) - There is no labour officer and no one to refer questions on food or conditions, wages, hours, etc. of workmen in the docks or industries, on which the efficient working of the port and contentment of the people depends. Representations have already been sent to me direct to say that all labour employment

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by the Allies are being paid at unfavourable rates.

(e) - The P.W.B. representative is being taken away.

5. I am fully aware of the importance of operations now in progress in the North, but if these become clogged by any failure or strikes at the initial ports of supply, no amount of staff forward will put the situation right. The subjects above are the irreducible minimum on which the life of the Community depends and in addition we require Finance, Public Health, Public Works Officers, etc. if available.
6. I ask therefore, for urgent consideration for the immediate posting to this HQ. of:
- I. - An experienced food officer.
  - II. - An officer to deal with Labour and consider all questions on conditions of employment.
  - III. - Two additional legal officers.
  - IV. - A public relations or press officer.
